Suicide of Aged Couple, Noted Philanthropists, Creates Profound Shock (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, June 15-The suicide of Moritz Oppenheim, venerable Jewish philanthropist and benefactor of art and science, and his wife, profoundly shocked Berlin today when it became known. Consternation was caused previously by a brief announcement in the press that a "wellknown couple had committed suicide as a result of inner depression". The reports did not state the names. which became known only subsequent to the funeral.

Herr Oppenheim, who was eightyfive years old, was the proprietor of a jewelry business which had continued in Frankfurt for more than three hundred years. He was widely known for his philanthropic activities and for his generous support of scientific experimentation. He contributed heavily to finance research in botany and astronomy particu-larly and a small planet discovered by the Frankfurt Observatory was named "Mauritius" in his honor.

On the occasion of his eightieth birthday, the city of Frankfurt presented him with a silver tablet.

A letter written by the Oppenheims before they took their lives. declared that they could not continue living under the new circumstances in Germany.

Young Israel Convention To Aid Sabbath Observers

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)
ASBURY PARK, N. J., June 15 -Plans to find work for more than 10,000 young Tews who observe the Sabbath and thus are handicapped in business will be formulated at the annual convention of the Council of Young Israel Organizations, which opens here tomorrow at the Hotel Clarendon-Brunswick, Delegates from the United States, Canada, Great Britain, France and Poland will attend the conference, which will close next Monday.

A program of vocational training for young Jewish men and women will be mapped out in an effort to help them secure employment. Delegates will outline a plan to interest Jewish youth in the perpetuation of lewish faith and culture.

Persecution a Challenge

"Anti-Semitic persecution practiced by Christians in the name of Christianity, is a non-Jewish prob-lem," Mr. McDonald said. "It is a challenge to civilized man." He added that the "obligation to be generous in the relief of those suf-ferers is not merely upon the Iews who are more fortunately situated, as in America; the obligation rests, it seems to me, just as heavily upon American non-Jews." Such aid, he said, "would hearten a great people in the knowledge that they are not alone in their hour of battle for freedom and equality of rights." Before introducing Governor Leh-

man, Mr. Guggenheim said: "The unfortunate conflict that is taking place in Germany can have but one result. For it is a battle of bigotry against reason, of the darkness of a night against the light of the ages, of savagery against culture. It will end as all such chap-ters in history have ended. We condone in a spirit of leniency the atrocities of a Nero, the depredations of an Attila, the cruelty of a Torquemada, as a part of the barbarity of the times in which they lived but how will history record the reversion to barbarism of Hitler, the Nazi, in a day in which France produced a Briand, England a MacDonald, and India a Ghandi." Baltimore City Council Protests Persecutions Of Jews in Germany (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

BALTIMORE, June 15-Resolu-tions protesting "discriminating decrees" against Jews in Germany and asserting the body's belief "in religious and racial tolerance" have been adopted by the Baltimore City Council.

Introduced by E. Lester Muller, president of the body, the resolu-

tions read in part:

"The City Council of Baltimore has learned with great concern and deep regret of the plight of the Jews in Germany, arising as a result of governmental decrees discriminating against them, and it desires No Clothing From Jews by solemn resolution to give evidence of its sorrow and condemnation of such relapses into the unfortunate bigotry of a medieval era."

Pollak Dies in Prague Following Heart Attack

A doctor was called, but Pollak never regained consciousness, dying within an hour of paralysis of the heart.

Isaac Piroshnikoff Dies: Popular Concertina Artist

Isaac Piroshnikoff, well-known concertina artist, died here Wednesday at his home, 461 Fort Washington Ave., of a heart attack.

Piroshnikoff was born in the Ukraine on May 8, 1859. He was the founder of the Warsaw Conservatory and later became military bandleader at Vilna. He was also conductor of the orchestra at the Teachers' Institute there. His method of concertina instruction, which made it easy for beginners to grasp the fundamentals, was introduced into many Russian teacher's insta-

tutes. In 1900 Piroshnikoff opened a publishing business in Vilna, printing a

This is expected to lead to a heated discussion in view of the strong divergence in opinion over the use of the boycott weapon.

The United British Fund for German Jews announced today that it had raised 120,000 pounds (approximately \$496,800) thus far. The contributions include several from non-Icws who made donations as testimony of their sympathy with the fewish victims.

some slight degree to mitigate their distress. It is the duty of all rightthinking men and women, regardless of faith, to lessen so far as lies within their power, the hardships of which a persecuted pople have been made the victims. It is heartening to know that so many of our fellow-Americans of other faiths, have militantly rallied to their support, and have expressed their abhorrence of actions which threaten the very basis of civilization."

Thousands Needing Help

In failing to come forward generously in this campaign, the Jews will indict themselves in their own eyes, declared Rabbi Wise, in his address. Thousands of destitute Iews are besieging the office of the committee in Berlin and other German cities asking for food and shelter and the necessities of life, he said. Other thousands are pleading for help to leave Germany and migrate to other lands, and the present flight of the Jews from the Reich is just the beginning of a great exodus which will continue for some time, he asserted. The remainder of German Jewry is facing the necessity of re-establishing themselves in new fields and training their children for a new way of life.

"National Dementia"

Hendrik Willem Van Loon, au-thor and historian, said that the persecution of the Jews in Germany is an outstanding example of "national dementia", of an unreasoning and blind hatred that had swept over an entire nation. He pointed out that, given the power possessed by the Nazis and with their means of propaganda, any nation could be taught to hate whatever the ruling group wantde them to. He pleaded not only for consideration of the immediate necessity for helping the Jewish victims of the Nazi rule, but also for a more far-sighted understanding and the creation of conditions in the world that will make a Hitler an impossibility.
