## 3 ROUMANIAN POLICE FUNCTIONARIES DISMISSED IN CONNECTION WITH TORTURE ACCUSATION

Horrible Details of Torture of Jewish Man and Woman Recalled; Medical Officials Previously Completely Denied Story of Torture as Baseless

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

CZERNOWITZ, Dec. 13 — Three police functionaries have today been dismissed by the order of the Minister of Interior. They are to be put on trial for torturing a Jewish man and woman, by the names of Feldman and Natasha, on the accusation that they were implicated in Communist activities.

The above case of torture, following similar cases, was the occasion of a great deal of interest and discussion both in Roumania and abroad. It is interesting to recall that the most recent report stated that the medical officials assigned to examine the alleged victims denied the reports of the tor-

ture as reported in the Jewish press. They declared that they found the woman totally uninjured, while Feldman, who was unable to walk, was said to be suffering only from corns.

In the disclosures regarding the tortures published in the Jewish press, the experiences of the tortured woman, Natasha, were described as unprintable.

## Einstein's Name Used in Stock Exchange Swindle

BERLIN, Dec. 13—An effort to utilize Professor Einstein's name for a stock exchange swindle was exposed today when police took proceedings against a banker, M. Ernst.

The accused has declared that Einstein had approved of his, the banker's, system of establishing mathematically, the stock exchange fluctuations. He claims that he was thus able to guarantee his customers assured profits. The banker actually succeeded in his scheme and by misusing the name of the world renowned mathematician and scientist, he obtained large sums.

## Vast Concourse Attends Funeral of Zlatopolsky

PARIS, Dec. 13—Thousands of Jews attended the funeral of Hillel Zlatopolsky in Paris this afternoon. Jewish organizations in the city, Zionist as well as Communal, were represented. Orations were delivered by Rabbi Julie Weil, Rabbi Eisenstadt, and Victor Jacobson on behalf of the Zionist Executive. Isaac Naiditch, for many years a colleague of the deceased and co-author with him of the Keren Hayesod school, represented that institution.

Hebrew literature of which Zlatopolsky was an unremitting patron was represented by Zalmen Schneur, the Hebrew poet, who is by some regarded as the equal of Bialik. Funeral addresses were also delivered by Schneur and Vladimir Jabotinsky.

## Greek Public Prosecutor To Take Action Against Pro-Government Organ

President of Jewish Community Invited to Submit Evidence for Purpose of Prosecution

SALONICA, Dec. 13—The public prosecutor today decided to take action against the agitation carried on by the "Makedonika Nea," controlled by the War Minister, General Kondylis. The paper recently commenced a campaign of incitement against the Jewish population, in connection with a promise given to a Jewish delegation by Premier Tsoldaris, that the existing restrictions with regard to elections would be abolished. ## Nazi Students Threaten Continued Disturbance Unless Jewish Professor Is Dismissed

Swift Action by Police and Detention of Students Legitimation Cards Restores Order

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Dec. 13—Following a notification by the Nazi students of Breslau University that they would not rest unless Dr. Ernst Cohn, a Jewish Professor at the University, was dismissed, the students assembled demanding that Professor Cohn should leave the University immediately.

Police, however, deprived fifty of the Nazi students of their legitimation cards, whereupon quiet was restored in the University.

Violent disturbances, due to the same cause, took place at the University a week ago. On that occasion, the police took elaborate precautions, putting down barbed wires at the main entrance to the lecture hall where Professor Cohn was to lecture and chaperoning those who wanted to attend the lecture through a narrow side door where they had to pass police inspection. When Dr. Cohn started to speak, the Nazi students called him names and created a tumult, and the police finally cleared the University. On that occasion 200 student cards were retained, and it was subsequently established that there were many non-students, members of the Nazi storm-troops, taking part in the disturbances.

## Attempt at Renewed Anti- Jewish Rioting in Lemberg Suppressed by Police

Jews Attacked in Streets and Cafes; Arrested Anti-Semitic Students Get Option of Fine or Imprisonment

LEMBERG, Dec. 13 — Excitement prevailed in Lemberg last night when the anti-Semitic students endeavored to renew the rioting which died down only a few days ago. They attacked Jews in the streets and cafes, occasioning a great deal of alarm. In one case a Jew by the name of Regenboirn, who was attacked in the Cafe Roma, fired a revolver in order to frighten off the attackers.

