Zionist Executive Rejects Revisionists' Appeal for Putting Off World Parley

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON, July 5—The Zionist Executive Committee has decided against postponing the World Zionist Congress in Prague this August, it was announced here today. Post-ponement had been requested by va-rious parties, particularly by the Revisionists, who pointed out that grave tension has been caused among the Jewish masses by the murder of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, and that the German Zionist leaders would be unable to attend the convention in August due to trouble in their coun-

try.
The Revisionists demanded, in-stead of the world congress, the immediate calling of a meeting of the Actions Committee to discuss new plans. Various Zionist groups in Pales-

Ambassador Dodd Sails With U.S. Instructions On Racial Issue in Reich

Fighter for Academic Freedom Hopes for a Change in Condition of Jews; Wise Also Sails

Dr. William E. Dodd, the new American Ambassador to Germany, sailed for Europe on the S. S. Washington yesterday with the conviction that an improvement in the position of the Jews in Germany is

bound to come before long. Dr. Dodd declared to a representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that he is sailing with definite instructions on the racial question in Germany which, he hopes, will lead to a change in the present situation. He recently had conferences on the subject with President Rosevelt, he

"I have studied thoroughly the problem of the Jews in Germany since my appointment as Ameri-can Ambassador to that country," Dr. Dodd declared. "Being a liberal and a scientist, my views on the racial question are obvious and ought not to be defined. I am fully in harmony with the President's attitude on the subject, and his views on the racial question are well-known from his stand and actions in this country. I cannot, of course, disclose the details of my discussion with the President, but I am sure that a change of the situation of the Jews in Germany is bound to come."

The new Ambassador who is better known as a scholar than as a politician, is loking forward to his activities in Germany where he has spent a number of years in his early life. He speaks German fluently, and is well aware of the great (Continued on Page 4)

Nazi Lawyers Demand Arvans Dismiss Jews In Legal Partnerships

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, July 5-An order prohibiting Aryan lawyers from entering into partnerships with or sharing the offices of Jewish lawyers was issued by the Lawyers' Association here today. The association or-dered that law partnerships dating back to September, 1930, must be dissolved wherever a Jew and an Aryan were together. The partnerships must be broken up, it was commanded, even if the Jewish partner has not yet been dismissed from office due to the fact that he is a war veteran.

It was indicated at the same time by the Lawvers' Association that a larger dismissal of Jewish notaries is expected shortly. The first two lists of dismissals of Jewish notaries were merely the beginning, it was hinted. In the near future such serious restrictions will be imposed that only those Jewish notaries who were appointed before the war will remain in office.

Lansbury Urges League Intervene in Germany On Behalf of Jewry (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, July 5-A demand that the League of Nations intervene against Germany's persecution of the Jews was made this evening by George Lansbury in the House of Commons, in the course of a decommons, in the course of a de-bate on the Dominions' foreign af-fairs policy. During the debate the question of Jewish treament at the hands of the Nazis was raised by other parliamentarians.

Lansbury, in protesting against what he termed the brutal and ruth-less persecution of German Jews, also demanded justice for German communists because, he said, they, too, were human beings. Sir Austen Chamberlain pointed

out that, as a former foreign minister, he must speak cautiously regarding the internal affairs of another country, but he stressed the (Continued on Page 4)

of their liberalism. The American Jewish Congress, in a communication addressed to Mr. Strassburger, and signed by Bernard S. Deutsch, as President, points out that the appointment of Dr. Goebbels is direct sanction of his policies. It would have been singularly appropriate, says the communication, to have renamed Thomas Mann, precisely because he

was proscribed.

The American nation, dedicated to the principle that all men are free and equal, repudiates the policy of oppression practiced against the Jews by the Hitler government, says the communication. As a says the communication. As a newspaper publisher and molder of public opinion, it continues, it be-hooves Mr. Strassburger, to really enlighten the American people as to the facts of the persecution of Jews in Germany.

Jaffa Police to Ask to Hold Stavsky at Arraignment: Inquiry Not Completed

JERUSALEM, July 5—Abraham
Stavsky, young Revisionist who is
being held in connection with the
murder of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff,
will appear today before the British will appear today before the Brinsan Magistrate in Jaffa, at which time the police will ask that he be re-manded into their custody for a further period, it was learned here. The evidence against Stavsky not yet being complete, police state that they require more time for concluding the investigation.

The Jewish Telegraphic Agency has learned that the report pub-lished in yesterday's editions of some Palestine newspapers to the effect that Stavsky would be formally charged with murder today was premature. Only a remand will be sought tomorrow, it was definitely established.

Meanwhile a cook in a Jerusalem restaurant has come forward with an offer to give evidence that Staysky dined in his establishment between 8 and 8:30 p.m. on the Friday night Dr. Arlosoroff was slain. On the other hand, there are a total of six witnesses who claim they saw Stavsky in Tel Aviv shortly before the murder.

Three prominent Palestine lawyers, Messrs. Horiwitz, Eliash and Bernard Joseph are following the case as representatives of Mrs. Arlosoroff, widow of the murdered man, who is slowly recovering from grief and shock as a result of her husband's murder.

Street. He also conducted services at Beth Israel Hospital. He was born in Russia sixty years

ago and came to New York City as a young man. He is survived by a widow and four sons, one of whom, Abraham Ellstein, is accompanist for Molly Picon.

