Forty Jews Wounded in Jassy as Anti-Semites Attack Charity Ball

15 Seriously Injured; Police Arrive
Late; Attempt to Attack Jewish
Deputy in Parliament

BUCHAREST, Dec. 19.—Forty Jews were wounded in Jassy last night, fifteen gravely, when Cuzists attacked the Jewish Sports and Music Club where a charity ball was in progress.

Tremendous panic ensued when the attackers suddenly broke in on the throng. The authorities arrived on the scene only after some delay and failed to apprehend any of the Cuzists. An investigation has been promised.

The ball had been arranged in order to raise a maintenance fund for the Jewish hospital of Jassy and its ambulance service.

Tear and Gas Bombing Attacks on Jewish Warehouses in Germany

Believed to Be Part of Premeditated
Plot Arranged by Central Nazi
Headquarters

BERLIN, Dec. 19.—Tear and gas bombing attacks upon warehouses and other places of business owned by Jews were reported yesterday in Giessen, Mainz, Darmstadt, Worms and other towns.

The attacks are believed to be part of a premeditated plan worked out by Central Nazi headquarters.

In Giessen, tear bombs were thrown into three warehouses owned by Jews during the busiest trading hours. A member of the Nazi Storm Troops, Wenzel, was arrested by the police and confessed the act, explaining that it was done to damage the interests of the Jews.

Gas bombs were thrown into Jewish warehouses owned by Jews in Mainz, causing panic.

Bernstein, Internationally Known Socialist Theoretician, Succumbs At the Age of 83

Body to Be Cremated on Thursday;
Left the Jewish Community But
Remained Loyal and Proud Jew

BERLIN, Dec. 19.—Eduard Bernstein, internationally famed Socialist theoretician and writer, contemporary of Karl Marx and Friedrich Engels, succumbed yesterday to natural causes at the age of eighty-three after an illness of three weeks.

Although he formally severed his connections with the Jewish Community in 1877, at the dictates of the Social-Democratic Party, he remained in his own words "a loyal and proud Jew". In his later years he expressed regret that he had severed his connection, declaring that given the choice again, he would never leave the persecuted Jewish people. He was a firm friend of the Zionist movement and identified with the Poale Zion organization.

Until the last moment of his life, Herr Bernstein was in full possession of his faculties and active in political and social movements in which his career was projected.

Funeral services will be held on Thursday afternoon. The body will be cremated.

The news of his demise has brought widespread expressions of condolence. Hundreds of telegrams from abroad have been received at the home of Herr Bernstein and headquarters of the Social Democratic Party.

The funeral services will be broadcast over the Federal Radio station.

Otto Wels, president of the Social Democratic Party of Germany, laid a wreath of red carnations on the body this afternoon.

Herr Bernstein was the founder of the School known as "revisionism", a school of Marxian thought which challenged the extreme doctrines of Karl

Nazis Cause 200,000 Schilling Property Damage in Vienna in Anti-Jewish Boycott Drive

Government Announces Intention of
Employing Vigorous Measures
Against Nazi Terrorization

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

VIENNA, Dec. 19.—Property damage estimated at 200,000 schillings and an incalculable boycott damage was wrought here yesterday by the Nazis in their terrorization campaign against the Jews in an effort to prevent Christian Christmas shoppers from trading with Jews.

Hundreds of plate glass windows of Jewish shops were smashed and their property defaced with the slogan "Don't Buy from Jews!" The city was flooded with millions of boycott leaflets.

The police, in special patrols, attempted to apprehend the Nazis responsible for yesterday's occurrences, but met with little success even though Nazi homes were raided in some instances.

The fog which enveloped the city helped the Nazis to do their damage and escape.

Part of the loss is covered by insurance.

One-third of Aden Police Force to Be Composed of Indian Sikhs as Precaution

British Government Takes This Action
in Complaint Moslem Force
Does Not Protect Jews

LONDON, Dec. 19.—One-third of the police force of Aden, which in recent months has been the scene of anti-Semitic rioting, will in the future be recruited from India, the British government informed the Joint Foreign Committee today.

This change in the composition of the police force is in reply to the complaints that the present force, 200 in all, consisting of Moslems, failed to offer protection to the Jewish population during the riots.

