## Zionist Executive Issues Appeal to Revisionists on Eve of Kattowitz Conference

**A Call for Unity and Assurance There  
Is No Desire to Exclude Revi-  
sionists from Movement**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, March 17—On the eve of the conference of the Revisionist Party Council, to be held in Kattowitz on March 19-20, the Zionist Executive has published a warning and appeal to the Shekel-paying Revisionists who are to attend the Conference.

The World Union of Zionist Revisionists is composed of members who acquire the Shekel and adhere to the Zionist Organization, as well as those who do not buy the Shekel and who do not accept membership of the Zionist Organization. Both sections are to meet together at Kattowitz in order to consider the future of the Union in view of the recent decision of the Congress Court in Berlin on January 5th, which suspended the Revisionist Union as a separate Union within the Zionist Organization.

The Zionist Executive's appeal invites the Revisionists who adhere to the Zionist Organization, to examine anew their fundamental relations towards the Zionist Organization. They are asked to consider their position in the light of the verdict of the Congress Court declaring the Revisionist Union no longer a separate Union.

The Zionist Executive's statement concludes with the expression of hope that the Revisionists will unequivocally accept the laws and decisions of the

## French Pacifist Organizations to Assist Refugees from Germany

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

PARIS, Mar. 17—The Cartel de la Liberté, a Committee uniting a number of pacifist organizations in France, has decided to extend every facility to Jewish and non-Jewish refugees from Germany.

The problem of the numerous arrivals from Germany threatens to become acute, particularly in relation to the provision of work and employment. Hitherto, the Jewish relief organizations in the capitol, have made provision for destitute refugees and plans are on hand for raising funds for the purpose of assisting the new arrivals to maintain themselves while here.

## Manuscript Feuchtwanger's Second Volume *Josephus* Torn Up by Berlin Nazis

LONDON, Mar. 17—Dr. Lion Feuchtwanger, who is staying at Burgdorf, Switzerland, cabled today to London as follows: "Storm troops have broken into my Berlin home and threatened the servants with revolvers. A motor car has been stolen, desks broken open and documents and manuscripts, including the second volume of *Josephus*, torn up."

The London "Evening Standard," which telephoned today to Feuchtwanger's Berlin house for further light on the incident, was told by a servant that the raid was carried out by four Nazis, who broke into the house at the point of revolvers, and rushed into Feuchtwanger's study, which they thoroughly ransacked. They turned everything upside down, and tore up lots of papers. They eventually drove off in Feuchtwanger's motorcar, taking many documents with them. "I appealed to the police for help," said the servant to the "Evening Standard's" questioner, "but I was told they couldn't do anything."

Further messages have been received by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, on the occasion of its Fifteenth Anniversary. They include felicitations from such internationally known figures as Lord Melchett and Professor S. Alexander of Manchester, a distinguished writer on international subjects, and a holder of the Order of Merit, which is more prized than any other honor in the gift of the King of England.

In addition, there are a number of gratifying messages from important news agencies and newspapers, as well as editorials in numerous papers which subscribe to the J. T. A. service.

All these messages will be reproduced in a special enlarged issue to be published on Monday, March 20.

## Goebbels Prohibits Concert By Bruno Walter Following Prohibition at Leipzig

BERLIN, March 17—Minister Goebbels today took a further step in the campaign to eliminate Jews from the cultural professions, by prohibiting the concert which was to be conducted by Bruno Walter at the Berlin Philharmonic Hall. This follows the prohibition of a similar concert which was to be conducted by Bruno Walter at Leipzig last night. The official excuse given for the prohibition at Leipzig was that the concert threatened to disturb public order. Bruno Walter had just returned from New York where he had conducted the New York Philharmonic Symphony Orchestra.

It is pointed out here that though Bruno Walter is attacked as a Jew, he actually resigned from the Jewish Community some time ago and changed his name to Schlessinger.

As though not satisfied with only excluding Jews from the employment of their talents, the Nazis are also engaging in a drive even to wipe out the memory of illustrious Jews of the past, whose names have been perpetuated in the names of streets and institutions. One of the first Nazi acts in this connection was the changing of Rathenauplatz in Berlin to Wilhelmplatz. The Nazi Government of Thuringia has now decided to change the names of streets in the cities of Thuringia, which may have any Marxist or Jewish connection. They will be renamed after the leaders of the Nazi Party.

