## Untermeyer Assails Wise as Preliminary Boycott Meeting Is Opened in Amsterdam

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

AMSTERDAM, July 20.—Plans for internationalizing the world-wide anti-German boycott and establishing an international secretariat to coordinate the boycott activities in all civilized countries were nipped out here today at a preliminary session of the Jewish Economic Conference at the Carlton Hotel. Dr. A. Corabek, chairman of the American League for the Defense of Jewish Rights, opened the session in the presence of thirty delegates from many different countries, including those Americans, Dr. Corabek, Samuel Untermeyer and J. George Frohman.

The conference will last two days and will conduct its sessions secretly. At today's session, delegates listened

## British Board of Deputies Accepts Proposal to Enlarge Joint Foreign Committee

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, July 20.—Enlargement of the Joint Foreign Committee to include representatives of all leading Jewish organizations was definitely accepted today by the leaders of the Board of Deputies of British Jews, who will make the proposal to this effect at Sunday's session of their organization. The proposal will undoubtedly be accepted and thus a united Anglo-Jewish front for all political matters will be established. The Joint Foreign Committee was hitherto the group through which the Board of Deputies of British Jews and the Anglo-Jewish Association functioned together in foreign matters. With enlargement, the participation of Major H. L. Nathan, M. P., Lord Alfred Mclechett and other important representatives of various Jewish bodies is assured.

This compromise was agreed to by the leaders of the Board of Deputies of British Jews in order to avert the threatening serious crisis and the possible overture of the present leaders of English Jewry. The final agreement obliges the Board of Deputies to convene the World Jewish Congress for discussion

## J.T.A. BERLIN BUREAU CLOSED, EQUIPMENT SEIZED; FOREIGN SERVICE UNAFFECTED

BERLIN, July 20.—The Berlin bureau of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency was closed by the secret state police today and all furniture and equipment confiscated. The daily bulletin published for German subscribers by the bureau was also suppressed. The foreign service of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency is not affected by the suspension of the German service.

A letter over the signature of Hans Ludwig Dahn, chief of the Prussian state police and of the German political police states that "for the maintenance of public security and order and for the prevention in the future of State-endangering acts such as may be expected, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency is closed down by the police and all effects thereof placed under police arrest in accordance with article 14 of the President's ordinance of February 28, 1933 for the protection of the people and State. On the basis of the same order, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency publication is prohibited until further notice.

"In accordance with article 4 of

the same ordinance, any acts conflicting with the above order are punishable."

No action was taken against any members of the staff of the bureau which handles the distribution, in Germany, of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency's service. The service from Germany operates independently of the bureau through correspondents, most of whom are American citizens. It is not affected by the order against the Berlin bureau.

## Orthodox Rabbis Ask NIRA To Consider Jewish Sabbath

The Union of Orthodox Rabbis of the United States and Canada (Agudath Harabbanim) sent a telegram yesterday to General Hugh S. Johnson, Recovery Administrator, in Washington, asking him to take into consideration the thousands of Jews who cannot work on the Sabbath, when mapping out nation-wide plans for shorter working hours.

The telegram sent to General Johnson said:

"Being that the Industrial Recovery Act is also interested in regulating labor conditions which include distribution of working hours, and as thousands of Jewish citizens are directly interested in this distribution in connection with observance of the Sabbath which they may be compelled to violate, with Government consent if the Sabbath will also be included in the working days, may we therefore appeal to you to set a five-day working week so that Jews may have the privilege of observing the Sabbath. We assure you that hundreds of thousands of religious Jews of the United States will be highly appreciative of this consideration of the Government.

"The making of this appeal was decided upon at a special, well-attended meeting of the Union of Orthodox Rabbis of the United States and Canada, held in Far Rockaway. A similar appeal was made on June 17 in a letter to the President of the United States."

The telegram was signed by Rabbi L. Silver, president of the organization, and Rabbi L. Schuler, secretary.

## 30,000 March in London Anti-Hitler Protest Parade; Police Balk Fascist Disorder

LONDON, July 20.—Thirty thousand men, women and children marched here this afternoon in an impressive demonstration of protest against Hitlerite persecution of the Jews in Germany. From the London East Side to Hyde Park, where the marchers, whose numbers were augmented by several thousand spectators, heard the provocations denounced, adopted resolutions of protest and pledged themselves to boycott German goods, Jewish stores and shops were closed all along the route, in a gesture of support of the protest despite the fact that the British Board of Jewish Deputies, influential organization of leaders of British Jewry disapproved of the demonstration.

