## Nationalist Jews' Leader Attacks Zionist Resolution; Rundschau Indicates Error

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)  
BERLIN, Aug. 20—Holding that the German Zionists and friends of Zionism are responsible for the present situation of the Jews, The National Union of German Jews, the organization headed by Dr. Max Naumann, which recently endorsed the Hitler program and attempted to find means for enlisting German nationalist Jews in the Hitler movement, in a declaration published here yesterday, protests against the attempt to influence Government measures by foreign pressure.

The Union declares that German Zionists, though officially not participating in the World Zionist Congress at Prague, nevertheless doubtless influenced the Congress to adopt a resolution urging foreign powers to interfere in the internal affairs of the Reich.

"Trusting to the sound sense of the German people," the declaration states, "the Union expects a solution from inside Germany, without foreign interference, will be found

## Jews of Worms Jailed In Reprisal for "Slanders"

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)  
BERLIN, Aug. 20—A large number of Jews have been arrested in Worms, the police announced officially, and taken to the concentration camp at Osthofen. This measure, according to the explanations made by the police, became necessary in view of the provocative attitude of the Jews, exemplified in the insult of two Nazi storm trooper by Jews.

The police also intimated "degrading" remarks by Jews against the Nazi regime and declared that the arrests were reprisals against the report in a Strasbourg paper that three hundred Jewish families had been taken to concentration camps and seriously mistreated.

The authorities refused to give the exact number of men arrested merely declaring "a large number." At the same time a warning was issued that if the Jews did not behave more humbly, sharper measures would be taken.

## UNFINISHED BUSINESS PROLONGS SESSIONS OF ZIONIST CONGRESS INTO NEXT WEEK; JEWISH AGENCY GROUP STARTS CONFERENCES

PRAGUE, Aug. 20—The Administrative committee of the Jewish Agency for Palestine opened its sessions here today preliminary to the third ordinary meeting of the Council of the Jewish Agency which was scheduled to take place tomorrow and Friday.

The Jewish Agency is the body recognized by the League of Nations and by Great Britain, the mandatory power, as the representative of Jewry in all Palestine questions. It is composed half of Zionists and half of non-Zionist Jewish leaders. Strong dissatisfaction with the composition of the Agency and a demand for a reduction in the proportion of non-Zionists on it have been expressed at the Eighteenth World Zionist Congress, now in session here. Reform of the Agency will be one of the chief topics before the Agency sessions.

The non-Zionists on the Agency, it is learned, are willing to accept in an arrangement lessening their representation, provided that this revision be accomplished through friendly negotiations and that the Zionist Congress do not adopt any contentious resolution on the question.

In the event that the Congress acts on the demand voiced by the spokesmen of every faction in the Congress to take action to revise the Agency, many of the non-Zionist members, it is understood, would

prefer to withdraw from the Agency entirely.

**Congress Session Continues**  
The Congress, which was officially scheduled to end August 29, will not end its sessions this week, it was reliably learned today. The Congress will probably continue until Sunday or Monday.

Negotiations on the formation of the executive of the Zionist Organization are proceeding. The General Zionists, acting as mediators, have proposed an executive of two Laborites, one Radical, three General Zionists and one Miraschi representative. The Laborites, who hold 49 per cent of the seats, demand an executive of three Laborites, one Radical, two General Zionists, including Professor Selig Brodetsky, and one Miraschi.

The inter-factional negotiations between the various Zionist groups now proceeding are for the purpose of forming an executive without the leadership of Dr. Chaim Weizmann, whose return to the leadership had been constantly removed.

An executive of seven is being talked of by the negotiators. Aside from the question of party representation on the executive, the negotiations are further complicated by the question of the presidency of the World Zionist Organization.

The Laborites suggest an executive without any president but with Nahum Sokolow, present incumbent of the office, holding an honorary pensioned appointment.

