Nazi Arrest and Beat Jewish Relief Workers On 'Conspiracy' Charges (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, June 20—Nazi storm troopers raided an apartment where some twenty Jewish leaders were discussing questions concerning relief work, and arrested all present on a charge of conspiracy. The entire group was forced into a cellar, where they were beaten and mistreated by the Nazis, who refused to listen to explanations of the purpose of the meeting.

Meanwhile, the families of the arrested men appealed to the political police, who intervened and ordered the release of the prisoners. One of the prisoners suffered a broken ear-drum as the result of blows.

BERLIN, June 20—Siebert Frankenstein, a merchant, was sentenced to six months in prison for asserting that 200 crippled Jews are still in the hospitals as a result of Nazi beatings.

Hermann Meyer, a Jewish merchant, was sentenced to one month in prison for stating that reports in the foreign press regarding torturing of Jews here, were correct, because he himself knew of Jews whose eyes had been gouged out by Nazis.

Nazis Banned in Austria Following Bomb Outrages (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

VIENNA, June 20—The Nazi party was outlawed throughout the country, government authorities announced yesterday. The cabinet stated that the Nazis were prohibited from engaging in any political activities, and would not be allowed to wear the party badge or other emblems.

Another terrorist outrage here yesterday caused the cabinet to issue its decree against the Nazis. Two men threw three grenades at a detachment of Heimwehr auxiliary police in Krems, wounding 32 men.

The outrage was credited directly to the Nazis, who denied complicity. Nazi prisoners, however, are said by police to have confessed.

REVISIONIST HELD IN ARLOSOROFF MURDER; PALESTINE STILL IN STATE OF EXCITEMENT (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, June 20—An extreme Revisionist named Abraham Stavsky, who came to Palestine three months ago from Brest-Litovsk, Poland, was revealed today as the man held by the police in connection with the assassination last Friday of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, Zionist labor leader.

The mystery regarding the murder of Dr. Arlosoroff deepened considerably today when police, without naming their prisoner, let it be known that the arrested man had shared the room in Tel Aviv of Ab Achiemier, who is known as a Revisionist extremist. Achiemier was also arrested last night when he used insulting expressions against the police and sought to hide them in their search of his room. He accused the police of deliberately diverting the investigation from Arabs to Jews. The Revisionist party tried unsuccessfully to secure his release on bail.

Stavsky was said by the police to have arrived three months ago from Poland where he had been active in the Brith Trumpeldor (Revisionist youth group).

He had intended to return to Poland to solicit subscriptions for the Revisionist organ, Chazit Ha'am and had obtained authorization to do so from the manager of the publication. He obtained a visa from the Polish consul at Tel Aviv on Wednesday and had asked the Palestine Government for a return visa which he had apparently failed to secure.

Demand Prison for Jew Who Took Hitler's Name (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, June 20—Imprisonment for the Jewish merchant, Adolf Morgenstern, is demanded in the Nazi press because he allegedly changed his first name from Abraham to Adolf and married an Aryan girl.

The papers claim that Morgenstern adopted the first name of Hitler in order to mislead Nazis into buying Nazi uniforms from him. Morgenstern did a wholesale business in selling uniforms at Kiel.

tine last night when it was reliably reported that Mrs. Arlosoroff, who witnessed her husband's murder, had identified the arrested man from among fourteen Jewish youths. Rumors regarding the crime and the investigation fly around unceasingly.

So intense is the excitement over the case that the Jewish Labor Federation has had to issue an appeal to its members to refrain from demonstrations or any other form of action in connection with the case. The federation has received a letter of condolences at the loss of its leader from Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchope, the High Commissioner.

6,000 Attend Services For Cantor Rosenblatt (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, June 20—Six thousand persons, including the American consul, Mr. Sloan, participated in the funeral ceremonies for Josef Rosenblatt, New York cantor, here yesterday.

Eulogies were delivered by Chief Rabbi A. I. Hachoen Kook and Rabbi Teitelbaum. Cantors Herschman and Roitman officiated at the ceremonies.

