Nazis to Bar Jewish Cattle Dealers, Tax Jewish Hops Exporters

Extending Terroristic Tactics to Small Provincial Traders; "Tak-ing Over" More Jewish Firms

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, May 18-Confiscation of Jewish business properties under the pretext of "corruption" is becoming a daily event here. The Voelkische Beobachter, Nazi government organ, reports today that the Nazi party has "taken over" the Jewish firm of Adolf Somerfeld, which has been in business here for many years and employed twelve hundred. Somerfeld was compelled to flee to Switzerland.

In addition to the use of terroristic methods in supplanting Jewish firms, the head of the economic department of the Nazi party is now planning similar tactics against small traders in the provinces.

It is reliably learned that within a week orders will be promulgated prohibiting Jews from engaging in the cattle trade and imposing special taxes on Jews exporting hops to America to be used in the brewing of beer.

The order prohibiting Jews from engaging in the cattle trade will be based on the pretext that Jewish dealers are deceiving and underpaying German peasants. It will affect hundreds of Jewish cattle-dealers whose families have engaged in the trade for generations.

Took Advantage of Peasants

The argument for the tax on hops exporters is that the Jews, in con-tracting for the crops last Septem-ber, took advantage of the farmers and paid them low prices for their (Continued on Page 4)

Roosevelt Under Jewish Influence, Nazis Charge (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, May 18-President Roosevelt is acting under Jewish influence, according to two Nazi organs, the Stuermer and the Deutsche Allgemeine Zeitung, today. The latter, in a lengthy, obviously governmentinspired editorial, explains President Roosevelt's "anti-German" attitude as due to the fact that three of his most influential advisers are Jews. The paper expresses surprise that no ambassador has yet been appointed to represent the United States in Germany. It does not, however, mention the storm of protest which swept over Germany when it was reported here that President Roosevelt was considering the appointment of Herbert Bayard Swope, outstanding American Jewish editor.

The Stuermer deplores that President Roosevelt, definitely a friend of

the Jews, is ruling America "in a pure Jewish way", supporting Poland against Germany. The paper criti-cizes the invitation of Ignace Paderewski, former Polish premier, and world-famous musician, to the White world-i

The paper is also unsparing in its attacks on the New York Times, which it says is working against German interests both politically and economically.

Transjordan Anti-Jewish Conference Ends in Riot (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JERUSALEM, May 18-The con-

ference of Transjordanian nationalists for action against Jewish settlements in the region, which was scheduled to take place at Essalt vesterday, was not held because of sharp clashes between the organizers of the conference and their opponents. Several were wounded in the dispute. As a result, the conference has been postponed until Tune 5. A delegation representing Trans-

ordanian inhabitants called upon Emir Abdullah, ruler of Transiordania, and complained of widespread starvation among the people. Emir Abdullah promised to ask the British Government for help.

British Jewry Unites In Appeal for Relief Of Jews of Germany

Zionists and Non-Zionists Agree to Combine Fund Efforts; Seek Two Million Dollars (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, May 18 - A united committee to appeal for funds for German Jewish relief was constituted here today, bringing to successful conclusion negotiations between Zionists and non-Zionists for

a merger of the two relief efforts. The presidium of the committee as announced today, is composed of as announced today, is composed of Lord Reading, Dr. Chaim Weiz-mann, former president of the World Zionist Organization; Lionel Rothschild, Chief Rabbi Joseph Hertz and Nahum Sokolow, presi-dent of the World Zionist Organization and of the Jewish Agency.

It is hoped that the committee will be able to raise a half million pounds (approximately two million dollars) in England alone. Alloca-tion of the funds raised, which formed the chief difficulty in the course of the negotiations and once led to their unsuccessful termina-tion, was left open. An allocation committee for distributing relief partly among the Jews in Germany and among Jewish refugees in other countries and partly in reconstruc-tive work, the bulk of which will be in Palestine, will be named. exact proportion of the funds to be used in Palestine, however, was not determined, the non-Zionist group pointing out that at this time it is difficult to foretell how the situation may develop in the future. But a "substantial proportion," it was agreed will be devoted to Palestine.

