No Visas to Jews

New German Orders

London Embassy States

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, June 21—Instructions not to issue visas to Jews for travel in Germany, and not even transit visas, have been issued to the German consular service by the Nazi Government, it was learned today.

The German consulate here refused to grant a visa to Isaac Pomeranic, a Polish Jewish citizen residing here, to cross Germany en route to Poland. He was informed by the German Embassy that "applications for German visas for Jewish travellers must be referred to Berlin for official permission." It was further stated that "new regulations from Berlin provide that no visas, including transit visas, are to be granted to Jews unless their visit is of direct importance to the German Government."

This new regulation was heatedly discussed in World Economic Conference circles today where it was generally considered as obstructing international travel to the many countries to which access is easiest through Germany. Several delegations indicated that their Governments would intercede because the new regulation would have an adverse effect on their tourist trade and on foreign trade relations.

Ban Roumanian Paper

For Criticism of Cuzists

CZERNOWITZ, Roumania, June 21—The Liberal newspaper, the Allgemeine Zeitung, has been prohibited by the military authorities because it carried articles against the United Minorities Roumanian Students Front for demanding a numerus nullus for Jewish students and pointed out the inconsistencies in Ukrainian and Polish minorities standing with the followers of Professor Cuzza. At the same time, other newspapers throughout the city feature an article by Cuzza, leader of the anti-Semitic forces in this country, protesting against Government interference with the process of ousting Jews.

Jews Can't Advertise

In Berlin Phone Book

BERLIN, June 21—The publishers of the official Berlin telephone book have declined to accept advertisements from Jewish firms, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns.

"In view of the Jewish character of your concern, we have been instructed not to accept your advertisement," a Jewish business house was informed by letter after it had sent advertising copy to the publishers of the directory.

Aryan World Congress

Urged by Nazi Press

VIENNA, June 21—Prior to its suppression by the Austrian government the Nazi press here yesterday took a final slam at Jews by urging the convening of a huge anti-Semitic pan-Aryan world congress "for relieving the world of Jews." The Nazi press claimed that Aryan parties from twenty-two countries have already agreed to participate in such a conference, the purpose of which will be to force Jews everywhere in the world to emigrate and form a Jewish National State, not in Palestine, because it is too small, but in Madagascar.

Madagascar is an island in the Indian Ocean and is the third largest island in the world. It is 260 miles distant from the southeastern coast of Africa. Since 1896 Madagascar has been a French colony.

Nazi newspapers here suggested that at the congress delegates could decide on the steps each country would take to make Jewish residents depart.

"Hitlerism will lead the pan-Aryan world movement to counteract Jewish domination," one Nazi newspaper asserted.

Arms Ordinance in Palestine

JERUSALEM, June 21—An ordinance forbidding street assemblies and the bearing of arms was promulgated yesterday by the Palestine Government. The ordinance is renewed periodically but attracted considerable attention in view of the state of agitation following the assassination of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff.

Abraham Stavsky, Accused Of Murder of Dr. Arlosoroff, Remanded for Investigation

TEL AVIV, June 21—Abraham Stavsky, Polish Revisionist accused of the murder of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff here last Friday, was arraigned today before Magistrate Korngryn and remanded for fifteen days at the request of Salim Hana, police official representing the public prosecutor pending further investigation.

Police Inspector Goffner, of Tel Aviv, appeared as a witness against Stavsky, and after taking the oath, affirmed that there was sufficient evidence against the prisoner to furnish reasonable grounds of suspicion.

Stavsky, speaking in Yiddish, complained that he had not been permitted to obtain counsel, although he had demanded the right of legal advice constantly. He insisted that he had spent Friday night, when Dr. Arlosoroff was assassinated by two strangers, in the city of Jerusalem, and therefore, could not have perpetrated the murder.

The magistrate declined to hear his defense, stating that the hearing today was only on the question of remanding him for further investigation and that "you will be able to say all you want during the interrogation."

Nordau's 'Doktor Kohn' Prohibited in Budapest

BUDAPEST, June 21—Production of the late Max Nordau's play on the theme of intermarriage, "Doktor Kohn," was forbidden by the police who informed the directors of the Bethlen Theatre that the discussion of the problems of Jewish and Christian relationships posed in the play, would endanger the peace at this time. The management of the theatre has offered to delete the controversial parts of the drama and has asked that the ban be reconsidered since it means unemployment for a large number of artists. The Home Office has appointed a commission to investigate the case.