The meeting will be held Tuesday evening in Carnegie Hall. Two hundred cantors of the Association and their assistants will sing fitting songs under the baton of Joseph Rumshinsky, noted Jewish composer.

Problems of Jewry Are Discussed at Convention

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

CHICAGO, June 20—Mrs. Alexander S. Langsdorf today delivered an address entitled "Child Study in 1933" before delegates to the tenth biennial assembly of the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods.

Jewish parents have problems that can best be discussed in Jewish groups, said Mrs. Langsdorf. "The greatest problem is the one of religious training in this irreligious era", she declared, "and we cannot ignore the difficulties the Jewish child faces due to the growth of race prejudice, intolerance and discrimination."

The delegates heard another lecture on the youth of today by Dr. A. L. Sachar, a member of the faculty of the University of Illinois, and head of the Hillel Foundation at Champaign, Ill.

"If you interest Jewish children in the dramatic qualities of Jewish cultural values", stated Dr. Sachar, "you will build up their loyalty."

Funeral Services Held For M. I. Block, Reporter

Meyer I. Block, veteran reporter for the Jewish Morning Journal, who died Sunday of a heart attack, was buried yesterday in Mt. Lebanon Cemetery. He was 51 years old.

Well known for his knowledge of conditions on the lower East Side in New York, Mr. Block was also in the public eye during the World War as one of the newspapermen who went along on the Henry Ford peace ship expedition. He is survived by three children, David, 13; Daniel, 11, and Rhoda, 10; two brothers, Abe and Moe; and two sisters, Mrs. Bertha Wise and Mrs. Birdie Miller.

JEWISH COLONIZATION SOON IN TRANSJORDAN, EMANUEL NEUMANN PREDICTS ON ARRIVAL HERE

Stating that "it is inevitable that Transjordan will soon be opened for Jewish colonization", Emanuel Neumann, American member of the Executive of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, who arrived here Monday after spending a year in Jerusalem, described yesterday his view of the situation for Jews in the Near East.

Mr. Neumann expressed intense surprise over the murder of Dr. Arlosoroff. "I cannot understand the motives of such a murder", he said. "Dr. Arlosoroff was beloved by all classes of the Jewish community in Palestine. He was also very friendly with the Arabs. I cannot imagine that this was a political murder."

Explaining his negotiations abroad with the Emir Abdullah, ruler of Transjordan, Mr. Neumann asserted that "the Emir realizes the opportunities for his country that would be offered by an influx of Jewish capital and Jewish undertakings. He is therefore in favor of a sincere basis of understanding and cooperation between Jews and Arabs."

Mr. Neumann described how Jewish refugees from Germany were flocking to Palestine. His statement follows:

"Over two thousand Jewish refugees from Germany have already reached Palestine and are getting themselves settled there. They are drawn from every stratum of society: laborers, skilled artisans, mechanics, professional people, manufacturers, students, artists, scientists, merchants. They are being warmly welcomed both by the Jewish community and by the government. It is generally recognized that they constitute a most valuable element which is bound to promote in a thousand ways the development of the Jewish National Home and the prosperity of Palestine as a whole. Their industry, thrift, technical equipment, and their sound approach to economic problems makes them an enormous asset for the country—far more precious than any amount of capital. There is every reason to believe that these two thousand are only the vanguard of a much larger number, perhaps fifty thousand or one hundred thousand, who will come to make their homes in Palestine. If these expectations are realized, the Hitlerist oppression in Germany may bring in its train the rapid industrialization of Palestine, which will rapidly forge ahead as a great center of civilization and culture in the middle East.

