Will Continue Search For Arlosoroff Slayers, Palestine Police Aver

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, June 29—An official communique from Palestine police headquarters today stated that inquiries into the murder of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff will be vigorously maintained in Jerusalem, Tel Aviv, Jaffa and Haifa until the investigation bears fruit.

Recent inquiries have led to the detention of certain new suspects for examination, though at present police decline to divulge the identity of these persons.

Nazis Propose to Create "Ghetto Union" for Jews

BERLIN, June 29—In connection with the announced prohibition against Jews as members of the new "national labor front," a Government plan for the establishment of a purely Jewish workers' union has been announced. Such a "ghetto union" would not be likely to be of any help to Jewish workers, it is generally felt here. The workers today appealed to the rest of the Jewish population for their support, pointing out that two-thirds of the total Jewish population consists of workers and employees who will be most severely affected.

Nazis Disregard League Upper Silesian Decision

BERLIN, June 29—The decision of the League of Nations that the rights of Jews in Upper Silesia should not be impaired by legislation of the German Government was disregarded today when thirty-five Jewish doctors and twenty Jewish dentists were suddenly dismissed from their positions with the sick benefit funds and municipal institutions in Gliwicz, Beuthen and other Upper Silesian towns.

A delegation of Upper Silesian Jews, including Dr. Weissmann, of Gliwicz and Dr. Zernick, of Beuthen, will proceed to Berlin to take up with the Ministry of the Interior the question of reinstating the dismissed men in their posts.

Jews Attacked by Nazis In Wuerttemberg Town

BASLE, Switzerland, June 29—Reports of serious mistreatment of Jews in Landau, Germany, a town in Wuerttemberg, on June 20 and 21 reached here today.

Nazi hooligans, according to reports, crashed into a cafe owned by a Jew and forced all visitors present to lift their hands over their heads and stand with their faces to the wall. The Nazi roughnecks thereupon set upon the Jews in the crowd and beat many of them unconscious with rubber sticks.

On the following day twelve Jews were arrested by the Nazis. Surrounded by jeering mobs carrying insulting anti-Semitic placards, the Jews were marched down the streets and finally taken to an isolated house on the outskirts of the town.

Once inside the house they were given a mock trial, and then inhumanly beaten. To make matters worse, when they recovered consciousness they were forced to sign declarations stating that they had never been touched.

Mayor Schaaf, of Landau, a militant Hitlerite, addressed a Nazi throng at a meeting in the market place after the incidents. He publicly boasted of the beatings administered to the Jews and declared that far worse happenings were still in store for the Jews of Landau.

German Press Confirms Austrian Jews Expelled

BERLIN, June 29—The German press, today, for the first time confirms reports of the expulsion of Austrian Jews from Germany. Four hundred Jews have already been deported to Austria as "undesirable aliens" in retaliation for expulsion of German Nazi leaders from Austria, the papers reveal today. The Telegraphen Union reports that large numbers of Jewish refugees are crossing the borders to Austria.

Labor Conference Asks League to Aid Victims of the Nazis

GENEVA, June 29—The International Labor Conference, in plenary session, today adopted a resolution asking the League of Nations to intervene in behalf of the refugees from Germany and, through the International Labor Office, investigate the situation without infringing upon any of the rights of Germany in internal matters. The resolution was carried by the impressive vote of 80 to 2, the Portuguese and Finnish representatives voting against it.

The resolution, formulated earlier by a committee for presentation to the conference, was the subject of a striking discussion today. The Dutch labor delegate, M. Kupers, urging transmission of the resolution to the League, described eloquently the persecution of the Jews in Germany and appealed to the League to intervene before it is too late to protect the oppressed. He indicated the urgent need of co-

World Zionist Congress To Convene in Prague

LONDON, June 29—The World Zionist Congress will be convened in Prague on August 16, the Zionist Executive announced today. Although the date of the congress had been fixed some time ago, the site for the affair constituted a difficulty which has now been overcome.

The congress is expected to be one of the largest in the history of the Zionist movement and more than three times as many delegates are expected as attended the Seventeenth Congress two years ago at Basle.

