Deputy Cuza Continues Speech Interrupted By Violent Outbreaks

"Roumanian People Would Massacre
Jews If Russia Attacked Roumania,"
States Anti-Semitic Leader

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUCHAREST, Dec. 16—Cuza, the leader of the anti-Semites in the Roumanian Parliament, continued today the inciting speech, interrupted yesterday when his followers attempted to attack Jewish Deputies in the House. He declared that the Roumanian people would massacre the Jews if Russia ever attacked Roumania.

Cuza's speech evoked a storm of protest in Parliament, the leader of the Peasant Party, M. Lupu, protesting vigorously, amidst general approval. He pointed out that such declarations were a crime against Roumania. The Speaker of the House, thereupon intervened with the declaration that minorities would always be protected because it was a patriotic duty to do so. He called upon Cuza to finish his speech which brought more hatred than use to Roumania.

Buenos Aires Protests Against Polish Excesses

BUENOS AIRES, Dec. 16—A great mass meeting held here voiced strong protests against the anti-Semitic riots in Poland. Copies of the resolutions adopted at the meeting have been sent to the League of Nations at Geneva and to the Polish Government in Warsaw.

Palestine Offices Destroyed In Certificates Controversy

CZERNOWITZ, Dec. 16—Revisionists and members of the Brith Trumpeldor, today completely destroyed the Palestine offices here, because of dissatisfaction with the distribution of the Palestine certificates.

Palestine High Commissioner Visits Hebrew University

JERUSALEM, Dec. 16—The High Commissioner has paid a visit to the Hebrew University. He will address the University's graduation ceremonies which are to be held next week.

Compensation to Jewish Victims of Aden Riots Refused by Government

Aden Chief Commissioner Declines to
Sanction Inquiry Determining
Amount of Damages

BOMBAY, Dec. 16—The claim for compensation by the Jewish victims of the Aden riots has been dismissed by the Indian Government authorities. Furthermore the Chief Commissioner of Aden, has declined to sanction an inquiry with a view to determining the exact amount of damage suffered by Jews, basing his refusal on the ground that since there is no individual on whom responsibility could be laid, a practical remedy is unobtainable.

The riots at Aden broke out on the evening of May 23rd of this year, when an attack was made on the Jewish quarter by Aden Arabs after a false report had been spread that Jews had defiled a Mosque by throwing refuse into it.

The rioting continued for two days, and during that period a number of Jews were injured and property amounting to 25,000 Rupees in value was damaged or destroyed. The Jewish Community of Aden has, ever since the outbreak, made repeated requests for compensation without receiving any satisfaction.

A Bombay Jewish advocate, Mr. Sargon, is now in London and it is understood that, following the dismissal of the case, by the Indian authorities, steps may be taken to bring the case before the Court of the Privy Council in London.

Anti-Jewish Excesses In East Galicia

WARSAW, Dec. 16—Anti-Jewish excesses occurred yesterday at Mosckin, in East Galicia. Two brothers, Jan and Wladyslaw Muszynski, both butchers, incited a crowd to attack Jewish passersby. As a result one Jewish woman, Tobia Spiesel, was seriously injured, while two others, Samuel Spiesel and Feder Bachl, also suffered injuries. Both the Muszynskis were arrested.

Plenum of Thuringian State Parliament Decides Schechita Prohibition

July, 1933, Fixed as Date for Enforcement;
Imprisonment for Infringement

BERLIN, Dec. 16—The Plenum of the State Parliament of Thuringia has, by the united votes of the Nazis and the German National Agrarian League against those of the Social Democrats and the Communists, decided to put into force the prohibition of Schechita as from July 1st, 1933. In the meantime, Thuringia is to negotiate with Prussia and the rest of the German states, with a view to the introduction of a general prohibition of Schechita.

The Law prohibiting Schechita, provides for a penalty of six months' imprisonment for infringement.

The Bill prohibiting Schechita, was passed by the Law Commission as recently as November 30th. On that occasion, no date was fixed for its enforcement as one of its provisions laid down that it was not to enter into effect until the neighboring states also decided to prohibit Schechita.

Aronowsky and Cohen Released by Court-Martial

HAVANA, Dec. 16—Elieser Aronowsky, the business representative in Cuba of "Der Tog," the New York Yiddish daily, and Chaim Cohen, an American citizen temporarily domiciled in Havana, have been liberated as the result of a special order made by the Military Commandant, Colonel Rosco, following intervention by the Jewish Center in Havana, and special efforts made by the Hebrew Immigrant Aid and Sheltering Society (HIAS).