Police arrived immediately after the commencement of the disturbance, arresting both the rioting students and some of the attacked Jews. Two students were immediately sentenced to 150 zlotys or fifteen days arrest, another was sentenced to 100 zlotys or 10 days.

## Three Nazi Officials Get Two Years' Imprisonment

BERLIN, Dec. 13—Three Nazi officials of Osterode in East Prussia were today sentenced to two years' imprisonment for a premeditated bomb attack on a Jewish warehouse of Lonky.

### Son-in-law of Dr. Wise Succumbs at the Age of 31

Dr. Leon Arthur Tulin, son-in-law of Dr. Stephen S. Wise, died at his residence here last night after an illness of four years at the age of 31.

Dr. Tulin, the son of Samuel Tulin, was born in Hartford, Connecticut. He was a graduate of Yale Law School, and was admitted to the New York Bar in 1925. In 1926 he was appointed assistant professor at Yale Law School. He held the latter position for two years until his appointment to the professorship of criminal law in Columbia University which position he held till his death.

Dr. Tulin is survived by a widow, the former Josephine Waterman Wise, daughter of Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, and a son aged 4.

### Don Angel Pulido Dies At Age of Eighty Years

MADRID, Dec. 13.—Don Angel Pulido, the creator of the idea of repatriation of the descendants of the expelled Spanish Jews, is dead at the age of eighty. He claimed that this would be a fitting means of amending in some measure the wrong which Spain had done to the Jewish ancestors of Sephardic Jews who are now scattered throughout the world.

The entire Jewish population mourns the death of Don Pulido.

### Organizer of Student Protest Declares Hunger Strike

Dr. Arthur Krauss who was reported last week to be engaged in organizing a protest demonstration against the anti-Jewish excesses in the Polish universities, has declared a hunger-strike. He explains his action as a protest against the maltreatment of Jewish students.

### Morris Rothenberg at Zionist Mass Meeting

Morris Rothenberg, President of the Zionist Organization of America, and Chairman of the Administrative Committee of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, will be the principal speaker at a large mass meeting and Zionist demonstration to be held tonight at the Hebrew Institute of University Heights, according to an announcement made by Max J. Schneider, Chairman of the Membership Committee of the Zionist Organization for the Bronx.

The presence of Mr. Rothenberg, one of the most distinguished figures in the Zionist movement, is expected to bring out an unusual attendance. This will also give the Zionists of the Bronx an opportunity to join in the tribute that was tendered to Mr. Rothenberg at a dinner at the Hotel Astor on Sunday, December 4th, when leaders of all shades of opinion in the Jewish community joined in praising Mr. Rothenberg's services to the Jewish people here and abroad.

Other speakers will include Max J. Schneider, who is President of the Hebrew Institute, and I. J. Shafer, President of Zionist District 39, under whose auspices the meeting has been organized.

### Hadassah Membership Count; Chanukah "Luncheons" Campaign

The national office of Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America, is making preparations for the tabulation of returns of its national membership campaign, just concluded. Hadassah chapters in forty states have been notified to complete their local tabulations by December 31, from which date the national count will begin.

"Chanukah Gelt" campaign will be conducted during the week of December 18 to 25, specially designated as "School Luncheons" week. In the 300 cities where Hadassah chapters function, rabbis or Hadassah speakers will address children in Sunday, religious schools and Talmud Torahs on the importance of Hadassah's work in feeding school children in Palestine. Throughout the week contributions will be collected for this special Hadassah activity. At the end of the campaign a banner will be given to the school that contributes the largest sum of money. Mrs. Rebecca Shulman, of Far Rockaway, L. I., is the national chairman of the Palestine School Luncheons Committee, and is directing the December drive.

Hadassah's school luncheons work in Palestine is one of the important phases of preventive work in the Hadassah health system. At present more than 4,000 school children are given daily hot luncheons. For many children the Hadassah meal is the only nutritious one they receive for the entire day.

