Hitler Warned Persecution Of the Jews Is Alienating English-German Friendship

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, June 28—The wave of protest against persecution of the Jews in Germany by the Hitler regime culminated last night in a deeply impressive non-Jewish mass-meeting in Queens Hall where three thousand people gathered to hear distinguished leaders in all walks of British life denounce the discrimination and brutality practiced against the Jews in Germany.

In one of the most striking demonstrations against intolerance since the protest here thirty years ago against the Czarist pogroms of the Jews in Russia, representative British leaders warned Adolf Hitler that his program of persecution and discrimination was alienating British friendship from Germany.

Archbishop Presents Resolution

Lord Buckmaster, Chancellor of England from May, 1915 to December, 1916, presided at the meeting. The Archbishop of Canterbury presented the resolution of protest which was adopted by the meeting. The resolution was seconded by the Rev. Dr. J. Scott Lidgett, vice-chancellor of the University of London and a Free Church spokesman, and by the Earl of Iddesleigh, a Catholic.

Lord Reading was the only Jewish speaker of the evening and he offered thanks on behalf of the Jewish community.

In the assembly were over sixty members of both houses of Parliament, members of the peerage, scholars, statesmen and church dignitaries.

The Archbishop of Canterbury was the principal speaker at the meeting. He visibly moved his great audience to tears with his description of the suffering innocent Jewish children undergo in the schools of Germany. He warned against the potential danger of the atmosphere of hatred in which the children in Germany are being raised under the Nazi regime.

Nazis Arrest Children At Arlosoroff Memorial; Try to Provoke Clashes

Communist Attempt to Break Up
Paris Meeting Causes Injuries;
Other Meetings Held Here

BERLIN, June 28—Over 200 Jewish children and Hans Stenberg, leader of the Palestine pioneers' group, Hechalutz, were arrested last night at a meeting in Philharmonic Hall in memory of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, noted Zionist labor leader, who was murdered recently in Palestine. Over three thousand Jewish men, women and children were present at the meeting for which permission had been granted by the authorities, and hundreds were unable to gain entrance.

The death of Dr. Arlosoroff was a deep blow to German Jewry because Dr. Arlosoroff had just outlined two comprehensive plans for their relief, and the memorial meeting held the interest of thousands.

Press in Madrid Protests Entry of Jewish Doctors

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

MADRID, June 28—Anti-Semitic propaganda has appeared in the press here, particularly in conservative papers, in connection with the proposal made recently to permit some of the German-Jewish doctors who have lost their positions in the Hitler regime to settle in Spain.

Some members of the medical college here fear that an influx of Jewish doctors would seriously impair the practices of the Spanish physicians in this country. In representing this viewpoint in the press they took the opportunity to introduce some anti-Semitic propaganda.

They wrote articles attacking Fernando de los Rios, former minister of public instruction, who is now minister of foreign affairs, alleging that he was planning to bring German Jews to Spain.

Minister de los Rios, in a letter to the press, answering the attacks, denied that he ever gave permission for holders of foreign medical diplomas to practice in Spain.

Jewish Workers, Doctors Hit by New Nazi Decree Depriving Them of Rights

BERLIN, June 28—The German Government withdrew the right of Jewish physicians to own nursing homes and clinics yesterday. At the same time, the municipality of Berlin ordered the sick benefit funds, municipal institutions and relief societies aided by the city not to send patients, not even Jews, to Jewish hospitals so that these institutions will not even receive indirect support from the city.

In an effort to relieve the condition of Jewish doctors, which is becoming constantly worse, the Berlin Jewish community today opened its hospitals and clinics to all Jewish doctors to enable them to treat their patients. The facilities of the clinics and laboratories supported by the Jewish community were put at their disposal.

Following on the ouster of Jews from labor unions throughout the Reich and the frequent prohibitions of Jewish labor groups, the Nazi press bureau points out that no Jew may join the new workers organizations now being formed into a comprehensive "labor front."

After the dissolution of their unions, Jewish workmen had hoped to be admitted to the new one. This hope is completely shattered by the Nazi pronouncement.

"Jewish workers are excluded once and for all from German organizations of every kind and therefore from the national labor front," the statement pointed out.

Raid Jewish Organizations

BERLIN, June 28—The political police yesterday carried out a raid on the Berlin headquarters of the Union of East European Jews. Another raid was made on the premises occupied by the Central Union of Eastern European Jews.