Gershon Portnoy, Director of the Havana Jewish Center, who had been arrested and placed at the disposal of the Minister of Interior, has also been released as a result of an order by the Minister.

In view of the fact that Havana is under martial law, the arrest had been regarded with considerable seriousness.

Discovers Time and Place of Elazar Kalir, Hebrew Poet

An important discovery has been made concerning the earliest and most prolific Hebrew poet, Elazar Kalir, the problem of whose time and place has perplexed Jewish scholars for centuries. Rabbi Joseph Marcus, a graduate of the Jewish Theological Seminary in New York, found among the Adler Manuscripts in the Seminary Library a poem by Kalir in which are vividly described the turbulent events of his time and place, and the Messianic hopes raised by those events for National restoration in Palestine. This discovery will shed much light on the history of his time, as well as on numerous other poems by the same poet, and on the time of his famous teacher Yannaï, whose works were published by Professor Israel Davidson. Rabbi Marcus' article on his discovery, together with many new poems from the Adler Genizah, will soon appear. Rabbi Marcus' researches on Kalir date back to 1923 when his prize essay on the sources of Kalir's poetry in Midrash and Pesikot was written.

Three years ago Rabbi Marcus discovered a new fragment of the original Hebrew of Ecclesiasticus, Ben Sira. He has also been of assistance to the famous Hebrew poet Bialik in his edition of the poetic works of Solomon ibn Gabirol and Moses ibn Ezra.

Dr. Franklin Reappointed To Library Commission

DETROIT, Mich., Dec. 16.—Dr. Leo M. Franklin, rabbi of Temple Beth El, has been reappointed a member of the Detroit Library Commission for another six year term. This appointment was made unanimously by the Board of Education.

During the past year, Dr. Franklin served as president of the Library Commission.

Annual Meeting of Jewish Welfare Board

National leaders, representing six national Jewish organizations, will participate in a symposium on the problem of the American Jewish youth, which will be the feature of the Annual Meeting of the National Council of the Jewish Welfare Board, to be held today, at the Y.M.H.A., Lexington Ave. and 92nd St., New York City.

This meeting, which will mark the 15th birthday of the Jewish Welfare Board, will be attended by officials of the organization, as well as heads of Y.M.H.A.'s and Jewish community centers throughout the country, and also prominent men and women leaders of Jewish communal activity in different parts of the country.

The symposium, which will discuss the theme "What of Our Youth—A Challenge to the Jewish Community," will be introduced by Felix M. Warburg, dean of American-Jewish philanthropists, and the speakers will include Ludwig Vogelstein, Chairman of the Executive Board of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations; Louis J. Borinstein, Chairman of the National Wider Scope Committee of the B'nai Brith; Louis J. Moss, President of the United Synagogue of America; Mrs. Arthur Brin, President of the National Council of Jewish Women; Benjamin Koenigsberg, Member of the Administrative Committee of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America; Bernard Semel, Honorary Secretary of the Jewish Education Association. Judge Irving Lehman, President of the Jewish Welfare Board, will preside at the symposium.

The sessions of the meeting will begin today, and following an address of welcome by Frank L. Weil, President of the 92nd Street Y.M.H.A., there will be presented reports and addresses on the work of the Jewish Welfare Board. Among the speakers will be Judge Lehman, Benjamin J. Bittenswiler, treasurer of the organization; Harry L. Glucksman, executive director; and Dr. Cyrus Adler, Chairman of the American Jewish Committee, and Chairman of the Army and Navy Committee of the Jewish Welfare Board. Dr. Adler, in his address, will review the 15 years work of the organization.

The morning session will close with brief reports by presidents of regional Federations of Y.M.H.A.'s and Jewish Community Centers, who will tell of the work in their localities.

A uncheon will be tendered the delegates by the Reception Committee of the Y.M.H.A.

In connection with the celebration of the 15th birthday of the Young Judea of Canada, on December 25th, a uniform country-wide program will be enacted simultaneously in all Young Judea centers.

On Sunday afternoon, December 18th, at 3:45, Dr. Abraham Wolfson, author of "Sins of a Life of Reason," will speak at the Central Jewish Institute, under the auspices of the Yeshiva Club. Topic—Spinoza, Philosopher and Jew.

To Mark 70th Anniversary Of Henri Slisberg

PARIS.—Baron Alfred Gunzbourg has agreed to preside at a social committee formed to celebrate the 70th anniversary of Henri Slisberg, the well-known Russian-Jewish advocate and social worker of Petrograd. A number of Jewish leaders of Paris will participate in that committee and a series of events is planned to mark the anniversary which falls at the beginning of 1933.