## Junior Hadassah Elects Celia Slobin President

(Czech Daily Bulletin)

CHICAGO, Aug. 30.—The youth convention of the Junior Hadassah, closed here today after adopting a number of resolutions on the German Jewish situation and electing officers for the coming year.

Among the resolutions adopted by the convention was one demanding the creation of a unified public opinion, through propaganda or otherwise, against the conditions now existing in Germany.

An increase in the budget from \$30,000 to \$42,000 was voted by the conference.

Celia Slobin of Buffalo was elected national president of the Junior Hadassah. The vice presidents are: Thelma Goldfarb of Brooklyn; Mary Frank of Chattanooga, Tenn.; Esther Brill of Chicago and Dorothy Finnerstein of Columbus, Ohio. Esther Levy of New York is the new treasurer and Hannah Schiff of Buffalo is secretary. Alice Benjamin of New York was re-elected executive secretary.

## Jewish Journalist Honored At Banquet by Brazilians

to Dr. Weizmann, insists on the re-election of Dr. Solovine. The General Zionists held the key position in the negotiations since they hold the balance of power in the Congress. Any coalition is entirely dependent on the votes of the General Zionists who, next to the Laborites, have the biggest group at the Congress.

However, all combinations thus far discussed completely eliminate the Revisionists and the possibility exists that the Mirischki will not be included in the new executive.

Dr. Weizmann last night declared his readiness to come to Prague to the Congress on condition that his visit would not be considered as meaning that he wishes to be re-elected as president.

Dr. Weizmann's declaration was made over the long-distance telephone, to Louis Lipsky, of New York, when the American Zionist leader tried to persuade Dr. Weizmann to attend the Congress. During the conversation Dr. Weizmann insisted he would not accept the presidency and that, if he came to Prague, it must be understood that he was willing only to cooperate with the Zionist executive body, and not assume its leadership except in activities in behalf of the Jews of Germany.

### Ask for a New Setup

With efforts to form a coalition administration around Dr. Weizmann—the course which the Congress was generally expected to have followed—apparently doomed to failure by Dr. Weizmann's decision not to accept reelection, the standing committee of the Congress last night appealed to Nathan Solovine, president of the organization, to suggest the possible composition of a new executive body.

Dr. Weizmann's availability and qualifications for leadership were dwelt on at length during the Congress session yesterday following sharp criticism of his stand and policies by Rabbi Stephen S. Wise of New York.

Morris Myer, of London, a General Zionist (Centrist) and strong Weizmann proponent, appealed to the Congress tonight for the return of Weizmann to the presidency. Characterizing Weizmann as the most suitable leader, with considerable influence in non-Zionist and non-Jewish circles, Myer warned against restricting Weizmann's activities to those in behalf of the German Jews. If this is to happen, he asserted, the remainder of Zionist activities would remain stagnant.

### For Unity and Strength

The debate continued throughout

the evening with the speakers including Samuel Usishkin, Robert Stricker of Austria and Russell Janner, British member of parliament, all appealing to the various Zionist factions to sink their differences and fight for unity and Zionist strength.

Revelation that 600 German Jews who emigrated to Palestine had received permission from the German Government to export 1,800 pounds each, permitting them to enter Palestine in the "capitalist" immigration classification, was made last night at a closed session of the political committee to which was referred the report of the Zionist executive on the agreement for the import into Palestine of three million marks of German goods.

The executive's statement, made Saturday night and repeated yesterday afternoon at the demand of Meir Grossman, head of the Jewish State party, formerly the Democratic Revisionists, that the executive was in no way connected with the negotiations, which were of a private character, was repeated in the political committee. The question of the agreement was referred to a special sub-committee for detailed discussion.

S. Hooton, manager of the Anglo-Palestine Bank, appeared before the committee to relate his firm's connection with the agreement. The bank, he said, would act as a liquidating and collection agency, collecting for the goods shipped to Palestine by the German Government and holding the funds until the German Jews for whose accounts the deals were transacted, would arrive in Palestine.

