## Colonel Donovan Denies He Gave His O. K. to Hitler's Allies Here

Though the name of Colonel William Donovan, Republican candidate for Governor of New York in the last election, is prominently featured on the letterhead of the organization known as the Friends of Germany, of which Edwin C. Emerson is chairman of the executive committee, Mr. Donovan has written to Bernard G. Richards, chairman of the Jewish Council of Greater New York, stating that he is not a member, it was learned yesterday. The organization seeks to organize sentiment in favor of Germany.

The letterhead lists Colonel Donovan as one of the honorary members. Colonel Donovan wrote to Mr. Richards: "The fact is I have not joined the organization to which you refer."

Last week several prominent persons in New York received a letter from Emerson, in which was enclosed an application blank. He asked that the persons receiving the letters join his organization, which has its headquarters in his office at 17 Battery Place.

"By reason of your known friendliness toward Germans your name has been proposed as that of a good friend of Germany and therefore a likely member of our society. So we send you the enclosed application

## I. Ben-Zwi, Labor Leader, May Be in Agency Executive

JERUSALEM, July 8.—I. Ben-Zwi, Palestine labor leader, is expected to join the Jewish Agency Executive following a conference with the Labor Party which is expected to take place Monday. Ben-Zwi, in conferences with the Vaad Leumi (Jewish National Council) and the Jewish Agency Executive, demanded the full powers of a member of the Executive similar to those enjoyed by Dr. M. B. Hexter, American member, and Heschel Farbstein of Poland.

The vacancy on the Executive was created by the death of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, who was the outstanding labor leader in the Zionist movement.

## 210 More Notaries Fired, 150 More Lawyers Listed, By Prussian Ministry (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, July 8.—A list of 210 more dismissed notaries, including 200 from this city, was published this afternoon by the Prussian ministry of justice. The ministry also released an order for the dismissal of 150 lawyers, including 100 from Berlin.

Among the lawyers and notaries dismissed were Professor Max Alsborg, Justice Counsellor Magnus, former publisher of the Juristische Wochenblatt, and Justice Counsellor Siegfried Lowenstein.

## Entering Wedge to Exclude Jewish Brokers in Reich

BERLIN, July 8.—An ordinance designed to eliminate all Jewish brokers from the stock exchanges was issued yesterday. The ordinance declared that, beginning October 1, discretion should be used as to which brokers are to be readmitted to the stock exchanges.

Jewish "staatenlose" (men without citizenship in any country) should be particularly excluded, the ordinance stated.

## Jewish Vendors Driven From Dessau Market

BERLIN, July 8.—All Jewish vendors in Dessau, Prussia, on the Elbe River, have been driven from the marketplaces, where they had traded freely for many years. The Dessau municipality issued a statement, after complaints were made, that "Jews should be thankful they still are permitted to remain in Germany altogether."

## Vienna Revisionist to Congress

VIENNA, July 8.—Austrian elections for delegates to the World Zionist Congress to be held next month in Prague resulted in the designation of two general Zionists, one Poale Zion member and one Revisionist. The Zionist Executive will have to determine whether the Revisionist seat will go to a representative of the Jabotinsky or Grossman faction.

## Reich Jews as Aliens, Status Proclaimed by Hitler Slogan Maker

BERLIN, July 8.—What will happen to the Jews of Germany following the promulgation of the law depriving them of citizenship in the Reich was graphically outlined by Dr. Gottfried Feder, chief theoretician of the Nazi party and author of the program of Hitler, who is now secretary of the Reich's Ministry of Economics.

The first result will be the proclaiming of all Jews as aliens in the Reich, Feder asserted, and their consequent subjection to laws governing aliens.

Secondly, Jews, no matter what their length of residence in Germany or the fact that they were born citizens here, will be required to obtain residential permits just as are foreigners and "staatenlose" (men without citizenship in any country).

Thirdly, Jews will be permitted to reside in Germany only as long as their presence does not affect the labor situation or the food interests of the Germans.

Fourthly, they will be subject to deportation following conviction on any crime, no matter how minor.

Fifthly, they will have to carry documents at all times showing they have permission to reside in Germany.

All these restrictions do not constitute a pogrom against the Jews, Feder asserted, but are merely put

Not only are its police intensively combing Palestine, but they are diligently searching in Syria, Egypt and several European cities, it was learned.

One man, Abraham Stavsky, a Polish Revisionist, is under arrest in Jerusalem in connection with the trial. He has been remanded pending investigation on two occasions.