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Boycott Group Organizing Printing Trade, Plans Christian Division

The American League for the De-fense of Jewish Rights is calling a conference of the printing trade to put into effect the German boycott age of medieval darkness." sponsored by the league and to apportion the work of printing a mil-lion placards. The placards are to be distributed and posted all through the United States urging observance of the boycott. This conference will be held within the next few days, it was said yesterday at the league's headquarters.

At the same time the league announced that a Christian Division is in the process of formation. A prominent New York attorney will organize this division, it was said. The league also announced receipt

of a letter from Mrs. Mary Harris president of the New York Ladies Auxiliary Consumptive Relief Society, comprising 2,000 members, applying for admission to the league and offering its fullest cooperation.

Federation Women Meet Today to Plan Relief

The newly-elected officers and directors of the Women's Division of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies, head-ed by Mrs. Sidney C. Borg, will hold their first meeting of the year this morning at the Federation Building. In view of the serious relief and other problems growing out of the

business depression, which confront all of the ninety-one charitable agencies affiliated with the Federation, the women's group is preparing now for the active campaign for funds which will be undertaken in the fall.

JEWISH DAILY BULLETIN American Jew Describes Jewish Life in Reich (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

DETROIT, May 18-"A Detroit Jew", writing from Berlin to the De-troit News, describes the horrors suffered by German Iews and the reasons for their silence.

"When the first reports of riot, murder and mistreatment reached foreign shores from Germany," he wrote, "the leaders of our new gov ernment feared the reputation of this country would be harmed and immediately issued a proclamation commanding every man, woman and child to write their foreign relatives that nothing of the sort happened in order to save Germany's reputation and put their leader in a better light.

"In reality, much has happened, and as soon as letters are not censored, our foreign brethren will hear enough to make them condemn forever Hitler and his tactics. For the present, we 'chosen people', boycotted and ousted humiliated and made to feel homeless and without equal rights, without a fatherland, and without much hone, are getting tired and weary of hearing the reports that 'nothing happened here'. Oh no, nothing happened, but for centuries the world will speak of 1933 as the

Warning from Metz

Acknowledging that "conditions in Germany are very bad", Herman A. Metz, in an open letter to Samuel Untermyer, warned that "the more the Jews here agitate, the more they irritate those now in nower in Ger-

Mr. Mctz, who recently returned from a trip to Germany to observe conditions at first hand, said that he himself was in sympathy with any protest against racial or religious discrimination.

He defended the Hitler regime as having accomplished good in the unification of Germany, and as having "brought within sight a clean-up of intolerable conditions under which it was placed by the Versailles Treaty and the agitation of other New Labor Regulations countries against them."

"Unless outside influences tend to aggravate the feeling against the Iews in general owing to local conditions of which the Germans should he the best judges in their own coun-try, things would ease up materially." said Mr. Metz.

Mr. Metz denied that his connection with the dye and chemical industries influenced his views in any way. saying that at least 80 percent of such products consumed in this country, including those handled by the concerns in which he is interested, are made in the United States.

Washington Fund Drive Onened at Meeting (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Morris Rothenberg, president of the Zionist Organization of America. who addressed the meeting, described Palestine as the only land inwhich refugee Jews might find op-portunity to establish themselves-permanently.

Other speakers were Rabbi William F. Rosenblum of New York and I. E. Kaufman, co-chairman of the campaign. Isadore Hershfield, the other co-chairman, presided.

