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CENTRAL UNION WILL NOT ABANDON STRUGGLE FOR EQUAL RIGHTS OF JEWS, SPOKESMEN ASSERT

Will Not Accept Status as Minority Group, as Counseled by Non-Jewish and Some Jewish Circles; Nazi Organ Threatens Reprisals Against Feuchtwanger; Einstein Attacked; Jew Shot Dead in Berlin; Jewish Deputy Attacked at Home by Uniformed Nazis

BERLIN, Feb. 27—Two impressive meetings were held here yesterday under the auspices of the Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith where speakers warned that the Nazi government plans to deprive the Jews of their rights, once it has established itself in power.

This warning was uttered by Dr. Bruno Weil and Rabbi Meer Hildeheimer.

Both declared themselves against the advice which is being received from non-Jewish quarters and from some Jewish groups as well, to abandon the struggle for equal rights and to accept status as a minority group.

The Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith, they declared, is determined to maintain a fast hold on the emancipation of the Jews and never voluntarily return to the ghetto.

BERLIN, Feb. 27—The home of Deputy Kurt Loewenstein was attacked last night.

A number of persons entered the house, locked Herr Loewenstein into his bedroom and then proceeded to break windows, furnishings and demolish the study.

Loewenstein managed to summon the police, who arrested one person.

Herr Loewenstein is the well known protagonist of school reform in the Berlin municipality.

The "Vorwaerts" in reporting the attack upon Kurt Loewenstein, a member of the Reichstag, asserts that he was attacked by uniformed Nazis, who planned to murder him.

Ten shots were fired into the bedroom where he was barricaded, the paper asserts.

A Jewish merchant, Guentter Falkenstein, was shot dead this evening in Grolmannstrasse. The murderers fled after their escape.

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Arabs to Refuse to Pay Taxes; Will Boycott British Goods as Part of Non-Cooperation Policy

High Commissioner Receives Letters
of Protest from Arab Bodies; Warn
of Recurrence of 1929 Riots

JERUSALEM, Feb. 27—The policy of Arab non-co-operation announced on Saturday by the Arab Executive following a conference, will take the form of refusal to pay government taxes and a boycott of British goods, it was announced yesterday by the Arab press.

The Arab press emphasizes that the present move on the part of the Arabs will mark a serious turning point in attitude toward Great Britain.

It is believed that the sudden aggressiveness displayed by the Arabs is inspired by the so-called National League of Great Britain in London which is pro-Arab in its sympathies.

The Palestine High Commissioner, Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchope, is receiving telegrams from various Arab organizations protesting against his statement given to an Arab delegation that the Palestine government finds it impossible to stop Jewish immigration to Palestine and land sales to Jews.

Arab leaders also warn the High Commissioner that his attitude may precipitate a recurrence of the anti-Jewish riots of 1929.

The Arab Executive, it is learned, plans to put a ban on Arabs who sell their land to the Jews and to bar them and their families from burial in Moslem cemeteries.

To Hold Last Rites Today for Mrs. Jacob H. Schiff; Widow of Philanthropist Dies at Age of 78

Joined Husband in His Last Philanthropies; Lived Retired Life After His Death

The last rites will be held this morning at 10 o'clock for Mrs. Therese Schiff, widow of Jacob H. Schiff, the philanthropist, and a distinguished benefactress in her own right.

Mrs. Schiff, who survived her husband by thirteen years, succumbed early Sunday morning to cerebral thrombosis, after an illness of ten days. She was seventy-eight years old. At her bedside when the end came were her daughter, Mrs. Felix M. Warburg and seven grandchildren, Frederick M., Gerald F., Paul Felix and Edward M. Warburg; John M. Schiff, Mrs. Walter N. Rothschild and Mrs. George Baker.

The services this morning will be private and will be attended by relatives and close friends. The services, which will take place from her city home, will be conducted by Dr. Samuel Schulman, rabbi of Temple Emanu-el. Interment will take place in Salem Fields Cemetery, where the body of Mr. Schiff is interred.

Since the death of her husband on September 25, 1920, Mrs. Schiff had led a retired life, devoting herself to philanthropic work. During her husband's lifetime she joined with him in the million dollar gifts to charities, hospitals, seminaries, East Side settlements, religious organizations, libraries, the Red Cross and such undertakings as the revision of the Jewish Bible and the establishment of the Jewish Institute of Technology at Haifa, Palestine. Subsequently she continued her benefactions, avoiding the limelight.