Central Conference of Rabbis Convenes Today

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

MILWAUKEE, June 21—Rabbis from all sections of the country are gathered here to attend the Central Conference of American Rabbis, which opens its forty-fourth annual session tomorrow. Problems significant to Jewish life both here and abroad will be discussed at the conference, which will continue until next Monday.

Of particular importance will be the report of the Special Committee on World Jewish Congress, of which Dr. William Rosenau, Baltimore, is the chairman. This committee was organized last year to confer with American and foreign Jewish communities and groups upon the advisability of instituting united action among Jews of all lands with respect to Jewish needs and rights.

The urgent need for unity in American Jewish life to meet the problems confronting Jews here as well as aiding the stricken Jews in Europe will also be discussed at the conference.

Enlightened Opinion Must Unite to End Hitlerism, Says Williams

"Germany has burned her bridges to the civilization of Europe. Until those bridges are restored Germany will be the danger spot of Western civilization."

Thus Michael Williams, editor of "Commonweal," Catholic weekly, summed up his observations of Hitlerism in an address before the American Jewish Congress at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel Tuesday night.

Victor J. Dowling, former presiding judge of the Appellate Division and a prominent Catholic layman, supported Mr. Williams' assertions in a message he sent to the meeting.

"The Hitler government by its actions and decrees in the short period of its regime has read itself out of the circle of civilized nations of the world," said Mr. Dowling, who is an honorary chairman of the million dollar defense fund of the American Jewish Congress, and who was prevented by illness from attending the meeting.

Other speakers included Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, honorary president of the American Jewish Congress; Bernard S. Deutsch, president, and George Gordon Battle, prominent lawyer.

Mr. Williams, well-known Catholic editor, returned from Germany last week. "My observations abroad were those of a practical newspaperman," he told the assembly. "I discovered that hundreds of thousands of Germans do not approve of the Nazi persecution of Jews. In the twenty-nine Protestant churches there is a complete blockade to Hitler's policies."

Mr. Williams described the Nazis' activities as "chaotic, brutal, inflamed and springing from racial fanaticism. Stupid books are being written to show ethnological reasons for German superiority. The universities are being organized in such a way that Nazi control will be absolute. Jews, Communists and other minorities are being sent to concentration camps or exiled or killed."

Mr. Williams stated that he learned on high authority that there were 3,000 known cases of brutal mishandling of Jews, with perhaps 10 percent of this number dead from their wounds. If Hitler holds power for any length of time, Mr. Williams concluded, another European war is inevitable.

Mr. Dowling stated in his message that "the German decrees against the Jewish people constituted a challenge to the civilized opinion of mankind."

"Enlightened public opinion," he declared, "irrespective of race or

Nazis Won't Exhibit Art At Pittsburgh Show Including Works of Jews.

Germany will keep out of the thirty-first international show of contemporary painters in Pittsburgh this autumn if the work of Jewish painters is included in the German section, Homer St. Gaudens revealed when he returned to New York yesterday after gathering paintings for the exhibition in Europe.

Mr. St. Gaudens said this was the attitude of Hans Weidemann, Nazi head of the art department of the ministry of public enlightenment and propaganda in Germany. Weidemann is now visiting in this country.

"I selected the work of Max Liebermann and Waltheim for the exhibition," St. Gaudens explained, "but these men did not meet with the approval of the Nazis. Therefore Weidemann made an official decision to keep Germany out of the show."

The Hitlerites recently ousted Max Liebermann from the presidency of the Prussian Academy of Art and also banned Waltheim because his grandfather was a Jew.

Pennsylvania Confers Degree on Judge Stern.

PHILADELPHIA, June 21—Judge Horace Stern, noted Jewish leader, was the principal speaker and the recipient of the degree of Doctor of Laws at the graduation exercises of the University of Pennsylvania here today.