Following the series of arrests of Jews throughout the country last week by Nazi storm troopers and auxiliary police, the state commissar for Essen announced today that no one is authorized to make arrests without a police warrant. This applies to storm troopers and even

Ullstein Press Commissar

BERLIN, June 28—The Ullstein newspaper organization, one of the largest in Europe, was placed yesterday under the political control of Eduard Stadler, as Nazi commissar. Stadler is a Nazi member of the Reichstag.

Blaschleger to Montgomery

MONTGOMERY, Ala., June 28—Rabbi Eugene Blaschleger, for the last four years assistant to Rabbi E. N. Calish at Beth Ahabah Synagogue, Richmond, Va., has accepted a request to become leader of Beth Or Congregation here.

Rabbi Blaschleger won his rabbinical degree from Hebrew Union College in 1927, and his M.A. at the University of Richmond last year. He is president of the Religious School Teachers' Association of Virginia, Maryland and the District of Columbia.

12th Century Hebrew Gravestones Found

VIENNA—The stones of the famous old Frankfurter Friedhof may now have to surrender their standing as the oldest to be found in Central Europe, and histories which have dated the Jewish community in Vienna as beginning at the end of the twelfth century may have to correct to a century earlier, according to European reports of the discovery of the oldest Jewish gravestone yet known.

During the laying of a canal whose construction work required the digging up of the land between the Universitätsplatz and the Baekerstrasse in Vienna, two broken tombstones bearing the remains of Hebrew inscriptions were recently found.

Dr. Wachstein, the well-known antiquarian, has made a study of the inscriptions; he declared that he believes them to date from the year 1120, and that they are therefore more than 800 years old. This startling conclusion denotes that there are at least a hundred years of Jewish history in Austria with which the world is totally unacquainted. Dr. Wachstein bases his conclusion upon a study of several Hebrew letters, used as numerals to indicate the date, which remain clearly to be seen and which presuppose the existence of other letters.

The oldest known Jewish cemetery in Vienna is the one on the Albrechtsplatz, (where now stands a monument to Goethe.) According to the dates on these stones and the known expulsion of the Jews from Vienna in 1420, it was unused after this time and fell into neglect; the stones from the tombs were stolen and made use of in the building of walls—no worse a fate than befell many of the ancient Greek and Roman statues which, irrespective of their artistic quality, often ended up by damming a sewer. Several tombstones have been discovered during recent years, but none which indicate so early a settling of Jews in the confines of the city of Vienna.

Houston Honors Dr. Schechter

HOUSTON, Tex., June 28—Dr. Abraham Schechter, orthodox rabbi of Adath Yeshurun Congregation here, who recently declined reelection to his congregation, last night was tendered a big farewell reception, attended by more than one thousand persons.

Outstanding rabbis, the mayor and communal leaders took part in the reception. Dr. Schechter is founder and chancellor of the Texas rabbinical organization, Kallah.

American Physicians to Honor Dr. Weizmann Today

The American Jewish Physicians' Committee for the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, will honor its founder, Dr. Chaim Weizmann, at a luncheon at the Hotel Astor here today.

Over 300 New York physicians are expected to attend the luncheon, according to Dr. Nathan Ratnof, chairman of the committee. Dr. Emanuel Libman will preside.

Borough President Samuel Levy, Judge Otto A. Rosalsky, John E. Sheehy, of the Department of Parks, and Samuel Fassler, Commissioner of Buildings, are among the prominent persons who will attend the luncheon.

Franco-Jewish Sports Groups Practice for Palestine Games

PARIS, June 28—Jewish sports organizations here are active in their preparations for the Maccabiad in Palestine. The three biggest Franco-Jewish youths' organizations, the Union of Israelite Youth, the Scolary Union and the French Maccabi, have formed a joint committee for the purpose of selecting a strong team to send to Palestine.

The first public display of a united Jewish sports festival will take place next Sunday in the presence of Lord Melchett.

Preceding the sports day, a conference will be held to decide the role which the Maccabi will play in France's fight against anti-Semitism. M. Henri-Pate, vice-president of the French Parliament, will take part in the conference.

Local Rabbi Reaches University in Beirut

BEIRUT, Syria, June 15—Rabbi Baruch Braunstein, counselor to Jewish students at Columbia University, New York City, has come to the American University here following a long sojourn in Palestine. He will lecture in Beirut on the "Spirit of Judaism" and will also give his impressions of his travels in Palestine in a series of talks at the Near East School of Theology.

