

Chancellor's Secret Orders Bar Jewish Physicians From Vienna Hospitals

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

VIENNA, July 17—The complete exclusion of Jews from the medical profession of Austria is believed the underlying motive of secret orders from Chancellor Engelbert Dollfuss' office to the Ministry of Social Welfare. These orders were brought to light today when the press revealed that the racial principle has been introduced in Viennese state hospitals, resulting in the exclusion of Jewish doctors.

Many Jewish doctors have confirmed the story, telling the Jewish Telegraphic Agency correspondent that discrimination against Jews has been practiced here for the last four months. They stated that even Jewish doctors desiring to do volunteer work in hospitals here to gain practice have been rejected, since the appointment of doctors to all hospitals came under the supervision of the Ministry of Social Welfare.

Crimes, Ukraine Settlement Carried Out for Year, Bureya Fails of Quota

MOSCOW, July 17—Jewish colonization of Ukraine and Crimea was carried out this year under a considerably reduced immigration quota, while in Bureya, autonomous Jewish regime in Siberia, colonization failed miserably, even though the original quota of 25,000 persons for the section was subsequently cut to 17,000 and then to 6,800.

The council of One Jewish colonization society, reported today that a thousand Jewish families arrived in Crimea this year and settled there according to plans. Thanks to having medical supervision and adequate food supplies, their arrival and settlement worked according to schedule, which is the first time this has happened. Moreover, a satisfactory choice of immigrants resulted in a minimum number of disillusioned persons returning to their home towns after arrival in Crimea.

Sixty percent of the Crimea immigrants settled in the Prekoderi re-

One-Third Palestine Public Works Budget For Jewish Labor

JERUSALEM, July 17—About one-third of the entire public works budget of the Palestine Government will be applied to projects on which Jewish labor will be employed, the Palestine Government has informed the Jewish Agency Executive here. Arrangements have been made, the Executive was informed after protracted negotiations with the Government, for putting this allocation into effect. The executive, however, in a reply to the Government, insists on a larger share more in proportion

BERLIN, July 17—The central authorities today lifted the ban set last week on the withdrawal of funds of Jewish relief organizations on deposit in banks here. All the relief organization accounts which had been blocked by this order have been released with the exception of those of the medical advisory bureau which was closed last week and still remains closed at the order of the Secret Police.

Nazi Press Campaigns To Justify the Impending Seizure of Jews' Property

BERLIN, July 17—A strong attempt to convince the German public that Jewish emigrants from Germany are engaged in anti-Nazi activities and are conducting a campaign against the interests of Germany abroad, is being made by the Nazi press following publication of the cabinet decree authorizing the confiscation of property of Germans who have fled abroad.

Under a banner headline, "What Our Emigrants Do in Paris," the Volkischer Beobachter, Hitler's own newspaper, carries a five-column article on its first page describing the activities of the Jewish Relief Committee in Paris. It alleges that the German Jews in Paris are indulging in all types of anti-German activities, issuing publications, organizing anti-German protests and meetings and spreading "slandering" propaganda regarding the maltreatment of Jewish women and the cutting off of the heads of aged Jews.

It also accuses these German Jews of having straggled their property

LABORITE TICKET APPARENTLY SLATED FOR MAJORITY IN ZION CONGRESS POLL HERE

A clear majority for the Poale Zion-Zeire Zion ticket for delegates to the World Zionist Congress at Prague next month seemed likely yesterday on the basis of incomplete returns in the nation-wide balloting which was held Sunday.

On this basis, the Laborite group would name half of the delegation to the Congress. According to cable advices from London, the United States is entitled to 17 delegates. Funds to cover Shukel payments, however, are to be transmitted to London immediately, the Zionist officers here declared yesterday, and on the basis of these payments, America will be entitled to 30-32 delegates.

Out of some 4,000 votes counted, the Laborite ticket, which was Number 2 on the ballot, was credited with 7,381. In New York, the Labor

ticket received 2,003 votes out of a total of 3,574. In Cleveland, the Laborites received 251 of the 459 counted. The Labor ticket also won large majorities in Boston, Philadelphia, Chicago, Buffalo, Pittsburgh, Cincinnati and Detroit.

ZOA-Hadassah Ticket Second

Ticket Number One, coalition slate of the Zionist Organization of America, Hadassah Organization and Order Sons of Zion, received 2,804 votes throughout the country. The Marachi ticket, which was Number Three, received 2,582 votes. Tickets Number Five and Six, on which the Jabotinsky and the Grossman Revolutionists ran, received 892 and 374 votes respectively.

Everywhere the adherents of the General Zionist Organization seem

Aleph Zadik Aleph Order At Omaha Convention Votes to Combat Hitlerism

OMAHA, July 17—Denunciation of the Hitlerite persecution of Jews in Germany and determination to battle any anti-Semitic manifestations was sounded at the tenth annual international "homecoming" convention of Aleph Zadik Aleph (junior B'nai B'rith) concluded in Omaha.