## \$708,000 Raised in U. S. For German Jews' Relief

Contributions in America for the German Relief Campaign of the Joint Distribution Committee total \$708,000 to date, Rabbi Jonah B. Wise, national chairman of the \$2,000,000 drive announced yesterday. Two hundred and fourteen communities have already engaged in relief drives and campaigns are now under way in another 104 communities, to be completed by July 30.

Of the \$708,000 thus far raised, \$375,000 was contributed in New York where the quota is \$1,000,000, or half the national goal. Dudley S. Sicher is chairman and Allie S. Freed associate chairman of the New York Appeal. Many contributions have come from non-Jews, Rabbi Wise said.

Funds raised for German relief by the Joint Distribution Committee are expended in Germany through the Zentrallausschuss fuer Hilfe und Aufbau of which Rabbi Leo Baeck is chairman.

## Rabbi Abraham Nowak Quits Cleveland Post

### Says Germany May Kill

What the Jews in Germany are experiencing today is not actually the full measure of what Germany is justified in doing to the Jews, Reich's Commissar of Justice Frank declared at a mass meeting of German jurists.

"Germany is justified in doing whatever she wishes to the Jews," he exclaimed, "including their destruction. And if the Government has not done this, it is due to the spirit of responsibility which the Government carries toward the German nation. But it is not due to outside influence.

"When a million Russians were destroyed by Jews," he shouted, "no one protested. But when Germany dismissed a single Jewish lawyer, the entire Jewish world raises anti-German propaganda the world over."

### "Boycott Jewish Firms"

New impetus has been given the anti-Semitic war here by a series of developments in the past few weeks, striking at the Jews from many directions.

Among these developments are the recommendation to non-Jewish firms, made in a strong appeal to them, to place their orders with Aryan travelling salesmen and boycott Jewish travellers in order to carry out the slogan, "Germans—buy only from Germans."

Members of the Nazi Party have been ordered not only to boycott Jewish shops, but also Jewish cafes and restaurants and places patronized by Jews in order to prevent their coming into contact with Jews.

Mass expulsion of Jewish students from the universities is made possible by the instructions of the Prussian Minister of Education to expel not only members of the Communist Party but also anyone suspected of being in sympathy with Communism. Since it is not necessary to prove the allegation of communist sympathies, the mere fact that the charge is made is sufficient to bring about expulsion.

The Voelkische Beobachter, newspaper owned by Adolf Hitler, has renewed violent anti-Semitic agitation after several weeks of chafing at the restraint imposed by the supreme Nazi councils.

### Nazi Blind Expel Jewish Blind

BERLIN, July 8—The association of blind members of professions has resolved to expel its Jewish members from the organization.

## Fifty New York M.D.s Protest Nazi Injustice; Signers All Non-Jews

Fifty prominent physicians in New York City have signed a petition circulated by Dr. Linsly R. Williams, director of the New York Academy of Medicine, protesting against the injustice done to their professional colleagues in Germany under the Nazi regime.

"We believe that science should not recognize any racial or political boundaries and we deplore the injustice done non-Aryan professional men in Germany, many of whom are of the highest standing," the statement which they signed read in part.

All the doctors who signed the petition were non-Jews.

## Dr. Margoshes, Ginsberg To Address Avukah School

## Brooklyn Dentist Sails To Give Palestine Course

Dr. Herman Ansubel, of Brooklyn, N. Y., noted dental clinician, has left for Palestine to give seminar and clinical demonstrations in the various phases of oral surgery to the dentists there, it was announced yesterday. He is going under the auspices of the Nathan and Lena Straus Health Center of Hadassah.

Dr. Ansubel left yesterday for Italy aboard the Conte di Savoia. After a short visit to Italy he will proceed directly to Palestine.

## Solomon Dannenbaum, 92, Dies

SAN FRANCISCO, July 8—Solomon Dannenbaum, 92 years old, a pioneer business man of the Pacific Coast and colorful figure in the local Jewish community, died here after an illness that began with a stroke of apoplexy on June 28. He was the grandfather of Raymond Dannenbaum, former publisher of The Jewish Journal. He was one of the oldest Masons in the State.

## New York Banker Finds Average German Not Keen Over Anti-Semitic Program

Walter Von Treslow, vice-president of the Central Hanover Bank and Trust Company, who returned Friday from Germany, said that as far as anti-Semitism was concerned, the German government was in the position of the musician who lost his flute and found a bass drum. It had found something and must use it, but it doesn't like it.

"I learned that in Germany there is a general admission that the government policy is wrong. The Hitler government has started the anti-Semitic program, and, although it realizes its mistake, must continue with it to save its face.