Considerable interest has been aroused by Rabbi Braunstein's visit to the American University here, to which, it should be remembered, the late Julius Rosenwald bequeathed \$250,000.

Rabbi Braunstein was expected here earlier in the year, and was expected to remain here for a whole semester, but his arrival in Beirut was delayed due to the time he spent conducting researches on Jewish history on the island of Majorca off the coast of Spain.

Rosenblatt Family Warns Against Fund Collections For Memorial to Cantor

A warning to the public against unauthorized solicitors for contributions to a fund to establish a memorial for the late Cantor Josef Rosenblatt was issued yesterday by Dr. Samuel Rosenblatt, of Baltimore, son of the famous Jewish singer, in a statement to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

"So far as we know," Dr. Rosenblatt declared, "nothing has been contributed as yet to any fund for Cantor Josef Rosenblatt. It has reached us that there are at the present time certain unauthorized individuals soliciting funds in behalf of the family. This has not been authorized by any member of the family and is being done without their consent.

"A national committee, not under the auspices of any specific cantors' association, but to consist of various responsible operating groups is in the process of being formed and those that wish to contribute toward the Josef Rosenblatt memorial will be requested to apply to that committee, and until its members are known, to the family."

Memorial services for Cantor Rosenblatt were held Tuesday evening in Carnegie Hall. The services were under the auspices of the Jewish Ministers, Cantors Association of which Cantor Rosenblatt was a member. About 2,500 people attended.

On the stage, which was flanked by portraits of Cantor Rosenblatt, were 200 cantors who sang sacred music including many of Cantor Rosenblatt's own compositions. For the first time since he composed "Shomer Israel", his fellow cantors sang the lament without his leading them. Joseph Rumshinsky, lifelong friend of the cantor, conducted the choir of cantors.

Solos were rendered by seven cantors assisted by the choir. Many of the soloists were so shaken by emotion as to make it difficult for them to continue. Later, when from a phonograph there issued the voice of the dead cantor, there was hardly a dry eye in the whole assemblage.

Rabbis Israel Goldstein, W. Margolis and N. Ebin, delivered eulogies on the life and achievements of Cantor Rosenblatt. They praised him for faithfulness to the Jewish religion, his services to his fellow Jews and for his charity.

Hitler Will Be Crushed Padgug Says

"Hitler will be crushed," was the keynote of an address delivered Tuesday night by Nathan M. Padgug, Deputy Attorney General of the State of New York, at the commencement exercises of the National Hebrew School, 206 East Broadway.

American Jewish Women Join Nazi Boycott Drive At Conference Here

Characterizing Hitler as the "most consummate liar in the history of the world" and the persecution of the German Jews as a "blow at the heart of all humanity," Samuel Untermeyer, principal speaker at the boycott conference sponsored by the Women's Division of the American League for the Defense of Jewish Rights, sharply attacked the present German government and its supporters in the United States, and urged the use of the boycott as the only effective weapon with which to fight the plague of Hitlerism.

Over 1,200 women, representing some 300 women's organizations, were present at the mass conference held at the Hotel Astor, Tuesday afternoon, and joined the nationwide boycott against Germany after calling upon all the Jewish women in the United States to boycott all German goods and services without exception, until Hitler falls and his barbaric policy of persecution ends, and pledged the support of all those present in the prosecution of a relentless boycott on all German goods. "Buy American," was adopted as a slogan.

Among the other speakers who addressed the conference were James W. Gerard, former Ambassador to Germany; Fiorello H. LaGuardia, former Representative; Michael Williams, editor of the Commonweal; Dr. A. Coralnik, president of the league; E. Rabinowitz, secretary, and Mrs. Mark Harris, chairman of the Women's Division, who presided.

A cablegram from Lord Melchett, president of the Anglo-Jewish boycott committee, was read, welcoming the cooperation of American Jews in the boycott movement and emphasizing the need for making the boycott world-wide.

One Way to Act

"There is only one way of coping with the barbaric warfare upon a crushed and prostrate people by a cowardly foe who violates all the 'rules of the game' and vents its bigotry, cruelty and hatred on peaceful, law-abiding, unarmed men and on defenseless women and children," Mr. Untermeyer said.

"If our people were armed as Hitler is, they would defend themselves. Since they are not, we must use the next best weapon at hand. And the economic boycott is a weapon that strikes Hitlerism at its weakest point—the pocketbook."