### Governor-elect Lehman to Address Chanukah Dinner

Governor-elect Lehman will make his first appearance, since his election as Governor of New York State before a Jewish audience, at the Chanukah Dinner of the Jewish Education Association, which takes place next Sunday night at the Biltmore Hotel, New York.

Colonel Lehman, it is understood, will address the guests, and his message is expected to be of interest to all sections of the population, irrespective of creed or race.

In connection with Colonel Lehman's acceptance of the invitation of the Jewish Education Association, Israel Unterberg, President of the Association, pointed out that Colonel Lehman has been interested in the work of the Association since its beginning, eleven years ago.

### Samuel Bayer Elected President of Yeshiva College

Samuel Bayer has been elected President of the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary, (the Yeshiva) and Yeshiva College, according to an announcement by Rabbi M. S. Margolies, who, because of ill health, has retired from the office of President and has become honorary President of the Institution.

Mr. Bayer is well known in Jewish communal circles. He is President of the Uptown Talmud Torah, a trustee of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies of New York, former President and now trustee of the Machzikei Talmud Torah and of the Harlem Yeshiva. Mr. Bayer has been identified with the Yeshiva and Yeshiva College for many years having been a member of its Board of Directors.

### Two Jews Appointed on San Diego Community Chest Board

SAN DIEGO, Calif., Dec. 13.—Two Jews, S. I. Fox and L. M. Klauber, have been appointed on San Diego's Community Chest Board.

The Board has distinguished itself by its many-sided activities and its assistance to family welfare agencies. The Board has also established a central clinic service as a part of its program.

S. I. Fox is active in communal work. He is President of Temple Beth Israel, and is also a member of City Water Commission. L. M. Klauber is superintendent of the San Diego Gas and Electric Co.

The Temple on the Heights, B'nai Teshurun Congregation, Cleveland, Ohio, commemorated two-thirds of a century of its existence by a dinner held at the Chamber of Commerce on Sunday evening, December 11th.

The guest speaker of the evening was Clarence Darrow, who spoke on "Has Man Free Will?"

## Jews of Poland, Eastern Europe, Helpless in Face of Crisis, Rabbi Jonah B. Wise Says

### Hard Winter, Other Factors Causing Acute Distress Increase Need for American Jewish Aid

Warning that the Jews of Poland and other countries of Eastern Europe are facing a crisis this winter from which they cannot rescue themselves without the assistance of American Jewry was issued yesterday by Rabbi Jonah B. Wise, chairman of the fund-raising effort of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, agency for the relief of Jews overseas. Aggravation of the serious condition of these people by an early and hard winter as well as by the recent disturbances in Poland and prolonged economic retrogression, has reduced hundreds of thousands to a state of desperation, Dr. Wise said.

"It is almost impossible to credit the statements of impartial observers, as to the depths of misery and despair of the Jewish population of Eastern and Central Europe," he declared. "But the fact remains that these people have been existing under unbearable conditions, suffering cruel blows, spiritual and physical, and are now at the end of their tether. I am not exaggerating when I say that hundreds and thousands of these people cannot survive the winter unless the Jews of America intensify and extend their generous support in the face of conditions unparalleled in the last decade in Europe.

"The Joint Distribution Committee, as the Agency of the Jews in America, has undertaken relief measures in behalf of these stricken coreligionists for whose rehabilitation we have been laboring for eighteen years. In view of the drastic urgency of their needs, and in order to rescue thousands from starvation, disease and other conditions which menace them, it is imperative that these relief efforts be extended without delay and that funds for the work be made immediately available to the Committee."

## Nazis Favor Old Testament Methods

BERLIN, Dec. 13.—A Nazi motion before the Reichstag commission produced a witty reply by the Social Democratic Deputy Faust. The Nazi motion suggested that farmers be permitted to pay taxes in kind instead of money. Amidst general amusement, Deputy Faust pointed out that the Nazis were apparently attempting to restore the tax system of the patriarchs Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, to whom they were otherwise opposed. They apparently wished to return to Old Testament times when harvest offerings were substituted for taxes.