Alarming rumors that British Fascists and Nazi sympathizers in-

### Hebrew Physicians to Form Branches to Aid Hebrew Medical Works, University

A decision to organize branches of the Hasepef Hovevi (Hebrew Physicians) throughout the country, made at the group's latest conference in Chicago this month, is being put into effect, Dr. Moses Einhorn, editor of the Hebrew Physician, announced yesterday. Dr. Einhorn, who was chairman of the conference, stated that expansion of the organization was necessary in order to stimulate the interest of doctors in Palestine, and also in development of Hebrew medical literature.

At the conference in Chicago Dr. Einhorn presented a paper on "The Modern Conception and Treatment of Gastric and Duodenal Ulcers," the purpose of which, he explained, was not only to introduce the medical topic but also to reveal the great strides in the advancement of Hebrew medical literature. The fact that it was possible to present a scientific paper in the Hebrew tongue, he declared, proved his conviction regarding advancement of the language.

Another member at the conference was Dr. A. Lightstone, who read a paper discussing the necessity of opening a medical school in the Hebrew University. He stressed the importance of eradicating the discrimination which now handicaps the Jewish student at the gates of many colleges, that bars him from hospital appointments and places obstacles in his way even when he does succeed in graduating.

#### Medical School at University

This discrimination, Dr. Lightstone pointed out, inflicts great injustice not only upon the Jew but upon humanity as a whole. A medical school in the Hebrew University, founded by Jews, open to all the world, irrespective of race or creed, would be a fitting answer to these discriminations, he asserted. Medical knowledge, said Dr. Lightstone, would spread from such an institution and with that knowledge a broader and more tolerant spirit would spread.

Dr. L. E. Schereta was another who presented a paper at the Conference. His topic was "The Development and Advancement of the Hebrew Medical Terminology and Literature." He mentioned the fact that medical terminology in Hebrew has been discovered in the Talmud, but due to the advancement and discoveries in biology, physiology and bio-chemistry the creation of a new nomenclature is necessary. The Hebrew Physician, he declared, in association with a group of physicians in Palestine, has undertaken the work of creating, simplifying, modernizing and harmonizing the

### Wiss, Deutsch to Ask

#### Extension of Nansen System

Prior to his departure for Europe, where he will join Rabbi Stephen S. Wiss, Bernard S. Deutsch, president of the American Jewish Congress, declared that his organization will make representations to the League of Nations to expand the Nansen passport system to apply to Jews who are being expelled from Germany. "There seems to be no doubt that the East European Jews are to be further victims of Nazi violence," he told members of his organization at a dinner in his honor in the Bronx.

### Nation Proposes Bringing

#### 300 Ousted Scholars Here

The full sum of \$120,000, desired for the new University in Exile, has been pledged to provide employment for two years for fifteen German professors dismissed by the Nazi government, according to the current issue of The Nation. The magazine made a plan for a further sum of \$1,200,000 to extend the proposed university work for one year and to secure positions for the entire membership of 300 scholars whom the Hitlerites have displaced.

### Dizengoff Tells Warhope

#### Of Near East Fair Plans

 JERUSALEM, July 6—M. Dizengoff, mayor of Tel-Aviv, has visited the High Commissioner and told him of the preparations being made for the 1934 Near East Exhibition and Fair. Sir Arthur Warhope is the patron of the exhibition. The celebration of the twenty-fifth anniversary of Tel-Aviv's founding, which occurs next year, will be one of the features of the exhibition. The first big building to be erected on the Fair grounds will be the British Industries Pavilion. A total sum of 50,000 pounds will be spent putting up the various Fair buildings.

### Rosenman Named to Bench

ALBANY, July 20—For the second time in two years Samuel I. Rosenman, coaxed to President Roosevelt during his term as Governor, was named to the New York Supreme Court bench yesterday by Governor Lehman to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Judge Henry L. Sherman. He will return to the Supreme Court bench after an absence of only seven months.