Mr. Slisberg was born in 1863, in Poltava. He made his studies in St. Petersburg university and later in Germany and France; he became a barrister and also a noted research worker of law. It was at that time that he commenced his activities in favor of the Jewish emancipation. In 1891 he participated as a member of a committee of the American Congress for study of the causes of Jewish emigration. The results of his work were incorporated into the so called Webster Report to the Congress.

A close collaborator of the Baron Horace Gunzbourg he played an eminent role in the ritual murder trial of Blondes in Wilno in 1900. He was also engaged in the enquiry into the pogroms of Kishinev and Homel and was connected with the Jewish Colonization Ass'n (J.C.A.) work in Russia from 1893 onwards. At one time the president of the Jewish community of Petrograd, he was also known for his general activity, and Stolypin, the Russian Minister, appointed him State-Councillor. In 1920 he fled from Russia and settled in Paris, where he is continuing his activity in amelioration of the conditions of immigrant circles. He has made several journeys to the United States.

Mrs. Felix M. Warburg Arrives in Jerusalem

JERUSALEM, Dec. 16.—Mrs. Felix M. Warburg, wife of the noted Jewish philanthropist, who arrived here today, declared to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that she was glad to find such an optimistic atmosphere prevailing in Palestine. She said that she would here await her son, Edward, who would be arriving from Persia, and they would tour the colonies together, accompanied by Dr. Maurice Hexter, and Dr. Judah L. Magnes.

The Goel Tzedek Congregation of Toronto will celebrate its fiftieth anniversary by a four-day program. There will be a congregational service on Friday night, December 23, on which occasion Rabbi Samuel Sachs, spiritual head of the congregation, will deliver the sermon. Saturday morning, December 24, the Junior Congregation will hold a joint service with their elders. The Sunday School will celebrate on Sunday morning, December 25.

The closing event will be in the form of a congregational banquet, to be given in the Synagogue Chambers on Monday night, December 26. Rabbi Jesse Winesfield, of Adath Jeshurun, Syracuse, N. Y., will be the guest speaker.

Campaign to Extort Foreign Currency and Gold From Jews in Russia

Has Received Material Proving Tens of Thousands of Jews Arrested Declares Chaim Nachman Bialik

TEL AVIV, Dec. 16—Chaim Nachman Bialik, the foremost Hebrew poet of the day, has issued an appeal against the arrests of Jews in Russia in connection with a campaign by the authorities to extort foreign currency and gold coinage from them. He claims that he recently received new material from Russia proving that tens of thousands, mostly Jews, had been again arrested. He calls on the Jewish press to join in a protest against the arrests.

Bialik declares that thirty Jews were kept in a pit under the open winter sky for three days at Korosten, near Kiev, without food, in connection with a drive to induce them to give up currency and coinage.

According to an appeal which has reached Bialik from Kiev, eighty percent of the people arrested are now verging on death; in Chabne, Wolf Slutsky died from the tortures to which he had been subjected in connection with the currency inquisition.

A similar appeal from Moscow urging large scale protests today reached Bialik who submitted the above documents to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, under his own signature, affirming their reliability.

Unfounded Report of Modification of Sunday Law

WARSAW, Dec. 16—A report published by the "Moment" which quotes a speech delivered by the Vice-Director of the Chamber of Commerce at Lodz, has aroused a great sensation throughout Poland. The Vice-Director of the Chamber of Commerce, is reported to have stated that free trading licenses would be granted to Jewish merchants who had been ruined and that modification of the Sunday Closing Law was projected by the Government. This is being widely interpreted by the Jewish population as a sign that relief is in sight.

The Jewish Telegraphic Agency is informed, however, that no such concessions are intended. The report is merely father to the wish of what the Jewish population would have desired for the alleviation of their distress.

The official statistics regarding the Jewish population of Alsace-Lorraine carry some interesting details of the Jewish organizations in the recovered French provinces: three consistories are supervising the Jewish religious life: those of Strasbourg, Colmar and Metz.

At the head of each there is a chief rabbi. Twenty-two rabbis are attached to the three consistories and are assisted by eight-hundred sub-rabbis. All the expense incurred by these institutions is borne by the departmental budgets.