In 1921, she gave the sum of \$300,000 to the Henry Street Settlement for the establishment of a visiting nurses' administration building in memory of her husband. This was her largest single

Last May, she gave to the Boy Scouts of America the sum of \$250,000 to establish a permanent reservation and training school, as a memorial to her only son, Mortimer Schiff, who died in 1931 and who, at the time of his death, was the president of the Boy Scouts of America.

She was active in the work of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies, to whose last campaign she contributed \$32,000; the Emanu-el Sisterhood of Personal Service, the Loeb Convalescent Home and the Montefiore Hospital for Chronic Diseases. She was joint donor with her son and son-in-law, Felix M. Warburg, of a gift of \$150,000 to the building fund of the Montefiore Hospital in 1929. She was interested in the Young Men's Hebrew Association and contributed \$30,000 to the building fund of that institution in 1927. One of the beneficiaries of her philanthropy, too, was the New York Section of the Council of Jewish Women, of which she was honorary president, and to whom she gave \$15,000.

Mrs. Schiff also gave the sum of \$500,000, together with Mr. Warburg, to the Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati.

Cincinnati was the native home of Mrs. Schiff, who was born there on November 5, 1854, the daughter of Solomon Loeb, the founder of Kuhn, Loeb and Company.

Mrs. Schiff is survived by her daughter, Mrs. Felix M. Warburg, seven grand-children and nine great grand-children.

Resolutions mourning the passing of Mrs. Schiff were adopted by a number of organizations including the Conference Committee of the National Jewish Women's Organizations, of which Mrs. Maurice Steinfeld is chairman; and the New York Chapter of Hadassah, of which Mrs. David DeSola Pool is chairman.

The conference committee's resolution declared:

"Jewish women everywhere are sadly aware of their irrevocable loss in the passing of Mrs. Jacob H. Schiff. She served generously and sympathetically in giving of her material means and of her counsel. She carried on the traditions of her husband, who to this very day holds a rank of nobility in the grateful memory of Jewry.

"The position of Jewish womanhood was exalted throughout the long years of her life. She revealed to the world the power of the ideals of Judaism in serving not alone her people and her country, but also peoples in all portions of the globe. Her deeds will be the flames of an eternal lamp that shall

Three Faiths Protest Hitlerism Menace; Anti-Semitism of Nazis Condemned at Socialist Rally

A protest against the menace of Hitlerism in Germany to the status of the Jews and appeal to the sense of justice of the German people was uttered on Sunday morning at Carnegie Hall by representatives of the Catholic, Protestant and Jewish faiths, at a meeting convened under the auspices of the Executive Committee of the American Jewish Congress.

Addresses were delivered by Martin Conboy, prominent Catholic layman; Dr. S. Parkes Cadman, who is chairman of the Committee on Good Will Between Jews and Christians of the Federal Council of the Churches of Christ and a leading Protestant preacher; Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, honorary president of the American Jewish Congress and Bernard S. Deutsch, president of the Congress, who presided.

Mr. Conboy declared that it was the duty of all Americans to protest against any attempt on the part of Hitlerism to deprive German Jewry of their equal citizenship rights.

Dr. Cadman said that an injustice to the Jewish people is an injustice to the world.

"Hitlerism," he asserted, "must be defeated. It is a recrudescence of the pre-war madnesses, of diabolism and blood lust and hate. Let us never cease until it is defeated."

"It is an obligation that rests upon those who are so situated that they can do so to voice a protest when the lives, the well being and the fundamental rights of their kindred are endangered, said Mr. Conboy.

"No one can say of the Jews of the United States that they have never failed to discharge this obligation.

"Every American must honor them for it. We in this country differ about many things, but one instinct we have in common is a hatred of oppression. With that goes a corresponding sympathy for the weaker element who in any country feel the heavy hand of the tyrannous and strong.

"Happily, this meeting is not called for the purpose of denouncing a pog-

"There is ground for apprehension when a man is placed in office who wrote, as one of Herr Hitler's lieutenants did a few months ago, that the Nazis would not murder the Jews when his party came to power.

"The literature of politics, indeed all history, is replete with accounts of things that have been done after the opposite intention has been declared.

"Captain Goering, who took that pledge to do no murder, made it appear as a concession to what he called "a disruptive and poisonous element which had brought harm to the German people." Captain Goering is now Speaker of the Reichstag and Minister of the Interior for Prussia.

"One cannot blame the Jews of Germany, or their friends and kinsmen here, if they look upon the pledge as an inadequate guarantee of security when made by a man who now has the power to do irreparable damage if he should happen to change his mind.

