45,000 Jewish Refugees In Countries Near Reich, Labor Conference Told

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

GENEVA, June 22—There are now 45,000 German Jewish refugees in the countries neighboring on the Reich, it was revealed today in a report to the International Labor Conference meeting here, by the labor leaders, Kupers, of Holland; Jouhaux, of France, and Schurch, of Belgium.

They pointed out that this number is increasing constantly in view of the persistent Nazi policy of annihilating the Jews, and warned of serious repercussions to be expected in the adjacent countries to which the refugees had fled. The labor market, already upset, will be made worse by this influx, it was pointed out.

Since the labor conference has already dealt with such problems, notably in the case of the Russian and Armenian refugees, the conference invites its governing body and the Labor Office here to undertake necessary studies of the problem, without interfering with internal questions touching on Germany's national sovereignty, with a view to the satisfactory settlement of Germany's refugees in countries where they might find employment without detriment to the economic welfare of these countries.

Nazi Officers Accused Of Jewish Bomb Attacks

VIENNA, June 22—Nazi officers from Germany are accused by the Austrian police of having organized the bomb attacks on the Jews which featured the anti-Government Nazi demonstrations last week, according to an official communique.

A Colonel von Biehl and a Captain Kraus are named by the police as responsible for planning the attacks. Both officers and their Austrian accomplices escaped to Germany, leaving behind them plans for further outrages against the Jews, the materialization of which was checked by the Government's drastic actions to check the Nazi reign of terror.

Revisionist Fined for Obstructing Investigation Of Arlosoroff Murder

TEL AVIV, June 22—Ab Achimeir, Tel Aviv Revisionist, who was arrested last Monday evening for interfering with the police when they searched the room he had shared here with Abraham Stavsky, who is being held in connection with the assassination of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, Zionist labor leader, was freed today in magistrate's court after payment of a fine of one pound and costs. His attorney explained that Achimeir's actions and language to the police were the result of the great excitement he was laboring under at the time due to his fear that responsibility for the murder would be put upon the Revisionist party.

State Dept. Gives Council Assurances of Interest In German Situation

The State Department at Washington, through William Phillips, Under Secretary, is giving its careful attention to the situation created by Nazi persecution of Jews in Germany, according to Dr. Samuel Schulman, chairman of the special committee of the Synagogue Council of America, who yesterday revealed the nature of a correspondence carried on between his organization and the U. S. Government during the last two months.

The special committee, appointed by State Senator Albert Wald, president of the Synagogue Council of America, and consisting of Dr. Samuel Schulman, chairman; Ben Altheimer, Bernard Drachman, S. Herbert Golden, Herbert S. Goldstein, Mordecai M. Kaplan, Isaac Landman, Elias Margolis, D. De Sola Pool, Abram Simon and Elias Solomon, sent a letter on May 18 to President Roosevelt.

In the letter President Roosevelt was asked to "heed the cry of our hearts and the prayer of every Jew in this land and to do in an impressive way whatever you think wise and effective in order to bring home to the imagination of the German people the great wrong which

Arlosoroff Murder Case, German Question Raised In House of Commons

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, June 22—The question of the Jews of Germany was brought up in the House of Commons again this afternoon when Geoffrey Mander, National Labor member, asked if the Government had any reason to believe that the treatment of the Jews had become more lenient in Germany or whether the persecution of the Jews was still continuing.

Barnett Janner then brought up the question of the Jewish position in Upper Silesia, where the League of Nations Council has ordered the restoration of civil and political rights to the Jewish population.

Undersecretary of State for Foreign Affairs, Captain Anthony Eden, asked for time in which to answer the questions raised.

The assassination of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, Zionist labor leader, in Palestine, was also reported to the House by the Colonial Office. Details of the case were reported as well as the fact that Abraham Stavsky, who has been arrested in the case, has put forward a defense in the form of an alibi.

Criticize Latvian Govt. For Boycott, Protests Ban

RIGA, Latvia, June 22—Criticism of the Government for taking measures to stop the boycott of German goods here and to prevent Jewish anti-Nazi protests, was voiced in the Parliament yesterday by Rabbi Nuruk and the deputies Dubin and Kalnin. The latter, who is the Socialist leader, asked why the police had prohibited the scheduled lecture by Ezriel Karlebach, Jewish writer, of Hamburg, which was to have taken place last night, and why the authorities are preventing the boycott. The reply of the Minister of the Interior is expected next week.