"Minute Week" of Charity Federation to Be Extended For Another Week

11,818 Minutes of Time Sold at Eleven Dollars Per Minute; 32,822 Minutes Still Unaccounted for

The minute drive now being conducted by the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies has been extended for another week, due to the urgent necessity for completing the 1932 budget for the support of 91 philanthropic institutions, it was announced yesterday by Paul Felix Warburg and Ira M. Younker, under whose leadership the Federation is engaged in raising \$3,923,000.

Although 11,818 minutes of support time were sold at \$11 a minute during the past week, there still remain 32,822 minutes unaccounted for by contributions, they pointed out. The drive is based on the cost to the Federation of \$11 a minute to support the sick, destitute, orphaned, aged and handicapped in its 91 institutions for one minute. A deficit of \$361,000 must still be raised.

The second week of the minute drive will be marked by many meetings of trade, professional, industrial and fraternal groups within the Federation, the first of which will be a rally of the Lodges and Societies Division this afternoon at the Community House of Congregation Emanu-El. More than 500 officers, representing 300 lodges, fraternal societies, and labor unions, will meet under the leadership of Sol Tekelsky in a final rally to stimulate the sale of minutes among the thousands of like organizations in New York City.

Speakers at the rally will include former Supreme Court Justice Joseph M. Proskauer, president of the Federation; Dr. Nathan Ratnoff, of Beth Israel Hospital, one of the seven hospitals affiliated with the Federation; B. C. Vladeck, managing editor of the "Jewish Daily Forward"; Judge Jonah J. Goldstein, a trustee of the Federation; and Mr. Tekelsky. There will be music by Cantor Josef Rosenblatt, and Gottfried Federlein, the organist of Temple Emanuel.

In an urgent appeal to workers, contributors and those who have not yet contributed, Mr. Warburg and Mr. Younker stressed the need for completing the budget before the first of the year.

Meer Grossman Arrives

In Jerusalem

JERUSALEM, Dec. 16—Meer Grossman, one of the vice-presidents of the World Union of Zionist Revisionists, has arrived in Palestine. It is understood that he will stay here for several weeks after which he plans to go to the United States via London.

Einstein Will Lecture At Hebrew University, Dr. Weizmann Hopes

Dr. Weizmann Will Proceed to Palestine in October, 1933; His Chanukah Visit Undecided

LONDON, Dec. 16—In a statement to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, Dr. Weizmann revealed that he would go to Palestine only in October, 1933, when he hoped to remain there for some time in connection with his plans relating to the Agricultural Institute. He said, that his visit to Palestine projected for Chanukah, was still undecided.

He further disclosed that a London Committee, the personnel of which, included himself, Sir Philip Hartog and Sir Herbert Samuel, was engaged in drawing up a Constitution for the Hebrew University for submission to the Palestine Government, with a view to securing Government recognition for the University. He stated that he had discussed the possibility of Einstein lecturing at the Hebrew University before the latter's departure for the United States. Dr. Weizmann, had claimed that all Einstein would require would be a pencil, paper and a chair, in order to make it possible for him to give the Hebrew University, the fullest advantage of his teaching. Apparently, however, Einstein disagreed with Dr. Weizmann's view of his requirements for lecturing at the University. Nevertheless, Dr. Weizmann expressed the hope that Einstein would one day go to Palestine in order to fill a Chair at the Hebrew University.

Dr. Selig Brodetsky Arrives in Poland

WARSAW, Dec. 16—Dr. Selig Brodetsky, who arrived here today, received the press and discussed the Zionist attitude toward current Palestine problems. He associated himself with Dr. Arlosoroff's statements as expressed in a recent press conference at Jerusalem, in which the latter denied that the High Commissioner before his departure for Geneva had received an assurance from the Jewish Agency that they would not oppose the scheme for a Legislative Council, and that the withholding of their opposition was in exchange of certain practical concessions on the part of the Palestine government, such as an increased number of certificates.

Dr. Brodetsky, who is to participate on Sunday in a meeting of the Zionist Council, is to spend a few days in Poland in connection with the campaign for the Keren Hayesod.

The protest meeting of the Intercolllegiate Menorah Society, at City College, against the Polish riots, previously announced for today, has been postponed to Thursday, December 29th. The time and speakers will be announced later.

Dr. Weizmann on Progress Of Hebrew University

LONDON, Dec. 16—The Society of Friends of the Hebrew University here held their annual meeting this evening with Dr. Weizmann as the chief speaker. Dr. Weizmann discussed the need for growth of the Hebrew University, particularly in relation to the deplorable position of the Jewish students in Eastern and Central Europe.