Boston Libraries Aid Jewish Book Week (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

BOSTON, May 18-Special pro-grams devoted to Jewish books and to the Jew in literature are being presented in this city this week in connection with the annual observ-ance of Jewish Book Week, being commemorated throughout the country. This is the seventh national observance, designed to revive interest in Jewish books and to focus attention on valuable Jewish literature and outstanding Jewish authors, with a view to creating greater good will and a better understanding between

Libraries, synagogues, religious schools, and study groups have stressed the gospel of Jewish Book Week throughout the city during the week. The Boston Public Library is cooperating with the Boston Jewish Book Week Committee, composed of prominent men and women of the city, by holding special exhibits at the various branches of the Library. Rare Hebraica and Judaica are on display in the Treasure Room of the Library. At the West End branch, an exhibit was devoted to the Jewish (Continued on Page 4)

Affect Jews in Greece C. T. A. Mail Service)

SALONICA — Several hundred Jews residing in Salonica and Athens will be affected by the recent promulgation of laws forbidding foreigners living in Greece from per-forming manual labor in certain trades. It is feared that these new regulations will force a number of Jews to quit the country since they will be unable to hold their jobs. The laws will be put into effect gradually, according to the decision of the parliamentary commission of the

Government party.

Visitors Banned for Jewish Prisoners in Concentration Camps

(J. T. A. Mail Service)

CHEMNITZ-Regulations governing the treatment of the prisoners in concentration camps throughout Saxony have been published. They pro-vide for the separation of the prisoners into two classes: young prisoners capable of being reformed-in the Nazi sense-and hardened sinners-members of non-Nazi organizations and officials of Marxist orga-

Although all prisoners are supposed to have been incarcerated on political grounds, numerous Jews now in the concentration camps have been imprisoned on all kinds of false charges in order to separate them from their businesses and thus enable the Nazi economic groups to deal the more easily with Jewish businesses marked down either for Nazi absorption or destruction.

Among the prisoners in the concentration camps in Saxony are some thirty Jewish businessmen Chemnitz and the neighborhood, who were arrested early last March, as part of an organized Nazi plan to drive Jews from the textile industry. In most cases these men were arrested on accusations made by members of the Christian-Retailers and Wholesalers Unions, who are still waging a bitter war against the few Jewish merchants remaining in busi-

The regulations for the treatment of prisoners of concentration camps make no specific mention of Jews as such, although they provide that prisoners may receive one visit weekly from a Christian clergyman. They may also be visited once fortnightly by a near relative and may send out one postcard weekly.

Although, since the publication of these regulations, a number of rela-tives of prisoners have been allowed to visit their relatives, numerous applications by Jewish relatives of prisoners has merely led to a great deal of correspondence, but without any official visiting permit being issued to them.

Leaves German Ship As Protest Gesture

Dr. Bruno Birnbaum, noted German political economist, who was a passenger on the around-the-world cruise of the Hamburg-American liner Resolute, left the ship at Yokohama as a gesture of protest against the anti-Semitic program put into effect in Germany, fellow passengers disclosed yesterday when the vessel docked here. The persecutions start-ed while Dr. Birnbaum was on the high seas.

German-Jewish Organ Analyzes Statistics On School Attendance

In view of Nazi claims that the "overcrowded" conditions in German schools and high schools which has resulted in decrees practically closing these institutions to Jewish students, the Jewish Daily Bulletin publishes here a translation of an analysis of the situation which apneared in the C.-V. Zeitung, official organ of the Central Union of German Jews.

"In order to show the general effeet which the 'Law Against the Ov-ercrowding of the German Schools and High Schools, of April 25, 1933' will have on the non-Aryan classes, it seems to us important to give here some material available for this pur-pose in the official statistical publications of the high schools.

"The latest official figures refer to the summer-session of 1932, during which the number of native students of all the high schools of the German Reich amounted to 123,048. Of these, 103,353 were male students and 19,695 female students. These figures for the summer session of 1932 may represent the limit for the present. They are in the summer session of 1932 already lower than those of the 1932 already fower than those of the loars of rigger Education.

"The number of the native students in the German high schools exceeds that of the matriculated forcigners in the Reich by 6,558. This is a figure which has suffered a decrease of 8 percent in comparison with the summer session of 1931. The drop in the case of the foreign students in the Reich is thus still greater than in the case of the na-tive students. The total number of the native and foreign students of the Reich in the German high schools in the summer session of 1932 amounted to 129,606. Of these 5,233 were of the Jewish faith, i.e., 4.02 percent. A comparison of the total Boston Congregation number of male and female students and the number of Tewish students (Continued on Page 4)

Metropolitan Section Names Delegates to Congress Sessions

Delegates to represent New York City at the sessions of the American Jewish Congress, to be held at the Hotel Willard, Washington, May 20 to 22, were elected Wednesday night, at a meeting of constituent organizations, held at the Hotel Pennsylvania.