Sons of Zion to Convene**At Long Branch Tomorrow**

LONG BRANCH, N. J., June 22 — Dr. Stephen S. Wise, Morris Rotherberg, president of the Zionist Organization of America, and Louis Lipsky, head of a group of distinguished Zionist leaders who are scheduled to address the twenty-fourth annual convention of the Order Sons of Zion, which opens here this Saturday night and will continue until Monday evening.

Other speakers include Rabbi Meyer Berlin, head of the World Mizrahi; Captain Abraham Tulin, Abe Goldberg, and Dr. A. Coralnik, head of the American League for the Defense of Jewish Rights.

Sidney Matz will speak on "The Citrus Industry in Eretz Yisroel." Joseph Hestrin, representing the Pole Zion, will deliver an address entitled "In Memoriam, Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff."

Isaac Allen, Nasi, or grand master, will preside at the convention's sessions. Jacob Kaplan will present the grand secretary's report. Harry A. Fine, of Newark, will head the convention committee.

Delegates from more than thirty cities are expected to attend the Order Sons of Zion convention.

Jews in Polish Town**Made Homeless by Fire**

WARSAW, June 8—Thirty per cent of the Jewish population of the town of Sabota, near Lodowicz, were left entirely without means of livelihood as the result of a fire which broke out during the night. A committee to aid the unfortunates was organized by the rabbi of the town.

Weizmann Arrives Today For American Visit

Dr. Chaim Weizmann, outstanding world Zionist leader, will arrive here today aboard the Berengaria. Dr. Weizmann is coming here to be the guest of honor on July 3 at Jewish Day of the Chicago Century of Progress Exposition.

This Sunday, at 6 P. M., Dr. Weizmann will speak over a nationwide hook-up arranged by Columbia Broadcasting System's WABC. His subject will be "Palestine and the Solution of the Jewish Problem."

Yesterday Dr. Weizmann sent a radiogram to Louis Lipsky, national chairman of the American Palestine Campaign, voicing his regret at the death of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff in Tel Aviv, Palestine.

In his radiogram, Dr. Weizmann lauded the services of the head of the political department of the Jewish Agency, saying:

"The death of Dr. Arlosoroff is an irreparable loss. In the short time of his activity he gained the confidence of the British authorities and of the Jewish settlement in Palestine. He combined brilliant ability with fine qualities of character and leadership, occupying a foremost place amongst the younger generation. I mourn the loss of a devoted servant of the cause of Palestine and a great personal friend."

Sunday evening, July 2, a dinner will be given at the Palmer House in Chicago in honor of Dr. Weizmann. He also will be a guest of the Jews in Philadelphia on June 25 at a dinner arranged by the Zionist organization there. The dinner will take place in the Crystal Ballroom of the Benjamin Franklin Hotel at 6:30 P. M. Dr. Weizmann will remain in Philadelphia only one night, and then proceed directly to Chicago.

Teachers Summer Institute in Syracuse

Thirty-five persons have already made reservations to attend the Teachers' Summer Institute, July 5 to July 20, in Syracuse, N. Y. The course is sponsored by the North-east Religious Union, affiliated with the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, in cooperation with the University of Syracuse. The course is designed to give teachers in Jewish schools a better understanding of their subjects and problems.

Wins Archbishop's Oratory Medal

U. A. H. C. Backs Vogelstein Stand on Hitler Protests

CHICAGO, June 22—Harmony, shattered for a while when the question of Jewish demonstrations against Hitler caused a lively argument, was completely restored as delegates to the convention of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations renewed their approval of Ludwig Vogelstein's presidential message.

Yesterday there were some protests by delegates who thought Mr. Vogelstein's stand on demonstrations against Hitler was not strong enough. The committee on the president's message, however, adopted the report, quieting the dissenters.

"Your chairman's comment in his report upon the German situation might well and truthfully have warranted more violent and vehement denunciation," the committee stated, "but the restrained and temperate language of the report has appealed to your committee as the wisest course."

German Relief Drive**Appeals to Jewish Youth**

Problems facing the Jewish youth in Germany will be discussed by James W. Gerard, former ambassador to Germany, at a rally of young Jewish men and women in the Greater New York area, to be held next Monday evening at Temple Emanuel, Fifth Avenue and 65th Street. At the rally every young Jew in the five boroughs will be asked to contribute toward the \$2,000,000 fund being raised by the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee German Relief Campaign.

