

Nazi Storm Troopers Use Force to Seize Control of Dental Body

Ask Appointment of Geneva Representative to Protect Jewish Holders of Nansen Passports

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, May 8—Unprecedented brutality was displayed yesterday by uniformed and armed Nazi storm troopers at the annual meeting of the dentists of Berlin. The Nazis invaded the hall where the meeting was held, demanding that the executive board, which included several Jews, resign immediately and that the meeting be conducted under a Nazi presidium. While the Jewish members of the executive committee immediately left the platform, the non-Jewish chairman, a German Nationalist, stubbornly refused, whereupon the Nazis with leveled revolvers dragged him from the hall. At the same time, they ordered all Jewish dentists present to leave the hall.

The meeting continued without its president and Jewish members and elected a "pure" Nazi executive board.

Something must be done to provide better protection for Jewish holders of the Nansen, League of Nations, passports, is the plaint of the Jewish holders of the passports in London, who suggest the appointment of a special representative by Geneva.

The present Nansen representation in Geneva consists of one

Wauchope Promises Visas For 200 More German Jews

JERUSALEM, May 8—High Commissioner Wauchope promised an additional two hundred Palestine visas immediately for German Jews able to meet financial requirements, in an interview with Emanuel Neumann, American member of the Palestine Executive of the Jewish Agency. The interview took place just prior to the High Commissioner's departure from Palestine for London for a month on account of the illness of his sister.

The strike at Petach-Tikva has ended with an agreement reached by all parties.

Anglo-Jewish Association To Aid German Jews To Obtain Livelihood

Chief Rabbi Hertz Aligned With American Jewish Committee Against Demonstrations

LONDON, May 8—Readiness to provide opportunities to earn a livelihood for Jewish refugees from Germany was emphasized by Leonard Montefiore, chairman of the Anglo-Jewish Association, at the annual meeting of the organization yesterday. He declared the main problem was the destiny of the half-million Jews remaining in Germany and stressed the urgency of assisting the German Jewish leaders to save all that can be saved. He promised grants from the funds of the Anglo-Jewish Association for the rehabilitation of the exiled German Jews and those dispossessed in Germany. He quoted the speech of Sir John Simon, Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, in Parliament last month, in which Sir John intimated that some measures of facilitating immigration of German Jews into England and Palestine would be taken. Mr. Montefiore also mentioned the declaration of Stanley

Two Jewish Boys Jailed Fighting London Fascists

LONDON, May 8—Two Jewish youths today were sentenced to five weeks' imprisonment for attacking Fascists selling copies of the Fascist weekly in Piccadilly last night. Conflicting reports about the cause of the fighting in which one Fascist was knocked unconscious, circulated in the London press today. Some of the papers suggested that several women objected to the selling of the weekly and that the two boys, John Feigenbaum, 23, and Hyman Goldstein, 17, intervened. Others maintained that an organized Jewish group began to fight with the Fascists.

Seven were arrested in the scrimmage. Two participants in the fight, including one of the Fascists, were fined nominal amounts. The two imprisoned Jewish youths announced they would appeal the verdict of the court.

Prevent Dismissed Jews From Opening Shops; Extend Numerus Clausus

Sobernheim Ousted from Bank Post; Tax Advisers Lose Permits; Nazis Boycott Wolf Lectures

BERLIN, May 8—Dr. Alfred Hugenberg, Minister of Economics and Agriculture in the Hitler cabinet, today ordered the resignation of Kurt Sobernheim, well-known German-Jewish banker, from the supervisory council of the Zentralbodenkreditanstalt, private commercial bank.

By cabinet decree, a numerus clausus has been initiated against Jewish tax advisers, similar to that in operation in the civil service. Permits to practice, even those granted since the advent of the Hitler Government, were ordered to be withdrawn from all Jewish tax advisers.

