## NAZI INCITEMENTS INTENSIFIED AS ELECTION DAY APPROACHES; PAGES OF CARICATURES; CONSTERNATION OF JEWISH LEADERS

Nazi Election Slogans Call on Germans to Give the "Jewish System Notice to Quit on March 5th"; "Jews Swindling Our Nation"; Progressive Dismissal of Jewish Officials; Two Jewish Women Officials Eliminated After Nazi Persecution

BERLIN, Feb. 20—With the approach of the German general election, fixed for March 5th, the fulminations and incitements are daily assuming an even more violent character than hitherto. Even the fact that Nazi papers like the "Angriff" and the "Voelkischer Beobachter" are now regarded as semi-official in character, does not deter them from engaging in agitation of the most irresponsible and dangerous sort.

Thus, the "Angriff" has published two pages of caricatures in connection with the election, accompanying them with captions such as "Jewish vampires" and "Jewish economics". One caption proclaims in heavy type, "The Jews are swindling our nation" and goes on to quote from one of Hitler's statements: "Jews always were parasites!"

Further captions aimed at identifying anti-Semitism with the Nazi struggle against the Communists are devoted to expressions such as "Communism is a Jewish creation for enslaving the German people through Jewish high finance!" There are also a number of cartoons of a general character in furtherance of the widespread campaign opened in connection with the election,

slogans such as "Cleanse the German Homeland of the Jews", "The New German History as seen by the light of Jewish fraud!", "A thousand years ago there were no Jews in Germany—Germany's glorious period, but since then the Jews have completed the ruin of Germany," "Only Nazism can save you"; and "Give the Jewish system notice to quit on March 5th".

Apart from the widespread incitements by means of the printed word, the numerous anti-Semitic declarations

## Christian Youth Arrested For Grotkowski's Murder

WARSAW, Feb. 20—A sensational revelation was made today by the Yiddish paper, "Moment," to the effect that Jan Grotkowski, the Polish student, whose death marked the opening of the recent Lemberg excesses, was murdered by a Christian student. The announcement also disclosed that the four Jews who had been arrested and imprisoned for months had been released only because a Christian youth had been arrested for the murder. The "Moment" reveals that the name of the arrested youth was being kept secret by the investigating authorities in order to enable them to complete their investigations.

It was on the night of last November 26-27 that six Christian Polish students were involved in a drunken brawl in which one of them, Jan Grotkowski, received a wound from which he died. This incident was followed by serious anti-Jewish excesses in Lemberg as well as in other parts of Poland where the arrest of a number of Jews on the charge of complicity in the death of Grotkowski was used by the anti-Semites as material for pogromist agitation. According to an interpellation submitted by the Club of Jewish Deputies, there were no less than 399 casualties in Lemberg alone, following Grotkowski's death.

## Palestine Labor Convention Demands Immigration Be Entrusted to Jewish Agency

Resolution on Popularization of Palestine Products; Protests Against Zionist Persecutions in Russia

JERUSALEM, Feb. 20—A demand for the abolition of all immigration restrictions was made in a resolution adopted at today's closing session of the Histadruth Convention. The Convention, which lasted for more than a week, has attracted wide interest throughout the country.

The resolution requests that the supervision of Jewish immigration should be entrusted to the Jewish Agency. It further instructs the Executive of the Histadruth to develop an intensive political campaign in that direction.

While protesting against what it describes as a limitation of Chaltuz immigration, a further resolution urges that steps should, nevertheless, be taken abroad to organize and train laborers who should be fully qualified for work in Palestine.

Among other resolutions, the Convention also decided to develop a campaign for the popularization of Palestine products abroad as well as in Palestine. Of special interest was a resolution declaring determination to oppose Jewish employers who do not employ Jewish labor in the orange-groves. The Convention uttered a strong protest against the Zionist persecutions by the Soviet authorities.

By 164 votes against the 32 of the more radical left-wing Poale-Zion and Hashomer Hazzair, the Convention expressed its confidence in the Zionist Executive and approved its policy of concluding collective agreements with the employers.

## Swastika Not Christian Emblem Declares Ex-Minister of Justice

BERLIN, Feb. 20—According to Dr. Wolfgang Heiner, an ex-Minister of Justice, who spoke at the Congress for Free Speech held yesterday, the Swastika, which is the Nazi emblem, is not a Christian emblem. The speaker demonstrated that the Swastika had been found on Jewish tomb-stones dating from pre-Christian times.

