## 60,000 Families in Berlin Hopefully Look to Zion; Nazi Terror Is Unabated

Half of City's Jews Register for  
Palestine Information; Roll of  
Slain and Beaten Mounts

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, May 20—More than 60,000 Jewish families, half of the entire German-Jewish population, have registered at the Palestine bureau in Berlin to obtain information regarding emigration to Palestine, it was learned from highly reliable sources today. Only a very small proportion of these families are Zionists but all are anxious to leave Germany as soon as possible.

The position of the Jews of Germany today is no better than it was in the first days of the Nazi revolution. A wave of terror has suddenly been renewed in the last three days, both in Berlin and in the provinces, and a new series of excesses has been reported.

On Wednesday the home of the Polish Jew, Moishe Poliwood, in the Grenadierstrasse, was invaded by Nazis who dragged Poliwood from the house. He has disappeared without a clue as to his whereabouts.

Another Nazi group kidnaped the twenty-one-year-old son of a milk-dealer, Mendel Scherer. Young Scherer was later found with both legs smashed, totally blind in one eye, and his face pitifully crushed.

## Nazis Ask Latvian Gov't For List of Refugee Names

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

RIGA, Latvia, May 20—The social-democratic newspaper here discloses that the German embassy has officially requested the Latvian Government for a list of the German refugees now in Latvia. The paper claims the German Government wants the names for reprisals against the relatives of the refugees still in Germany. It urges the Latvian Government, under no circumstances to divulge the names, demanding a protest against the attempted intervention of the German Government in Latvia's internal affairs.

The Zionist Organization of Latvia has invited pioneers (Chalutzim) to the Zionist farm in Latvia where Palestinian settlers are trained.

## Galician Jew Who Saved Life of Hitler Rewarded; Dubious on Call to Berlin

A Galician Jew who served in the same company with Adolf Hitler during the War, and who saved Hitler's life, has received a thousand marks from the Nazi Chancellor and an invitation to visit Berlin, Warsaw papers, received here yesterday, assert.

The former Jewish soldier recognized Hitler's pictures and wrote him, recalling the incident. The gift and invitation followed. The German consul is quoted as declaring he has instructions to issue the necessary visa.

Hitler's former companion is in a quandary. He would like to ask the Chancellor to end Jewish persecutions, but his friends warn him not to go to Berlin, lest the Nazis do away with him in order to remove a possible source of embarrassment to their chief.

## Belgian Faculty Members Protest Nazi Persecution

ANTWERP, May 20—The entire professional corps of Belgian universities, comprising 154 faculty members, signed a letter appearing in the press yesterday protesting against Nazi discrimination against sections of the German population "because of their race or creed". The signatories to the letter also express their sympathy with the victims of persecution.

## Nazi Attacks Against Jews In Austria Are Increasing

VIENNA, May 20—Attacks by Nazis against the Jews in the provincial sections of Austria are increasing, it was learned today. The police report discloses that four Nazis under arrest have confessed to carrying out attacks against the Jews at the instigation and orders of Nazi storm troops.

Nazi gangs at St. Poelten stoned Jewish women pedestrians, it was learned. Two Jewish girls were injured. The windows in many Jewish stores and homes were smashed during the disturbances.

## Silesian Jews' Plea Gets Right of Way at League Of Nations' Council

Urgency of Crisis Facing "Non-Aryans" in Plebiscite Region  
Is Recognized at Geneva

GENEVA, May 20—The General Secretary of the League of Nations has recognized the urgency of the two petitions presented to the minorities section earlier this week for intervention in behalf of the Jews in the plebiscite region of Upper Silesia, and the petitions will be submitted directly to the League Council for consideration.

The importance of this recognition of the urgency of the situation, stressed by Dr. Leo Motzkin and Dr. Emil Margulies when they presented the petition, lies in that, instead of following the routine procedure of referring the petitions first to the accused state for its observations, the complaints will be communicated directly to the council.

The decision of the General Secretary has aroused considerable interest in League circles. The petition of the Upper Silesian Jewish citizens, submitted under Article 147 of the German-Polish convention, is being immediately placed on the council agenda, while the petition of Jewish organizations under Article 72 of the same convention, in accordance with general minorities procedure, will be turned over to a committee of three members of the council for investigation.