## Fighting at Vienna University, Several Injured on Both Sides

VIENNA, March 17—Police yesterday raided the offices of the Union of Jewish Ex-Soldiers. They conducted a search, but found nothing incriminating. At the same time unknown persons broke into the premises of the Hagana—a non-partisan Jewish self-defense organization—and removed the register of members.

Apart from these symptomatic raids which indicate the uncertainties of the situation in Vienna, a number of anti-Semitic fights broke out in the Univer-

### Protagonists of Immigration Restriction Transferred From House Immigration Committee

WASHINGTON, Mar. 17.—The two leading opponents of immigration on the House Immigration Committee are no longer on that Committee, but have been transferred to other committees.

The two restrictionists in question are Congressman Jenkins of Ohio, and Congressman Green of Florida. They have always consistently opposed any liberalization of the immigration laws. They will be replaced by more liberal members.

### American Jewish Congress Holds Meeting Today

Representatives of the American Jewish Congress residing in New York are meeting today at the Hotel Astor, in order to discuss arrangements for a projected protest meeting at Madison Square Garden. The protest meeting is in connection with the present Jewish situation in Germany.

### Kaufman, Cattle King of Montana, Succumbs at 84

HELENA, Mont. Mar. 17.—The death here of Louis E. Kaufman, 84, removes one of the most famous Cattle Kings in Montana.

Born in Germany, Kaufman arrived here in 1866, and engaged in gold mining. He later turned to cattle raising, and his brands soon were known throughout the State of Montana. Charles Russell, the celebrated cowboy-artist, was manager of one of the Kaufman ranches.

Mr. Kaufman was a member of Congregation Emanuel.

### German Jewish Ex-Soldiers Hold Public Forum to Discuss With Other Veterans

BERLIN, Mar. 17.—In an attempt to counteract the slanders that have been spread regarding the part played by Jewish soldiers during the War, the Reich Federation of Jewish ex-Soldiers organized a public forum here on Wednesday.

The Jewish ex-service men sent out an invitation addressed to comrades of all faiths "to come together for a debate which is to be non-political."

As a result, over 1,000 German ex-soldiers, including members of the Stahlhelm, the Nazi Storm Troops, and many Jews crowded the Philharmonic in order to listen to the case made out by Dr. Freund, the President of the Federation of Jewish Ex-Service Men.

There was some disturbance at the commencement of the proceedings, a number of Nazis interrupting Dr. Freund, but order was soon restored. It is understood the head of the Berlin Police Department had issued instructions that peace was to be maintained in all circumstances.

Dr. Freund pointed out that thousands of German Jews had fought for the Fatherland on all the fronts, and that more than 12,000 Jews were killed in the course of the War. He also rebutted the charge that the German Jews had no national consciousness. He dealt with the accusation levelled against Jews or inclining towards radicalism, by explaining that Jewish liberalism was the natural reaction to the persecution they had suffered.

A number of speakers spoke in opposition, adducing the argument of Jewish radicalism, that Jews had undermined national sentiment and that Jews were aloof, holding themselves apart from the rest of the German people.

In reply, Dr. Freund stated that the Right Parties had refused to have anything to do with the Jews, and that the object of the present meeting was to prepare the way for Jewish cooperation in the general work of German upbuilding.

Dr. Louis H. Fliegman has just been elected president of the staff of St. Peter's Hospital, Helena, Montana, managed by the Episcopal Church. Dr. Fliegman has held this post for a number of years and is also Chairman of the Montana State Board of Health.

### Expulsion of Jews From Chemnitz Textile Industry, Announces the "Angriff"

BERLIN, Mar. 17.—The "Angriff," the Nazi paper of which Minister Goebbels is still the Editor, announces the expulsion of all Jews from the Chemnitz textile industry. The announcement is communicated in a long, vituperative article, presenting alleged facts and figures, showering abuse on the Jews.