After a few hours, the Congress was dissolved by the police without any reason being given.

## Jewish Shops Are Attacked in Roumanian Labor Disturbances

BUCHAREST, Feb. 20—Simultaneously with the present labor disturbances raging here, the police were compelled to concentrate on the centre of the city in order to protect the public buildings when the demonstrators made an attack on the Northern Railway district. This gave an opportunity to a horde of hooligans who broke the windows and looted goods from Jewish shops. Considerable damage was done, in particular, to the shops of Davie Leibovitch, Leon Gutman, David Baltar and Avram Felcian.

It is not clear whether the attack was prompted by anti-Semitism or was merely hooliganism consequent on the present general unrest.

### Organization of Community Urged at Convention Of Jewish Council

#### Plight of Educational and Other Institutions Discussed; Delegates from 348 Organizations Attend

The Annual Convention of the Jewish Council of Greater New York, held Sunday morning and afternoon in the Hotel Imperial, was attended by delegates from three hundred and forty-eight organizations, including the heads of a number of central bodies, fraternal orders, and local educational and charitable institutions. The Council aims to maintain a central coordinating agency for Jewish communal activities of New York, and a number of speakers stressed the need of enlarging and strengthening this body.

The morning session of the Convention was opened by M. Mortimer Lancet, Chairman of the Convention Committee, and addresses on the purposes and aims of the Council were delivered by Herman G. Robbins, Acting President; Bernard G. Richards, Chairman of the Executive Committee; Judge Hyman J. Reit, Harold L. Budner, Nathan Padgug, and others.

The report of the Secretary, Jacob L. Warkow, described the services rendered by the Council to the membership of affiliated organizations in the direction of giving them advice and assistance sought from philanthropic societies, city departments, and other public and private agencies. The Council had given its assistance toward the establishment of the Jewish Information Bureau, under the direction of Bernard G. Richards.

The Council has also made studies of local conditions affecting the Jews of New York which will furnish the basis for future action.

Rabbi Lazar Schoenfeld gave an account of the attempt which was being

### Scheme to Raise \$20,000,000 For Palestine Land Purchase

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

**JERUSALEM, Feb. 20**—A gigantic plan for the accumulation of twenty million pounds of Jewish capital for land purchase in Palestine, was proposed by M. Ussishkin, head of the Jewish National Fund, in a speech delivered at a press conference here.

"The recent tumult raised abroad about Palestine prosperity" said Mr. Ussishkin, "was harmful and only served to mislead World Jewry. Of the 323,000 dunams which the Jewish National Fund possesses, we obtained only 40,000 during the last three years which is a lower rate of progress than in any previous period."

He went on to say that "private orange groves do not mean national prosperity."

Mr. Ussishkin presented figures showing that at least twenty million pounds were deposited throughout the world in different banks as Jewish endowment funds. He calculated that if these sums would be deposited with the Jewish National Fund, the Jewish National Fund would pay to the institutions concerned, the same interest as they were receiving elsewhere. At the same time, these vast sums could be utilized for buying land in Palestine, an investment, which was today safer than any bank. In that way none would suffer loss, while gigantic land areas could be acquired for the Jewish people.

### Festival of Purim to Be Observed by Jewish Centers

Purim, the Feast of Lots, celebrated as a merry-making holiday, will be observed by Jewish Centers, Y.M.H.A.'s and Y.W.H.A.'s on Saturday evening, March 11th, and Sunday, March 12th. A guide to the observance of Purim on the part of Jewish Centers has been prepared by the National Jewish Welfare Board, parent organization of Jewish Centers.

### Examination of 2 Arabs Arrested In Jacoby Bombing Opens Feb. 28

**JERUSALEM, Feb. 20**—The public examination of the two Arabs arrested on suspicion of being implicated in the bombing which led to the death of the Jewish colonist, Jacoby and his son on December 22nd, will open on February 28th. The police department believes that it is in possession of conclusive evidence. It is understood that twenty-seven witnesses will be interrogated at the investigation.

J. Jacoby and his nine-year old son, were the victims of a bomb-outrage at Nahalal on December 22nd when a bomb thrown by an unknown person exploded in their home. Subsequently a number of Arabs were arrested in Haifa and it was reported that the police had discovered in their possession parts of bombs similar to that thrown into the Jacoby home. The two Arabs at present under arrest, were also arrested on that occasion.