This committee of three will meet beginning next week. It is expected to recommend that the petition submitted by the Jewish organizations in various countries be considered by the council simultaneously with that of the Upper Silesian Jews.

## Roumanian University Closed After Anti-Semitic Rioting

BUCHAREST, May 20—The University of Cluj has been closed down for the remainder of the term following anti-Jewish disturbances there. Forty students guilty of organizing an attack on the Jewish students at the institution have been expelled by the university senate.

### **Samuel P. Schwartz Dies; Noted Indiana Attorney** (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

**SOUTH BEND, Ind., May 21**—Funeral services were held here for Samuel P. Schwartz, one of Indiana's most prominent criminal attorneys and prosecuting attorney of St. Joseph county for three terms. Mr. Schwartz died suddenly Friday of a cerebral hemorrhage. He was forty-one years old and is survived by his widow and one daughter.

He was well-known as a cross-examiner and for his use of the "insanity plea" as a defense advocate. He was known as a careful student of law and literature. He was active in the work of the Democratic party and in B'nai Brith circles and Temple Beth-El activities.

### **Camels Yield to Motors, Palestine Survey Shows** (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

**JERUSALEM (by mail)**—The camel, which even until recently was the chief means of transportation in Palestine, is being rapidly replaced by the automobile.

There were thirty motor cars in all of Palestine in 1920. Today, a count reveals no less than 5,000.

### **Braude in Finance Post**

**CHICAGO, May 21**—Jacob M. Braude, president of the Chicago Zionist Organization for the past two years, has been appointed as Assistant Director of Finances of Illinois by Judge Henry Horner.

Mr. Braude has been active in Jewish communal activities in Chicago and served as chairman of the All-Chicago Chanukah festival last December.

### **Hebrew University Press Issues Fichte**

"The Vocation of Man", by Johann G. Fichte, which has just been published in Hebrew by the Hebrew University Press at Jerusalem, is the latest addition to the series of Philosophical Classics, many of which are appearing in Hebrew for the first time. The pocket edition of Fichte's classic is designed for use as a text in the Philosophy courses of the Hebrew University, and is sold, as are the other numbers in the series, at a minimum price to the general public of Palestine and abroad. "The Vocation of Man" was translated into Hebrew by Abraham Yaari, of the University staff, and edited by Dr. Hugo Bergmann, librarian, and a member of the Department of Philosophy.

"The Philosophical Classics" are issued under the general editorship of Professor Leon Roth, head of the Department of Philosophy of the Hebrew University, and formerly of the University of Manchester, England. The series include Book I of Aristotle's "Metaphysics" (translated for the first time directly from the original into Hebrew); Descartes' "Discourse on Method" and "Meditations on First Philosophy"; Kant's "Metaphysics of Ethics"; Leibniz's "New System and Monadology" and Rousseau's "Social Contract." The books are sold in this country by the Bloch Publishing Co., New York City, official agents for the Hebrew books issued by the Hebrew University Press Association.

During the past year the circulating book department of the Hebrew University lent 29,758 volumes to residents of Palestine, not only including the Jewish population, but Moslems and Christian scholars, who make use of the Library facilities, according to the report submitted by Dr. Bergmann to the League of Nations for the mandatory power, in accordance with word received by Dr. A. S. W. Rosenbach, bibliophile and book collector of New York and Philadelphia, and president of the American Friends of the Hebrew University. There are over 256,000 volumes in the Hebrew University Library. In addition to establishing a branch Medical Library in Tel-Aviv for use of physicians, the Library also commenced last year regularly to supply all medical books and bulletins to hospitals at Haifa and Afulah, according to the report.

### **Syracuse University Houses Zionist Exhibit**

**SYRACUSE, May 20**—An exhibition of Palestinian art work, plant life, statistical growth of the land, various newspapers and the latest literary output, activities of the Hebrew University and of the Jewish National Fund, is being conducted, until the closing of school, in the main lobby of the Syracuse University campus library. The collection is the property of Ben-Naim Pine, violinist and a junior in the College of Fine Arts, who, while in the Holy Land for more than two years, specialized in gathering the natural and creative material of Palestine.

