Two Jews Killed in Raids On Wiesbaden Homes By Unidentified Nazis

One Shot to Death, One Dies of
Heart Attack at Point of Pistol
as Homes Are Invaded

WIESBADEN, April 24—Two new Jewish deaths, resulting from raids upon their homes by "unidentified persons" were reported here today. Dairyman Kassel, 59, was shot as he attempted to escape through the window of his home when it was visited by a Nazi raiding party. The death was attributed to motives of "personal vengeance," and the raiders were reported as "unknown." Salomon Rosenstauch, 58, whose home was also invaded, died of heart attack when the Nazis pointed a pistol at him.

Family Records Are to Be Searched for Jewish Ancestry

Nazis Regard Census Statistics as
Unreliable for Finding Jews

BERLIN, April 24—The non-Aryan population of Germany, according to the Nazi standard, which regards the existence of one non-Aryan grandparent as proof of a contaminating strain, will not be determined in the next census of the population of Berlin, which is to take place on June 16, it was learned today. The questionnaires prepared for the gathering of statistics on the population do not inquire into the religion of the person's grandparents.

It was pointed out that this by no means indicated that the Nazis will abandon their intention of extending their anti-Semitic activity to all persons who have had a Jewish grandparent. Verbal evidence given to census-takers is regarded as insufficiently exact in the determination of the Jewish strain. Family registers will be investigated instead, as offering more certain evidence of Jewish origin.

Jewish Doctors Imperiled By New Restrictions, 6,000 May Lose Jobs

Banned from Organized Medicine,
Thousands Facing Ruin; Pro-
tract Reinstatement

BERLIN, April 24—The ruin of the practice of six thousand of the seven thousand Jewish physicians in Germany is threatened in the plan to expel them from participation in the work of medical service associations, which was proposed today by Nazi officials. Comparatively few of the physicians derive any considerable part of their income from private practice and a great number would be unable to continue if their work in the health services and sick-benefit associations were withdrawn. If the one per cent numerus clausus that has been suggested goes into effect, only five hundred Jewish doctors will be permitted to practice.

Even if permission to practice is extended to all those physicians who have war service records, as was done in the case of lawyers, it is felt that the situation would not be greatly relieved, as the investigation of war records would be protracted, and the elimination of Jewish doctors from health agencies and institutions would meanwhile continue.

Nazis Order Jews to Quit Diplomatic Service

Lithuanian Minister, Grandson of
Jew, Is Relieved of Post

KOVNO, April 24—Minister Zerlin, the German ambassador to Lithuania, has been recalled because it was discovered that his grandfather was a Jew, it was learned today. It is expected that the Nazi administration will completely retire Minister Zerlin from the diplomatic service. His brother, a practicing attorney, has also been removed from office.

Nazis Expel Jewish Students From Baden And Dresden Universities

New Decrees by Minister of Educa-
tion Exceed Any Previous
Discrimination

BERLIN, April 24—No Jewish students will be allowed in the colleges of Baden and Dresden, in accordance with the latest measures taken by the Nazi Minister of Education. Decrees of unprecedented stringency were promulgated at various educational centers of the Reich, tending to shut Jews out of the colleges, and to destroy Jewish contributions to science and art.

The State Minister of Education of Baden today issued a decree banning non-Aryan students from admission to any of the centers of higher education in the province.

In Dresden, the Commissar of Education went even further, and ordered that the prohibition should also affect non-Aryan students already in attendance at the University. These students shall be refused re-admission for the new term. This decree will abruptly terminate the courses of any Jewish students at the University of Dresden. No new applications from non-Aryan students are to be granted.

Rigorous application of the numerus clausus limiting Jewish enrollment in universities strictly to the Jewish proportion of the population has been ordered in Cassel. Jewish students already in attendance at the University are not, however, affected by this decree.