### Rabbi Wise Attacked

A bitter attack on Rabbi Stephen S. Wise of New York, a member of the Bloc in the American delegation opposing the re-election of Dr. Weizmann as president of the Zionist Organization, was made last night.

Rabbi Wise, earlier in the day, had sharply criticized the Weizmann policies and had roundly scolded the Zionist Laborite faction for seeking to make a "Dupin" of Palestine and for monopolizing immigration permits for those in accord with Laborite principles. The resentment against Rabbi Wise's speech, expressed by vociferous interruptions of his address by Laborites, crystallized last night in a denunciation of the American Zionist leader by Brevi Katzencron, Palestine Laborite, who charged Rabbi Wise with being ignorant of labor conditions in Palestine. Rabbi Wise, said Katzencron, was also

## Argentine-Palestine League In National Parley Sept. 2

(J.T.A. Special Correspondent)  
BUENOS AIRES, Aug. 29—The Argentine League for Working Palestine has called a national conference of its twenty-five divisions for September 2.

The combined membership of the twenty-five sections of the League numbers 1,200. More than half the sections were started this year during a campaign carried on by I. Ranzil, Palestinian representative of the Palestine Labor Fund.

The campaign for the fund had brought in \$200,000 pesos, when it was interrupted by the campaign for the establishment of German Jews in Palestine, an action prompted by the London appeal. Moreover, the most important provinces, Entre Rios, which usually subscribes generously to all Jewish causes, could not participate in the fund-raising this year because of the last year's poor harvest.

A number of the new sections of the League are in the colonies and the principal members are children of the second and third generations of the local immigrant group. The older colonists are sympathetic to labor Palestine and take great pride in the nationalist activity of their children.

The colonists here have a custom of allocating certain stretches of their land for national causes and contributing to the cause the sums raised by selling the crops of these stretches. This year the Palestine Labor Fund was added to the purposes so aided and was assigned forty-eight hectares (1188 acres). Of these, ten are in the Mosseron region, ten in Bernardino (Pampa), ten in Tres Lagunas and ten in the Luján colony.

## To Open Brooklyn Drive For Synagogue Membership

Arnold M. Schmidt, of Union Temple, chairman of the Brooklyn Committee of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, has sent out a call for a meeting to be held September 7, in the Community House of Temple Beth Shalom, 8th Avenue and Garfield Place, to inaugurate a membership drive to cover all of Brooklyn and to reach every Jew in Brooklyn not affiliated with a congregation.

The membership drive will be conducted under the auspices of the North East Religious Union, regional division of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, parent body of all the reform Jewish congregations of the United States. Mr. Schmidt has addressed his call to the reform congregations of

## Yiddish Newspapers Here Declared Ready to Sign Code; Matroth Bakers on NRA

Jewish newspaper publishers are ready to sign the NRA newspaper code, they informed the Recovery Administration in a telegram to Washington. A telegram was also sent to President Roosevelt pledging him full support in the carrying out of his policy.

At a meeting of the foreign language newspapers, the Jewish section chose E. C. Vladeck, of the Jewish Daily Forward; Israel Friedkin, of the Jewish Morning Journal, and David Shapiro, of the Day, to be the Jewish committee section of the foreign language papers.

The Association of Matroth Bakers of America, Inc., through Judge H. J. Reit, counsel for the association, announced that they have signed the President's NRA code. The thirteen bakers who constitute the association produce eight percent of the Matroths consumed in the United States.

The question of Sabbath observance which has been agitating Jewish Orthodox circles has been brought to the fore by the appointment of a delegation to discuss the matter with General Hugh Johnson, head of the National Recovery Administration.

The delegation was chosen at a meeting of rabbinical and lay organizations and consists of Rabbi Israel Dushkevitz, president of the Rabbinical Board of Greater New York; Rabbi A. Silver, president of the Union of Orthodox Rabbis of U. S. and Canada; Dr. Jonas Siroon, chairman of the Kehillo Kolofash of Greater New York; Moses H. Hoenig, president of Young Israel, and J. L. Horowitz and N. Rothman of the East Side Chamber of Commerce.