This exhibition of modern Palestine is sponsored by the local branch of Avukah, student Zionist Federation of America, and local branches of the Young Poale Zion Alliance, as part of the campaign inaugurated by the Alliance to spread among American students greater acquaintance with the modern Jewish literary, artistic and scientific developments. Louis Gross, junior in the Liberal Arts College, is president of the Syracuse chapter. Mr. Pine is one of the leaders of the four branches of the Young Poale Zion Alliance in Syracuse.

Last year a similar display was shown in the Public Library here in connection with the 11th Young Poale Zion Alliance convention, which was held in the city at that time. The exhibition was unusual and rumors of it soon spread throughout the country. The Jewish National Fund in Jerusalem was so pleased with this unique form of teaching people about Palestine that it asked Mr. Pine to describe his display in his own words. The article was then translated into every language and was published in every country where there is an interest in Palestine and in the work of the Jewish National Fund.

### **Labor, Lawyers, M.D.'s Coordinate** (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

**BERLIN, May 20**—A united front has been created by all unions of employees here with the decision to bar Jews from membership.

The association of lawyers today adopted resolutions affiliating its members, in a body, with the Nazi lawyers' association. The medical association also decided to amalgamate with the Nazi doctors' group.

**American Zionists****To Hold Convention  
In Chicago, July 1-4**

The Zionist Organization of America will hold its thirty-sixth annual convention in Chicago beginning Saturday evening, July 1 through to July 4, Morris Rothenberg, president of the organization, announced yesterday.

The convention will coincide with Jewish Day, July 3, at the Century of Progress, and Dr. Chaim Weizmann, former president of the World Zionist Organization and of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, who will be in Chicago in connection with Jewish Day, will be the guest of honor at a banquet tendered him by the convention delegates on July 4.

Issues upon which American candidates will stand for election to the World Zionist Congress which will be held in August, probably in Carlsbad, are expected to be formulated at the Chicago meeting. Elections for the American delegates will be held in nation-wide balloting July 9.

Asserting that the delegates at the Chicago meeting "will be confronted with the most momentous problems with which the movement has had to deal since its inception," Mr. Rothenberg declared, "It is our hope that the Chicago convention will provide an unprecedented demonstration of Zionist strength, a symbol of the will of the Jewish people towards the reestablishment of its ancestral homeland and center of culture, where men and women may find not merely physical safety, but spiritual freedom."

**Syracuse Minister Joins****Protest Against Persecutions**

SYRACUSE, May 21—Rev. Dr. Ray Freeman Jenney, pastor of Park Central Presbyterian Church, has indorsed the stand of the national conference of Jews and Christians against the Hitler atrocities, and issued a statement in which he calls upon public opinion to express itself against intolerance in all forms.

"I consider it my duty not only as a Christian minister, but as one actuated by humanitarian motives, to join with other clergymen throughout the United States against the Nazis persecution," he declared. "I recognize that Germany is not alone in the persecution of minorities—political, religious and racial. The time has come for public opinion to express itself vigorously against intolerance in all its forms in Germany and elsewhere."

Dr. Jenney was chairman of the Good Will Seminar for Catholics, Jews and Protestants of Central New York, which recently met here in Syracuse Hotel.

**Lloyd George Lays Hitler's  
Drive to 'Degrading Envy'**

LONDON, May 12 (by mail)—"Degrading envy" is at the bottom of the Nazi persecution of the Jews, according to Lloyd George, former Prime Minister, in an address before the British and Foreign Bible Society.

"Jews in that country, as in every country, have attained high positions not because they are Jews, but because they are men of great intellectual attainment, and many of them men of resplendent genius.

"Gifted races are never popular where they are in a minority. The Greeks were not very popular in the cities of the Empire. Scotsmen have lived it down. (Laughter). I am sorry the German government should take this line at this moment. It is a misfortune to Germany and the rest of the world."

**Anglo-Palestine Exhibition  
To Be Opened by MacDonald**

LONDON, May 20—Prime Minister J. Ramsay MacDonald will formally open the Anglo-Palestine exhibition here June 7, it was announced yesterday. Particular significance is attached to this in view of the general political situation and the position in the world's eye which Palestine has assumed as a result of the persecutions of the Jews in Germany.