The Indian recruits are to consist of Sikhs and the government hopes in

rostrum, with Bible in hand, seeking to refute the anti-Semitic attacks of the Cuzists, an anti-Semitic Deputy. Ciolac, rushed upon him and attempted to wrest the Bible from him. The entire Jewish delegation in the House, headed by Deputy Meyer Ebner, rushed to the defense of Deputy Weissman, forming a cordon of protection around him.

The excitement engendered brought about the suspension of session by the president of the Chamber, Dr. Pop. A government consultation followed, as a result of which Professor Cuza was instructed to check his associates. Deputy Weissman continued his discourse when the session was resumed, and pointed to the patriotism evinced by the Jews during the World War.

Deputy Weissman was attacked on November 29th by Deputy George Cuza, a son of the notorious anti-Semitic leader, when he sought to disprove the blood-ritual murder libels against the Jews.

Deputy Weissman defined the political position of the Jewish minority in Roumania. He demanded reform of the citizenship laws and educational liberty in the universities.

The pro-government Jewish deputy, Aureliu Weiss, contended that the only means of destroying anti-Semitic hatred is through membership of Jews in the Roumanian parties.

Bernstein, Internationally Known Socialist Theoretician, Succumbs At The Age of 83

Marx. Herr Bernstein is credited with having influenced the international Socialist movement, with particular reference to Germany, more profoundly than any individual since Karl Marx. For twenty-three years Bernstein lived abroad, unable to return to Germany because of the rigid anti-Socialist laws of Bismark. From 1878 to 1890 he lived in Switzerland. In 1890 he was expelled from Switzerland and went to London where he remained until 1901 when he was permitted to return to Germany.

In a statement to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency on the occasion of his eightieth birthday, Herr Bernstein set forth his views on Jewry and Judaism as follows:

"When I left the Jewish Community, I did so in order to preserve Socialist Party discipline which at that time was recommending its members to leave their religious communities as a protest against the anti-Semitic race hatred which was then being preached by the notorious Dr. Stoecker, the Court Chaplain of the time, who was a founder of the German anti-Semitic movement.

"As a Jew who was a leader of the Socialist Party, and engaged in preaching to my Christian comrades that they should leave their churches, I had to be consistent and leave the Jewish community, although much to my regret and with a great deal of grief. Today I could in no circumstances leave the persecuted and oppressed Jewish Community.

I have always fought for Jewish rights and I am working now to assist in the upbuilding of a Jewish home in Palestine which, however, must not be a national State constituted on chauvinistic lines in any way injurious to the Arab population. I am fighting together with the Poale Zion for the realization of their ideals and I declare myself in every way to be a Jew in the positive sense of the word."

On his seventy-fifth birthday, Herr Bernstein described his early Jewish environment in an article written for the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

"My parents were both Jewish," he wrote, "but members of the Reform Community, observing Sunday as their day of rest and they were not bound by the Jewish dietary laws. I had a cousin, Aaron Bernstein, a great man whom I always regarded with immense awe and affection. He was a founder and for many years editor and chief leader and writer of the 'Berliner Volkszeitung'. He also wrote scientific works which won the admiration of scientists of the rank of Alexander von Humboldt. He was a practical scientist. In politics he was one of the leaders of the German Democratic movement and one of the first champions of the Jewish emancipation campaign in Germany.

Nazis Cause 200,000 Schilling Property Damage in Vienna in Anti-Jewish Boycott Drive

ish Nazi terrorization, which has caused considerable property damage and serious business losses.

At the same time Secretary of State for Security Fey threatened serious consequences to the Nazi Party if it persists in its terrorization tactics adopted to prevent Jews from benefiting from the Christmas trade.

The Socialist press however demands at this juncture an explanation for the fact that the government up until now has taken no action beyond searching homes of Nazis which invariably has proven fruitless.

Thirty-two Nazi youths arrested for distributing anti-Semitic boycott appeals will be submitted for trial, it was learned today. An investigation into the boycott agitation will include a probe into the role played by Nazi leaders in instigating this activity.

The Nazi press counters these steps with recrimination. It accuses the police department of being dominated by the Jewish spirit and of protecting the trade on Sundays of "Jewish parasites."

The Nazi organs also hail the results of the police searches in connection with yesterday's attacks, pointing out that although eighty writing desks and safes belonging to Nazis were broken into and searched, no incriminating evidence was found.