The Chemnitz textile industry, which employs large numbers of workers, both in Chemnitz and the surrounding districts, has been largely built up, both as far as technique and export are concerned, by Jews.

The attack in the "Angriff" is particularly significant, as it was hoped that the paper would become more restrained in expression when its editor, Goebbels, assumed the responsibility of office in the Cabinet.

### Swedish Legation Offers Reward for Detection of Attackers of Stuttgart Consul

STUTTGART, Mar. 17.—Following representations by the Swedish Legation in Berlin, the Stuttgart police have offered a reward for the detection of those who attacked the Swedish Consul at Stuttgart some time ago.

Dr. Wanner, the Swedish Consul at Stuttgart, who is a Jew, was attacked a few days ago by Nazis, who broke into his home.

### Appeal for Relief for Russian Jewry Issued by Chief Rabbi Kook and M. Ussischkin

JERUSALEM, Mar. 17.—An appeal has been issued here by Chief Rabbi Kook and M. Ussischkin, head of the Jewish National Fund, calling upon all Jewry to start a relief campaign for the provision of food to Jews in Soviet Russia.

Large numbers of Palestinian Jews who have friends and relatives in Russia have recently received news pointing to a state of semi-starvation.

At the end of last month, relief work for Russia was initiated in Tel Aviv by the proclamation of a "Week for Helping Soviet Jewry." Addresses have been delivered in all the synagogues and offerings were accepted for transmission to Soviet Russia through "Torgsin." In Tel Aviv alone, over \$1,000 was collected by the local relief committee.

It is now planned to set up a permanent organization for relief in Russia, as well as the issue of a special appeal for the provision of Matzoths for Jews in Russia.

## Palestine Labor Opens Campaign Against Non-Zionists of Jewish Agency

**Claim That Non-Zionists Have Not Stimulated Influx of Jewish Capital Into Palestine**

JERUSALEM—A campaign against the non-Zionist members of the Jewish Agency has been opened here by the "Davar," the daily newspaper which serves as the organ of Palestine labor.

The controversy, which marks the commencement of propaganda in connection with the next Zionist Congress, is concentrating on a line of argument aiming at showing that the non-Zionists have not justified the expectations of the Zionists and have not stimulated any influx of national capital into Palestine. In a long editorial, the "Davar" attempts to demonstrate that it was a mistake to share the responsibility of the Jewish Agency with non-Zionists, but that this error may still be rectified at the forthcoming Congress.

The Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns that the general Zionists of Palestine too, intend to raise, at the next Zionist Congress, the question of abolishing the so-called enlarged Jewish Agency, by dispensing with the non-Zionists. They hope thus to ensure that the work in Palestine will be conducted exclusively by Zionists.

Palestine Labor's campaign against sharing the control of the Jewish Agency with non-Zionists may be traced to a disagreement between Labor and the non-Zionists over the question of the management of the Emergency Fund raised after the Palestine disturbances in 1929. The "Davar" claims that the Jews in Palestine have not had sufficient representation on, or influence over the disposition of the Fund. At the recent

## Protection for Czechoslovakian Jews in Germany Assured

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

PRAGUE, Mar. 17—Assurance of protection for Czechoslovakian citizens of the Jewish Faith residing in Germany is contained in a statement circulated by the official Czechoslovakian news agency. This is in reply to intervention by the Jewish deputy, Goldstein, complaining that large numbers of Czechoslovakian Jews were being subjected to persecution in Germany.

Commenting on Deputy Goldstein's intervention, and the subsequent statement by the Czechoslovakian agency, the Nazi press in Austria condemns it as a part of a united Jewish campaign against Nazi Germany.

It goes on to say that this united front which is in progress of being organized against Nazi Germany, is spreading to the United States, England and Poland.

## English Papers Express Anxiety For Safety of Noted Germans

**Many Jewish Names Among Those Arrested and Present Whereabouts Not Known**

LONDON, March 17—The English press continues to devote a great deal of space to acts of violence committed against Jews.

