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Three Arrests Expected In Propaganda Bombing of German-American Picnic

SPRINGFIELD, N. J., Aug. 10.—The arrest of the three men who are responsible for the dropping of Nazi leaflets from an airplane on the German-American picnic held last Sunday was expected last night, according to Springfield police officials.

Last Saturday, the three men, who are known to the police, asked for permission to distribute the leaflets at the picnic of the German-American League of Essex County and the United Singers Society, but when permission was refused, they hired an airplane from Roland and Chet Newman, who operate the local airport.

One of the men went up with Chet Newman who flew the plane and dropped the leaflets over the picnic crowd. The other two remained below. Although Chet Newman was convicted of any complicity in the affair, he was grounded by a Department of Commerce

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Seek to Place Non-Jews Formerly in Jewish Offices With New Aryan Lawyers

BERLIN, Aug. 10.—As a result of the wholesale dismissal of Jewish lawyers, several thousand non-Jewish clerks, formerly employed in the offices of these lawyers, find themselves without jobs.

In order to cope with this situation, the Prussian Ministry of Justice, in an official communication issued today, orders every new Aryan lawyer admitted to practice to be obliged to employ clerks previously with the Jewish lawyers and who now find themselves unemployed.

The communication adds that already 450 such unemployed clerks have been placed with new Aryan lawyers and that a list has been compiled in order to provide the remaining unemployed clerks with posts at the first opportunity.

ATTENTION FOCUSED ON JAFFA AS EVIDENCE MOUNTS AGAINST ARLOSOROFF SUSPECTS AFTER IDENTIFICATION OF TWO BY WIDOW

JAFFA, Aug. 10.—Palestine's undivided attention today centered on the court-house here where the magistrate's examination into the murder on June 16 of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, brilliant young Zionist leader, was continued and police witnesses added to the mounting pile of testimony against Abraham Stavsky, extreme Revisionist, and Zvi Rosenblum, also a Revisionist, who are under arrest in connection with the crime.

So great is the interest in the case that the dingy court-room was crowded again today as it was yesterday during the dramatic scenes when Mrs. Sima Arlosoroff, the murdered man's widow, took the stand and denounced the two defendants were her husband's slayers.

The newspapers of the country are heavily featuring the examination, issuing special editions and reporting the proceedings verbatim.

Today's witnesses were Major Stafford, assistant superintendent of the Jaffa police, and Major Faraday, deputy superintendent of the Tel Aviv police.

Identification Possible

Stafford, under examination by Public Prosecutor Shkiri, described the identification parades at which Mrs. Arlosoroff had picked out the two suspects and revealed that he had personally checked on the possibility of identifying people at night in the place and under the conditions prevailing at the time of the murder. He said he had gone to the scene of the crime and from his experience in identifying an Arab riding by on a camel at midnight convinced himself that it would have been possible for Mrs. Arlosoroff to have obtained a picture of the assassin clear enough to form the basis for later identification.

He declared that Mrs. Arlosoroff, in identifying Rosenblum, wished to

see him undressed because in the line-up he had been freshly shaven and appeared pale and younger. A few days later, he said, she recognized Rosenblum's jacket from among ten others.

Faraday's evidence was concerned chiefly with the foot-prints on the beach and at the scene of the shooting. One of the Redoubt trackers, he stated, recognized the prints of a man running as Stavsky's, but another identified both the traces of a man running and later, walking, as those of Stavsky.

Wanted Lawyer

After the trackers had pointed out Stavsky as the man they said left the prints, Stavsky said, "Of course these are my tracks. I want a lawyer," according to the witness.

Under British procedure, counsel for the accused is not allowed to cross-examine witnesses in the magistrate's hearing but the accused themselves are allowed to do so. Stavsky utilized this right to obtain from Major Faraday the admission that the prisoner had been brought

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Palestine Colonies Ready

For 653 German-Jewish Children, Randschau Says

BERLIN, Aug. 10.—Palestinian schools in the various colonies are ready to absorb 653 German-Jewish children, educating and caring for them, the education department of the Vaad Leumi (Jewish National Council) declared after taking up the matter with the various colonies established by the Keren Hayesod (Jewish Foundation Fund); the Jo-discher Randschau reported today.