Palestine's representation will be increased from 39 to 48. Central Poland will have 90 delegates as compared to 33 at the last Congress. West Galicia is sending 40 instead of eleven representatives. The full list of delegates has not yet been published.

Hebrew U. Physicians' Group Host to Weizmann

The progress made at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem was graphically described yesterday to over four hundred members of the American Jewish Physicians' Committee for the Hebrew University at a luncheon tendered Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the institution, at the Hotel Astor.

Discussing the university and its work, Dr. Weizmann aroused enthusiasm, when after discussing criticism of the university recently voiced by Professor Albert Einstein, he expressed his belief that the noted scientist would go there.

"There is his place," Dr. Weizmann exclaimed. "He would cease to be a wanderer throughout the universities of the world."

Dr. Emanuel Libman, chairman of the executive committee of the physicians' group, presided at the affair. Dr. Nathan Ratnoff, president of the group, introduced Dr. Weizmann and spoke of the work being done at the university and of plans for the future. He told of the plan to build a university hospital and medical school. Dr. Libman appealed to the Jews of America to help raise \$200,000 to strengthen the university and enable the committee to continue its support of research activities there.

Among those present at the luncheon were Dr. Julius Jarcho for whom the Medical Library at the Hebrew University is named; Borough President Samuel Levy; Judge Otto A. Rosalsky; Hon. John E. Sheehy of the Department of Parks; Commissioner of Buildings Hon. Samuel Fessler; Dr. A. S. W. Rosenbach, President of the American Friends of the Hebrew University; Judge Julian W. Mack, member of the board of Governors; Dr. Solomon Lowenstein, vice-president of the American Friends of the Hebrew University, and Dr. Israel J. Kligler, head of the Department of Hygiene and Bacteriology at the Hebrew University, now on leave of absence in this country.

Yeshivoh Federation Reports

A sum of \$67,316 was given to the Jewish Parochial Schools of Greater New York during the last two years by the Federation of Yeshivoh, C. Joshua Epstein, treasurer, reported at the second annual conference Wednesday night. Jacob L. Andron was reelected president of the federation.

Frick Plan Proposes Sterilization of Jews.

BERLIN, June 29—A plan for the sterilization of Jews in Germany as a lower element of the population was announced yesterday by Wilhelm Frick, Minister of the Interior, at the first meeting of the newly-organized council on race policies for purification of the German race. The plan also provides for prohibition of intermarriages.

In announcing his plan, Frick charged that 400 Eastern European Jews had been naturalized in Berlin in 1930.

Reich's Minister Conti argued against consideration of the Jews as an inferior race, pointing out that the official Government attitude toward the Jews was not as of an inferior but as an alien race, intermarriage with which would only lead to race hatred.

Greenstein Maryland Relief Administrator

BALTIMORE, June 29—Harry Greenstein, director of the Associated Jewish Charities and chairman of the Baltimore Council of Social Agencies, has been named State Administrator of Unemployment Relief.

Announcement of his appointment in this capacity and that he will serve without cost to the State—his services being loaned indefinitely by the Associated Jewish Charities—was made by the Maryland Board of State Aid and Charities.

The Committee to Survey Social Welfare here has appointed Edward D. Lynde, assistant director of the Family Welfare Association of America, and Harry Lurie, director of the Bureau of Jewish Social Research, of New York City, to make the investigation of welfare work in Baltimore contemplated as a prelude to far-reaching changes in the existing systems, it was announced by Mayor Howard W. Jackson.

Polish Jews Participate In Treaty Celebration

WARSAW, June 29—Jewish youth organizations participated strongly yesterday in the Polish celebration on the anniversary of the signing of the Versailles treaty which gave Poland its existence and access to the sea. Throughout the Jewish quarter of the city, youth groups, headed by bands of musicians, and carrying patriotic banners, marched at intervals through the day. Members of the Brith Trumpeldor, Revisionist youth group, carried signs proclaiming, "No Poland without the sea; no Palestine without legions."

ORT Office in Berlin Receives Pleas for Aid

Hundreds of German Jews of all classes go daily to the office of the World ORT organization in Berlin and request to be placed in that group's agricultural cooperative colonies or other institutions and undertakings, according to the People's ORT Federation in New York.