Work to Meet Situation

"The Executive of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, with the help and cooperation of the entire Jewish community there, have set to work

promptly to meet the new situation. Our first step was to form a general committee representing all important groups and bodies, to centralize and coordinate all efforts. This committee functions under the auspices of the Jewish Agency. The next step was the launching of a campaign for funds—Palestine's own modest contribution toward the great world fund. This is the first time that such a campaign is being conducted in Palestine and when I left there was every prospect that the quota of 20,000 pounds which the community had set would be realized. We have also organized three sub-committees to elaborate plans for receiving and absorbing German Jewish immigrants; one on agricultural settlement, one on urban settlement, and the third on education.

"Much work has already been done by these committees and as I have already indicated, the actual absorption of the refugees is already in progress.

"The Palestine government, while welcoming the newcomers, has been ultra-cautious in the matter of immigration permits. They have thus far underestimated the need and the possibilities. However, I have the personal assurance of the High Commissioner, Sir Arthur G. Wauchop, that the six month quota of 5,500 immigration permits which was granted would be increased before the six-month period was over if the world-wide efforts now being made by the Jewish people meets with success and means are secured with which to go forward with a broad colonization program.

"The Jewish Agency is keenly aware of its duties and responsibilities in this connection. We have mobilized our best forces and sinking all differences of party and faction have drafted all available people for the emergency. We are gratified by the response among those whom we have invited to serve on either the general world appeal or in other ways are:

"Dr. Chaim Weizmann, former president of the World Zionist Organization; Sir Herbert Samuel, former High Commissioner for Palestine; the London Rothschilds, the Marquis of Reading, Pinchas Rutenberg, managing director of the Palestine Electric Corporation, and others."

Hitler-Wagner Nuptials Reported Off Because Jews Hired in Festival (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, June 20—A breaking off in the reported engagement between Chancellor Adolf Hitler and Frau Winifred Wagner, is seen as certain as a result of Frau Wagner having engaged two Jewish singers for the Wagnerian festival at Bayreuth, which she is supervising.

The two Jews are Alexander Kipnis, formerly a singer in a synagogue choir, and later well-known in America, where he sang with the Chicago Opera Company, and Emmanuel List.

LONDON, June 20—The London Herald reports today that the celebrated Wagnerian festival at Bayreuth may be abandoned this year unless Frau Winifred Wagner, widow of the son of the famous composer, Richard Wagner, who is in charge of the festival, accedes to Nazi demands and cancels the engagement of two Jewish artists for participation in the event.

Nazis Threaten Women Patronizing Jewish Shops (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, June 20—A warning that Christian women patronizing Jewish shops will be treated by the storm troopers "like dishonorable women who in wartime were friendly with the Belgian soldiers," was issued by the storm troops commander Aigeltinger in the form of an advertisement in the Krefelder General Anzeiger. The Nazi leader asserted that he has the names of the Christian women who have been contacting the Nazi anti-Jewish boycott by patronizing Jewish merchants.

Rose Pastor Stokes Dies Of Cancer in Germany (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

FRANKFORT, Germany, June 20—Rose Pastor Stokes, well-known in American Socialist and Communist circles, died here of cancer. She was 54 years old.

Mrs. Stokes lived a very stormy life. She was born in Russia and lived for some time in the slums of London. Later she came to the United States and worked in cigar factories in Cleveland, Ohio, where her radical career began. She joined the Socialist party and immediately become known as a fiery speaker.

In 1905, while employed on a Jewish newspaper, she met and married J. G. Phelps Stokes, New

Hitler Stresses Nazi Aim To Cut Off German Jewry From Rest of World (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, June 20—The determination of the Nazis to sever all connections of German Jewry with the rest of the world was expressed today in a statement by Chancellor Adolf Hitler regarding the aims of the Third Reich made at a conference of Nazi leaders here.

Among the five major aims enumerated, the second is "cutting every international tie whatsoever, which applies not only to Marxism, but equally to the intellectual ties of Jewry."

The Nazi economic union, acting on the orders of Rudolf Hess, Hitler's personal deputy in the direction of the Nazi party, today issued official signs for stores which are entitled to be known as "German Establishment," the text of the sign. Each sign is numbered and carries a swastika framed in a shining, rising sun. The purpose of the signs is to make it possible to distinguish Aryan stores from Jewish, in order to boycott the latter.