Colonies such as Nachal and Kibbutz are ready to absorb 200 German children, the paper states. Settlements such as Ein Charod, Beth Alpha and Chelchikah are willing to accommodate 450 children.

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Dr. Shoshana Buchmil Dies; Was Labor Zionist Leader

JERUSALEM, Aug. 10.—Dr. Shoshana Buchmil, noted worker in the cause of Labor Zionism, died here yesterday at the age of fifty-seven.

Dr. Buchmil was born in Russia, in the schools and universities of which she was educated. She engaged in the practice of medicine, her surviving husband also being a physician.

She became interested in the Poale Zion (Labor Zionist) movement early in her youth and was one of the earliest colonists in Palestine, where she settled as long ago as 1905. In 1909, she went to the United States as a guest of the Poale Zion movement there in order to urge the need for colonists to Palestine. She was known to be a very persuasive speaker.

Leo Frankel

TORONTO, Aug. 10.—Leo Frankel, president of Frankel Brothers Metal Company and the National Electric Heating Company, died yesterday at his home here after a long illness. He was 69 years old. Born in Biblis, Hessen, Germany, Mr. Frankel came to Canada at the age of 17. He founded the firm of Frankel Brothers in 1886. During the World War Mr. Frankel served on the board of the Toronto and York Patriotic Fund. Later he was active in the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies.

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to the scene handcuffed but had been freed during the time necessary for him to run and walk to provide footprints for comparison with those at the scene of the crime.

Minz Forgotten

Although Yehuda Minz, 19-year-old member of the Revisionist youth group, Brith Trumpeldor, is also held in connection with the murder, there has been little attention paid to him thus far in the examination. Major Stafford said he would produce several witnesses who saw the youth running on the beach after the murder.

Rosenblat, who Mrs. Arlosoroff said yesterday was the man who fired the shots at her husband, was not involved in the testimony today. Since he was not arrested until six weeks after the crime was committed, witnesses explained today, it was not possible to compare his footprints with the original tracks on the sand made at the time of the murder.

The investigation will continue in Jaffa magistrate's court tomorrow.

JAFFA, Aug. 9.—A series of dramatic incidents were unfolded here today as Mrs. Sima Arlosoroff, widow of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, head of the political department of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, and Zionist labor leader, took the stand in magistrate's court and confronted two of the men accused of assassinating her husband on the night of June 16.

Pale and worn and speaking in a low voice, Mrs. Arlosoroff, under the questioning of Public Prosecutor Shitrit, recounted Dr. Arlosoroff's activities from the time he returned to Tel Aviv from Europe to the moment he fell mortally wounded outside the old Moslem cemetery near the Tel Aviv seashore.

Two Men Followed Them

After dinner at the Kaetadan pension, she said, she and her husband, at about nine-thirty o'clock, left the pension for a stroll along the seashore. Anxious because she had noticed two men following them, she asked her husband to return, she said, but he insisted there was no danger and they continued walking.

She first noticed the two men fol-

lowing them, she testified, when they were near the Levkovich factory. The pair passed them several times and she was consequently able to obtain a good impression of their looks. At the prosecutor's request she drew a diagram of the positions of all four at the moment of the murder and handed the diagram to the court. She did not remember, she said, whether one or two shots were fired.

As soon as the shots were fired, she testified, she frantically ran for aid, crying, "Help! Help! Jews shot him." Dr. Arlosoroff, who had fallen to the ground, interrupted her, she said, and to her cry that Jews had shot him, interposed, "No, Sima."

A hushed court-room heard this part of the testimony which was given in a low voice which occasionally broke, revealing the agitation of the witness at having to live through the scene of her husband's death again.

First Statement to Rice

Following the shooting, Mrs. Arlosoroff gave her first statement to Captain Rice of the Palestine police at three o'clock in the morning, she declared. She gave him full descriptions of the assailants. The illumination of the stars, she declared, was sufficient for her to get a good mental picture of both men.