#### Sunday to Mark Anniversary

The 825th anniversary of the death of Rashi, famous Jewish-French biblical and Talmudical commentator, will be observed here Sunday at the synagogue of the Congregation Beth Shalom, South 13th Street and Marcy Avenue, Brooklyn. This will be the first time that an anniversary of Rashi is observed in this country.

The memorial has been arranged by the Descendants of Rashi, a group organized in New York recently to perpetuate the memory of Rashi and bring all his descendants into closer contact with the sources of Jewish learning.

### Canadian Zionists Name

#### Frelmann for Congress

MONTREAL, July 20—A. J. Frelman of Ottawa, president of the Zionist Organization of Canada, and Mrs. A. J. Frelman, president of the Canadian Hadassah, will be the Canadian Zionist delegates to the World Zionist Congress at Prague, it was announced today. S. E. Scherensberg of Montreal, and Rabbi Samuel Sachs, of Toronto, were designated as alternates.

Canada will have four delegates at the Congress, two General Zionists and two Poale Zion-United Labor group representatives. The latter two have not yet been named.

to a report from ten countries on how the boycott was being conducted in these lands. The reports also described efforts being made to organize facilities for the interchanging of products between different countries in order to push out German goods.

### Rabbi Wise Attacked

Dr. Stephen S. Wise, who has bitterly opposed this preliminary conference, was attacked today by Samuel Untermyer, who in a statement called Dr. Wise a "trouble maker." Mr. Untermyer challenged Dr. Wise to declare openly whether he was for the anti-German boycott or against it. He added that Dr. Wise does not represent the American Jewish Congress, ninety percent of whose members "enthusiastically favor actively supporting the boycott."

Authorities of the Amsterdam municipality and Dutch government adopted an attitude of strict impartiality toward the conference, but the fact that the sessions are veiled in secrecy has stimulated great interest in the Dutch press.

ing the German situation in the autumn.

While opposition is not expected regarding the enlargement of the composition of the Joint Foreign Committee, a serious controversy is feared over the fact that a group of the Board of Deputies is demanding that the present vague purposes of the world congress be defined concretely in advance of convention.

They demand, first, that the world congress be a public one, or at least that a number of the sessions be open to the public.

Second, they demand that not only Jewish individuals from various countries but also Jewish organizations be invited to participate in the world congress.

Third, they demand that the conference not only discuss but actually decide on measures in connection with the German situation, such as the enforcement of the anti-German boycott.

While leaders of the Board of Deputies may be agreeable to effecting a compromise on the matter of whether or not the sessions should be private, suggesting that delegates themselves, when the conference is convened, decide the question, they strongly oppose the other proposals. All this is expected to arouse animated discussions at Sunday's session.

tended to cause trouble during the demonstration brought out hundreds of London mounted and foot police who accompanied and closely guarded the two-mile-long procession. Special instructions were issued to the marchers to ignore any provocations and to behave calmly. No disorders of importance resulted except that city traffic was considerably interfered with.

Huge crowds, far outnumbering the marchers, lined the route of the procession and cheered all sections of the parade which took three and a half hours to pass.

Hundreds of banners urging a boycott of German goods waved over the heads of the demonstrators. Scores of automobiles bore placards and signs to the same effect and boycott slogans were roared out through megaphones by hundreds of the demonstrators.

The most popular slogan was the demand, "Restore German Jewish Rights—Protect the World from Hitlerism!"

A particularly impressive section of the parade was a section of be-medalled war veterans including hundreds of disabled ex-soldiers headed by a crippled veteran in a wheel-chair. This section bore a banner which drew resounding cheers from the spectators—"1914, We Defended Freedom from the Huns—1933, We Must Defend the Jews from Hitler's Atrocities."

Accompanied by four bands, the procession reached Hyde Park after the long march of three and a half hours, and there was augmented by thousands of others including Jews from the provinces, non-Jewish sympathizers and an organized section of Roman Catholics. Speakers addressed the huge throng from several platforms set up through the park, decorated with bunting in the white and blue of the Zionist flag and with the Mogen David, five-pointed Jewish star. The speakers included Holford Knight, prominent National Laborite member of Parliament; Dr. David Joelchman, Jewish communal worker and chief organizer of the demonstration, and Father Day, Society of Jesuits.

### Harry Alan Potamkin