The ORT is active at present in the work of the Central Organization for Industrial and Trade Relief. Up to the present the ORT has opened many courses to train Jews in Germany to be chauffeurs, automobile mechanics, metal workers and cutters. Hundreds of German Jews are taking these courses.

The ORT has also opened many bureaus in England, France and Yugoslavia to assist skilled Jewish workers in finding employment. The organization is now working on plans to bring relief to hundreds of Jewish refugees from Germany. This plan, according to the New York office, entails the transportation of whole industries out of Germany.

Protest Boycott Stamp Ban

In a letter to Postmaster General James A. Farley yesterday, Samuel Untermyer protested against a Post Office Department order forbidding the pasting on envelopes of stamps urging a boycott of German goods.

The American League for the Defence of Jewish Rights, issued today a boycott pin to be worn by all who sympathize with the boycott movement. "Boycott Hitler's Germany," is the slogan engraved on the pin.

WEIZMANN OUTLINES PLAN FOR COLONIZATION OF 250,000 JEWS IN PALESTINE WITHIN FIVE YEARS

Dr. Chaim Weizmann, former president of the World Zionist Organization and of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, outlined a program Wednesday evening, for the colonization of 250,000 victims of anti-Semitism in Germany and in other lands. He was guest of honor at the first public reception for him since his arrival in the United States last Friday.

"Such a program would require the whole-hearted cooperation of the Mandatory Power, which will in turn need the encouragement of the League of Nations and the United States," he declared.

"A minimum of \$25,000,000 would be required, to be raised with the assistance of the Jews in the interested countries.

Requires Unity

"It must also be stressed that such a large-scale program demands unprecedented unity among the Jewish people. Its objects might easily be wrecked by the opinionated selfishness of that die-hard group which refuses to recognize the existence of Palestine. As never before there is expected of all Jews a subordination of their preconceptions to the broad demands of a crucial period in Jewish history.

"If we continue to develop Palestine along those lines which we have followed from the day of Theodor Herzl, we shall have reason to be proud of our achievement. We shall be bringing Jews into a country where the dignity of human labor will be paramount. We shall be building a country where the worth of the individual will be measured by his contribution to the creation of a happy people. We shall have a community that will strive to enrich the many and not the few. We shall show the world that Jewish idealism and Jewish vision, when given full play, can bring forth a civilization as noble and as fruitfully as any which history has known."

The meeting was under the auspices of the American Palestine Campaign, the Zionist Organization of America and the Jewish Agency for Palestine. Samuel Untermyer, chairman of the Weizmann reception committee, acted as chairman.

Among the other speakers were Louis Lipsky, national chairman of the American Palestine Campaign; Morris Rothenberg, president of the Zionist Organization of Amer-

ica and Rabbi Samuel Schulman of Temple Emanu-El.

Palestine Central Solution

"More and more," said Mr. Rothenberg, "the eyes of Jewry must turn to Palestine as the central solution of the Jewish refugee from persecution."

"The problem of the Jewish people is an international problem and not the concern of the Jews alone," declared Mr. Lipsky. He predicted Dr. Weizmann's speedy return to the center of world Zionist activity.

Rabbi Samuel Schulman said, "There are various ways of helping our Jewish brethren in lands in which they suffer, but there is no door in any country which seems to me to be so hospitably open as is that of Palestine. Therefore non-Zionist as well as Zionist, anti-nationalist as well as nationalist, within Jewry should give unstintingly so that we are able in a spirit of justice and peace, in cooperation with the Arab inhabitants of Palestine, to make as large and secure a home as possible for the Jews who are to go there."

Dr. Weizmann came to the United States as guest of honor at Jewish Day at the Century of Progress Exposition in Chicago on July 3.

Jewish Youth Held For Trampling Swastika

BERLIN, June 29—Jacob Herrnfreund, 20 years old, was arrested yesterday on the charge of having torn down and trampled upon the swastika banner which hung over Nazi headquarters in the Brandenburgische Strasse. Although he was supposed to have torn down the flag in broad daylight, workmen on a neighboring building project denied they had witnessed the act and, in fact, denied that it had occurred.