Continuing her evidence, she said she picked out both men later in identification parades by their faces, build and gait. One of the dramatic moments of the day occurred here, when, at the request of the prosecutor that she point out the two men, she rose on the witness stand and pointed toward Abraham Stavsky and Zvi Rosenblatt, the two Revisionists held in connection with the crime, who were seated in the court-room between police officers. In a clear, firm voice, she declared she was convinced they were the men.

Disguised Voice

When she heard their voices during the identification parades, she testified, she got the impression that Stavsky was disguising his voice. Looking steadily at Rosenblatt, she said she was even more positive he was one of the pair when she saw him unshaven at Captain Rice's office in Jerusalem a few days after the identification parade.

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Protesting Nazi Neighbors Plan Further Appeal After Suffern Board Rejects Plea

SUFFERN, N. Y., Aug. 10—Residents of this town who have objected to the antics of the German-American Commercial League which has a camp here on a fifty-acre tract leased from a local realtor, were planning to carry their protest to the Ramapo Town Board, following the rejection of their complaint by the Suffern village zoning commission Wednesday evening.

The local residents objected to the singing of Nazi songs and the anti-Semitic actions of the Nazi group. According to villagers, members of the League paraded the streets, making insulting anti-Semitic remarks and shouting "down with the Jews." Members of the First Baptist Church had also objected to the conduct of the campers, saying they ran nude, mixed swimming parties in the swimming pool near their camp.

The zoning board ruled that the camp was outside their jurisdiction and advised the villagers to protest to the Ramapo Town Board.

During the hearing a letter was read from a New York attorney who represents the League, denying the charges and stating that the League was a non-commercial, non-profit organization.

Harry M. Goldberg, New York attorney and Suffern resident, acted as spokesman for the complaining villagers.

Must Prove Wife Aryan To Hold Prussian Job

BERLIN, Aug. 10—Henceforth every employee in the public institutions subordinate to the municipalities of Prussia will have to prove not only his own Aryanism but that of his wife, if he is to retain his place, according to an order promulgated yesterday by the Prussian Minister of the Interior, Dr. Wilhelm Frick.

Even the perfect Aryan whose wife is only a 25 percent Jewess is to be summarily dismissed, unless he legally disassociates himself from her.

In doubtful cases, the matter will be referred for final decision to the racial expert by the office of the Ministry of the Interior.

Dutch Jews Receive 225 Jewish Children Refugees from Germany

AMSTERDAM, Aug. 10—Two hundred and twenty-five German-Jewish children, chiefly from the Rhine district, arrived in Holland today, to stay with Dutch Jewish families for the time being.

The racial laws put into effect by the Hitler regime have worked hardships not only on the adults but also on the children. As children of Jews they are the objects of discriminations that make life very hard for them. Movements are on foot in many countries by Jewish individuals and organizations to take the children out of Germany and put them into a wholesome environment.

Medal of Honor Presented To Sholom Schwartzbard By Jewish War Veterans

A medal of honor was presented to Sholom Schwartzbard, French War Veteran and killer of the notorious pogrom leader Petlura, at a dinner in his honor given by the Jewish War Veterans of America.

The dinner which was held Wednesday evening was also a form of greeting for the other French Jewish War Veterans who are here to return the visit of the American Legion to France. About one hundred persons attended the dinner which was held at Trotzky's Restaurant.

Glad to Greet Comrades

In his speech Mr. Schwartzbard expressed his joy at being able to greet in person his American comrades. "We came here as strangers," he said. "We come from France and even from its colonies. There are among us Moroccan, Tunisian, and even Algerian Jews. When we discovered each other on shipboard, we wondered how we could reach our American Jewish comrades. You can imagine our surprise and joy when we were met on the ship by a delegation of American veterans in uniform."

Mr. Schwartzbard then told of some of the scenes of horror he had witnessed in the Ukraine during the pogroms and said that the position of Jewry was still tragic, that persecution was still rampant and only the form had changed.

Mischa Elman, Famed Violinist, Refuses German Bid for Concert Series

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 10—Mischa Elman, world famous violinist who is leaving Los Angeles on a concert tour, declared in a letter to Walter S. Hilborn, chairman of the local United Jewish Appeal, that he refuses to have anything to do with Germany as long as the Hitler regime is in power.