Over four hundred delegates and visitors attended. The Supreme Advisory Council of the order also held its sessions simultaneously.

International officers elected were: Harold Miller, Hollywood, Cal., president; Bert Abramson, Washington, D. C., vice-president; Joe Solomonow, Council Bluffs, Ia., secretary; and Arthur Gottesman, Atlanta, treasurer.

A feature of the convention was the formation of an A. Z. A. Alumni Association, the governing board of which is headed by Philip M. Klutznick, who retired as executive secretary of the order after serving in that capacity for seven years.

Klutznick is being succeeded by Julius Bisno of Memphis.

The principal address and the presentation of awards was made by Sam Beber of Omaha, president of the Supreme Advisory Board of A. Z. A.

The awards: "Best Chapter" award, Nathan Strauss chapter, Los Angeles; youth selected as the "exemplification" of A. Z. A. principles, Al Klein of Salt Lake; award for cooperation in national A. Z. A. work, Ben Z. Glass chapter, Milwaukee.

Arab Executive Rejects French Report As Not Going Far Enough

JERUSALEM, July 17—The French Report on the development of Palestine, released by the Colonial Office last week after an eighteen months' delay, has been rejected by the Arab Executive as well as by the Jewish Agency for Palestine, it is learned here. The Arab Executive, in a memorandum submitted to the Palestine Government last March, rejected the report on two grounds, according to Jamaal Huscini, secretary of the executive. The first ground, he said, was because the report was based on the letter of Prime Minister J. Ramsay MacDonald to Dr. Chaim Weizmann in 1931, in which the British premier acknowledged the obligation of the British Government to facilitate Jewish settlement of Palestine. The second reason was the failure of the report to propose complete prohibition of immigration and the sale of land.

However, the two million pound loan proposal made by Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, the Colonial Secretary, in the House of Commons Friday, whereby the Arab population would be greatly benefited, may alter the situation. The Arab Executive is meeting shortly to discuss this matter.

Hold Communist in Attack

LODZ, Poland, July 17—The Revisionist, Walfisz, who was arrested here last Friday in connection with the stabbing of a Left Wing Poale Zionist, Silberstein, in the course of a Revisionist meeting, has been released by the police. Silberstein, who is a youth of 17, is in a critical condition. Authorities have arrested an alleged communist named Cytrynowski in the attack.

"Corner House" Moves

Residents of "Corner House," 311 West 14th Street, for the last 17 years a shelter for orphanage "alumni" and homeless Jewish young men, have established themselves in the house's new building, the \$500,000 Lavanburg Memorial Foundation, at 331 West 12th Street.

Corner House is primarily an organization for the care of youths who have completed their periods of residence at the Hebrew Orphan Asylum and similar institutions. The Lavanburg House was erected in 1928 through the generosity of the late Fred L. Lavanburg, as a memorial to his mother. Until recently it was used as a home for Jewish girls.

Non-Aryan 'Non-Jews' Unite for Relief from Treatment to Jews

BERLIN, July 17—The much-debated question of what will become of approximately 2,000,000 Germans who despite being non-Jews are classified as non-Aryans by Hitler and treated like Jews because one of their grandparents was Semitic, was culminated today in the organization of a special "Reichsverband of Non-Aryan Christians." The Reichverband, according to an announcement made by its leaders here, aims to organize all "victims" of the Nazis who are distantly related to Jews.

Representations will be made to the government later, it was said, with the hope that some of these non-Aryans will be reinstated into the good graces of the rulers of Germany, or at least be granted the privilege of having a distinction drawn between them and real Jews.

In order to become a member of the Reichsverband one must declare himself an "undivided German patriot" and "whole-heartedly accept" "the Socialist German national principle."

German Schochtim Issue Plea for Assistance

FRANKFURT-AM-MAIN, July 10—An urgent appeal for the relief of German schochtim who have been barred from the exercise of their profession has been issued to Jewish leaders and communities throughout the world by the provisional Committee for the Relief of Kasher Slaughterers in Germany. The committee's statement reads:

"As a result of the prohibition of Kasher slaughtering in Germany, countless slaughterers are in terrible need. An urgent appeal is addressed to all Jewish leaders and communities to help alleviate this need by apprising the Committee for the Relief of Kasher Slaughterers of any vacant positions, so that German schochtim may, because of their peculiar circumstances, be aided in securing positions."

Untermyer Boycott Speeches Published

The speeches which Samuel Untermyer, noted New York attorney who is now in Europe in connection with the movement to establish a world-wide anti-Nazi boycott, has delivered advocating boycott activities, were published yesterday in pamphlet form by the American League for the Defense of Jewish Rights. An appendix to the publication lists the chief type of products which are imported from Germany.

out of Germany and of having converted it into cash.

