PRESIDENT OF WARSAW DISCIPLINARY COURT REPLACED FOR FAVORITISM TO ANTI-SEMITES: STUDENT PROTEST DEMONSTRATION IN NEAR RIOT

Dismissed Because Student Participants in Anti-Semitic Excesses Escaped With Reprimands Only, While Jews Who Were the Victims Were Disciplined; Throng of Three Thousand Students and Sympathizers Demonstrates in Protest; Mounted Police Drive Into Demonstration, Seeking to Prevent Presentation of Resolution to Polish Consulate; Resolution De-clares Polish Government Could Have Prevented Outbreaks If It Were Sincere; Set Precedent by Economic Discrimination

WARSAW, Dec. 22-The president of the University Court was recalled from office by the Senate of the University of Warsaw because of the partiality evinced by him to the students on trial for attacking the Iews during the recent anti-Semitic excesses, the Yiddish press reports today.

Professor Waszutinski, the presiding officer recalled, showed his favoritism to such an extent that Jewish students who suffered at the hands of anti-Semites were expelled as disciplinary measures, while their attackers escaped with minor reprimands.

The dean of the Evangelical College of the University of Warsaw, a clerical, Bursze, was appointed to replace Waszutinski.

Subsidy to Jewish Schools in Tangiers Debated in Cortes; Supported by Minister

Objections Raised to Subventioning Jewish Schools While Other Religious Schools Excluded

MADRID, Dec. 22-A heated debate developed in the Cortes last night in connection with the subvention to Jewish schools in Tangiers which the Minister of Education de los Rios included in his budget.

A priest Gomez Roji pointed out that since subsidies to religious schools are prohibited by constitution, no exception

could be made for Jewish schools.

The Minister of Education defended the subsidy asserting that it is neces-sary for political reasons. The subvention aims to stimulate the Sephardi Jewish schools because they preserve Spanish traditions among emigrants. He also stated that the Jewish School subsidy is smaller than that alloted for Spanish institutions in Jerusalem which are also religious in character but main-

A protest demonstration against the recent anti-Jewish excesses in Poland participated in by three thousand students of New York colleges yesterday afternoon ended in a near riot when mounted police sought to prevent the demonstrators from presenting a resolution of protest to the Polish Consulate in New York.

The melee occurred when mounted police drove into the crowd and sought to prevent their approach to the offices of the consulate. One of the marchers was arrested and a half dozen clubbed.

was arrested and a half dozen chubed.

The arrested man is James Strafino, a non-Jew, of 709 W. 176th street.

Participating in the demonstration were members of the Social Problems Clubs of City College, New York University, Columbia University, Hunter College, Long Island University, the National Student League, the Menorah Society and the Young Poale Zion Organization.

The demonstration began in perfect order at 1.30 P. M. in front of Hunter (Continued on Page 2)

Two Jews Injured, Arab Killed in Clash in Colony (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, Dec. 22-Two Jews were seriously injured and an Arab killed in the Pardess Hana colony near Hedera in a clash which ensued when Bedouins with their cattle invaded a field being ploughed by Jews.

The Jews, who were injured, sought to drive off the Bedouin trespassers.

Thereupon the Bedouins attempted to attack the colony. The police arrived in time to disperse the mob.

Charge Discrimination Against American Jewish Students

Jewish Organizations Protest: Rectors Condemn Action

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Dec. 22-Discrimination is being practiced at the University of Cologne to prevent American Jewish students who have been enrolled at the University from taking their places in the class rooms, the Jewish Telegra-phic Agency was informed yesterday by an authoritative Jewish source.

American Jewish students were permitted to enroll at the University for this semester's work since the rector of the institution has no legal author-ity to bar them. The University head, however, informed all professors and lecturers that all American Tewish students arriving to take their places in the class rooms were to be told that there was no room left. This order was carried out at the beginning of the college term. Cognizance of this state of affairs

was taken at a recent conference of German University Rectors held in Berlin which condemned the action of the Cologne University authorities.

Explains They Have Been Given Wide Powers of Discretion in Regard to Tourist Visas (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, Dec. 22-British consuls in Europe have been granted wide powers to use their discretion in granting tourist visas for admission to Palestine, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency was informed today by the Palestine High Commissioner, Sir Arthur Gren-

The explanation of the High Commissioner was offered in view of the general perturbation which has followed the tightening of immigration requirements for tourists desiring to enter Palestine from abroad.

On July 31st, the Palestine govern-ment published an immigration ordi-nance under which no person is permitted to enter Palestine without permission from the immigration depart-

Dr. Lion Feuchtwanger Criticized for Views on Palestine and Judaism

Jacob Fishman Scores Omission of References to National and Practical Aspects of Palestine Work

Jacob Fishman, managing editor of the "Jewish Morning Journal," takes issue with Dr. Lion Feutchwanger in his column on the latter's views on Palestine and Judaism, as expressed in an address delivered on Tuesday at a reception arranged by the American Friends of the Hebrew University.

Mr. Fishman refers to Dr. Feuchtwanger's statement that he envisions Jerusalem as the spiritual center of the world and objects to the latter's making the Hebrew University the centrifugal point of this center

Mr. Fishman also derided Dr. Feuchtwanger's view that the Iews have nothing in common except their mental-

Dr. Feuchtwanger's address was disappointing, writes Mr. Fishman. Feuchtwanger, he says, places all emphasis upon the Hebrew University and brushes aside all else in Palestine. "It is remarkable that this novelist of rich fantasy sees nothing or pretends to see nothing of the great epoch, of the great drama now being created in Palestine, known as the rebuilding of 'Alt-Neue-land."