### Dinner Honoring Straus To Open Palestine Drive

A dinner honoring Nathan Straus, Jr., for his services to Palestine will be utilized to open the American Palestine Campaign of the Jewish Agency in New York City on March 29th, according to an announcement issued by the Jewish Agency for Palestine, the body administering Jewish reconstruction activities in Palestine.

The committee sponsoring the dinner, to which invitations are today being issued, comprises Dr. Cyrus Adler, Governor Herbert H. Lehman, Louis Lipsky, Judge Julian W. Mack, James Marshall, Morris Rothenberg, Felix M. Warburg and Dr. Stephen S. Wise.

The dinner to Mr. Straus will be a city-wide function, with hundreds of delegates from each section expected. In previous years of fund-raising for Palestine, emphasis has been placed upon individual functions in the various boroughs. But in order that every element and group of New York Jewry may participate in the testimonial to Mr. Straus, who is Chairman of the American Palestine Campaign of Greater New York, the efforts of all Palestine workers will be concentrated on this single function, through which the great bulk of New York's quota for Palestine is expected to be raised.

### British Firms Get \$160,000 Contract for Petrol Tanks

**HAIFA**—A contract in the amount of \$160,000 for the construction of petrol storage tanks at Haifa has been obtained from the Iraq Petroleum Company by two British engineering firms.

Eight thousand tons of steel will be needed for the construction of the tanks to be used by the Iraq company.

## Jewish Agency Committee For Reorganizing Agency Fails to Produce Plan

**Committee to Meet Again in Summer;  
Appeals to Public Opinion to Take  
Interest in Problem**

BERLIN, Feb. 20.—The Organization Committee appointed by the Jewish Agency Administrative Committee at its session in London last August, has met here and after deliberating for two days has issued a communique which indicates that no definite decisions have yet been reached.

The Committee which met under the chairmanship of Berl Locker, head of the Organization Department of the Zionist Executive, had under consideration various schemes that had in view the possibility of broadening the non-Zionist representation on the Agency and of imparting to it a wider democratic character, by creating an electorate which would also include, as voters, Keren Hayesod contributors throughout the world.

Although the question of democratization was one of the main problems before the meeting of the Organization Committee, the communique does not disclose whether any progress has been made by the Committee in this particular direction. The statement issued by the Committee at the conclusion of their deliberations also invites Jewish public opinion to interest itself in the question of the reorganization of the Jewish Agency, so that the forthcoming summer session of the Jewish Agency which is further to consider the problem may be assisted in framing a definite plan.

The question of the reorganization of the Jewish Agency was the subject of considerable discussion at the last meeting of the Zionist Actions Committee held in London last August. It was following adoption of a resolution by the Actions Committee, calling for the appointment of a committee to discuss reorganization that the Administrative Committee, composed of non-Zionists as well as Zionists, sanctioned the appointment of the Organization Committee which has just met in Berlin.

## Almost 100% Jewish Children In School System in Ukraine

MOSCOW.—Almost fully 100 per cent. of the Jewish children in the Ukraine, White Russia and Crimea come into the scope of the school system, says the latest report of the Jewish School Section of the Ministry of Education.

There are in Soviet Russia at present, it states, more than 1,200 Jewish elementary schools, 59 technical schools, 10 Jewish sections in State pedagogic and scientific institutions, museums and archives, and over 600 Jewish clubs and reading rooms.

**1933 Plans for Bureya Under Way;  
Lack of Housing and Shortage  
of Food**

MOSCOW.—The 1933 transmigration movement to Bureya is now under way, and according to a report from Chabarovsk, the centre from which the Bureya work is being conducted, 1,500 transmigrants are to be absorbed during the first quarter of this year, including 445 workers in various trades, who will be distributed in the collective farms, industrial collectives and other enterprises, according to plans already made.

In spite of repeated admonitions, the Chabarovsk statement complains, there are among the new transmigrants who have arrived during January some who are not fit for work, old people, large families in which there are many young children, and workers in trades which are not required, like tailors, and furriers.

The leaders of the Bureya settlement work insist that the local recruiting commissions must exercise more care because these people break down the entire settlement plan.

The main task of the Jewish migration work in the Soviet Union this year is to enable the Government to organize a Jewish national territorial unit in Bureya by the end of this year, to organize and consolidate the Jewish collective farms in the Crimea, and in the Jewish national regions of the Ukraine, says a statement issued by the Comzet and Ozet headquarters in Moscow.