Assails New York Times

The *Lokal Anzeiger*, consulting the *Völkischer Beobachter*, features a first page story from its New York correspondent, August Thaidfeld, giving the impression that the Jews are the chief instigators in the United States against Germany and alleging that the "American Zionist press," with other Jewish organizations, is spreading information detrimental to Germany, thus influencing senators, congressmen and others in high Government posts.

The New York Times also receives its share of the attack in this paper. Adolph Ochs, publisher of the newspaper is described as a "Jew from Germany who went to the United States in war-time and is now ferociously engaged in campaigning against Germany with all kinds of atrocious propaganda."

This provocative article, which seeks to establish an atmosphere justifying the not-far distant expropriation of the property of Jews, concludes with the assurance the United States, too, will become anti-Semitic because "the average American is an anti-Semite from the cradle."

George McClellan Resigns From Friends of Germany

George B. McClellan, former mayor of New York, is the latest prominent person to resign from Edwin Emerson's "Friends of Germany," pro-Hitleric organization in New York with headquarters in the Whitehall Building, 17 Battery Place. In a letter received yesterday by Bernard G. Richards, chairman of the Jewish Council of Greater New York, 102 Park Avenue, Mr. McClellan stated that he had given up his honorary membership in Emerson's group.

Last week Colonel William J. Donovan, Republican candidate for governor of New York in the last election, announced that he had never joined the "Friends of Germany" after Mr. Richards had written to him to point out that his name was prominently featured on that society's literature.

Professor Robert Moses Lovett, well-known Chicago liberal and educator, announced recently that he had withdrawn from connection with the Friends of Germany.

The officers of the Friends of Germany, in addition to Emerson, who is chairman, are given on the letter-head as: Dr. John Hoving, vice-president; Lieutenant Colonel Henry

This office has even rejected recommendations for appointments of Jews from directors of various hospitals. In many cases Jewish doctors had been waiting for a vacancy for some time, under the assurance that when their turn came and they were at the head of the list they would be appointed, but the Ministry of Social Welfare has shipped their names in favor of non-Jews.

Medical organizations here are convinced that the social welfare ministry is acting under orders from the chancellor's office aiming at exclusion of Jews from medical work altogether, since doctors are not permitted to do medical work in Austria unless they have done hospital work for one year.

No new Jewish doctor therefore will be able to qualify for practice in Austria, unless conditions change. Representations to the government so far have proved fruitless.

to the Jewish contribution to Government revenues and in accordance with the terms of the MacDonald letter. The reply stresses that, even in 1931, the Jewish share of the Palestine public revenues was 41 per cent.

Of the 2,000,000 pound loan announced in the House of Commons last week, only 200,000 pounds will be used to settle "displaced" Arabs on the land, it was stated.

An official communique published this morning, confirmed this latter fact. "It is notified for the general information," it reads, "that of the proposed loan of two million pounds, which loan was foreshadowed by the Colonial Secretary Friday, 250,000 pounds will be allocated for the settlement of landless Arabs. Other important allocations will be devoted to the provision of credits to assist all types of agriculture and for the provision of funds for important public works urgently needed for the general benefit of the country, including water supply and drainage. Full details will be announced later."

Covered to Be Honored

plan. Others settled in Siveropol, Dnipro and Yevgenovka.

The Ukrainian plan also worked fairly successfully under a reduced quota, providing for 1,000 families. In Kakhovka 454 families settled, while 421 families settled in Stalin-dorf. Only Zlatopol was behind, with 38 families instead of the planned 150.

In Bureya, however, the plan failed. Only 20 families and 941 individuals arrived in that remote place. The immigrants consisted of the most undesirable types for colonization, according to *Ennes*, Yiddish Communist newspaper, which accused the Central Commission of being responsible for a bad choice of people.

Ennes also attacked the local commissions on immigration for submitting exaggerated plans regarding the possibility of colonization on a large scale. The organization expressed the hope that next year's immigration plans will be based on a detailed scheme for consolidation of the position already attained. Ennes stated that 150 impartial specialists ought to be sent to Bureya to get an end to irresponsible management taking place there and to insure the execution of the colonization of Bureya with Jews.

Jewish Student Wins Syracuse Music Honor

3,000 At Los Angeles Protest

LOS ANGELES, July 17—More than 3,000 Jews and Gentiles were present at a mass meeting here to listen to stirring talks against Hitlerism in Germany. The meeting was arranged by the United People's Conference Against Fascism.

Persecution of liberals and Jews was attacked by prominent persons, including Dr. Lewis Brown, Dr. Aaron Rosanoff, Dr. James G. Coleman, A. L. Zevin and S. W. David-ovitch.
