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Jewish Board of Deputies in London Decides on Protest Demonstration; No Date Fixed

Influential Jewish Circles Oppose Immediate Demonstration; Agitation for Boycott Grows

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, March 27—Fearing disturbances, the Jewish Board of Deputies called out special police to assure order in the neighborhood of Bloomsbury where the Board met this morning in order to decide on their attitude to the German situation. The entrance to the meeting place of the Anglo-Jewish parliament representing the Jews of the British Empire was surrounded by anxious crowds, while a stream of private cars bearing appeals for a boycott of German goods filed slowly past.

The first part of the meeting, which was public, was attended by representatives of the whole of the general press. Strong opposition to public demonstrations was expressed by a most influential section of the Board, to the extent that the President, Neville Laski, the former president, Max Goldsmid, the president of the Anglo-Jewish Association, and Sir Leonard Cohen, president of the Jewish Colonization Association, threatened to resign if the proposal for an immediate demonstration were carried.

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Official Ban on Jewish Judges And Attorneys in Bavaria

BERLIN, March 27—Commissioner of Justice for Bavaria, Frank, has issued a decree excluding all Jewish judges and attorneys from participating in criminal cases. The decree also specifically bars Jewish judges from sitting in civil cases.

In addition, the Mayor of Munich issued an edict that no municipal contracts or orders are to be given to Jewish Marxist firms in the future, while the newly appointed head of the municipal Schools in the same city has declared that from the beginning of next term no Jewish child is to be allowed to attend Christian schools, and Jewish school doctors shall no longer treat German children.

German Jewry Appeals That Demonstrations Be Not Held

Vice-President of Central Union, at Present in U. S., Brings Appeal to Speakers at Madison Square Garden

BERLIN, March 27—The most responsible Jewish quarters in Germany, including the Zionist Federation, the Central Union of the German Citizens of the Jewish Faith, the League of German Jewish Veterans and the Society of National German Jews have joined, through the Jewish Telegraphic Agency here, in an appeal to the American Jews to abandon today's demonstrations against alleged atrocities in Germany.

The German Jews disapprove the anti-German propaganda which has manifested itself throughout the world and express the hope that the German people will soon gain an appreciation of loyal German Jewry. They appeal that no resolutions harmful to the German people should be adopted.

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Goebbels Offers Reward For Name of Single Jew Killed in Nazi Revolution

LONDON, March 27—In an exclusive article, covering the whole of the front page of yesterday's "Sunday Express," Goebbels denies the Jewish atrocities and offers a reward for the name of a single Jew whose death can be laid to the Nazi revolution.

Of the anti-Semitic movement in Germany, he says it is caused by the fact that German laws, though a small percentage of the general population, hold an enormously large number of influential public posts. Moreover, he charges a large number of Jews being involved in corruption scandals which he alleges have exasperated the German population. Nevertheless, he declares that Jews are allowed to conduct their private business and practise their religion freely, and that no hair of anyone's head would be touched.

The German authorities, says Goebbels, have the power to guarantee complete and absolute security to all observing the laws of the German people. The German people, he added, had other business than that of Jew-baiting.

Central Committee for Congress Poland and Brith Trumpeldor Declare for Jabotinsky

Grossman's Followers Appoint Commissioner to Carry on Work, Set Up Opposition Youth Federation in Poland

WARSAW, March 27—The Central Committee of the Revisionist Union in Congress Poland has declared itself for Jabotinsky in the struggle that has arisen between the two wings of Revisionism, following the conference at Kattowitz. In addition, the Brith Trumpeldor organization in Poland has ranged itself on the side of Jabotinsky.

The Revisionists' Central Committee in Warsaw has suspended all Revisionists adhering to Meer Grossman's views, and to the London Executive, which had been dissolved by Jabotinsky.

On the other hand, the followers of Grossman in Poland, who have been suspended by the Central Committee in Warsaw have appointed a special commissioner charged with the Revisionist work in Poland, and with organizing a new Revisionist Youth Federation in opposition to the Brith Trumpeldor.

At a crowded meeting addressed here by Jabotinsky in the Philharmonic Hall, tear-bombs were thrown into the Hall, and leaflets coupling Jabotinsky and Hitler and denouncing them both, were distributed.

Polish Consul Intervenes in Brutal Nazi Attack on Rabbi

BERLIN, March 27—The Polish Consulate at Essen has intervened in the case of an attack at Duisburg, where Hitlerites penetrated the house of Rabbi Bereischa, a Polish citizen, attacked him, and dragged him through the streets, wrapped in a Republican flag. It was not until the Rabbi had been seriously injured that the police intervened and put him under protective arrest. The Rabbi's wife, who was pregnant, was also seriously molested.

At Cologne, the Nazis attacked a Polish citizen by the name of Abraham, threatening him with death. His wife, panic-stricken, jumped from a window, breaking her leg. Both husband and wife are now in the hospital.

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Policy of Non-Cooperation With British Government Decided by Arab Conference

Conference Scores Mufti as British Agent

JERUSALEM, March 27—Adopting a policy of non-cooperation with the Palestine Government, a conference of several hundred Arabs at Jaffa yesterday decided not to make public how such non-cooperation was to be carried out. The conference resolved to call a congress within two months in order to initiate wide action along the lines of the resolution.