The recruiting of transmigrants, it says, must be absolutely voluntary. There must be no compulsory measures and no administrative or social pressure in order to prevail on people to emigrate.

In recruiting transmigrants for Bureya, it must be remembered, it says further, that in addition to transmigrants for the Soviet and collective farms, who are to number about 2,400 families, and are to be recruited mainly among the declassed and unskilled workers, Bureya also requires a large number of skilled workers in various trades, and artisans who should number about 3,600 families.

A large proportion of these transmigrants will go out with contracts with economic organizations in Bureya concluded by special representatives of these organizations, who will come into the recruiting places and work in conjunction with the Comzet and Ozet.

The Ministry of Labor has also ordered its local departments to take an active part in the recruiting of transmigrants for the economic, industrial and artisan enterprises in Bureya.

Transmigrants for the Crimea and for the Jewish national regions of the Ukraine, the instructions say, are to be

## America's Contribution Toward Palestine Upbuilding Extolled At Washington Forest Banquet

**Zionists to Reforest Area Between  
Haifa and Nazareth as "Living  
Memorial" to George Washington**

The role of America as setting, since the days of George Washington an example to the world in the application of the principles of civic freedom and religious liberty was extolled, and the contribution of Americans toward the upbuilding of Palestine as a Jewish National Home was described as of a decisive character in addresses delivered last night at the George Washington Palestine Forest Banquet held at the Astor Hotel in the presence of more than 600 persons.

Nelson Ruttenberg, Police Trial Commissioner and President of the Jewish National Fund of America, acted as toastmaster at the dinner, which was given for furthering the project launched by the Fund to commemorate the bicentennial anniversary of George Washington.

Mr. Ruttenberg announced that he received word from the Jerusalem headquarters of the Jewish National Fund, which is the Zionist agency for the reclamation and reforestation of land in Palestine as national Jewish property, that the site for the planting of the Washington Forest has been definitely chosen. The Washington trees, as a "living monument" to the first President of the United States, will be planted on an area of 8,000 dunams between Haifa and Nazareth, on land owned by the Fund along the Haifa-Nazareth road.

Mr. Ruttenberg also made public the text of a message he received from President-elect Roosevelt, who, when informed that a tree had been planted in his name, wrote: "Some day I want to see that tree in person—I have never yet been to Palestine and hope to go."

The speakers, among whom were George Gordon Battle, Grover Whalen, Chairman of the New York City Bicentennial Commission; Dr. Israel Goldstein, Rabbi of Congregation Bnai Jeshurun; Robert Szold, former President of the Zionist Organization of America; Isaac Allen, President of the Order Sons of Zion; Leo Wolfson, Chairman of the J.N.F. Council of Greater New York; Miss Edith Elkind, a Member of the National Board of Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America; Ephraim Caplan, Jewish writer and Zionist leader, and Rev. Z. H. Masliansky, urged universal support for the project.

A number of contributions for tree planting, including one of \$750 by the Shomrim Society of the New York City Police Department, and one of \$250 by Dr. Frank Levander, were announced.

by Nazi leaders whose authority has been increased since Hitler's assumption of the chancellorship, are adding to the difficulties of the Jewish population. An average example is the statement of the Saxon Nazi leader Mutschmann who, in issuing instructions to Nazi functionaries, declared that all the recent governments were only sham governments, of which the Jews, in reality, had pulled the strings. He concluded with the cry, "We shall smash Jewry with its disruptive influence!"

It is no exaggeration to say that the Jewish leaders are in a state of consternation, as it is clear that the Emergency Order which prohibits incitement against religious bodies is not being applied where Jews are concerned.

### Chief Police Aliens Officer, Friendly to Jews, Dismissed

BERLIN, Feb. 20—The elimination of the Jewish officials from the public services is proceeding apace. The latest victims are two Jewish women who, for many years, occupied high posts in Government departments. They are Government Councillor Kaethe Rosenheim and Police Councillor Martha Mosse. It is significant that both these women had for long been subjected to most virulent persecution in the Nazi press.

It is evident also that the campaign is being directed not only against Jews alone, but that attention is also being paid to non-Jews suspected of any degree of friendliness towards Jews. A victim in this connection, is Goehrke, chief police Aliens Officer who has been dismissed by Police President Levitzow, his office being sealed by one of his Nazi opponents. Commenting on Goehrke's dismissal, as Goehrke was regarded as a protector of East European Jews, the "Voelkischer Beobachter," the Nazi organ, announces that the State Attorney has ordered an investigation into the naturalizations of East European Jews during the last ten years. The paper adds that Goehrke was an honored guest at the gathering of the Federation of East-European Jews.