College, 68th street and Lexington avenue. The expectation was that everything would proceed in orderly fashion. A resolution was read, which, it was announced, would be presented to the Polish Consulate. After voicing protest against the anti-Semitic rioting which norah and the National Student League. has been recurrent in Polish University ties for a long time, the resolution declared it was the sence of American Jewish students that the Polish government, if sincere in its desire, coud prevent the outbreaks. Following the reading of the resolution, the students, joined by sympathizers, formed in the line of march, beginning at 67th street and Lexington avenue, circling Park avenue and proceeding to 66th street and Third avenue around the block on which the offices of the Polish Consulate are situated.

The police permitted the procession to proceed until it reached 67th street and Third avenue, as the demonstration was within three-quarters of a block from the Polish Consulate. At this point, a cordon of mounted police formed and opposed the turn of the marchers.

Police asserted that the marchers had no permission to pass the Consulate Later, Captain Day of the 67th Street police station, told newspapermen that the marchers had obtained a permit to pass the consulate, but that it was later rescinded by Police Commissioner Mul-

The mounted police were joined by thirty policemen on foot, while scores of detectives mixed with the throng. Undismayed by the police, the march-

ers pushed forward into 67th street. where the police drove into them. The crowd countered with a chorus of boos which continued as one line of the marchers after another attempted to break through

Making no headway against the drive of the police, the marchers scattered into cliques and dispersed. Dr. Arthur Kraus, an instructor in the philosophy department of City College, the hunger striker, who organized the demonstration, was in the procession and declared that the demonstration against pogroms had ended in a pogrom on American

Mr. Solow declared that the problem of anti-Semitism has become universal. "Tewish blood is flowing in Poland now. Only yesterday pogroms occurred in Roumania. Today on the streets of Berlin, Fascists agitate against the Jews. In America this anti-Semitism takes a milder form, but if the economic depression continues to make hopeless the young professional graduating from college, there may be attempts to translate this milder form into a more severe

form of Jew baiting."

Jacob Katzman declared that had the Polish government made a hone fide attempt to suppress the anti-Jewish outbreaks, it could have done so, since "it had no difficulty in suppressing the outbreaks of Ukrainian peasants, nor does it seem to have any difficulty in sunpressing the sporadic attempts of workers to secure better conditions."

Mr. Shapiro scoffed at the reports that the Polish government is taking disciplinary measures against the student rioters. He pointed out that at the Polytechnic Institute in Warsaw, a Jewish student who acted in self-defense was the one most severely punished.

After the demonstration had dis-persed, Zygfried Englich, acting Polish Consul General, received a delegation of newspapermen. He informed the press that Dr. Arthur Kraus had on several occasions received the aid, financial and otherwise, of the Polish Consulate.

He denied that any written request for a hearing had been received from the students, declaring that an appointment would have been made, had such

a request been received.

Asked concerning the reports that the Polish authorities had made no genuine effort to prevent the anti-Jewish outbreaks, the Consul stated that it was extremely difficult for the Polish government to do anything in matters of this nature since the Polish universities where the outbreaks originated enjoy autonomy. The Polish government did act, notwithstanding, and prevented a recurrence of the outbreaks, he asserted.

Palestine Government Scored For Failing to Complete Jewish Agricultural School

Colonial Secretary Says School, Made Possible by Kadoorie Bequest, Will Be Opened in September of 1933

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, December 22-The Palestine government is guilty of a grave injustice to the Jews, declared Barnett Janner in the House of Commons today, owing to its failure to complete the Jewish agricultural school for which funds were made available eight years ago in the will of the late Sir E. Kadoorie of Shanghai, while an Arab agricultural school was established some time ago under the terms of the same bequest.

Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, Minister of State for the Colonies, explained that the delay is due to the difficulties ex-perienced in finding a suitable site for the school and an adequate water supply. The school is partially completed and will open in September of 1933, the Colonial Secretary stated.

Some controversy has existed around the Kadoorie bequest. The terms of the will, which entrusted to the Palestine government a sum for the establishing of an agricultural training school, did not make it clear whether there were to be one or two such schools. The government therefore decided to establish two schools, one for Arabs and one for Jews.

The Arab Agricultural School has been functioning since January of 1931. It is maintained by the funds of the Kadoorie bequest and is under the supervision of the Palestine govern-

Jewish Scout Committee Merges With National Council

Announcement is made by Dr. Cyrus Adler, the Chairman, that the Tewish Committee on Scouting has been merged with the National Council, Boy Scouts of America, and now becomes an advisory Jewish committee of the National Scout Council.

"The step was taken," Dr. Adler said, "for the coordination of all the forces engaged in the larger program of the Jewish Committee which consists mainly of promoting Scouting among the American youth." The activities of the Jewish Committee which consist mainly of promoting scouting among Jewish people in their com-munal organizations in the United States are being continued under the auspices of the Committee on Relationships of the Boy Scout National Council. Similar coordination of work among the Protestant and Catholic groups is being arranged for through the Boy Scout Committee on Relationships so that all of this work will be directed from the headquarters of the Boy Scouts of America.

The Jewish Committee on Scouting

was organized four years ago largely at the instance of the late Mortimer L. Schiff, a charter member of the National Executive Board of the Boy Scouts of America, and at the time of his demise a year and a half ago, the President of the Boy Scouts of

Philip W. Russ, who was the executive director of the Jewish Committee on Scouting, has become Assistant Director of Relationships of the Boy Scouts of America and will continue in the service of promoting Scouting among Jewish boys and with the various co-operating Jewish organizations.