Yesterday's conference, which was a sequel to that of Feb. 25th, at which the policy of non-cooperation was first announced, marked an open and sharp opposition to the Mufti on the part of many delegates who accused him of being an agent of the Palestine Government, and of endeavoring to hamper the policy of non-cooperation.

In reply, the Mufti delivered a long defensive speech in which he recalled his work for the Arab cause and even offered his resignation from the Presidency of the Moslem Supreme Council. He was repeatedly interrupted by the opposition, and he was unable to conclude his speech.

The opposition leaders later declared that non-cooperation will mean non-payment of taxes as well as resignation of Arab officials from Government offices.

The conference passed off quietly, though special police measures had been taken to meet a possible emergency.

Australia, Canada, Argentine And Brazil Add Their Voices to World-wide Storm of Protest

MELBOURNE, Australia, March 27—Two thousand Jews, representing all sections of the Jewish population, last night passed a resolution protesting "in the name of common humanity against the ruthlessness of the outrages perpetrated on defenseless men, women, and children, by organized bands of hooligans, known to have the support of the German Government."

The resolution adopted at the meeting has been published in all leading Australian newspapers, and transmitted to the German Consul here.

February 25, the Arab Executive issued an announcement that they were considering a form of non-cooperation which would take the shape of refusal to pay Government taxes and a boycott of British goods. At the same time, the Arab press emphasized that the non-cooperation movement was intended to mark a serious turning point in the Arab attitude toward Great Britain.

Nazi Press Chief Confirms Boycott of Jews

A statement by Dr. Ernest Hanfstaengl, chief of the foreign press section of the Nazi party, reported by the United Press, confirms almost in every detail the reports of the systematic boycott and drive against Jews in German businesses and professions.

Asked for the cause of the wave of anti-Semitism in Germany, Dr. Hanfstaengl said:

"In the last fourteen years Jewry has achieved positions of influence which it has grossly misused morally, financially and politically in an unheard of manner, with the result that the German people crumbled morally, financially and politically.

"The same Jewry now is seeking to smirch Germany's renaissance."

Dr. Hanfstaengl is now to say, says the correspondent of the United Press, that theousting of Jews in Germany from influential positions will continue "until the house is cleansed."

German Jewish Mistreatment Confirmed, But Considered Virtually Ended, Says Hull

American Jewish Congress Addresses Letter of Thanks to Secretary Hull for Prompt Report

WASHINGTON, March 27 — Secretary Hull has secured the report asked by him from the American Embassy in Germany, and transmitted the findings to American Jewry through Dr. Cyrus Adler, President of the American Jewish Committee; Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, Honorary President of the American Jewish Congress; and Bernard S. Deutsch, President of the American Jewish Congress. The report addressed to them in the form of a telegram, is as follows:

You will remember that at the time of your recent call at the department I informed you that in view of numerous press statements indicating widespread mistreatment of the Jews in Germany, I would request the American Embassy at Berlin, in consultation with the principal consulates in Germany, to investigate the situation and submit a report.

A reply has now been received indicating that whereas there was for a short time considerable physical mistreatment of Jews, this phase may be considered virtually terminated. There also was some picketing of Jewish merchandising stores and instances of professional discrimination.

These manifestations were viewed with serious concern by the German government.

Hitler, in his capacity as leader of the Nazi party, issued an order calling upon his followers to maintain law and order, to avoid molesting foreigners, disrupting trade and to avoid the creation of possibly embarrassing international incidents.

Later, Vice-Chancellor von Papen delivered a speech at Breslau in which he not only reiterated Hitler's appeals for discipline but abjured the victors of the last election not to spoil their triumph by unworthy acts of revenge and violence which could only bring discredit upon the regime in foreign countries.

As a result, the embassy reports that the authority of the regular police has been reinforced.

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Day of Fasting, Intercession For Soviet, German Jewries Observed in Palestine

JERUSALEM, March 27 — A general day of fasting and intercession for Soviet and German Jewries, was observed yesterday throughout Palestine.

All over Palestine the synagogues were crowded and the Wailing Wall, where special services were held, was besieged by worshippers. Special prayers, in addition to the usual penitential prayers were composed for the occasion by the Rabbinate.

In obedience to the call of the Rabbinate, many Jewish stores were closed for an hour in the afternoon and tags were sold in the streets for the relief fund, which is being raised for Soviet Jewry.

In the synagogues, the rabbis dwelt touchingly on the present situation of the Jews in Germany and Soviet Russia, picturing the sufferings in these parts of the Diaspora.

The Tel Aviv City Council has resolved to hold a great public meeting of protest against the persecution of Jews in Germany. At a meeting of the Medical Association, a resolution was adopted protesting particularly against the elimination of Jewish doctors from employment in Germany.

Jewish national organizations are being pressed to initiate a campaign against Germany, including a strict boycott of German goods.

Protest Demonstration In Warsaw Forbidden on Grounds of Public Safety

WARSAW, March 27 — On the grounds of public safety, permission to hold a procession here in connection with the protest against German excesses has been withdrawn. The remainder of the program, the numerous meetings and prayer gatherings, will not be affected.