Hand in hand with the dismissal of Jewish and friendly officials, goes the appointment of Nazi nominees. The most recent is Dr. Conti, notorious as leader of the Nazi fraction of the German Medical Association who had made incessant efforts to inject anti-Semitism into the affairs of the Association. Dr. Conti has now been given a post in the Ministry of Interior. In a statement given by him to the "Deutsche Beobachter," after his appointment, he said that it would be his duty to carry into effect a program of race hygiene and to watch the naturalizations.

recruited among the impoverished Jewish masses, and among the less skilled artisans who do not belong to cooperatives. No workers are to be sent there.

Artisans belonging to co-operatives and collective farmers may be sent there, if their co-operatives and collective farms consent.

The unsatisfactory selection of transmigrants last year, the statement points out, resulted in a tremendous re-emigration movement. A large proportion of the transmigrants were sent back even before they arrived in the settlement areas, as soon as they came to Moscow.

The Comzet and the Ozet demand therefore that only sound people, able and willing to work and to face the difficulties that they will encounter at first should be sent out.

There is a shortage of housing in Bureya, and difficulties in providing food for the first two quarters of this year, the statement says, and the Comzet therefore recommends that till May only small families should be sent out, consisting of people who have no young children as encumbrances.

Every transmigrant family must pass a medical examination, to establish that they are able to work, and are not subject to infectious diseases.

People suffering from infectious diseases, who are physically weak, mentally deficient, or who used to be big traders, manufacturers, speculators, or clergy of any kind, must under no conditions be sent out to Bureya. The same applies to demoralized elements, such as professional mendicants, thieves, hooligans, etc.

Every family must have at least one member able to work, and in the case of large families two or three.

The recruits, before they are sent out, must be told of all the difficulties that they will encounter in Bureya in the early period. No promises are to be made to them which cannot be fulfilled. They must not be promised any big successes. No great hopes are to be held out to them.

The transmigrants to Bureya are to be warned in addition that if there is no work for them in Bureya in their own trades, they may be sent to different work, unless they have a special contract with an authorized economic organization.

Judge Isadore M. Golden was re-elected president of the Zionist District of San Francisco at the annual meeting. Leo J. Rabinowitz and Dr. Henry Harris were re-elected honorary presidents.

Other officers re-elected were: Mrs. I. D. Rifkin, recording secretary; Miss I. Meyerson, corresponding secretary, and Fred Adelson, treasurer.

general discussion of the Secretary's report, as well as the general problem of the better organization of the Jewish community. Mr. Richards then appointed three committees with Chairmen as follows: Resolutions—Judge Hyman J. Reit, Nominations—Morris Margulies, and Credentials—Maurice J. Weiss.

Dr. Soltes who spoke on the plight of educational institutions made a plea for the continued support of our educational and cultural activities, without which the Jewish spiritual heritage could not be preserved. Rabbi Joseph Gabriel, speaking in the name of the Federation of New York Talmud Torahs, made a similar plea for the recognition of the urgent needs of the Hebrew Schools of the City, some of which had to close their doors on account of lack of support. Congressman Samuel Dickstein discussed certain aspects of the immigration question. He said that the Jews would survive Hitlerism just as they had previously survived similar forms of bigotry. He paid eloquent tribute to President-elect Roosevelt, as a lover of mankind and friend of the Jewish people, whose advent into office will restore faith and hope all around. No such ideas, he said, as alien registration, would be countenanced during the administration of the President-elect. A series of resolutions presented by Judge Reit in behalf of the Committee on Resolutions and adopted by the Council, dealt with the enlargement of the purposes of the Council, the Jewish Congress, the proposed World Congress, the American Palestine Campaign, the question of Kashruth, discrimination, support for educational institutions, and the budget of the Council, etc. A notable feature of the Convention was the presence of a number of young people from various social and mutual aid societies. The following officers were elected:

Chairman, Bernard G. Richards; Vice-Chairmen, Isadore Apfel, Charles A. Cowen, Bernard S. Deutsch, Jacob Fishman, Abraham Goldberg, Dr. Samuel Margoshes, Rev. Hirsch Masliansky, George Z.