Meanwhile Herrnfreund's place of detention and fate remain unknown. Hitler's Voelkische Beobachter explains that the workmen on the building are socialists and naturally being glad that the flag was torn down by a Jew, therefore denied that the incident took place.

Jewish Centers to Celebrate July 4

Fourth of July will be celebrated this year by several hundred Y.M.H.A.'s, Y.W.H.A.'s and Jewish Community Centers affiliated with the Jewish National Welfare Board, in a fitting fashion, with mass outdoor programs as the main feature of the celebrations.

Soul of Jewish Child Seared by Hitler Regime Says Dr. Moskowitz

German-Jewish youth is pessimistic and discouraged, stated Dr. Henry Moskowitz Wednesday on his return from Europe, where he spent five weeks in Germany and elsewhere investigating conditions of Jewry in the Nazi regime. He will make a full report on his findings to the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee. Dr. Moskowitz is a member of this organization's board of directors.

The most heartbreaking tragedy, in his opinion, is the fate of the Jewish child in Germany. He said: "I do not desire to repeat details of brutal atrocities, but I cannot refrain from calling attention to the effect of the Hitler regime upon Jewish children. It is true that in the vast majority of the schools Jewish children are not separated from German children, but they are separated psychically by thousands of miles. The stories told by parents about their children's treatment in the schools is heartrending. The Hitler regime appeals to the emotions of the people; parades and holidays are frequent in Germany now. Pupils are informed that a holiday will occur on a certain day. Jewish children dress up for it. When they come to the school that day the teacher will ask them to arise in the presence of the German children and then say: 'You cannot participate in this holiday because you are not German'. The children then return to their parents, weeping, and ask them: 'Why am I not German?' This is worse than physical separation. Hitler has seared the souls of thousands of innocent children."

Want to Remain

Dr. Moskowitz stated that German-Jewish youth desires to emigrate elsewhere, where they can start life anew.

"But the mass of the 500,000 German Jews," he declared, "wish to remain in that country. They died for Germany during the war, 12,000 of them, and their contribution to German industry, science, art and letters show how they lived for Germany. The German Jew is being made the scapegoat of German misery he did not create."

Dr. Moskowitz revealed that he talked with responsible non-Jews as well as Jewish leaders and discovered that the accounts of conditions in Germany, as described by Dorothy Thompson, for the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, Knickerbocker, of the New York Evening Post, and Mowrer, of the Chicago Daily News, were "not only accurate, but restrained."

ordinating the work of the various committees for the relief of refugees.

Neither Holland nor other countries will take the advice of Dr. Paul Joseph Goebbels, Nazi propagandist, and murder the Jews, he declared. Referring to the obligation to act, he stated, "The matter is beyond class interests. Social justice and feelings of humanity demand initiative in this matter."

The discussion occupied attention at both the morning and afternoon sessions. The resolution was supported by Simpson, the Canadian delegate, and by M. Jouxhaux, of France, who stressed that adoption of the resolution was a gesture of solidarity with the oppressed. The British delegate, Mr. Leggett, also supported the resolution but said in voting for it, it was not his intention to condemn Germany over internal affairs.

Labor Law Against Aliens Promulgated by Reich

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, June 29—A law providing that aliens in Germany earning less than 700 marks a month will have to obtain special labor permits or suffer expulsion from the Reich was promulgated yesterday, taking effect July 1.

Consuls of foreign powers would be unable to intervene for their nationals under this ordinance, since labor legislation is an internal matter. The law, which may strike Eastern European Jews in Germany with especial severity, since it is not likely that they will be given the special permits, was forecast by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency in dispatches two weeks ago.

Lecturers Aid Refugees

LONDON, June 29—Lecturers at the London School of Economics have decided to devote part of their salaries each month to aid their colleagues in Germany who were deprived of their posts in the wave of opposition against German Jews.

Their contributions will be given to the fund maintained by the Academic Assistance Council, an organization formed last month to succor German-Jewish professors.