Presenting the diploma to Judge Stern, Dr. Thomas S. Gates, president of the University said in part:

"Horace Stern, President of the Court of Common Pleas, graduate of the College of the University of Pennsylvania and of its law school, for eleven years a lecturer in that school, and for the past five years a member of the University Board of Trustees. Lawyer, learned Judge, humanitarian, your services as a citizen of Philadelphia to your fellowmen, your breadth of vision and your far-seeing understanding in the interpretation of the law, your self-sacrificing work in philanthropy, have brought distinction to yourself which you have carried with gracious modesty, and honor to the University of which you are an alumnus."

Characterizing himself "as an eager spectator of life's parade," Judge Stern in his address, touched on "the needs of our troubled world today." He prescribed a "threefold prescription." First, he said, there is need of "faith in one another and in our institutions; second, the encouragement of the creative rather than the possessive instinct; and third, a proper recognition of human solidarity."

Symposium Sessions Feature Council of Synagogue Group

CHICAGO, June 21—The second and third sessions of the symposium on "Religion Tomorrow" today featured the meetings of the thirty-third council of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations and its affiliated brotherhoods and sisterhoods.

Charles P. Kramer, of New York, president of the National Federation of Temple Brotherhoods, presided during the morning session at the Hotel Stevens.

"The idea of this symposium," Mr. Kramer said, "is to guide us in reevaluating our religion to meet the conditions of tomorrow, and this on the possible theory that present-day conditions cannot be met in religious interpretations of yesterday and today."

Mr. Kramer introduced Dr. Leo M. Franklin, of Detroit, who spoke on "Jewish Contributions to the Idealism of the Twentieth Century."

The distinct contribution of the Jew, said Dr. Franklin, to the life of today has been in the field of ethics and religion, and it behooves us to inquire a bit more closely as to the special character of his gift.

"The Jew has conceived a universe who soul and center is God," Dr. Franklin stated. "This conception of God at once carries with it the idea of law, of order, and of a unity as the controlling factors alike of the natural moral world."

Rabbi Solomon Foster, of Newark, N. J., led the discussion which followed Dr. Franklin's address.

Evening Session

Mrs. Maurice Steinfeld, of St. Louis, president of the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods, presided this evening at the third and concluding session of the symposium.

"In the old Jewish concept of religion," she said, "it was regarded

DETROIT, June 21—Following action of the Federal Bar Association of New York in protesting the oppression of lawyers on account of their race and religion, the Detroit Bar Association has adopted a similar resolution. It reads:

"Resolved, that the Detroit Bar Association join in the protest of the Federal Bar Association of New York against the oppression of its brethren of the Bar on account of their race and religion by the German government and further

"Resolved, that the Detroit Bar Association join in the communication of the members of the New York Bar Association forwarded the Secretary of State of the United States by the secretary of the New York Bar Association on behalf of Messrs. Elihu Root, John W. Davis, Samuel Seabury, James W. Gerard, and others, and the officers of the Detroit Bar Association forward this resolution to the Secretary of State for transmission to the German Government if consistent with diplomatic usage and custom."

Sholom Maximon Dies

CINCINNATI, June 21—Sholom Maximon, noted Hebrew writer and teacher, died here last night of pleurisy and pneumonia. He was 50 years of age.

Maximon was one of the pioneers of the Hebrew movement in America, and contributed many articles to Hebrew newspapers and magazines. In recent years he taught Hebrew at Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati.

In accordance with his expressed desire, his body will be shipped to Palestine for burial.

Dismiss Jews from Chemical Trust

BERLIN, June 21—Jewish officials and employees of the Deutsche Chemische Gesellschaft were dismissed today. Among those who lose their positions by this move are Dr. Otto Warburg, a Nobel prize winner; Professor Arthur Rosenheim and Professor Max Bergmann.

Other Jewish Dismissals

BERLIN, June 21—The first list of Jewish notaries who have been dismissed from their positions in Prussia, was published yesterday by the Minister of Justice. It lists 86 names. The ministry also made public a list of 140 Jewish lawyers, 50 of whom are also notaries, who will not be allowed to practice law in Prussia. More lists are to follow, it was announced.