A scheme to prevent dismissed Jewish employees from finding any other occupation has been conceived by the Nazis who today declared a six months' ban on the opening of new retail establishments "in the interests and protection of retail trade." This actually means that dismissed Jewish officials and others of the intellectual classes for whom the only possibility of a livelihood existed in their opening of small businesses, now are prevented from following this intention and are compelled to consume their savings

Lodz Germans Anti-Hitler Polish German Party Says

WARSAW, May 8—The German workers of Lodz are emphatically opposed to the Hitler program and condemn the Jewish-German conflicts in the Lodz area, declares the German Socialist Party of Poland. The pro-Hitler councillor, Ewald, in accordance with the party's instructions has resigned his seat on the Lodz municipality council.

Chancellor Hitler, in conversations with Ambassador Wysocki, Polish minister at Berlin, deplored repressive activities against Polish Jews, according to a Berlin dispatch to the "Hajnt," Warsaw Yiddish daily, but gave no assurances there would not be repetition of previous incidents.

Rev. Holmes Gets Gottheil Medal of Z.B.T. This Year

The Reverend John Haynes Holmes of the Community Church, has been awarded the Zeta Beta Tau Gottheil Medal for the year 1932. This medal is given annually by this fraternity to the American who has done the most for Jewry, during the preceding year.

The recipient is selected by the vote of a Committee of Editors of the Anglo-Jewish press of the United States.

The presentation will take place in Boston, Mass., at a banquet at the Copley Plaza Hotel, on May 13th. A three-day convention of Eastern units of Z.B.T. will follow.

The Gottheil Medal was established in honor of Professor Richard J. H. Gottheil of Columbia University, an outstanding leader in Jewish, American and international culture. For many years, Dr. Gottheil was National President of Zeta Beta Tau.

In New York City, May 13th, "Old Timers' Day" will be celebrated at the Ritz-Carlton Hotel, where a ball will be given by the Metropolitan Alumni Club of Zeta Beta Tau.

Artist Wants to

Shed German Name

Lester Rosenfeld wants to be Lester Field. Mr. Rosenfeld, or Field, an artist living at 211 Central Park West, has applied to the Supreme Court for permission to change his name because he is "desirous of abandoning a name which betrays a Germanic family origin entirely opposed to his sympathies and convictions," his petition reveals. He feels a Germanic name "an obstacle to the advantageous disposition of his works and to his position as an artist."

FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION FOR RABBIS URGED AT UNITED SYNAGOGUE OF AMERICA CONVENTION

Election of officers of the United Synagogue of America will take place this morning, winding up the three-day convention of that organization and affiliated bodies, which began here at the Pennsylvania Hotel, Sunday morning.

More than 500 delegates were present, Rabbi Samuel M. Cohen, Executive Director of the United Synagogue announced yesterday. In his review of the year's activities, Rabbi Cohen reported that a total of 51 new congregations had affiliated with the United Synagogue during the year.

Yesterday's sessions were devoted to round table conferences on child and adult education. The fifth annual convention of the affiliated National Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs also took place simultaneously. The speakers were Dr. E. C. Lindemann, who took as his topic "Social Justice and Adult Education" and Theodore Charnas, who spoke on "The Jewish Point of View."

The Women's League also held a session Monday on the program of which were reports by the heads of various committees.

The convention of the main body was opened Sunday morning by Judge Hyman J. Reit, Chairman of the Convention Committee, who urged that a "back to the synagogue" movement be undertaken by the congregations. Louis J. Moss, president of the United Synagogue, followed with an address reviewing the present situation of the synagogue, and pleaded for full freedom of expression for the pulpit.

"It is absolutely essential that our pulpits be untrammelled and that our ministers have complete freedom of expression on all matters which they believe make for the happiness and contentment of the human being," he said. "Their utterances should not be censored even though they be at variance with the views of the dominant group in control of their congregations."

Social Justice Symposium

The same point of view was stressed by a number of speakers participating in a symposium on social justice, including Dr. Solomon Lowenstein, executive director of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies; Rabbi Samuel Freedman, of Philadelphia, and Professor Mordecai M. Kaplan of the Jewish Theological Seminary.