A reward of 15,000 schillings for the capture of Nazi hooligans, responsible for the damage to Jewish property, is offered by the Merchants Association.

this fashion to prevent future excesses against the Jews.

Serious rioting broke out in Aden on May 23rd after a rumor had been spread that Jews had defiled a mosque by throwing refuse into it. Many Jews were injured and a property damage estimated at 25,000 rupees was sustained by the Jews.

The Indian government on December 16th dismissed the claims of Jewish victims for compensation. The case may be brought before the court of the Privy Council in London for judgment.

NEGLECT OF CHARACTER-BUILDING AGENCIES WOULD BE CALAMITOUS, JEWISH WELFARE BOARD TOLD

Spokesmen at Annual Meeting Declare Such Agencies Must Now Enlarge To Meet Depression Problems

Neglect of, or inadequate support for character building institutions at this time would prove calamitous to the community as well as to the nation, declared speakers at the Annual Meeting of the National Council of the Jewish Welfare Board held on Sunday at the Manhattan Y.M.H.A. The depression, unemployment and idleness have placed heavy burdens on such organizations, they said, which must enlarge their programs affording moral and spiritual stimulation to thousands and thousands of men and women, and continuation of this type of service, it was pointed out, is just as important as is the provision of food for the hungry and shelter for the homeless. Reports submitted indicate, however, that the Jews in various cities, despite the present economic situation, are maintaining their Jewish centers and Y.M.H.A.'s.

Several hundred prominent Jewish men and women, leaders in Jewish Center and Y. M. & Y.W.H.A. activities in various parts of the land, were present at the Annual Meeting which marked the fifteenth birthday of the Jewish Welfare Board. Started as an agency to provide spiritual comfort among Jewish soldiers and sailors in the United States Army and Navy, it had expanded until today it not only continues its welfare work among Jews in the military and naval services, but carries on an extensive program of activity throughout the country, aiding institutions which are endeavoring to develop Jewish men and women into self-respecting members both of the Jewish as well as the American communities.

The importance of the work of the Jewish Center was emphasized in a letter from Newton D. Baker to Frank J. Rubenstein, Executive Secretary of the Y.M. & Y.W.H.A.'s of Baltimore, Md.

The convention was opened by an Invocation by Rabbi Henry M. Rosenthal of the 92nd Street Y.M.H.A., and was followed by an address of welcome to the delegates by Frank L. Weil, President of the local institution. Judge Irving Lehman, President of the Council, who presided, presented his annual message and addresses were delivered by Benjamin J. Bittenwieser, treasurer; Harry L. Glucksman, executive director and Col. Julius Ochs Adler, who read the report of the Army and Navy Committee for Dr. Cyrus Adler, its Chairman, who was prevented from attending the sessions.

Despite the present depression, Judge Lehman in his report announced that progress was made by the various Jewish Centers and Y.M.H.A.'s in the past year. In no case, he pointed out, was a building shut down or a professional executive relieved of his work. Five communities, he added, went ahead with

building campaigns successfully. The Jewish Welfare Board now has a membership of 259 constituent societies, he added. One hundred and seventy-two of these institutions own their own buildings, which have a value of \$27,000,000. The annual expenditures of the constituent societies, he pointed out, amount to \$3,500,000 and 137 professional executives are in charge of the work of these organizations. The societies, he said, have a paid membership totaling 200,000. The Jewish people, Judge Lehman emphasized, will always support work of Jewish community centers and kindred associations.

"It is the character of our people that has enabled us to survive the ordeals of the past and present," he said, "and which enables us to face a new and, as yet, mysterious, future bravely.

"The merger of various groups of Jews in efforts for the assumption of joint responsibility and for preserving Jewish ideals and spiritual traditions is one of our outstanding needs.

"Now we are in a new crisis, when we must fight again, not against men, but against forces and conditions. Again the need for the unification and mobilization of our forces is urgent."

The Army and Navy Committee reported that there are 3,500 men of the Jewish faith in the military and naval forces in the United States and in hospitals for disabled veterans. The latter group consists of approximately 1,250, including inmates of soldiers' homes, it was stated. In addition, the Committee looked after the religious and spiritual needs of 1,600 men who attended the Citizens' Military Training Camps during the summer of 1931 and 1,300 during the summer of the present year. The Committee announced that it was in direct contact with 160 posts and hospitals in continental America, the Canal Zone, China, Hawaii, the Philippine Islands and Haiti.