The exhibition was organized under the auspices of the Keren Kayemet (Jewish National Fund), with Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchop, High Commissioner of Palestine, and Lord Reading as patrons.

**Yale's Four Latin Awards****All Go to Jewish Students**

**Canadian Jewry Showing  
Solid Front; Organizing  
Body to Represent It**

MONTREAL, May 20—The movement for the creation of a permanent representative body to speak in the name of Canadian Jewry has gained ground in recent weeks as a result of steps taken by the Committee of Forty-one, which is an outgrowth of the conference which organized the successful local demonstration against the anti-Jewish atrocities in Germany.

In addition to continuation of the protest campaign against Jewish persecutions in Nazi Germany, the committee has also been given the task of creating an all-Canadian Jewish organization to deal with all matters pertaining to Jewish life in Canada and abroad and to act as the mouthpiece of Canadian Jewry in all national and international affairs.

The following officers and committees were elected to bring the project to fruition:

Præsidium, Rabbi Dr. H. Abramowitz, H. M. Ripstein, S. Belkin, Rabbi Julius Berger and Rabbi J. H. Stern; secretary general, H. M. Caiserman; treasurer, H. Wolofsky; financial secretary, I. M. Bobrove; executive committee: Rabbi H. Abramowitz, H. M. Ripstein, S. Belkin, S. Bruck, Dr. Norman Viner, Rabbi J. H. Stern, L. Zuker, H. Wolofsky, Rabbi Julius Berger, Rabbi J. L. Zlotnik, I. M. Bobrove and A. Velicovitch.

Boycott information and statistical committees have been appointed to gather necessary data on Jewish life in Canada as well as material for organizing a boycott against Germany.

A preliminary conference with the participation of representatives from Ontario and Western Canada will be held next month.

Rabbi J. H. Stern and H. Wolofsky, publisher of the Jewish Eagle and Canadian Jewish Chronicle, have been appointed fraternal delegates to the session of the American Jewish Congress which will be held in Washington.

**\$10,000 Relief Fund Raised  
On Streets of Amsterdam**

AMSTERDAM, May 20—The Committee for German Refugees today published a White Book on the persecutions of the Jews in Germany, consisting of authenticated cases and facts on the persecutions and the Nazi reign of terror.

A street collection for funds for the relief of German Jews brought in over \$10,000. In one of the collection boxes a thousand guilder bill (approximately \$450), was found.

He was taken to a hospital in a dying condition.

The body of a young Jewish girl of Breslau was found on a highway near Grossen. She had been forcibly taken from her home in an automobile and shot to death. Her handbag, containing a sum of money, was found near her body, untouched.

These isolated cases are an incomplete list, but a rigorous guard maintained at the hospitals, as well as the ban on publication of obituary notices, make it most difficult to obtain more details.

## Drop Race Query Protest At Syracuse University

SYRACUSE, May 21.—The protest of Jewish groups on the Syracuse University campus over an alleged affront to the Jewish race in a racial attitudes questionnaire distributed by a sociology student has died down after a statement by Professor W. C. Lehmann, in whose class the questionnaire originated.

Professor Lehmann denied that affront to any race was intended by the student, admitting that some of the questions, however, "were none too well chosen". The student responsible, he said, is "a humble follower of the Jewish faith and, of course, inexperienced in making such a study". The hastily-formed committee which was to have taken the matter to Chancellor Flint, has reconsidered its decision and has let the matter drop.

## Jewish Children Segregated

HAMBURG, May 20.—The Israelitisches Familienblatt, in a dispatch from Breslau, reports that arrangements have been effected in the local schools compelling Jewish school children to occupy separate benches several feet apart from the other children.

## London May Bar German Film; Jews Are Reported Boycotting All Reich Liners

LONDON, May 10 (by mail)—Decision of the exhibitors whether to show "Morgenrot", the German U-boat film, is wavering. Preparations long ago had been made for the exhibition.

Another reaction against German persecution is registered in the increased patronage English liners are enjoying. It is estimated that before the Nazis came into power, German liners carried fifty per cent of the Jewish travelling public. Much of this trade is now going to British liners, some to French and the rest to Italian. The boycott of German liners by Jews is virtually one hundred percent.

The German film referred to is now on exhibition in New York, at the Little Carnegie Playhouse.