Other speakers besides Mr. Gerard will include James Marshall, Paul Felix Warburg, Rabbi Jonah B. Wise and Miss Pauline Baerwald, chairman of the Junior Division.

Rabbi Wise, national chairman of the campaign, has announced that \$617,000 has already been contributed toward the \$2,000,000 goal. The contributions so far have come from 40 states and 171 communities. Every Jewish young man and woman in New York City will be asked to donate \$1.

Ministers Aid Relief Drive

MILWAUKEE, June 22 — Outstanding Christian ministers of this city have thrown their support behind the local campaign for funds to aid destitute, persecuted Jews in Germany.

Many of them have sent in contributions themselves, and issued statements denouncing the Hitler tyranny and cruelty, and calling upon the members of their own churches, as well as non-Jews generally to assist in the relief drive, which will open June 25.

Zionists and Laborites**Mourn Dr. Arlosoroff
At Memorial Meeting**

Over 700 people crowded into Beethovens Hall, 210 East 5th Street, Wednesday evening, to pay tribute to the memory of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, who was assassinated in Palestine. Representatives of all groups of Zionist laborites, and officials of the Zionist Organization of America united in condemning the murder, and reaffirmed their unshakable determination to carry on the up-building of Palestine despite obstacles put in their path.

A large portrait of Dr. Arlosoroff, draped in black, hung over the platform, and the platform itself was decorated with the emblems of the Poale Zion and the Zeire Zion, also draped in black. In opening the meeting, Meyer Brown, secretary of the Poale Zion, announced that the speakers had requested that there be no applause.

Morris Rothenberg, president of the Zionist Organization of America, said that words were inadequate to describe his sorrow. "I am here as a representative of the Zionist Organization, to mourn the death of Dr. Arlosoroff, not only as a labor leader but as a Zionist leader. I worked with him when he visited the United States and was in a position to know of his brilliant work on the executive of the Jewish Agency. How tragic, that his life should have ended just as he devised plans for bringing to Palestine our wretched brothers and sisters from that awful land now called Germany. It is no secret that the improved relations between the Jews and the mandatory power in Palestine are primarily due to Dr. Arlosoroff," he said.

Mr. Rothenberg asked that all judgment on the murder be reserved. He declared that the mere possibility that the act was the result of inner party strife should cause all factions to stop and think where they were going and put an end to all such doings. "A new atmosphere has come into the Zionist movement," he said. "First there are differences, then comes the cry of traitor, now a life has been taken. This cannot be tolerated. It is shameful that within the Zionist ranks should be found the hand willing to kill opponents."

Mrs. Goldie Meyerson, representative of the Palestinian Labor Delegation, said that the American Poale Zion had decided to place Dr. Arlosoroff's name first on the list of labor delegates to the Zionist Congress the day before the news of his assassination reached here. She paid tribute to his qualities of leadership.

Veterans Test Hartford**Ban on Boycott Stamps**

HARTFORD, Conn., June 22—The recent order of Assistant Postmaster Dillon banning anti-Hitler boycott stamps from the mails at the Hartford post office has been questioned in a letter from J. George Fredman, Commander of the Jewish War Veterans of the United States, to J. J. Woolfson, Deputy Chief of this state's Jewish War Veterans, it was made known today.

Fredman stated in his letter to Woolfson that expert opinion from many sources, including the post master-general's and solicitor-general's offices in Washington, was obtained before attempting the issue of stamps at a cost of about \$100,000.

"Hartford is not only the first, but also the lone city to complain," the commander wrote.

Woolfson said more than thirty letters bearing anti-Hitler boycott stamps have already been mailed to persons living in Hartford as a test, and all arrived at their destinations, in spite of Postmaster Dillon's order.

The possibility of legal steps against Assistant Postmaster Dillon by Samuel Untermyer, noted New York lawyer, was disclosed in Fredman's letter.

Rabbi Coffee Resigns

OAKLAND, Cal., June 22—Rabbi Rudolph I. Coffee, of Temple Sinai, this city, has tendered his resignation after twelve years of work.

The reason for his resignation was that he needed a long rest, Rabbi Coffee stated. He said he had no future plans.

"I will attend the religious fellowship in Chicago next month," he declared. "After that I don't know what I shall do."