## Margoshes Charges "Conscience Of World Has Failed Jews"; Palestine Only "Consolation"

### Addresses Meeting Establishing Permanent Conference of Jewish Organizations for Palestine

A permanent Conference of Jewish Organizations on Palestine was established last Sunday afternoon at a meeting at the Hotel Astor at which representatives of organizations estimated to include 150,000 members in New York City joined to assist the Jewish Agency for Palestine in the rebuilding of the Jewish National Home in Palestine. These organizations are not directly affiliated with the Zionist movement, and this marks the first attempt to consolidate their efforts on behalf of Palestine.

United States Attorney George Z. Medallie was named Honorary President of the Conference and Jacob Fishman, Managing Editor of the "Jewish Morning Journal," was elected President. The Vice-Chairmen are Isidor Apfel, President of the Independent Order B'rith Abraham; A. D. Braham, President of the United Romanian Jews of America; Judge Hyman J. Reit, President of the United Synagogue of New York State; Philip Luria, Dr. Mordecai Soltes, Benjamin Winter, President of the Federation of Polish Jews in America; Morris Margulies and Sigmund Thau. Isaac Meister was elected Treasurer and Samuel Goldstein, Secretary. Dr. S. Margoshes is Chairman of the Executive Committee.

The speakers at the conference included Dr. S. Margoshes, editor of "The Day," who presided; A. D. Braham, President of the United Romanian Jews; Morris Margulies, Secretary of the Zionist Organization of America; Jacob Fishman and Nathan Straus, Jr.

Referring to events within the past few weeks in Poland and the anti-Semitic disturbances in that country, Dr. Margoshes said:

"While the Government of Poland moved slowly and cautiously, protecting only the rioters and murderers, where was the League of Nations, entrusted with the safeguarding of Jewish minority rights? The League of Nations, presumably representing the conscience of the world, had not one word to say in protest against the Polish outrages."

The conference adopted resolutions calling upon the Jews of New York, through regularly constituted organizations, to give their utmost cooperation to the Jewish Agency for Palestine so as to insure the maintenance of the projects administered by the Jewish Agency and in order to accelerate the rebuilding of the Jewish National Home, to establish a permanent body with elected officers through whom the help coming from the various organizations may be guided and through

## To Petition New Jersey Legislature for Formal Welcome to Prof. Einstein

### Official Spinoza Celebration at Newark Protests Unjustifiable Attacks Upon Einstein

NEWARK, Dec. 13.—At the official celebration held here last Sunday night to mark the tercentenary of the birth of Baruch Spinoza a resolution was unanimously adopted petitioning the 1933 session of the New Jersey Legislature to extend a formal welcome to Professor Albert Einstein, now en route to America, where he will later join the faculty of the new Institute of Advanced Studies at Princeton University.

The resolution suggested by A. Silverstein, chairman of the tercentenary committee, and presented by A. Sigmund Kanengieser, Grandmaster of the Independent Order B'rith Shalom, protested "against the unfounded and thoroughly unjustifiable attacks provoked upon the greatest scientific mind of the century, Professor Einstein—to whom freedom of conscience is just as precious as it was to Spinoza—by a super-patriotic and inflated organization."

The resolution declared further that the attacks "in effect constitute a travesty upon the splendid judgment exercised by Louis Bamberger, Mrs. Felix Fuld, Dr. Abraham Flexner and trustees of the new Institute of Advanced Studies, in inviting Professor Einstein to honor the state of New Jersey by becoming a member of the faculty of the Institute."

Dr. Ruth Gruber, of Brooklyn, who recently surprised scholars of two continents by having the Ph.D. degree bestowed upon her at the age of 20, was the principal speaker at the observance. Challenging the oft-repeated assertion that Spinoza was an atheist, she pleaded for a "wider recognition of the religious precepts which motivated his life."

## 5 Jews and 4 Arabs Slightly Wounded in Labor Clash

JERUSALEM, Dec. 13.—Five Jews and four Arabs were slightly wounded in a labor clash which occurred at Nes Zionah.