A Return to Dark Ages

Former Ambassador Gerard declared that Germany had always been the homeland of anti-Semitism. "Even when I was there as the American representative, prejudice against the Jews was rife. This pre-

Western B'nai B'rith Lodges Study Fight on Hitlerism At Annual Convention

SANTA CRUZ, Cal., June 28—Following the usual plan of succession in office, Monroe Friedman was advanced to the post of grand president and Alexander Weinstein, of Los Angeles, was elected first grand vice-president, at the concluding session of the seventieth annual convention of District Grand Lodge No. 4, B'nai B'rith, here yesterday. David Blumberg, of this city, was elected second grand vice-president. Edward A. Zeisler, executive secretary, and Harry K. Wolf, grand treasurer, were reelected.

The convention opened Sunday with more than 150 delegates in attendance, representing subordinate lodges in California, Oregon, Washington, British Columbia, Montana, Idaho and Nevada.

Coincident with the three-day session of the grand lodge, the Women's Grand Lodge, comprising the ladies' auxiliaries from the same territory, held a convention here.

Mrs. Rose G. Bertram, of Venice, Cal., presided over the women's meetings. Mrs. Beatrice Peal, of Stockton, Cal., was elevated to the presidency for this year according to the succession plan.

The part being played by the B'nai B'rith in meeting the menace of Hitlerism was told by Judge Isadore M. Golden, of San Francisco, Western director of the Anti-Defamation League, who hastened to this convention from Chicago, where he had attended a hurriedly-called meeting of officers of the league.

Judge Golden delivered his report yesterday. He was followed by Edward A. Zeisler, who reported for the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation.

Nazis Arrest Children

At Arlosoroff Memorial; Try to Provoke Clashes

by Georg Landauer and Kurt Blumfeld, German Zionist leaders, passed off without any untoward incidents. At the beginning of the meeting, a gang of young Nazis had surrounded the hall and attempted to provoke clashes. A strong police detachment, however, succeeded in maintaining order by preventing any provocations, although it became apparent that the meeting would not pass without trouble premeditated by the storm troopers.

As the audience began to file out of the hall at the conclusion of the meeting, scores of uniformed brown shirts occupied the exits and, with the police, checked every member to see whether any one wore Zionist lapel buttons or other insignia which could be construed as being a uniform and hence, a reason for arrest, since no uniforms are allowed except those of the Nazis.

Unable to find anything incriminating the adult members of the audience, the troopers turned their attention to the children, including girls, many of whom were under ten years of age. The children were arrested under the pretext that their white blouses and black ties constituted a uniform. Some of the older boys, who wore blue trousers, were accused of being a bodyguard for the speakers.

The children were crowded into a number of police wagons awaiting in front of the hall, and immediately taken to the station. Despite the lateness of the hour and the age of the children, their parents were not permitted to see them or communicate with them.

The children were released this morning after a night in police custody, after their names had been registered with the police.

Communists Attack Paris Meeting

PARIS, June 28—Several Jewish youths were wounded here yesterday when communists attempted to break up a memorial meeting held in memory of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, assassinated Zionist leader.

The organizers of the meeting, who had got word of the intended raid, were prepared for the emergency and succeeded in preventing the communists from entering the hall.

The trouble-makers provoked a clash outside the hall and many youths were slightly injured in the fighting. The memorial services meanwhile passed off without interruption.

Name in Golden Book

The memorial meeting, held at the Philadelphia - Byron Talmud Torah, was addressed by David Sisslin, Joseph Haggai, Aaron Pregeron, Philip Slomovitz and Rabbi Isaac Stollman. Cantor Jacob Sonnenklar chanted the "El Molei Rachamim." All Zionist parties were represented.

Syracuse Memorial Meeting

"Hitlerism is the most poisonous philosophy in the world today. The Hitler government not only persecutes but they are ironclad liars of the most colossal sort. Evidence exists that some 3,000 Jews were bloodily wounded in attacks by the Nazis and that 300 of the victims died as a result of these attacks.

"It is not only the Jews who are being attacked, the Catholics and Protestants are also in danger. Already the onslaught on the Catholics is beginning and within a very short time it will be the turn of the Protestants.

"Disregard the urgings of the prudent; stand up and fight for the rights of the German Jews. You have the warm approval of all the Christians."