"Pogroms and other forms of official murder apart, there is enough in declarations made by the Hitler Party to call for emphatic protest.

"There is not much to be said for the policy that would spare a man's life while taking from him all that makes living worth while.

"Make a man an alien in his own land, deprive him of equal civil and religious rights with his neighbors, shut him out of all opportunities to employ his abilities for his own, his family's or his country's benefit, and what special advantage is there in being spared even a violent death?

"There is not a people under heaven that has ever accepted that dispensation, not one that has tolerated its continuance beyond the hour when it could be ended.

"Even if one generation submits, the next one will go into rebellion, and the process will be repeated as long as the evil endures.

"The announced intention to reduce the Jews of Germany to a servile condition is what constitutes a real menace as we in America see it. That is quite enough, if the danger is real, regardless of any contingent vacillation as to the political expediency of murder.

"If there are two subjects on which the mind of this country has been definitely made up, religious liberty is one of them and civil equality is the other.

"If it be pleaded that the present matter is not our concern, it must be answered that our decisions were taken on the broadest grounds of human interest and welfare. We cannot be indifferent when a retrograde tendency manifests itself anywhere. Still less can we do so when a nation that has high claims to recognition as one of

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Z.O.A. to Launch Shekel Campaign; Conference to Discuss World Congress

A nation-wide shekel campaign, which is to provide the basis for a large electorate for the next World Zionist Congress to be held in Carlsbad, Czechoslovakia, in August, was decided upon at a meeting on Sunday of the Administrative Committee of the Zionist Organization of America, at which Morris Rothenberg, president, was the chairman.

The meeting, which was attended by members from New York and various other cities, also took action upon the procedure for the election of American delegates to the forthcoming World Congress. It was decided to call a larger conference within the next three weeks, at which details of participation, methods of election, and campaign procedure would be determined. The forthcoming conference will also serve to work out the program for the shekel campaign. The general opinion was expressed by members of the Administrative Committee that it is essential for Americans to have a large delegation at the Carlsbad Congress. This can be obtained through regular Zionist membership and through shekel-payments, which entitle all Jews to have a voice in the selection of American representatives to the international Zionist congress.

The meeting was opened by Mr. Rothenberg with a review of the current Zionist political situation, as it is reflected in London and Jerusalem. He then followed with a report of the recent conference of the Commission on Youth and Education, stating that the results thus far as to the distinguished personnel and their earnestness have proved gratifying and expressing the hope that the Commission would be able to present its first report to the next annual Zionist convention. Mr. Rothenberg's report was favorably acted upon by the Administrative Committee.

Morris Margulies, Secretary of the Zionist Organization, reported that an intensive effort to increase the membership of the Organization is being combined with various cultural efforts. Particular emphasis is being placed on renewing the enrollment of thousands of individuals who have, for various reasons, been lost to the Zionist movement during the past three years. It was pointed out that if America is to have an adequate voice at the forthcoming Congress, it will be necessary to have a maximum membership in 1933. Mr. Margulies reported that there have been more Zionist meetings held throughout the country than during many years previous.

During the discussion of the Congress election procedure, the view was expressed that there should be a united front, which would enable the Zionist Organization and the Hadassah to come to Carlsbad with a common program of American aims. Among those

Series of Persecutions Reported Of Zionists Reported In Bessarabia

BUCHAREST, Feb. 27—A series of anti-Zionist persecutions is reported in Bessarabia.

The suppression of the Zionists and the arrest of their leaders is believed to be a fulfillment of an intention announced by Premier Vaida Voevod in an interview which appeared in the Paris paper, "Le Journal."

The Roumanian government, Premier Vaida Voevod declared in the interview, "is determined to suppress excesses both from the Right and the Left and to tolerate neither anti-Semitic student demonstrations, Soviet agitation nor Zionist agitation among certain Jewish elements in Bessarabia.

The police of Botoschani, it is now reported, at one o'clock in the morning suddenly searched the home of the president of the local Zionist group. Walter Abeles, the Zionist president, was taken to the police station for examination. Abeles has never been suspected of Communist activities.

In Piatra Meantz, the police raided a Zionist youth meeting and arrested all those present. Some of the arrested were held for two days and released only after the intervention of the Jewish Party.

In Jassy, where martial law prevails, 18 members of the Brith Trumpeldor, Zionist Revisionist Youth organization, were arrested and held for two days, being released only because of the intervention of Jewish deputies. The 18 will, however, be tried by a military court.

