Central Verein Involved In Charges Against Marx In Frankfurt Arrests

Bar Yiddish, Hebrew, in Baden Markets, Kottbus Peddlers Lose Licenses: Kosher Meat in Berlin

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, May 10-Grave charges against the Central Verein, the Central Union of German Iews, in connection with the arrest of Dr. Marx, representative of the organization, in Frankfurt, are disclosed today in the Frankfurter Zeitung for the first time, although Dr. Marx has been under arrest for about two weeks. Allegedly, Dr. Marx bribed a Frankfurt police officer and former member of the police presidium, named Mochrdel, who also has been arrested for combatting the Nazi movement, and illegally secured copies and photographs of official acts and helped cover up the tracks of other officials who helped the work of the organization.

The charges against Herr Steinberg, former police president and prominent Frankfurt Jewish leader, who was released yesterday after two weeks' imprisonment on charges of "passive bribery", have not been dropped, it was learned today, despite his release. Investigation of the case is expected to be concluded within a few days.

The Nazi commissar in Baden has issued a decree that Jews in public markets must not converse in Yid-dish or Hebrew. His ruling applies to other public places as well. The Mayor of Kottbus has gone even further in ordering Jewish vendors (Continued on Page 4)

Jews Boom Palestine Commerce Report States (Tewish Daily Bulletin)

WASHINGTON, May 10 - A wave of prosperity in Palestine, exceeding that of the pre-depression days, is reported by the United States Department of Commerce. Factories are working at full capacity to meet the increased demands for domestic products, the depart-ment said, "and the demand for labor in the building trades and agriculture is growing daily. The steady immigration of Jews from other countries is believed largely responsible for the upturn."

Goering Speech Reveals Continued Use of Terror To Quet Jews from Firms

Simultane-ously with this declaration of Captain Goering, however, additional announcements were made of the expulsion of Jews from business con-cerns. Torchlight Procession Through Berlin Streets Precedes Book Burning (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, May 10-The most extensive preparations were being made tensive preparations were being made throughout the Reich today for to-night's funeral pyres of "un-Ger-man spirited" books, mostly by Jew-ish authors. Over twenty thousand volumes were collected in Berlin in specially mobilized motor cars and trucks, from private libraries and homes. For several hours preceding the bonfires, a torchlight procession was marching from the Oranienburwas marching from the Oranienburgerstrasse in military formation to the Brandenburger Gate and along Unter den Linden to the Opera House Square, where the huge fire was to be lit.

Not all the books collected were to be burned, however, A large pro-portion of the seized volumes are to be sent to the paper mills to be re-converted into pulp. For this reason several paper mills provided the vehicles used in collecting the con-demned books.

Philadelphia Society Protests Treatment Of Doctors by Nazis

May Invite Profession's Leaders To Hold Clinics in America; Replace German Products (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

PHILADELPHIA, May 10—The Philadelphia County Medical Society, one of the largest of its kind in this country, yesterday raised its voice "against the injustice visited upon members in the medical profession in Germany" and called upon the Pennsylvania State Medical Society and the American Medical Association to communicate with their col-leagues in Germany "irrespective of birth or descent" to bring about the abolition "of a discrimination so re-puguant to the spirit of science and of humanity."

Abraham Meyer Dies, Was Chicago Attorney (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

CHICAGO, May 10 - Abraham Meyer, nationally known authority on banking law and long a member of the famous Chicago law firm of Mayer, Meyer Austrian and Platt, died Saturday in Paris, France, after a three-month illness, according to word received here at his firm's offices today. He was 61 years old.

Mr. Meyer, a brother-in-law of the late Levy Meyer, with whom he ranked as a corporation lawyer, had gone to Paris on the advice of his physicians to consult noted specialists there. He was especially famed among lawyers as an authority on the intricacies of the law of negotiable instruments.

Born in Chicago, July 27, 1871, he was educated in the public grammar and high schools, received his bachelor's degree at Yale in 1892 and a law degree at Lake Forest University in 1896. For a time he was counsel for the old American Trust and Sayings Bank, a constituent of the present Continental Illinois Bank. That association gave him his first deep interest in banking law, which he retained throughout his life.