Mr. Elman had received a letter from his former German manager asking him to give a series of concerts in Germany. The Jewish partner of this concern was dismissed by the Nazis.

In his reply Mr. Elman stated: "So long as Jews continue to be humiliated by the Hitler government and deprived of the rights that every other German enjoys in his own country, I will refuse to do business with German firms or individuals. I feel that I am voicing the opinion of the entire civilized world and also of many Germans in and out of Germany."

The refusal of Mr. Elman to appear in Germany follows that of many of the most distinguished artists of the musical and theatrical world to appear in Germany, as a protest against the treatment of their German Jewish colleagues. The Nazi regime has recently made desperate efforts to induce well known artists to appear in Germany, only to meet with rebuffs.

Arlosoroff Mourned by Mizrahi Conference

KRAKAU, Aug. 10—The World Mizrahi Conference opened here yesterday with hundreds of delegates present, including one hundred rabbis from various countries throughout the world. Thousands of visitors are present to view the deliberations of the Orthodox Zionists of the world.

Representatives of the state, the municipality, the Jewish Kehillah of Krakau and the French and Czech consuls greeted the conference. Telegrams of greeting were sent by the conference to President Moscicki of Poland and to Marshall Josef Pilsudski. A cable of greeting from Chief Rabbi Kook of Palestine was read.

In his opening speech, Rabbi Meyer Berlin, president of the World Mizrahi Organization, enlivened the

John Koerber, president of the League, told police when he complained about the affair, that the bullets were Russian. He said that they called the League members cowards and urged them to join the Nazi organization. According to the police, the three men said that they represented The Friends of New Germany.

The United States Government through agents of the Department of Justice began an investigation of the incident, asking the Springfield police to submit a complete report of the affair.

Cori to Remain at Post

Edward Cori, Immigration Commissioner at Ellis Island since 1911, will continue on with his work there with the new title of Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization, despite his announcement on Wednesday of his resignation.

He was induced to reconsider his action by Secretary of Labor, Miss Frances Perkins, who telephoned him from Washington and persuaded him to remain to guide the transition through the reorganization by the Presidential order merging the Immigration Bureau and the Naturalization Bureau here.

Requests for Palestine Land

The Jewish National Fund of America receives two requests for the purchase of land in Palestine, under the will of Abraham Eichel of 270 Riverside Drive, it was disclosed when his will was offered for probate on Wednesday. Mr. Eichel died on July 17 last. The value of his estate was not disclosed.

The institution receives the residuary estate of undetermined value, and the principal of a \$20,000 trust fund after the death of the life tenant, James Eichel of 270 Riverside Drive, a brother of the deceased.

Three other institutions also receive bequests. They are the Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society and the Hebrew Kindergarten Day and Night Nursery, which get \$2,000 each and the Henry Street Settlement which gets \$500.

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when the prosecutor produced Rosenblatt's pocket and the witness, in a voice trembling with emotion, declared it was the coat worn by the man who had shot her husband. She had previously picked the coat out of several shown here at the police headquarters.

Mrs. Arlossoff failed to identify Rosenblatt in two lineups because the men were deliberately withheld from the prosecution, but had identified him on three other occasions, it was brought out.

Saw Miss Running

Regarding Yehuda Miss, 19-year-old Irish Trumpeterette (Revisionist youth group member) who is also held in connection with the case, Mrs. Arlossoff said she believed she had seen him running from town when she was hastening to the pension after the shooting to call the police and medical assistance.

Following the examination by Prosecutor Shitrit, the two accused men questioned the witness at length. Rosenblatt elicited from her the statement that on seeing him at Captain Rice's office she told him, "Say the whole truth. Since you are very young I will do my best to facilitate your position up to the highest quarters."

When she recognized Rosenblatt at the identification parade, she asked him, "After all that happened are you still quiet?" his examination of her revealed.

The young Revisionist in closing his questioning of Mrs. Arlossoff, asked her what she meant by telling him at Captain Rice's office to "confess, since there is serious evidence against you."

"I meant if I identified you it would be sufficient to charge you," she replied.

The hearing will be continued tomorrow.

Justice May Speak on Paganist