Jewish Students Win Many Honors at Yale

NEW HAVEN, Conn., June 21—The outstanding prize available to the 1,000 members of the graduating classes at Yale University—the Alpheus Henry Snow Prize of \$500 was awarded at the graduation exercises yesterday to a Jewish student, Eugene V. Rostow, of New Haven, a senior in Yale College. Announcement of the award was made by Dr. James Rowland Angell, president of the University in Woolsey Hall before some 3,000 people. This prize is annually awarded to a student who "through the combination of intellectual achievement, fine character, and personality, shall be adjudged by the faculty to have done the most for Yale by inspiring in his classmates an admiration and love for the best traditions of high scholarship." Rostow is generally considered the most brilliant man in the senior class. He was recently awarded a Henry Fellowship which will provide for post-graduate study at Cambridge University, England.

Rostow was one of the three students, all of whom are Jewish, to be graduated "with special distinction"; the other two are Samuel Block and Saul Padowitz.

Of the twenty students who graduated with special honors, five were Jewish; the ten percent of Jewish students in the senior class contributed twenty-five percent of the number carrying off special honors. The Jewish students in this group are Robert Burstein who was graduated with special honor in French; Sol Morton Isaac, Government; Sheldon Zachary Kaplan, German; Herbert Mandelbaum, Philosophy; and Richard Siegel, Latin.

In addition to these students the following received "high oration appointments" indicative of their high scholastic rating in the senior class, at the graduation exercises:

Confirms J.T.A. Report Of Palestine Loan

LONDON, June 21—Confirmation of the report of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency last week that a new two and a half million pound loan for Palestine is pending is carried by the Manchester Guardian which discusses the loan which is intended for public works and for the settlement of landless Arabs.

The paper points to the safety of investment in Palestine loans, and reminds its readers that the first Palestine loan, issued in 1927 at 10½%, is now quoted at 115. In addition, it remarks, deposits in Palestine banks amount to 6,000,000 pounds, of which five-sixths is Jewish capital.

Stavsky Known in Brest-Litovsk

BREST-LITOVSK, Poland, June 21—Abraham Stavsky, who has been arrested in Jerusalem in connection with the assassination of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, Zionist leader, left here for Palestine last winter in a party of Revisionist tourists. He was described by his former acquaintances as of an "impulsive nature."

Maintain Peace, Laborites Ordered

WARSAW, June 21—Orders have been issued to all members of the Palestine Labor League to refrain from any acts of revenge against Revisionists under threats of immediate expulsion from the organization. Feeling has been high against the Revisionists since suspicion of the murder of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, Palestine labor leader, was directed against members of the Revisionist group.

A similar order has been cabled to the provincial federations by the Poale Zion and Histadruth, labor groups, demanding the maintenance of peace.

Miss Eva Landman Dead

as an integral part of life, and inasmuch as the synagogue was considered the tangible symbol, the interpretation of this ideal, the synagogue attained a position of pre-eminence."

Mr. Adolph Rosenberg, of Cincinnati, spoke on "The Synagogue and Its Opportunities."

"In the task of bringing religion to bear decisively upon the problems of our work-a-day world," he declared, "the Synagogue must play its traditional role of teacher to the House of Israel."

Dr. Joseph Rauch, of Louisville, Ky., delivered an address on "What Part Is Jewish Education Destined to Play in Our Survival?"

"Once the religious schools will be restored to priority of significance in Jewish life," he asserted, "we shall not be wanting for men and women who will restate for us our sacred heritage so that it will be as meaningful for us as it has been for our ancestors."

School Problems

Earlier in the day, speaking before the assembly of the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods, Dr. Emanuel Gamoran, educational director of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, discussed "Contemporary Religious School Problems."

"One of the most constructive forces in American Jewish life," he stated, "is the Jewish religious school, and there is much that the members of the Sisterhood can do to keep it constructive and make it creative."

creed, must unite in combating forces of evil and retrogression which are an affront to our common humanity. It is vital that divisions of race and creed be forgotten at this critical juncture in the history of mankind. All creeds must join in this battle for progress and humanity in which the American Jewish Congress is playing a leading role."

George Gordon Battle, lawyer, said, that he had never known of a cause or issue that was more important or better justified than the fight against Hitlerism.

"I do not think this is a Jewish question," he asserted. "It is a question that involves all humanity because it is a question of a protest against intolerance, ignorance and bigotry that is a danger to all civilization. I think there should be an appeal against these activities as broad as humanity itself."