Gottfried Feder, newly appointed Nazi head of the national Technical Society, has demanded the removal

War-Time Scenes Recalled As Refugees Clamor For Palestine Visas

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, April 24—Scenes reminiscent of war time when all relief offices were besieged by refugees, are taking place daily now at the Berlin Palestine bureau. Hundreds of Jews, old and young, men, women and children crowd the corridors of the office building clamoring for Palestine visas since Palestine is now practically the only country open to the Jews, even if restrictedly. Officials at the bureau despair of being able to accommodate the flood of applicants, especially since only a thousand certificates have been granted by the Palestine Government.

Many of the visa-seekers come from the provinces, spending their last pennings in making the trip. They tell pitiful stories of their ruined shops and lost means of livelihood and beg the bureau officials to save, at least, the younger members of the family.

The majority of the applicants have never been Zionists but they want to go to Jerusalem or anywhere, because no one knows what further cruelties or persecutions are in store for the Jews in Germany.

Jewish Community Centers Report Increased Activity

A survey of the effect of the economic depression upon Jewish recreational institutions conducted recently by the National Jewish Welfare Board, indicates that while the income from the more than 275,000 members in 262 YMHA's, YWHA's and Jewish Community Centers has decreased appreciably during the past year, the attendance at mass functions and other Jewish Center activities has, on the contrary, increased considerably. This was the substance of an address delivered by Harry L. Glucksman, executive director of the Jewish Welfare Board, parent organization for Y's and Jewish Centers, at a conference of executives Sunday at the 92nd Street Young Men's Hebrew Association.

"This emergency conference of the heads of Y's and Jewish Community Centers was convened by the Jewish Welfare Board for the purpose of considering ways and means of increasing the scope of usefulness of those institutions to meet the greater demand on their facilities, resulting from the increase in unemployment," Mr. Glucksman stated.

"Recognizing the difficulties in which many unemployed members find themselves, the policy of the Jewish Community Centers has been to accommodate themselves to current conditions. In many Centers members were permitted to pay their dues in quarterly and monthly installments. In deserving cases, the payment of membership dues was temporarily waived altogether. In order not to affect the pride of the unemployed adversely, Jewish Centers in making provision for them have done so on the basis of 'payment when able'. Every effort is made to retain such members on a basis which will permit them to enjoy the full privileges of the association, and also to maintain sustained contact with the Center and the community. The underlying motive of the Boards of Directors in extending these privileges to those unable to meet their financial obligations has been to help maintain the morale of the membership, particularly of the younger people during these trying times. Opportunities for wholesome recreation and social contacts were therefore cheerfully provided to all who have applied, and the masses of the Jewish people have responded eagerly to the call for aid and support in maintaining the usefulness of the Center unimpaired."

"That the Jews of America recognize and appreciate the opportunities for wholesome recreation afforded by the Y's and Community Centers is shown by the continued support

BERLIN, April 24 — Charlotte Berner, Jewish singer who appeared with the Chicago Opera Company in 1924, vanished today from her pension, leaving a note to explain her disappearance.

"I have no more strength to live in my own Fatherland," she wrote.

The opera singer is a native of Leipzig. Recently she was dismissed from her theatrical engagements as a result of the Nazi ban on Jewish artists.

All the Jewish directors of the well-known firm of Ferdinand Faber were arrested this morning at Cologne on the pretext of filing false income tax returns. This charge is a new feature in the liquidation of Jewish-controlled firms.

Ask That Yiddish Be Accepted as Subject In American Schools

A decision to launch a movement for the introduction of Yiddish as a subject in the American schools was adopted yesterday at a meeting of progressive Jewish organizations at the Pennsylvania Hotel.

Representatives of nearly fifty branches of the Workmen's Circle, Jewish National Workers' Alliance, Jewish Culture Society, Poale Zion and various types of Yiddish schools participated.

The conference issued a call to the Jewish population throughout the country to carry on the movement to a successful end, emphasizing that the time is ripe for this national undertaking.

Most of the speakers indicated that the question of the study of Yiddish in the American schools is important not only for itself, but even more as an aid in the upkeep of Jewish nationalism and in the combating of assimilation.

Dr. Chaim Zhitlowsky delivered a lengthy address in which he declared that the knowledge of Yiddish would help prepare the American Jewish youth to meet all possible discriminations. He cited the tragic situation in Germany as an example of the necessity to unite Jewish children with the Jewish people through their language, history, culture and literature.