Announcement was also made of the election of Major Benjamin H. Namm and former Congressman Isaac Siegel to membership on the Army and Navy Committee of the Jewish Welfare Board.

Mr. Glucksman in his report as Executive Director, announced that through the aid of the Jewish Welfare Board every effort was made to keep Jewish center activity going without, in any way, diminishing the influences of the organizations towards their communities. In the past year, he stated, 35 membership and deficit fund campaigns were conducted in which over \$280,000 were raised, and in no case, he pointed out, were professional workers "laid off." One hundred and thirty-seven centers, he added, are manned by professional

\$59,000 Raised for Education Association; Governor-elect Lehman Stresses Cultural Needs

The sum of \$59,000 for the maintenance of the schools of the Jewish Education Association which is seeking a fund of \$100,000, was raised at the eleventh annual Chanukah dinner of the Association at the Hotel Biltmore on Sunday night.

Governor-elect Herbert H. Lehman was the guest of honor and principal speaker of the evening. He emphasized that character building agencies such as the Jewish Education Association are as important as those which minister to the physical needs of society.

Other speakers included James Marshall, Israel Unterberg, president of the Association; Mark Eisner, Borough President Samuel Levy, Mrs. Gabriel Hamburger, president of Ivryah, and Magistrate Jonah J. Goldstein. Bernard Semel, honorary secretary of the association, was the toastmaster.

Governor-elect Lehman declared in his address, which will be the last he will deliver at a public function for the next several months, owing to the pressure of public work, as follows:

"Your association stands for spiritual leadership and character building, and there has been no time within this generation when the need of spiritual leadership was so great. The material resources of the community are lessened by economic and industrial depression. The suffering that comes from widespread unemployment, exposure, hunger, worry, cold, and lack of shelter, taxes the resistance and strength of thousands of our citizens.

"We are striving, with all the forces at our command, for material and economic reconstruction, and we cannot

workers as compared with 135 two years ago.

"Up to now, there has been no unemployment problem," he said, "in so far as Jewish Center workers are concerned."

Mr. Glucksman reviewed the Jewish communal situation resulting from the depression in this country and declared that: "Regrettable as is the fact there are definite evidences that reduced support of constructive Jewish activities is rapidly reaching the point of endangering their existence. Although we have for generations been characterized as 'The People of the Book' and 'Lovers of the Ideal of Learning' the work of many synagogues and Jewish educational institutions is being seriously impaired. And the Jewish community centers are more recently facing the same trying situation.

He criticized Jewish Federations for cutting their education budgets.

The morning session concluded with

reports on activities of regional organizations. Six presidents of state Federations presented reports, and they included: Moritz M. Gottlieb, President, Pennsylvania Federation of Y.M. and Y.W.H.A.'s; Albert Rosenthal, President, New York State Federation of Y.M.H.A.'s, Y.W.H.A.'s and Community Centers; Max Kabatznick, President, Associated Y.M. and Y.W.H.A. of New England; Philip Dimond, President, New Jersey Federation of Y.M.H.A.'s and Y.W.H.A.'s; Edward Rosenblum, President, Middle Atlantic States Federation of Y.M.H.A.'s, Y.W.H.A.'s and Kindred Associations; M. Maldwin Fertig, President, Metropolitan League of Jewish Community Associations.

Mr. Fertig, who is counsel to Governor Franklin D. Roosevelt, deplored the fact that the public does not respond as freely to appeals of support for work of this type, as it does for hospitals, homes for the aged, and other philanthropic institutions. He pointed out that Jewish centers and Y.M.H.A.'s performed preventive work of an important character, and he announced that in his study of criminal cases, he was unable to find one individual who was convicted who had any contact with Jewish center or Y.M.H.A. work, or institutions of a similar nature.