The conference will consider further action on the situation facing the German Jews. One session will be devoted to a discussion on the subject of the World Jewish Congress. Other sessions are to discuss organizational problems and the reports of important Congress committees.

New York City will be represented by 320 delegates elected by local organizations and 65 delegates elected by national groups. The meeting ratified the election of the delegates. The New York delegation will be headed by Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, headed by Rabin Stephen S. Wise, honorary president and Bernard S. Deutsch, president of the American Jewish Congress; Borough President Samuel Levy, George Z. Medalie, United States Attorney; Louis Lip-sky, national chairman of the American Palestine Campaign; M. BERLIN, May 18-Fines will be levied against customers and pat-rons of Jewish shops in Wuerzburger, General Nazieger, Nazi com-missar, has announced in Wurzburg.

"The Jews are not friends of the German people," he declared The Germans are deadly enemies of the Germans are deadly enemies of the Jews and vice versa. Germans con-sistent in their belief, will refuse to buy from Jews. Unfortunately, some do not possess this pride and feeling of honor, particularly the women, some of whom openly, others secretly, continue to purchase from Jews. It also becomes necessary to form a women's department for traitors and it is similarly advisable to brand and mark women persisting in making purchases from Jews, to fine them and publish their

names in the press.
"Germans should beware of these women who no longer have anything in common with the German na-tion since one of these days which is not far away, we will settle our account also with such people." The Juedische Rundschau, which

"The Russian anti-Semites were amateurs compared to the Hitlerites. At the most they killed a few hun-dred at a time. The Nazi 'pogrom-stchiks' threaten the lives and wellbeing of 600,000 people. Only the other day a German-Jew said to me, there are only three courses open to the Iews in Germany; economic extermination, suicide or emigration'. If we here do nothing, it will be extermination for German Jewry. This is the word of Hitler himself, in his speeches he used the German word vernichten'. We are told that we should leave it to the German Iews to negotiate with their own govern-ment. But there is no one to nego-tiate with. There are no negotiations in Germany-only orders-and orders have been given to destroy the Ger-man Jews."

Other speakers who addressed the meeting included: Judge Hartman, Professor Chayim Chernowitz, Mr. Perlman, Dr. Ratnoff and Mr. Fox.

Over 95 local organizations as well as many national groups were represented at the meeting.

Joel Slonim Honored

A resolution thanking Joel Slonim, prominent Yiddish newspaperman, for his efforts in connection with the anti-Hitler demonstration in New York City, was unanimously adopted by the steering committee of the American Jewish Congress which directed the protest.

"These numbers of the male and female students of the Jewish faith include only those who for the statistical study indicated that they belonged to the Jewish race. One can assume that the number of students. whose religion is unknown, to a cer-tain extent includes also Jews and young men of Jewish descent; as well as that the numbers of students of the Evangelical and Catholic re-ligions include offsprings of Jewish fathers and mothers, and grandfathers and grandmothers, respec-The total number of stutively. dents of unknown faith of the summer session of 1932 in the German Reich amounts to fully 1,900, i.e., to about 1.5 percent of the total number of the students. If one counts a third of that as directly or indirectly Jewish, there results a proportion of 0.5, which if added to the above mentioned average proportion of 4.02 percent of students of the Tewish faith, would give a total propor-tion of fully 4.05 percent. Herein are not included, however, the above mentioned groups of those students, who are of Jewish descent, but belong to one of the Christian reli-gions. Due to the lack of information, it is impossible to determine exactly the number of Christian students of Jewish descent. One has to forego an estimate also, mainly for the reason that there is no material of any kind available for the other population groups from which an inference as to the composition of the student body might be