The London "News-Chronicle" expresses disquiet over the fate of Kurt Hahn, who was arrested by Nazis last Saturday, and of whom nothing has since been heard. Hahn was a leading educationalist with a reputation also outside Germany. He was the Director of the Schlossalem School, a South German establishment created by ex-Prince Max of Baden. The "News-Chronicle" reports that when Prince Berthold of Baden, learned of Hahn's arrest last Saturday, he telegraphed Hindenburg and received the assurance that Hahn would be released, though this has not yet occurred.

The London "Daily Herald" and the London "Times" in particular reproduce stories of attacks on Jews in Bavaria, and in other provincial districts. The "Daily Herald" tells of the case of a Jew, Stelz, who was taken from his house in Straubing, in Lower Bavaria, by four armed men, who broke into his house, and carried him away in a motorcar. He was found a few hours later on a main road riddled with bullets. The "Times" gives prominence to the lengthy list of complaints, comprising over 100 cases of unauthorized arrests and of torture of Polish Jews prepared by the Polish legation in Berlin. In most of these cases the victims were taken to private prisons, apparently run by the Nazis, and there beaten with sticks, truncheons, and special instruments so constructed as to inflict pain without breaking bones. It appears from these details that the torturers take special care to avoid inflicting damage on the skull or any other part likely to lead to fatal results.

The "Manchester Guardian" voices a feeling of growing anxiety, felt in liberal circles in England, regarding the fate of well-known Republicans who have disappeared and whose whereabouts cannot be discovered.

It also calls attention to the disappearance of such leading Jewish Socialists as Hilferding, Dr. Hertz, and Stampfer. It declares that the civilized world has a right to know what has happened to these distinguished men and a right to insist upon an assurance that they are safe.

## "Le Miroir", Notorious French-Canadian Anti-Semitic Paper, Suspends Publication

**Suspension Thought Attempt to Influence Legislature on Taschereau Bill**

MONTREAL, Mar. 17—The anti-Semitic weekly "Le Miroir," has suspended publication indefinitely, according to a statement published in a special edition of the paper, issued yesterday. It gives financial difficulties as the reason for the suspension.

"Le Miroir," one of the anti-Semitic Goglu publications, gained notoriety as the result of a campaign of anti-Jewish vilification, carried on in its columns. A great deal of its space was devoted to rehashing ancient anti-Jewish fables, and it did not even hesitate to revive the vilest of mediaeval slanders. An example of the attitude of "Le Miroir" can be gained from one particular edition of the paper, which called for a boycott against the Jews, and displayed a series of anti-Semitic slogans, which it asked anti-Semites throughout the world to use in the form of stamps as a means of propaganda. Typical examples of the slogans were, "Jews are responsible for the misfortunes of Russia, Spain, and Mexico. Drive them from Quebec"; "Do not permit our political parties to be controlled by the Jews"; "The Jews are an Asiatic race, a combination of the yellow and black races."

"Le Miroir" subsequently was sued before Justice Desaulniers, by E. Abagov, a Jewish merchant, who applied for an injunction to restrain the owners and editors of the Goglu publication from continuing their campaigns. Though Justice Desaulniers dismissed the application, he handed down a slashing indictment of anti-Semitic campaigns in

## "Beobachter" on Feuchtwanger's Address at J. T. A. Tea

BERLIN, Mar. 17—The "Voelkischer Beobachter" has returned once again to the subject of the lecture delivered by Dr. Lion Feuchtwanger on February 8, at a tea given in his honor by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

The Nazi organ severely criticizes the German Ambassador and the German Consul-General in the United States for failing to undertake any action against the anti-Hitler propaganda contained in Feuchtwanger's address.

The address by Feuchtwanger was on the subject of Hitler as a writer. Dr. Feuchtwanger pointed out that Hitler's book, "Struggle," which he asserted was replete with errors of fact and language, sold only 200,000 copies, despite an extraordinarily intense sales propaganda.

general and those of the Goglu publications in particular.

It being revealed that the law was inadequate to protect the public against certain forms of libel and slander by a publication, Premier I. A. Taschereau sponsored a bill at the end of February respecting defamatory libel of the sort engaged in by the Goglu publications.

It was thought here that the suspension of "Le Miroir" was connected with the desire to influence the Legislature's attitude toward the bill by going out of business temporarily and reappearing when the attitude would be more favorable.