He is survived by four sisters He was a member of the American, Illinois and Chicago Bar Associations, and the Standard, Harvard-Yale-Princeton and Lake Shore Country Clubs.

D'AVIGDOR GOLDSMID APPEALS FOR AID FOR GERMAN JEWS: SAYS PALESTINE SOLE REFUGE

day visit to this country, O. E. D'Avigdor Goldsmid, chairman of the council of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, addressing the Eastern Parkway section of the American Palestine Campaign at the Brooklyn Jewish Center, called for "exceptional sacrifices to meet a unique situation" in extending relief to the Jews of Germany.

Mr. Goldsmid asserted that in addition to the claim which Palestine has upon Jews "on sentimental and religious grounds, it has, under present day circumstances, a still greater claim at being to all intents and purposes the only country open to those suffering from discriminatory legislation of the German Government."

His views on the importance of His views on the importance of Palestine for meeting the problem of homeless Jews were emphasized in the address of Morris Rothenberg, president of the Zionist Organization of America. Other speakers at the dinner were Robbi I. H. Levintal, of the Broodkyn Jewish Center; and Milton Good, Chairman of the Control of the C effort for Palestine.

"The rebuilding of Palestine should be acceptable to every think-ing Jew," Mr. Goldsmid said. "It should be acceptable to those who have hitherto considered Palestine as an experiment. It should be acceptable to those who have been out of sympathy on other grounds with the movement. And today in addition to claim which Palestine has upon us on sentimental and religious grounds, it has, under present day circumstances, a still greater claim as being to all intents and purposes the only country open to those suffering from discriminatory legislation of the German Govern-We know that a number of the refugees, particular the younger generation, are desperately anxious to go to Palestine today. The ar-rival of new immigrants involves additional expenditures of all kinds which the Agency must be in a position to meet, as it is the only body in Palestine that is responsible for the admission of the immigrants. In order, therefore, to meet that situation, it is essential that additional funds should be provided the Agency, quite apart from the current day to day expenditures, which the Agency has not been able to meet.

Unheard of Situation

Palestine Promises Solution

In his remarks, Mr. Rothenberg pointed out that while Jews will never yield their inalienable right to live on a basis of equality with and to enjoy the same privileges as all other citizens in the lands of their birth or adoption, the task of finding a solution for hundreds of thousands who must flee from persecution or whose existence has been made impossible by economic discrimination, is inescapable." "Palestine," he said, "while not

offering a complete solution to the physical aspect of the Jewish problem, is at least the most promising solution for hundreds of thousands of our people seeking a refuge and loriging to live a consciously Jewish life. Every other country has its doors barred. The noble tradition which this and other enlightened countries long honored of opening their portals to the oppressed and the disinherited of the earth, has under the newer conception of civilization been thrown into the discard."

Synagogue Group to Act For United Leadership In American Jewry

Louis J. Moss was re-clected President of the United Synagogue of America at the closing sessions of the convention held here at the Hotel Pennsylvania. The remaining officers will be elected by the executive council of the organiza-

tion at its next meeting. Matters varying from the persecution of the Jews in Germany to birth control were discussed at the final meeting. A series of resolu-tions were adopted, one of them deploring "the division within the recognized leadership of American Israel" in the matter of the German situation. The resolution provides for the appointment of a committee to work towards a "united leader-ship for our people."

Another angle towards the solution of the problem of German Jewry was approached in a resolution which urged the adoption "on the part of England of a more liberal policy with reference to immigration into Palestine of Jewish re-

fugees from Germany. The convention also went on record as indorsing the program of social justice, outlined by the special committee of the United Synagogue. A supplementary resolution calls upon the incoming social justice committee "that it study the question of birth control and present definite recommendations on the subject at its next convention.

"Be it also further resolved that a copy of these resolutions or others, when finally adopted by the American Medical Association, be sent to President Roosevelt, Secretary of State Hull, and Dr. Royal S. Copeland, United States Senator, from New York, with a request that they be spread upon the Congressional Record."