The afternoon session was given over to discussion of the problem of the Jewish youth in America. It took the form of a symposium entitled "What of Our Youth—A Challenge to the Jewish Community," in which officers and representatives of six national organizations participated. Felix M. Warburg, dean of American Jewish philanthropists, introduced the subject, and others who spoke included: Ludwig Vogelstein, chairman of the Executive Board of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations; Louis J. Borinstein, chairman of the National Wider Scope Committee of the B'nai B'rith; Louis J. Moss, president of the United Synagogue of America; Mrs. Arthur Brin, president of the National Council of Jewish Women; Benjamin Koenigsberg, member of the Administrative Committee of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations in America; Bernard Semel, honorary secretary of the Jewish Education Association.

Mr. Warburg's address, which was read by Leon J. Obermayer, reviewed the important part played by social agencies catering to the youth in character building, especially in abnormal

times. He told of his own work many years ago when he, with others, organized efforts to develop "lads connected with the Hell's Kitchen gang and gas house toughs" into useful citizens of the city. He referred to the establishment of the first Children's Court and his appointment as one of the first probation officers in the city. Bespeaking the financial support for this type of communal service, he said:

"But who shall say that the need of character building and Jewish training and the strengthening of the moral fibre of our youth is less insistent than physical relief? If work of this character is a community responsibility in normal times, it is no less so in an emergency. In the community program it occupies an essential place, for in a unified program every need of the community must be considered."

Continuing, he said: "The distress resulting from the business depression has so deeply engaged our attention and efforts in behalf of the unemployed and their families, that the work of our established social and religious institutions is threatened for lack of adequate support. Yet the fact must be evident to every thoughtful person that because of the economic condition these institutions are now more needed than ever before. They are a bulwark against the disintegration of character and a force for sustaining the morale of our young people."

Mr. Vogelstein spoke on youth work of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, an organization dealing with the activities of Reformed Judaism. He said it was the oldest organization of its kind, and probably the largest in the world. Its purpose, he added, is the preservation and perpetuation of liberal Judaism in this country, and he reviewed the steps taken by his organization to inculcate an interest in Judaism among the growing Jewish generation.

A resolution calling on the President of the Jewish Welfare Board to convocate a conference of Jewish national organizations to consider the problems of adequate support for Jewish culture and communal institutions was adopted.

A resolution on the deaths of Mortimer L. Schiff and Edward S. Steinman, both of whom served the Jewish Welfare Board and the Jewish Center movement, for many years, was also adopted.

At the conclusion of the meeting the following officers were elected: Irving Lehman, President; Felix M. Warburg, Vice-President; Jacob M. Loeb, Vice-President; Jacob K. Newman, Vice-President; M. C. Sloss, Vice-President; Benjamin J. Buttenwieser, Treasurer; Joseph Rosenzweig, Secretary.

In literature he wrote poems and novels which achieved great popularity in their time. But his chief interest was in the Jewish Reform Community of which he was one of the founders. He was for many years its preacher and he and Dr. Stern were the authors of the Prayer Book adopted by the Community. He was a fluent Hebrew writer and Biblical exegetist and he exercised a tremendous influence upon the course of my life.

"I never forgot that I was a Jew," he declared.

For the greater part of his life, Herr Bernstein took no part in Jewish affairs. He was 74 years old when for the first time he took his stand on the platform of a Jewish meeting organized by the Committee for Promoting a Working Class Palestine. The building up of Palestine, he declared then, is a symbol of the progress of mankind and must be safeguarded against possible failure. Since then he gradually came very close to Jewish life and addressed many Jewish meetings.

afford to overlook the potent force and value of spiritual leadership and character building in combating discouragement, and in maintaining morale.

"And at this particular time courage and morale are sorely needed in our fight against conditions which must, and will be, overcome.

"Spiritual leadership certainly should include religious training and religious education. It must apply to adults and children alike. Many of those of us who have reached manhood or womanhood appreciate the importance of spiritual values, and wish to supplement our lives with these values.

"When the elemental call of bread for the body reaches our ears we are naturally tempted to lay all else aside, and regard all other things as superfluous.

"Nothing, of course, can be permitted to interfere with the care of the immediate and compelling needs of our fellows. But we cannot afford to neglect either the body or the spirit. We can not afford to feed the bodies of our children, and permit their souls to starve.

"True religion teaches justice, charity, tolerance, love and good citizenship. We are aiding good citizenship when we teach children to revere, respect, and love religion, regardless of the particular denomination or faith of which they are adherents. Character-building and character-preserving agencies are, at this time, substantially as important as those which minister to the physical needs of society."