Among the other speakers were David Pinski, Meyer Brown, L. Siegal, Jacob Levine, M. Chanin, and Leibush Lehrer. J. Mendelson presided.

The conference elected an executive committee of twenty-five members, which constituted itself as a permanent body to carry on the movement for the study of Yiddish in the American schools.

Jewish Agency Campaign To Settle German Jews In Palestine Aided

JERUSALEM, April 24 — The Vaad Leumi (Jewish National Council) and the Geman Jewish Association agreed to join with the Jewish Agency for Palestine in its campaign for settlement of German Jews in Palestine. The decision was reached at an all-day conference under the chairmanship of Emanuel Neumann, American representative of the Jewish Agency. Pinchas Ruttenberg, Palestine engineer; M. M. Ussishkin, head of the Jewish National Fund and Dr. Arthur Hantke were present at the conference.

Edouard Herriot Refuses To Discuss Nazi Acts On Way to Washington

Edouard Herriot, the former French Prime Minister and statesman who arrived here on Sunday, on his way to Washington, expressed the warmest feelings towards the Jews and his profound sympathy with suffering German Jewry.

M. Herriot expressed deep regret for not being in a position to discuss now, while on his way to confer in Washington on international problems, the Nazi persecutions in Germany.

Looking out of the window of the tug Macom, which brought him from Quarantine to the railroad in New Jersey and while admiring the New York sky-line, the congenial former French Premier evinced a great interest in the questions put to him by the representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency. He would gladly discuss the Hitler problem, he indicated, but his mission to Washington does not permit him to do so now.

"I am coming here as a guest of President Roosevelt and before I see him, it is not, I think, fair for me to make any statement on international affairs", M. Herriot replied to the question, whether the French government will take any steps towards the alleviation of the lot of the persecuted Jews in Germany.

M. Herriot then emphasized that his attitude toward this question has been clearly brought out in his recent speech at the mass meeting in Lyons, the French city of which M. Herriot is Mayor, called to protest against the anti-Jewish atrocities in Germany.

The noted French statesman promised, however, to speak more freely on this subject on his return from Washington to France.

James W. Gerard, former American Ambassador to Germany, who acted as official welcomer of the City of New York, later made the following remark to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency representative, "You will understand that it is impossible for the French statesman to condemn the present German government today while on his way to Washington to discuss international problems tomorrow with the representative of the same government."

Pasha, of the Arab Executive, published an appeal against immigration into Palestine of German Jews who "destroyed Germany as they did Russia."

which they have given these institutions", Mr. Glucksmann continued. "It should be noted that despite the economic upheaval, not one YMHA or Jewish Center was compelled to close its doors. Salaries of workers have been slashed and expenses have been cut to the bone, but the morale of the Centers has been maintained. With the aid of membership and deficit campaigns conducted with the cooperation of the Jewish Welfare Board, the base of support has been widened. Hence, while the average amount contributed by members has decreased, the total number of supporters has been augmented. The latter have been drawn from all elements in American Jewry — Orthodox, Reform and Conservative. The Jewish Community Center is rapidly taking its place as a unifying factor in American Israel."

of all non-Aryan engineers from positions where their influence or activity might be detrimental to German science.

What he calls the pernicious influence of the Jews in engineering and scientific circles is cited by Herr Feder as the cause of this act.

Meanwhile, extensive preparations are being made everywhere for the general burning of Jewish books set for May 10. Many communities have anticipated the event, and already consigned works of Jewish authorship to the flames. The students of the University of Kiel have collected two thousand volumes, mostly of a non-political nature, in preparation for the bonfire. Scientific and literary books are in preponderance. Reading libraries at many other universities have prohibited the loaning of books of Jewish authorship to students.

The works of Jacob Wassermann, Lion Feuchtwanger, Arnold and Stefan Zweig, and of the non-Jews Emile Zola, and Thomas and Heinrich Mann were among the books seized by storm-troopers in Breslau bookshops, and condemned as unfit for the Aryan mind.