Sir Philip Hartog, who presided, disclosed that Dr. Weizmann had consented to go to Jerusalem for the purpose of taking charge of the new Agricultural Institute affiliated with the Hebrew University.

Dr. Weizmann, speaking on the importance of the new Agricultural Institute, declared that the Institute had its own budget, but he hoped that the Government also would grant it a subsidy, so as to enable it to carry on its work which was for the general benefit of the country.

Brith Trumpeldor Bravery Acknowledged by Government

PARIS—According to a report received here by the headquarters of the Brith Trumpeldor, the members of the local section of the organization in Harbin, Manchuria,—most of them students—have been freed by the Government of all charges and fees connected with their studies in the University and schools. This concession has been made in acknowledgment of the courage displayed by the members of the Harbin Brith Trumpeldor, during the disastrous flood and epidemic which recently befell the Harbin district.

British Fascists Who Will Not Play Ping-Pong With Jews

LONDON—According to a report from Leeds, the city in Yorkshire which contains one of the largest Jewish communities in the country, the local Fascists who run a club known as "The Yorkshire Fascist Table Tennis Club," have decreed that the game is not to be played with Jews. In this connection, the London "Jewish Chronicle" publishes the following amusing comment:

The worst has befallen! The Fascists have nerved themselves for one great resounding, crushing effort against the despised Jews. To show that now, at long last, they really and truly mean business, they have solemnly resolved that—they shan't play ping-pong with us! The thunderbolt fell in Leeds. The Yorkshire Fascist Table Tennis Club forged it. One of its most cherished principles was that never would it wield a racket in company with a Jew. It could never rise to the full majesty of the game, or do justice to its own mighty prowess in such harassing circumstances. So when it discovered that the Leeds Table Tennis League, of which it was a member, had so outraged its most sacred feelings as to arrange a fixture for it with the local Judeans, it downed "rackets" and resigned! Here, then, is the anti-Semitic cult revealed in all the nakedness of its miserable, puny, witless and humorless self. "If 'Judea' won't 'perish' then, at any rate, it shan't ping-pong with us!" Hitlerism has struck one grand blow against the dominance of the accursed Jew. Ping-pong shall be Juden-rein, and the world be saved. Sir Oswald Mosley must feel a proud man this day, and Hitler has some consolation for his nasty set-back in Germany. He may not be Chancellor, but at least he can boast that no Leeds Fascist crosses rackets with a Jew! For our part, we do not take the childish tomfoolery of these Fascists seriously. Having exposed the fooling antics of their movement so effectively, we even think they have deserved well of us. Besides, if they have de-Judaised table tennis, we Jews have, at any rate, the compensation of a real tennis champion in our German co-religionist, Prens. So we can dismiss these gallant sportsmen and red revolutionaries with the good humored admonition: "Well done, ye good and faithful Jew-baiters. Now run away and play ping-pong, all by yourselves! . . . And, by the way, whatever you do, be very careful not to enter for the premier Table Tennis trophy—the Swaythling Cup! For not only was this trophy presented by a Jew, but it has actually been won by a 100 per cent Jewish Hungarian team, including even the officials!" Oh dear, dear, what is a poor, simple-minded Fascist to do!

Decline of Hebron Since Massacres of 1929

JERUSALEM,—The City of Hebron, which until 1929 was fairly prosperous has suffered a steady decline since August of that year, when many Jews were ruthlessly done to death by Arabs of the city and neighborhood.

It is interesting that the Hebron correspondent of "Falastin" complains of the exceptionally bad economic situation in Hebron, and suggests the development of the town as a summer resort. The correspondent reports that at present nearly 50 per cent of Hebron's dwellings are untenanted.

This betokens an effort on the part of the Hebron Arabs to find some means of revenue with which to replace the money which the Hebron Jewish Community had previously brought into the city.

Polish Ambassador in London on the Excesses

LONDON, Dec. 16—According to the report of the Joint Foreign Committee, which is to be submitted to Sunday's meeting of the Board of Jewish Deputies, the anti-Semitic boycott agitation by the Nazis in Germany continues ceaselessly and with unabated violence. The report adds that the Jewish economic situation in Germany continues to give rise to considerable anxiety.

The report also makes public correspondence between the Polish Ambassador in London and the Joint Foreign Committee regarding the recent Polish disturbances. In the correspondence, the Polish Ambassador expresses the assurance that "necessary steps are being taken in order to prevent the occurrence of further disorder." He adds the belief that the feeling of unrest is already subsiding.
