Jewish Schools Affected By New Regulations And Loss of Subsidies (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, June 14-The Berlin City Council, with the Social Democratic representation abstaining from voting, upheld today the decision of the magistrate's court, re-turned last month, abolishing reductions in school fees for Jewish children as long as the percentage of Jewish children in the public schools is higher than the fixed quota of one and a half percent. The law will go into effect October 1.

The Ministry of Education has ordered the headmasters of all private schools, including teachers of dancing, athletic instructors, art and theatrical schools to submit proof of their Aryan origin and German citizenship before August I. The Wuertemberg state Ministry Education has excluded two

Nazis Study Jewish Investments in Reich, Create 'Buy German' Body (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, June 14-Every firm in Germany will shortly be requested to submit to the Government definite and detailed information regarding the amount of Jewish capital in the concern, the number of Jewish employees still remaining and the number of Jewish stockholders, with information as to whether they reside in Germany or abroad.

This data, it was learned, is being requested at the demand of the eco-nomic department of the Nazi party in order to establish the extent to which capital is still controlled by the Jews. A marketing committee which aims

to popularize goods made by Germans" has been established as a semi-governmental institution, it was announced today. The committee will issue a so-called "ursprung schutzmarke", which only pure Aryans will be entitled to use as a trade mark in order to make possible differentiation between Aryan-made products and foreign and Jewish goods made in Germany.

No Diplomas for Jews **Education Minister Rules** (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, June 14-Jewish students completing satisfactorily their university courses will not be admitted to the examinations for graduation and will not be permitted to receive their diplomas according to an order issued by the Minister of Education. Privy Councillor Helfritz, rector of the University of Breslau, referring to this order, declared that an appeal to the ministry against this decision would be useless, since the Minister of Education does not intend to make any exceptions to this rule.

Delegates to the convention decided to hold the 1934 convention in St. Louis.

Louis Kranitz, of St. Joseph, Mo., was elected first vice-president. Other officers were elected as follows: Justin Stillman of Columbus, O., second vice-president; Leonard H. Judge Julian Mack Warns American Jews of Duty (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

SAN FRANCISCO, June 14-In the light of the present plight of the Jew in Germany, American Jewry faces the imperative duty of mobil-Fran of Brooklyn. BALTIMORE, June 14-A resolution directed against the treatment being accorded Jews in Germany and urging the administration at Washington, through friendly representations to request the German government to end its racial and religious intolerance was adopted at the June meeting of the executive Baltimore. The resolution was presented by

Edward J. Colgan jr. Adoption of the resolution carried with it a provision that copies be sent to President Roosevelt, the Secretary of State and members of Maryland's delegation to Congress.

Berliner Tageblatt to Have Second Jewish Issue

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, June 14-The Berliner Tageblatt, which last week created somewhat of a sensation with a special four-page supplement devoted to the problem of integrating German Jews in the "New Germany," Sunday devoted a full page to the reaction to this step from abroad. Another supplement is an-nounced for next Sunday.

Among the reactions noted, from Paris, London, Warsaw, Prague, Budapest and Stockholm, by correspondents of the paper, were com-pliments to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency for its interpretation of the supplement. The general reaction was one of mixed feelings.

The paper states that thousands of letters have been received by it from its readers. Jewish circles however, continue to regard here, however, continue to regard the Tageblatt's efforts with considerable skepticism, in view of the fact that the recognized Jewish leaders have not been invited to present their side of the question and participate in the discussion. A frequent question is why hasn't the Tageblatt reinstated the Jews dismissed from its own staff if it is really anxious to aid in the solu-tion of the German Jewish problem.

Canadian Jewish Congress To Meet in October (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

TORONTO, June 14-The All-Canadian Jewish Conference which is assembled here is preparing to take action on the momentous problems of Jews in Germany. A committee to study the advisability of declaring a boycott on German goods has been appointed, and they are expected to shortly advocate measures of reprisal against persecution in Germany. A Dominion-wide drive for relief funds for German-Jewish refugees is in the immediate offing.

It was decided that the Canadian Jewish Congress will convene in Montreal on October 21. Popular democratic elections will be held not later than October 1. A. J. Freiman, president of the Zionist Organization of Canada, was elected honorary president of the conference.

Medical Association Protests Persecution of German Jewish Doctors

(Jewish Daily Bulletin) MILWAUKEE, June 14-Repression and persecution by the Hitler regime of Jewish medical men in Germany were denounced by the American Medical Association, holding its annual convention here.

The house of delegates of the organization unanimously adopted a resolution assailing Hitlerism in these words:

"The American Medical Association in annual convention assembled condemns the persecution of any individual on account of race or religion by any state or under any flag."

The action of the house of delegates, it was explained, binds the thousands of members of the association. Dr. C. E. Morgan, of Som-erville, Mass., offered the resolution on behalf of the public relations committee

Dr. Leopold Dichtwitz. former chief of staff of the Rudolf Virchow Hospital in Berlin and president of the German Congress of Internal Medicine, attended the convention here. He declined to comment publicly on his experiences in Germany.

Argentine German Jews Organize to Aid Refugees

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence) BUENOS AIRES, June 3-German Jews in Argentine who have until recently kept their Jewishness secret and who have had no relations with other Jews, have now organized a society to help German-

Jewish immigrants and unemployed. Although the newly formed society has the objective of social relief, a sign of the times is the very fact that German Jews come together as Jews for the purpose of

carrying on Jewish activities.
Four hundred people participated in the organization meeting, most of them coming from the middle class, among them many merchants and importers. Because of the sudden transition from Germans to German Jews, there was great con-fusion during the discussions. The chairman of the meeting opened with the declaration "We are not interested in politics, our only concern is to help." The same stand was emphasized by the chief speaker of the meeting, Dr. Weil

20,000 Trees Destroyed In Balfour Forest Fire (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, June 14-Twenty thousand young trees were destroyed when a fire of mysterious origin swept through part of the Balfour Forest, planted by the Jewish Na-tional Fund in honor of the late Lord Balfour. The fire follows a series of uprootings of trees by vandals in forests planted by Jewish settlers. The police, suspecting an incendiary, are prosecuting an extensive investigation into the causes of the blaze.

Must State Religion Registering in Prussia (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, June 14-Henceforth, everyone registering their residence with the police, as required by the regulations, will have to state their religion, according to new police in-structions issued by the Prussian Ministry of the Interior. Foreigners in Germany were not previously requested to state their religion when registering. The new order, it is believed, is aimed to furnish a check on the movements of Jews and Catholics.

The discussions also touched upon the question whether German Jews should remain in the German societies here which have been built to a large extent by Jews and with fewish money and most of which have recently become more or less Hitleristic. It was indicated that should Iews leave the Democratic and Republican German societies. they would not be able to continue their existence. The question of the advisability of leaving the German societies was temporarily postponed

The newly organized society of the German Jews is known as the Hilfs-Verein Deutsch-Sprechenden luden (Relief Society of German

Speaking Jews).
Local Jewish groups expressed great satisfaction with the new or-

ganization. The rise of Hitlerism has brought into existence the organization of another group of Jews who have heretofore not taken any active part in Jewish public life, the English and North American Jews who have formed the Maccabean Association and Club.

List of 'Reliable Jews' (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

PRAGUE, June 14-The Prague press reports from allegedly reliable sources that the Nazi authorities in Germany are preparing a list of "reliable Jews" who have rendered great service to the German nation in art, science, finance and trade. Completion of the list will take six months and then those Jews includ-ed in it will be invited to return to Germany and resume their former occupations.

Slight importance is attached to the report which is believed to have been inspired by the Nazi propaganda department.