The Rabbinical Association of Warsaw has joined with Orthodox communities in other parts of the world in proclaiming tomorrow as a day of fasting and prayer in connection with the persecution of German Jewry.

Warsaw Bourse Closed in Sympathy with Protest

WARSAW, March 27 — The Warsaw Bourse was closed down completely today, joining in a protest of sympathy with the Jewish victims in the Nazi disturbances. The Bourse shut down early after listening to an address by the Jewish Deputy Wislicki.

The Jewish Union of Literateurs has passed a resolution expressing its protest against 'cruelties and persecution against Jews in Germany.

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compromising on the date which was left to the discretion of the leaders of the Board. In addition it was decided by an overwhelming majority to take no action in the direction of a boycott, but declaring that since the boycott was sporadic it was to be left to individuals to act as they desired.

Although representatives of the whole of the general press attended to report the meeting, the proceedings were in camera. Neville Laski, the president, later issued a statement to the press, pointing out that Jews had no quarrel with Germany, but were concerned with the discrimination against its Jewish citizens. He declared that Jews would resist any attempt to convert the Jews of Germany into a class of helots and untouchables.

The resolution adopted declared that "the Board views with deep anxiety the events in Germany and has had under consideration what steps are most likely to prove useful for the Jews in Germany who, irrespective of political associations, have been singled out as special victims of persecution and violence. The Board believes that the freedom and justice which Germany is demanding abroad, it must concede also to its own citizens, Jewish and non-Jewish. The Board unanimously resolves to take steps to secure recognition of this viewpoint in all responsible quarters. As an expression of the profound sympathy of every Jew in England, and as a means of voicing their indignation against the persecution of the Jews of Germany, a public meeting will be held in London at the earliest appropriate date."

The resolution generally has not met with a great deal of satisfaction, as feeling is running high, particularly in London, where young men and women are parading the streets and distributing leaflets calling for a German boycott.

An incident in the Stamford Hill district, North London, has served to focus a certain amount of attention on Sir Oswald Mosley's Fascists, who passed through the district bearing Swastika armbands. A clash with incensed Jewish youths in the neighborhood was narrowly avoided by the arrival of the police.

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bis have sent a protest to Bishop Manning, one of the speakers at Madison Square Garden, protesting against what they describe as "exaggerated reports of Jewish atrocities". It is understood, also, that the German Zionist Federation have addressed themselves to Bishop Manning reiterating their protest against untrue tales of cruelty and against "those Jews who are attempting to misuse the Jewish question in the political interests of other countries."

They demand that the question of the protection of Jewish rights should not be linked with the political actions against Germany.

The J.T.A. here is further informed that Mr. Ernest Wallach, Vice-President of the Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith, who is at present on a stay in the United States for business purposes, has addressed the following telegram to the Governor of the State of New York, Herbert H. Lehman, the Honorable Alfred E. Smith, the Right Reverend William T. Manning, Bishop of New York; Bishop Francis J. McConnell, Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, Admiral Richard Byrd, Mr. Bernard S. Deutsch and other speakers at the meeting planned for last night in the Madison Square Garden of New York:

"The undersigned Vice-president of the Central Association of German Citizens of Jewish Faith, has just received the following cable from the President of the Association, Dr. Julius Brodnitz in Berlin: 'We earnestly urge you to do all in your power in order that Monday's Mass Meeting be called off, or if such should, against our sincere hopes not prove possible, to prevail upon the speakers of the evening to refrain from stirring the emotions of their audience against Germany. We can assure them that the German Government is permanently and successfully engaged in assuring Peace and Order to all citizens without discrimination.'"

In an accompanying letter Mr. Wallach says:

"In conveying the contents of this telegram to you, as one of the principal speakers of tomorrow's event, I beg to identify myself with the appeal therein voiced by the elected representation of Germany's Jewish population and to earnestly bespeak you to aid us in preventing any action which is liable to encroach upon the prestige of our country and thereby seriously affect our most vital interests."

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reaching a political readjustment as has recently taken place, some time must elapse before a state of equilibrium could be re-established.

In the opinion of the embassy such a stabilization appears to have been reached in the field of personal mistreatment, and there are indications that in other phases the situation is improving.

I feel hopeful in view of the reported attitude of high German officials and the evidences of amelioration already indicated, that the situation, which has caused such widespread concern throughout this country, will soon revert to normal. Meanwhile I shall continue to watch the situation closely, with a sympathetic interest and with a desire to be helpful in whatever way possible.

In a telegram sent to Secretary Hull by Rabbi Dr. Stephen S. Wise and Bernard S. Deutsch, on behalf of the American Jewish Congress, the writers expressed gratitude for the prompt report, which, they declared, "confirmed our fears that there has been considerable physical mistreatment of Jews, picketing of Jewish merchandising stores, and instances of professional discrimination." It adds, "Until the status of the Jewish citizens of Germany is safeguarded and the position of non-national Jews is secured, the enlightened opinion of America must watch with profoundest anxiety the development of events in Germany."

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