Neville Laski Warns Of Flambovant Protests Against Nazi Tyranny

(Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, July 5-A warning that a greater massacre of German Tews than is now being faced may yet follow, since Jews are hostages in the hands of their Nazi enemies, was uttered Monday night by Neville Laski, Jewish communal worker, at the annual dinner of the Reli-gious Board for Jewish Education. Lloyd George was the guest of honor at the dinner.

Laski, denving that the Iews intend to meet war with war, said he opposed flamboyant theatrical acts such as demonstrative boycotts. He. stressed his opposition to the street march being proposed by Jews here through Hyde Park July 20.

Lloyd George made a short address, flinging a challenge at the Third Reich. He asked how it was possible for them, while proscribing. the Jewish race, to continue to wor-ship the Jewish Bible. He described the section now on top in Germany as "a residium whose antipathies are expressed in gross

Every Jewish persecutor, he de-clared, pins to his own breast a badge of inferiority, acknowledging that he is beaten by Jewish sub-tlety, 'perfinactly and imagination,' and admitting that he cannot fight the Iew on equal terms.

Nahum Sokolow, president of the World Zionist Organization and of the Jewish Agency, paid a tribute to Lloyd George, describing him as the father of the Jewish national home. Dr. Sokolow claimed that only with a revival of spiritualism can we overcome the terrible crisis with which German Tewry is face to face.

Weizmann to Aid Cleveland Drive for German Relief (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Dr. Chaim Weizmann, former president of the World Zionist Organization and at present one of the leaders in the British Campaign for the aid of the Jews of Germany, will stop over in Cleveland on his return east from Chicago on Thursday to address the final meeting of the campaign workers to be held at the Hotel Statler.

According to Mr. Wise, fund solicitations were surprisingly suc-cessful, considering the depressed status of local business conditions.

Also unani-mously adopted was Dr. Chaim Weizmann's 5,000,000 pound drive for the settlement of 250,000 German Jews in Palestine. An American-Palestine campaign to start the new drive before September was urged by the delegates.

Weizmann Gets Ovation

The resolutions were presented by Louis Lipsky and seconded by Abram Goldberg and Eliku Stone, who characterized them as "a restatement and reaffirmation of fun-

damental Zionism."

The movement to secure the appointment of American delegates to the World Zionist Congress who were in favor of the election of Dr. Weizmann to the world presidency gained great impetus on Monday as a result of his arrival on the convention scene in connection with Jewish Day. Making a dramatic appearance, unexpected by the delerates, at the morning session, Dr. Weizmann received a prolonged ovation. This ovation was repeated ovation. This ovation was repeated when 2,000 persons crowded the grand ballroom of the Palmer House on Monday evening at a dinner in Dr. Weizmann's honor. James Waterman Wise Says Jews Must Not Relax In War Against Hitlerism (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

CHICAGO, July 5-James Waterman Wise, of New York City, aroused 350 delegates to the Na-tional Jewish Youth Conference in session here vesterday to a pitch of intense feeling and enthusiasm when he demanded, in a talk on the German situation, that political intervention and an economic boycott must be pushed with the full force of American Jewry.

of American Jewry.
What is going on in Germany, he said, is part of the sub-conscious life of all Jews throughout the world. In telling what must be done to eliminate Hitlerism he declared that they must do everything possible to keep the wave of indig-nation at white heat.

"Jews must let the world know." he asserted, "that we will continue to raise our voices and speak intermittently until these wrongs have been righted. We must continue our own struggle for liberation of German Jewry. We must do this in order to retain world opinion now so strongly in our favor. Germany will feel the effects of this propaganda despite the iron ring of cen-

ganda despite the fron ling of car-sorship which surrounds it."

Mr. Wise declared that the Jews of the United States have the right to expect President Roosevelt to speak out against the German situation.

Dr. A. L. Sachar, of Champaign, Ill., director of the Hillel Founda-tion, talking about the Jew on the American scene, told the delegates that the main problem confronting the Jew here is the preserving of the cultural autonomy of a minority people.

Judge William Lewis, of Philadel-phia, discussing our relation with Palestine, said that country was the most hopeful solution of the Tewish problem.

In a statement issued prior to his departure, Dr. Wise called upon all Jewish organizations to join in making the World Jewish Congress the most representative organ of the voice of world Jewry.

were promoted to the rank of notaries only when they reached an advanced age, only a small number of them still are in office. All the others, who were appointed under the republic, face dismissal.

More than 1,200 German-Iewish lawyers who formerly were officially permitted to appear in courts have now been advised by the authorities to form collective organizations. Each collective, it was ordered, should consist of ten Jewish lawyers, and only one representative of each collective may appear in court on the same day.

The official reason given for this advice was that the appearance of a large number of Jewish lawyers in court would enrage the populace at the present time. In reality, however, the advice is tantamount to an order reducing the number of Jewish lawyers who may appear in court to one-tenth of the former number. From now on 120 lawyers instead of 1,200 will be able to practice in German courts.

Judges have been warned against making any attempts to help pov-erty-stricken Jewish lawyers by ap-Hitlerism Is World Threat pointing them as counsel for the poor or as executors. Any attempt by a judge to help a Jewish lawyer will result in his dismissal, the order