"The Germans appreciate that the attack on the Jew is costing them colossal sums in business and world trade. Everywhere in Germany, I found business men and financiers who deplored the Jewish excesses. Only when it is realized that the relation of the German to the Jew is of primary importance and not secondary, will there be a change."

## Third Booklet on Nazi Persecution Is Issued

LONDON, July 8—A third booklet on the persecution of the Jews in Germany was issued here today by the British Board of Jewish Deputies. It contains the latest facts published in the British press regarding the treatment of the Jews by the Nazis.

In a foreword to the publication, Neville Laski, Leonard Montefiore and Leonard Stein point out that persecution of the Jews in Germany has been conducted without any connection with the Government's political opposition. The Jews, it is asserted, are persecuted as Jews, a fact which is perceived in the laws expressly discriminating against the Jewish race. The persecution is particularly intense, it is stated, of the educated Jewish classes, such as university instructors, civil servants, lawyers and doctors.

## Minneapolis Mayor Names Jew to Public Welfare Body

MINNEAPOLIS, July 8—I. S. Josephs, a leader in Jewish communal life in Minneapolis for many years, was named to the board of public welfare in the first appointment to be made by the new mayor, A. G. Bainbridge, after he took office Monday. Mr. Josephs has for a number of years been active in civic and philanthropic activities in Minneapolis.

## Garment Strike Near Settlement as Employers Meet Terms of Union

The strike of clothing workers initiated by the Amalgamated Clothing Workers of America, and involving 50,000 workers in New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania, a majority of whom are Jewish, continued yesterday. The leaders in charge expressed themselves as being well satisfied with the success of the stoppage in the men's clothing industry. Settlements with the employers are being made very rapidly and the settlement committee of the union was active all day yesterday and will be busy today receiving applications from the employers and negotiating settlements, it was said at Union headquarters. At the same time the union made arrangements for a series of mass meetings to be held tomorrow at which the strikers will be told of the progress made.

Joseph Schlossberg, secretary-treasurer of the Amalgamated Clothing Workers, declared "there is a general spirit of optimism among the workers. Everyone is looking forward to a good season. The stoppage will result in the complete unionization of the industry in this district.

"We asked for an increase in wages of 25 per cent, but found that earnings were very unequal in the various shops. Certain ruthless employers had cut wages very deeply even succeeding in making cuts in earnings which the workers were compelled to keep secret, on threats of losing their jobs. Naturally they will have to increase wages all the more. Other employers who were more humane will have smaller increases to make. The settlements being negotiated by the union will carry wage increases ranging from ten to thirty per cent."

At the same time that the Amalgamated strike was in process of being settled, a new strike involving from 20,000 to 30,000 workers in the garment industries loomed as a result of a dispute between the International Ladies' Garment Workers Union and the Industrial Council of Cloak, Suit and Skirt Manufacturers, Inc. The representatives of the workers and employers who have been in conference, disagreed on the question of renewing a working contract based on 'week-work' or 'piece work.'

The union demanded the incorporation of week-work into the contract pointing out that they were bound by the result of a referendum held by the workers who voted 2 to 1 in favor of week-work.

The employers refused to deal with the union on any basis that did

## Canadian Jews to Select Zionist Delegates Wednesday

MONTREAL, July 8—Election of delegates to the Eighteenth Zionist Congress will be held here and in other Canadian cities next Wednesday, for the first time in the history of the Canadian Zionist movement. Canada is entitled to four delegates.

Mandates are being sought by five lists. The General Zionists, Poale Zion-Zeire Zion, Mizrahi, Zionist Revisionists and Democratic Revisionists.

## Oakland Jewish Welfare Fund Selects Officers

OAKLAND, Cal., July 8—Michael Grodin was elected president of the United Jewish Welfare Fund of Oakland at the seventh annual meeting held at the Jewish Center here. Other officers elected were Matt Wahrhaftig, first vice-president; Dr. Charles Wise, second vice-president; Bernard Silverstein, third vice-president, and Mrs. Frederick Kahn, treasurer.

Announcement was made that the eighth annual appeal will be made in the latter part of August and that a part of the fund will go to the relief of German Jewry.

In an interview he said he strongly disapproved of Hitler's policies in Germany and declared that the Nazi party is financed by the barons of industry to destroy every vestige of the once powerful German Socialist party.

"But now Hitler has grown over the heads of those who employed him," declared de Lachne.