Dr. Lowenstein in his address supporting the full freedom of rabbinical utterance argued that preaching alone would not suffice. "There must be intensive study and discussion and meeting of minds in an absolutely open forum." There were difficulties in the way of con-

gregational free speech, he pointed out, "in the social prejudices of the members of the congregations." Once these difficulties are removed, the rabbi, "grounding himself on the Biblical, Talmudic and Rabbinical tradition and literature, must from this Jewish point of view immerse himself in a knowledge of the economic and sociological structure of the world in which we live. These are no longer simple matters of oppression of the agricultural laborer by the wealthy landlord or the ruling classes against which the prophets fulminated. No one is so simple as to conceive of the present situation merely in terms of a conflict between capital and labor."

Embraces Social Problems

Professor Kaplan told the delegates that Jews must conceive of religion as the Torah does, as being not merely a matter of relationship of the individual to the universe, but as embracing social problems. The Torah dealt very definitely with such matters as poverty, usury and other economic problems and the Jewish rabbi, he said, must voice the Jewish thought on these social matters.

Rabbi Freedman, chairman of the Social Justice Committee of the United Synagogue, outlined plans formulated by this committee to support the movement for social justice among the congregations.

Before immersing itself in world problems, Rabbi Elias Margolis told the delegates, "Jews must integrate their own lives and solidify Jewish thought." "To your tents, oh Israel," was the slogan which Rabbi Margolis said he hoped would go forth from the convention.

Other speakers at the Sunday session were Mrs. Morris Silverman and Congressman Herman P. Koppleman of Connecticut.

Women's League Meets

The Women's League of the United Synagogue of America, opened its convention with a session Sunday night. The opening address was delivered by Mrs. Samuel Spiegel, president of the organization, who made a plea that the Jewish woman evince greater interest in the Jewish youth for the preservation of Judaism.

The principal speaker at the session was Dr. Siegfried Wachsman, Medical Director of Sydenham Hospital, who spoke on "The Psychology of the Jew." Other speakers were Mrs. Israel Davidson, acting president of the New York Branch of the Women's League; Mrs. Martin Strauss, chairman of the credentials committee, and Mrs. Charles I. Hoffman, honorary president of the Women's Synagogue.

Untermyer Backs Boycott At Palestine Campaign Opening in Boston

BOSTON, May 8—Adolf Hitler and the Nazi policy of persecuting the Jews in Germany were vigorously denounced here last night at the demonstration dinner at Symphony Hall which marked the opening of the American Palestine Campaign in Boston. Twenty-five hundred attended the affair which was addressed by Samuel Untermyer, of New York, who delivered the keynote speech; Hon. Elihu D. Stone, of Boston, New England Zionist president; Rabbi Solomon Goldman, of Chicago, and Lieutenant Governor Gaspar Bacon, of Massachusetts.

Mr. Untermyer, in a broadcast speech, declared himself "the ardent champion of an effective boycott that will teach the German people that the Jews have not lost their self-respect. It is the only effective weapon against this brutal onslaught upon our people," he declared. He described Hitler as "the mad hatter of Vienna" and "master of false and poisonous propaganda."

Condemnation of practices of the new German Government was expressed by Lieutenant Governor Bacon who endorses the movement to "establish a Jewish national home in Palestine."

"It is fitting that the Jewish people of America should subscribe to the restoration of the Land of their forefathers," he declared. "What seems to be needed is international action."

Rabbi Goldman declared the position of the Jew in Europe is again being challenged with all the fury and fanaticism of the Middle Ages. Hitler and his Nazis have reminded the Jew that Palestine must be opened to the refugee, to the Jew who is again fleeing discrimination and persecution, he said.

Greetings were extended to the assembled group by Max Shoolman, chairman of the dinner committee; Harry Berman, chairman of the Boston drive, and Judge Jacob J. Kaplan, honorary chairman of the American Palestine Campaign, who acted as toastmaster.

Elected Omaha Commissioner

OMAHA, May 8—Harry Trustin was elected one of Omaha's seven city commissioners, receiving the third largest number of votes.