"Der Angriff" bases its present attack upon Dr. Feuchtwanger on the address delivered by him in New York on February 8th at a tea in his honor given by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency. In his speech, Dr. Feuchtwanger ridiculed Chancellor Adolph Hitler, head of the Nazi party, as a writer, and referring to the latter's book "My Struggle," a volume of about 140,000 words, declared: "It contains, if one were to make a list of the offenses against German grammar and style about 140,000 mistakes."

Quoting the "New York Times" report of the Feuchtwanger address, "Der Angriff" says: "These fellows who abuse Germany will meet corresponding consequences upon their return to Germany."

In the same article the Nazi paper attacks the American correspondent of the German Socialist Press, a German Jewish journalist, Dr. Lipschuetz, for "publishing swinish libels and denunciations in the American press."

The treachery of the Jews, too, is blamed for the inquiry addressed to the French Foreign Minister by French Deputies concerning the military character of the Nazi Storm Troops.

BERLIN, Feb. 27.—The "Voelkischer Beobachter" yesterday published an attack upon Professor Albert Einstein, the distinguished scientist, impugning his scientific achievements on the ground that Professor Einstein allegedly once declared: "I am a race-Jew. I want to have nothing to do with Germans."

"Hundreds of scientists," says the paper, "are demolishing Einstein's teachings, but the gullible and superstitious masses continue to believe."

BERLIN, Feb. 27.—The Jews were accused of causing the cultural disruption of Germany in the course of an address broadcast yesterday by Herman Wilhelm Goering, the Nazi leader, who is Minister without Portfolio in the Federal German government and Minister of Interior of Prussia.

Minister Goering's statement is the first outspoken reference to the Jewish question by a member of Chancellor Hitler's cabinet.

In line with its attack of Saturday, "Der Angriff," Berlin Nazi organ, yesterday published a new tirade against the Jews.

The Nazi All German Information Service reports that the Jewish population has received instructions to buy only essentials and to provoke a business crisis, the paper asserts. In the next breath, the Nazi organ declares that the Jews have been instructed to

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the leaders amongst civilized peoples has been implicated by its choice of spokesmen."

"We are not met to offer counsel to Germany. We are not met to make protest against Germany, but as friends and well-wishers of Germany, we wish today to point out certain dangers to Germany, which inhere in the situation which has come to pass," said Dr. Wise.

"There is a twofold danger that faces Germany today,—the danger in the relationships with which Germany will be wise enough to deal, and the danger of peril and strife in the inner life of Germany; the conflict and the strife are at hand. We Jews are not the only victims of Hitlerist terror and oppression. We are merely the earliest and the chiefest victims of Hitlerite hatred and rage. Hitlerism means one thing—no friend of humanity, no friend of Germany, and we who are the friends and well-wishers of Germany, cannot fail to lament over the truth that Hitlerism means the rule of hatred, a nation that has served by hatred is tragically dis-served. A leader who sets out to divide his national home against itself may have electoral triumphs for an hour, but he is bound to go down in the end in moral defeat and in spiritual disaster."

"The American people know that we are not strangers in Germany; our fathers were not alien there. For one thousand years and more we have lived in Germany, and we have been among the constructive, serviceable, enriching upbuilders of Germany."

"What if we had given Germany nothing, but Heine and Berner, Wassermann and Ehrlich, Mendelsohn and Einstein! How could any reasonable, sane person say that we are strangers in Germany? Germany is greater than Hitlerism. Germany means freedom, justice."

In explaining the purpose of the conference, Mr. Deutsch declared:

"The American Jewish Congress has convened this morning to give earnest and reasoned consideration to the recent developments in Germany that make imminent the menace of Hitlerism."

Anti-Semitism of Nazis Scored at Socialist Rally

Hitler, fascism and anti-Semitism were strongly assailed by Ab. Cahan, editor of the "Jewish Daily Forward" in an address delivered on Sunday at Town Hall, at an anti-Hitler rally arranged by the Socialist party. Mr. Cahan was one of the principal speakers at the meeting which was attended by a large throng.

"Hitler's anti-Semitism," he said, "is the cheapest and rottenest sort of demagoguery. I know Germany and I do not believe that the Germans will permit their culture to be advertised through the medium of pogroms upon the Jews." This statement was warmly applauded by the audience.

Former Judge Jacob Panken demanded that the League of Nations and the United States government formally protest against the anti-Semitism of the Nazis.

American Hitlerites present at the meeting, sought to interrupt the speaker, and when they began to heckle Vincenzo Vaciria, former member of the Italian Parliament and Bruno Wagner, president of the Friends of the German Republic, they were thrown out of the hall by the audience.

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