Untermyer to Address Women's Boycott Meeting

Samuel Untermyer will address more than 2,000 women at a conference at the Hotel Astor here next Tuesday afternoon. The purpose of the meeting will be to launch a nation-wide boycott among the women in this country of German goods and services. The conference is sponsored by the Women's Division of the American League for the Defense of Jewish Rights. Mrs. Mark Harris is chairman, Mrs. Julius Ferber and Mrs. Peter Schweitzer are vice-chairmen.

The committee plans to concentrate on organizing a consumers' boycott of German products. They will ask that purchasers show preference for American goods wherever possible as substitutes for the banned German products.

Among the organizations that will be represented at the conference are: Federation of Jewish Women's Organizations, Hadassah, Daughters of Israel, Daughters of Jacob, New York Auxiliary of the Consumptive Relief Association of Denver, New York Physicians' Wives' League, Children's Welfare League, Women's League of Palestine, Ladies' Auxiliaries of the Jewish Workmen's Circle, Jewish National Workers, Hebrew National Orphan Home, Ivriah, Joshua Ladies, Jewish Pythian Sisters, Young Judea, Jewish Women of America, Hias, and the Palestine Lighthouse for the Blind.

Palestine Interests Jews of Germany

BERLIN, June 20 — Thirty-five hundred German Jews have joined the ranks of Palestine pioneers training for settlement there, the Juedische Rundschau, chief German Zionist publication, reports. Over 16,000 inquiries have been made at the Berlin Palestine office regarding immigration and possibilities of settlement there.

A noticeable growth in the membership of the German Zionist Federation as well as in the attendance, and new classes in Hebrew for prospective Palestine settlers, is also reported.

Fine London Gangster For Attacking Jews

LONDON, June 20 — The activities of a gang waging a war of terrorism against Jews in the North Hackney section of London came up in London Court yesterday when one member of the gang, named John Hamilton, was arrested for attacking a Jew in the street.

The court fined Hamilton two pounds sterling and at the same time issued a warning to all gangs that if there were any more cases of this nature, the sentences in the future would be prison or hard labor.

Educators Aid Hias

Members of the public school system in New York have organized the Educators' Division of the Hias Emergency Fund for the relief of Jewish refugees from Germany. On the committee, including non-Jews as well as Jews, are: Dr. I. David Cohen, principal of Boys' Continuation School, chairman; Dr. Oswald Schlockow, Dr. Benjamin Veit, associate superintendent of schools, and Frank J. Arnold, Rufus P. Hartill and Ellen A. G. Phillips.

account of how Nazis murdered a Jewish dentist, Alfred Meyer, in Wuppertal-Barmen, is contained in a Berlin report to the Manchester Guardian.

His body was found at the Bever Valley dam, the paper says, with bullet wounds in the head and knife wounds in the chest. The body was sewn up in a sack, weighted with stones.

The Guardian correspondent states that the police know the identity of the murderers, but have not arrested them because they are Nazis. Such cases are still continuing in large numbers, the paper states, but they are more closely concealed.

York millionaire. The marriage created a great sensation in American society.

During the 20 years in which she was married to Mr. Stokes, she participated in uncounted strikes and radical demonstrations. Many times she was arrested and jailed for her activities and during the war she was sentenced to 10 years imprisonment for her opposition to the war. Execution of the sentence was delayed and she was finally pardoned by President Wilson. She was one of the founders of the American Communist Party in 1919.

Several years ago during a Communist demonstration she attempted to shield a young boy from a policeman. She was struck in the breast with a night-stick and this blow brought about the cancer from which she died.

In 1925 she divorced Mr. Stokes and later married Isaac Roman, a teacher and writer.

ST. PAUL, June 20 — Rabbi Harry S. Margolis, of Mount Zion Temple, this city, has been appointed a member of the local board of education. This is the first time under St. Paul's commission form of government that a Jew has occupied such a position.