Trustin has been active in both Jewish and non-Jewish communal affairs. He is a past president of the B'nai Brith and was commander of the Omaha post of the American Legion when it was the largest post in the world.

Los Angeles Jewry Joins in Demands for United Action

LOS ANGELES, May 8—A demand that the B'nai Brith, the American Jewish Congress and the American Jewish Committee take immediate steps to secure united action in order to establish a "leadership that all Jews can follow and that can act as a spokesman and representative of the entire American Jewish people" was voiced at a meeting of representatives of Los Angeles Jewish organizations. Unless such action is taken, it was pointed out, these organizations "will find themselves without followers, which will mean disaster."

In resolutions adopted at the meeting of which Rabbi Edgar F. Magnin was chairman and I. Irving Lipsitch, secretary, other communities throughout the country were urged to take similar action.

The resolution adopted by the meeting follows:

"The present crisis in the world position of the Jewish people emphasizes the need of united, coherent, effective national Jewish leadership in America. Recognizing this as a vital necessity, the representatives of all Jewish organizations of Los Angeles, in meeting duly assembled this fifth day of May, 1933, do hereby declare that our national leaders, entirely forgetful of personalities, should find a way to agreement and to a common purpose and a common platform in order that there may be established a leadership that all Jews can follow and that can act as the spokesman and representative of the entire American Jewish people.

"We therefore demand of the leaders of the Constitution Grand Lodge of the B'nai Brith, the Amer-

Syracuse Will Continue

Good-Will Seminars

SYRACUSE, May 8—The two-day sessions of the Good Will Seminar held here last week at the Hotel Syracuse for Catholics, Jews and Protestants of Central New York, was concluded with the reelection of Rev. Dr. Ray Freeman Jenney, pastor of Park Central Presbyterian church, as permanent chairman of the local movement. Rabbi Jesse Biencfeld of the Temple Adath Yeshurun was reappointed secretary, and Prof. James A. Shea of Lincoln Junior High School as treasurer.

It was the second Good Will Seminar to be held in Syracuse. It has been decided to continue the project, and have such Seminars annually so as to promote friendship and better understanding among all creeds in America.

Local Nazis Ridicule German Jewish Soldiers, Resent May 10th Protest

Two hundred German Nazi sympathizers braved a cold rain Saturday night to gather in the Kreuzer Hall for the regular weekly meeting of the "Friends of Hitler." The meeting, originally scheduled to be held at the Liederkrantz Hall, was moved to the Kreuzer Hall after members of the Liederkrantz Club objected to renting space to Hitler supporters. A large majority of members of the Liederkrantz Club are Jewish, and insisted that future rentals of their auditorium to the "Friends of Hitler" be cancelled. Nazi demands for beer were rejected by the club on Monday in view of club restrictions against serving the beverage to any but members of the society.

The Nazi meeting opened with a vitriolic attack on the Jews by an extemporaneous speaker, who ridiculed the part taken by German Jewish soldiers in the World War. The speaker purported to have served in the German ranks from the outbreak of the war.

Speeches made during the evening equally denounced atrocity propaganda, which was stated to be the creation of French and Jewish publishers, and demanded unity among Germans both at home and abroad.

Special attention was called to Dr. Hjalmar Schacht's denunciation of The New York Times' reports on Jewish persecution in Germany.

"What are the American people to believe?" one speaker asked. "The atrocious lies and propaganda printed in pro-Jewish newspapers or the word of persons like Herr Schacht, who has just come from Germany?"

Outspoken resentment against the Jewish protest parade taking place Wednesday was expressed. The demonstration was described as an overt attempt to promote American

Episcopal Leader Urges Jewish Voice as Nation

SCRANTON, Pa., May 8—Establishment of a Jewish homeland which would permit Jews to have a voice in the world's political and economic affairs as a nation was urged here by the Rev. Dr. Henry Hitt Crane, nationally prominent Methodist Episcopal leader.