Mr. Richards wrote to Colonel Donovan and to several other persons whose names are listed on the Friends of Germany's letterhead, asking them whether they were affiliated in any way with Emerson. So far only Colonel Donovan has responded. Other men listed on the letterhead as honorary members of the organization include: Poulney Bigelow, Malden, N. Y.; Professor Robert Morss Lovett, Chicago; the Hon. George B. McLellan, Washington, D. C.; General Herman A. Metz, New York City, and Mr. Jeremiah A. O'Leary, New York City.

The Friends of Germany is a different organization from the Friends of New Germany, the latter being anti-Semitic in character and the organization through which the local Nazi groups work. Emerson however, has been charged at various times with being anti-Semitic following articles which he wrote in the America's Deutsche Post, Nazi organ in New York.

Though he once made the statement that "half of the Friends of Germany's members were teachers of the German language in New York City high schools," officials at Board of Education headquarters said they have never heard of Emerson or his organization.

Howard A. Shiebler, secretary to the superintendent of schools, told the Jewish Daily Bulletin: "I know of many organizations to which New York high school teachers belong, but the 'Friends of Germany' is a new name to me. I am sure that no teachers of German, whether Jewish or Gentile, in the New York school system belongs to Mr. Emerson's group."

Jacob Greenberg, an official in the foreign language department of the Board of Education said: "So far as I know, no teacher in the New York school system has ever belonged to the Friends of Germany."

Reports from Newark on June 20 stated that Mr. Emerson on that day addressed members of the local branch of the Friends of New Germany. "Jewish boycotting of German goods is not and never will be effective," he stated. "The great German nation should be conceded the right to fashion its fate ac-

cording to its own ideas. No man possessed of the least knowledge of the Hitler movement can speak of it as one lustful war. Hitler's aims are, above all, German life and German culture."

When the Friends of New Germany had its headquarters at 309 East 92nd Street, Mr. Emerson, who denied any affiliation with this group, was said, however, to have been instrumental in getting new members to join it. Information about the New Germany is freely dispensed and copies of the latest German publications are sold in Mr. Emerson's office in the Whitehall Building, where the German Consulate is also situated.

Writing in the Deutscher Beobachter, supplement of the America's Deutsche Post, Emerson said, describing the May Day parade here: "Early in the day the Jewish Communists and Socialists came straggling from the ghettos of New York's East Side. They tramped in separate hordes, thousands—small swarthy men with thick lips and kinky hair."

Emerson is correspondent for several German Nationalist newspapers, which are now Nazi-controlled, and at his office these papers and other anti-Semitic literature, can still be obtained by the public.

Harry W. Garring, Grand Dragon of the Ku Klux Klan here, after addressing a conference of delegates from German-American societies, on the aims of the Klan, was the subject of a warning editorial in the New York Staats-Zeitung, wherein German-Americans were warned against the purposes of the Klan. Whereupon Mr. Garring answered to the effect that he was not attempting to capitalize in America the race-hatred being promulgated in Germany.

The conference, he told the Staats-Zeitung, "was for the sole purpose of bringing to the attention of German-Americans the fact that they should unite and band themselves as one for the protection of the rights handed down by their forefathers and mothers, and against the persecution that has been brought upon them as a descendant of Germany."

### To Talk About Women of Zion

Miss Lillian G. Genn, magazine and syndicate writer, who has recently returned from a trip through the Near East and Europe, will be the guest speaker on the Woman's Radio Review program over WEAJ on Wednesday. She will speak on "The Activities of Women in Palestine."

Miss Genn, who went abroad to interview celebrities, was the guest of Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchope, the High Commissioner of Palestine.

## Show Jews No Mercy In Carrying Out the Law, 50,000 Nazis Are Urged

BERLIN, July 7—"Show no mercy to Jews in carrying out the new state employment law!" Reichs Governor Jakob Sprenger told 50,000 Nazis in a speech at the Berlin Sports Palace here today.

Each German employee in the future must consider himself a "civil soldier in the German army," he declared. The Jewish element must therefore be eliminated without consideration for personal feelings, he said, in the interest of the new German state.

## Bronstein Torture Trial Put Off 6th Time, to Oct 4

BUCHAREST, July 8—For the sixth time the year-old Bronstein torture trial has been postponed, but this time a date for the hearing was fixed for October 4.

Samson Bronstein was arrested in May 1932, on charges of being identified with communist activities. The charges proved groundless. But during his examination he was subjected to six hours of torture that sent him to a hospital for several months. It was feared that he would never be able to walk again. He has, however, recovered.

The three gendarmes and Captain Panisoara who are accused of cruelly torturing Bronstein have so far pleaded not guilty.