Rabbi Coffee has long been active in Jewish welfare and religious work in northern California. He was chairman of the Jewish Committee of Personal Service at state institutions.

Central Conference of**Rabbis Hears Newfield
Urge Leaders to Unite**

MILWAUKEE, June 22—Opening the forty-fourth meeting of the Central Conference of American Rabbis here today, Rabbi Morris Newfield, of Birmingham, Ala., made a survey of the condition of the Jews in Germany since the advent of the Hitler regime.

He expressed the grateful appreciation of American Jewry that "the civilized peoples of Europe and America have spontaneously expressed their sympathy with the Jews of Germany in their sad plight and have fearlessly condemned those outrages and brutalities."

Rabbis from all sections of the country, gathered here for the conference, heard Rabbi Newfield deplore "the lack of unity in American Jewish life" in its approach to the solution of the problem of the German Jews. He stressed the paramount need for such unity in order to bring the fullest "moral and financial succor to the dispossessed and jobless Jews of Germany."

"American Jewry has been thoroughly aroused by the grave plight of our German brethren, and is making strenuous efforts to bring them succor," he asserted. "In connection with these endeavors, two paramount problems have forced themselves to the attention of all American Jews. One is the lack of unity in American Jewish life. Never has this been so forcibly demonstrated as in this bitter emergency. All of us are ready to help. Several national organizations are engaged in this task. But instead of unity of action there is dissension; instead of concert of counsel, there is discord and disagreement as to procedure."

"Concerted action by the American Jewish Committee, the American Jewish Congress, the B'nai B'rith and other national organizations would undoubtedly lead to quicker and better results. We need a united Israel."

"I therefore recommend that the Central Conference of American Rabbis not only endorse this movement for unity but express its readiness to participate in any plan that will lead to its consummation."

Honor Kahn, Architect

is being done in the endeavor to disfranchise, to exclude from citizenship, and to exclude from normal participation in the opportunities of living six hundred thousand German Jews of Jewish faith."

The letter continued: "We hope that you, with your wisdom and with your love of your fellow men and with your recognition of what Jews in this, our land, have done to prove the worthy citizenship of men and women of Jewish faith, will choose the best means of exerting the influence of your great office and of the great leadership in the world with which Providence has blessed you so that you will speak a message of glad tidings to the world, consoling and encouraging not only the Jews of America who are grieved and sorely distressed beyond words, but every Jewish heart in the world."

On May 29 William Phillips wrote for the Secretary of State as follows: "Please be assured that careful note has been taken of the contents of your letter and its enclosure, and that this Department is giving the entire situation the most careful and attentive consideration with a view to being helpful in every way it properly can."

The Synagogue Council of America, with offices in the Congregation Emanu-el, 3 East 65th Street, is affiliated with the Central Conference of American Rabbis, Rabbinical Assembly of the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, Rabbinical Council of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America, Union of American Hebrew Congregations, Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America and United Synagogue of America.

gained admission to this country only after Dr. Arlosoroff had intervened for him after he had been turned back at the frontier, was re-manded into custody yesterday for a fifteen day period while police continued their investigation of the murder.

The British Labor party cabled condolences to the Palestine Labor Party over the loss of its noted leader. A delegation of Arab sheiks from Transjordan, visited the Jerusalem offices of the Jewish Agency for Palestine to express their regrets at the death of Dr. Arlosoroff and to express their hopes that the work of rapprochement between the Transjordanian population and the Jews, initiated by Dr. Arlosoroff would not be discontinued. A group of Kerak chieftains also telephoned expressions of their feelings to the Jewish Agency offices.

Tension in Poland

WARSAW, June 22—Tension between Revisionists and young Zionist laborites is increasing despite strict orders from officials in the Revisionist and labor groups to their memberships to refrain from any acts of violence or revenge in connection with the murder of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff. Reports circulated here that angry laborites had attacked Revisionist premises because the alleged slayer of the Palestine labor leader is a Revisionist, proved unfounded.

Special editions of the Revisionist organ, Die Welt, triumphantly assert that Abraham Stavsky, Polish Revisionist who is being held in connection with the murder, established an alibi at his hearing before a Tel Aviv magistrate yesterday. At the hearing Stavsky asserted he had been in Jerusalem on the night that Dr. Arlosoroff was slain in Tel Aviv.