A Jewish orange contractor had engaged only Arab labor for work in connection with the orange picking, boycotting Jewish labor. Jewish pickets persuaded the Arabs to leave the grove, but later encouraged by the contractor, the Arabs returned to work, resulting in a clash between the pickets and the Arabs.

Nine Jewish pickets and numerous Arabs were arrested by the police who arrived on the scene. The injured have been taken to a hospital.

He read messages relating to Spinoza's life and precepts, specially directed to the Newark celebration, from Secretary of the Interior Wilbur, President Robinson of City College, New York; Professor Adolph S. Oko, of Hebrew Union College; Dr. Frederick Kettner, author and director of Spinoza Center, New York; and Benjamin De Casseres, author, and only living lineal descendant of Spinoza.

## 3 Jews Elected to Rochester Chamber of Commerce

ROCHESTER, Dec. 13—Three local Jewish civic leaders will be elected to office in the Rochester Chamber of Commerce, one of the largest bodies of its kind in the United States, for the year 1933.

They are: Benjamin Forman, head of B. Forman Co. women's department store; Sol Heumann, clothing manufacturer, and Alfred Hart, founder and owner of the chain of Hart Food Stores, president of Temple Beth El and a director in several national Jewish organizations.

Mr. Forman has been nominated to be a member of the Board of Trustees of the Rochester Chamber of Commerce to serve for two years. He has seen previous service in past years in this office. Mr. Heumann was also nominated to the Board of Trustees for a term ending in 1935.

Mr. Hart was nominated for his first term as a trustee. Nomination is tantamount to election. The new officers will be formally installed in January.

The Thirty-third Annual meeting of the Hebrew Educational Society, Brooklyn, N. Y., will be held tonight at the Society's building. Max Herzfeld, president of the Society, will render the Annual Report. Election of officers will be held. A special program and tea will follow the meeting.

The Hebrew Educational Society is one of the constituent societies of the Brooklyn Federation of Jewish Charities, concentrating mostly on recreational and educational activities.

whom bodies not represented at the conference might be brought within its scope. A resolution was also adopted extending to Dr. Chaim Weizmann, former President of the World Zionist Organization, an invitation to visit the United States.

A. D. Braham declared that the Jewish fraternal societies in America are gradually disintegrating. He estimated that there were probably over 400 of these organizations in New York with physical assets running into hundreds of thousands of dollars. He suggested that these organizations be brought beneath the wing of the only permanent Jewish movement—Zionism—to enable them to survive.

Jacob Fishman, who was elected chairman of the conference, referred to Palestine as "the only country in the world today that has room for Jewish immigrants." He predicted that if the present tempo of work in Palestine continued, we might expect to see Palestine on its feet by 1940, so that it would no longer have need for funds from abroad.

## Police Confiscate Nazi Boycott Appeals

VIENNA, Dec. 13—Under instructions from the attorney-general, the police have confiscated a Nazi anti-Jewish boycott appeal, distributed under the slogan of "not a single penny for the crucifiers of Christ."

The agitation is in connection with the Christmas shopping season and is designed to divert all such business from the Jewish stores.

It may be recalled that a similar agitation was attempted last year when hundreds of thousands of leaflets were distributed bearing the inscription "No Jewish goods", printed under the picture of a Christmas tree.

system of a separate Electoral College, which maintains a political ghetto for the Jews, would be changed.

In connection with its anti-Jewish agitation, the "Makedonika Nea" also announced a series of fictitious historical articles entitled "The Jewish Hangmen of Salonica," in which is portrayed the character of one Peretz Cohn, who is said to have become a favorite of the Turkish Government of Salonica and occasioned the execution of numerous Greeks.

As a first step, the public prosecutor has invited Eli Ebenosiglo, President of the Communal Assembly, Asher Moissis, and the legal councillor of the community, Yomtov Yakov, to submit evidence for the prosecution.

The agitation carried on in "Makedonika Nea" shows no sign of abatement, and the inciting articles which continue to be published are seriously disquieting the Jewish population.

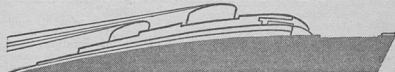