Speaking in the fashionable Elm Park Methodist Episcopal Church, Dr. Crane said that "America should be seething in protest against the vicious and cruel persecution of the Jews in Germany."

He attributed Hitlerism to the Versailles treaty, the depression and to resentment of the Jews' "natural intellectual superiority."

Photograph Students

A small number of students who disobeyed the Nazi order to quit lectures given by Professor Wolff at the University of Berlin, were photographed in his classroom so that a record of such "rebellions" might be preserved, today's issue of the Voelkischer Beobachter, chief Nazi organ, reports. The paper describes the circumstances under which the students marched out of Professor Wolff's lecture-room, compelling Professor Wolff to interrupt his lecture and hurriedly depart from the hall.

Professor Wolff is one of the three Jewish professors still left at the university under the official civil service regulations. But despite this, he is nevertheless boycotted by the Nazi students.

Russian, himself a holder of a Nansen passport, and a German who is allegedly a Nazi sympathizer.

The Nansen office in Berlin is flooded with Jewish inquiries and requests for intervention, but it is taking no action, asserting that nothing can be done under the present regime. It is believed that a special Geneva representative could accomplish more for the protection of holders of the Nansen passports.

Hebrew U. Needs Room, Equipment for More Students

JERUSALEM, April 15—Applications and inquiries from Jewish students in seventeen foreign countries seeking admission into the Hebrew University were received during the first quarter of 1933, according to figures available here. First in line of 135 applicants was Poland, from which 57 inquiries were received; next was America, and third was Germany.

Over half of the applicants inquired regarding admission into the Faculty of Humanities. Of the 73 would-be students who so applied, 36 were enrolled for the summer term of this year.

Some of the countries from which applications came were Italy, Algeria, South Africa, Belgium, Hungary, Yugoslavia, Latvia, Egypt, Iraq, Czechoslovakia, France, Roumania, and Switzerland.

Inquiries are showing a tendency to increase owing to the condition of Jews in European countries. The Hebrew University could take care of many of the harassed young Jewish men and women at present subject to persecution in certain universities abroad or debarred from higher study in their own countries, if additional funds were made available to strengthen the teaching staff and to increase accommodation and equipment, particularly in the laboratories. Restriction of space now rules out the admission of a large number of foreign Jewish students.

Announce National Fund Grant at University Tea

JERUSALEM, April 15—The establishment of a chair at the Hebrew University, to be devoted to land problems, was announced here by M. Ussishkin, head of the Jewish National Fund, at a tea given by the Society of the Friends of the Hebrew University at the King David Hotel. Chancellor Magnes of the University, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of the United States, and Mr. Justice Gad Frumkin of the Palestine High Court were present at the tea. Mr. Ussishkin stated that the Jewish National Fund would contribute \$500 annually for the chair.

boycott of German goods. One speaker facetiously declared that the boycott could have little effect on Germany's foreign trade, because Germany has no foreign trade. The Versailles Treaty saw to that, he declared.

Speakers bewailed at length the "present humiliation" of Germany; and they stated that the only means of elevating Germany to a par with other countries was that of unified action under Hitler. The audience was called upon to subordinate individual state and party opinions to policies of the present administration.

The need of pro-Hitler sentiment among expatriates as well as among Germans at home was stressed. It was stated that Germans abroad could never hope to attain social parity with natives of their adopted country so long as Germany continued to be regarded as an inferior power.

The National-Socialist Party in the United States, which was "dissolved" one month ago, continues to operate in new headquarters at an undisclosed address. Regular Saturday night meetings will continue to be held in the Kreuzer Hall, which has been newly decorated. A large American flag and equally large black swastika enclosed by a white circle in a red field drape the windows behind the rostrum. A banner, running half the length of the hall, summons in German, "Awake, Germans!" The crowd closed each speech with a vociferous "Hail Hitler!" The meeting was adjourned after the audience with the Nazi salute sang the Hitler anthem.

Much Nazi literature was distributed among the audience, while German Nazi papers and the America's Deutsche Post enjoyed extensive sales.