At the same time the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America sent a telegram to General Johnson, endorsing the movement for a five-day week, but asking for exemption for all Jewish workers who observe the Sabbath in all the codes that provide for a six day week.

The union asked for blanket provisions in all codes to safeguard the religious rights of all faiths with respect to their Sabbath.

## Dallas Jews Aid NRA Application in Texas

DALLAS, Texas, Aug. 29—Dallas Jewry is playing a leading role in the application locally of the President's national recovery program. The Dallas NRA Board of ten members has begun to function with three Jews holding important places on it. They are Hyman Froilinson, chairman; Arthur L. Kramer, former president of the chamber of commerce, and Fred F. Florence, president of the Dallas Clearing House Association.

Mr. Florence, in addition, is the Dallas member of a district NRA committee named by the National Recovery Administration.

On the State Recovery Board, one of the nine members is Rabbi Henry Cohen of Galveston.

As treasurer of the State committee in charge of the campaign, Mr. Florence in the last few weeks has borne much of the burden of putting over the proposed \$20,000,000 State relief bond amendment. He is chairman of the Dallas RNC committee and has devoted much of his time in recent months to solving local relief problems. Governor Miriam A. Ferguson leans heavily on him for advice in these matters, just as she did during the bank moratorium.

## Dr. Hayon, Famous French Physician, Dead at Age of 92

PARIS, Aug. 29—Dr. Georges Hayon, noted physician and surgeon and former president of the French Academy of Medicine, died here yesterday at the age of 92. Born in Paris of Jewish descent, Dr. Hayon early became known for his work in many fields of medicine. His work was given recognition in 1886 when he was made a member of the French Legion of Honor.

He spent several years as professor of therapeutics and materia medica at the Hospital of St. Antoine, and later taught at other French institutions. He wrote several treatises on various aspects of medicine and surgery. Among his better known experiments was treatment of cholera involving cold-water injections.

motivated in his attack on Dr. Weismann by a malicious, personal hatred of the former president of the World Zionist Organization.

Rabbi Wise, who styles himself in America, on being a radical, Katsenelson said, would be ashamed to survive, in New York, the applause of reactionary elements as applauded his speech here yesterday.

"While here," Katsenelson asserted, "he has associated himself with those who are helping to create an atmosphere similar to Hitler's."

#### Fishman Attacks Him Too

The speaker evidently referred here to the Revisionists, the extreme right-wing Zionists, who are especially hostile to Dr. Weismann and who greeted Dr. Wise's speech with vehement applause.

Katsenelson's attack on Rabbi Wise was followed by another at the hands of Jacob Fishman, New York editor and member of the American delegation.

Rabbi Wise, in attacking Dr. Weismann and the Laborites, did not represent American Zionists, who wish to dissociate themselves from Rabbi Wise's statements, Fishman declared.

"We don't want to carry the responsibility for Rabbi Wise's words," Fishman told the Congress. He urged it to adopt the American plan, proposed Monday by Morris Mordecai, president of the Zionist Organization of America, for a campaign to secure an international loan through the League of Nations to finance the settlement of German Jews in Palestine.

### Brits Abraham Order Joins Movement to Boycott Reich

The Independent Order Brits Abraham has joined the boycott movement, according to an announcement issued by Max Silverstein, national grand master of the order.

"In order to cooperate with the boycott movement," declared Mr. Silverstein, "The Independent Order Brits Abraham has decided to join the American League for the Defense of Jewish Rights, the national organization, of which Samuel Untermyer is honorary president."

The order has a membership of about 100,000 in twenty-seven states.

shortly permitting really German-looking Jews to cooperate in the National German State."

The Eighteenth World Zionist Congress at Prague misconceived the German-Jewish situation when it demanded the restoration of Jewish rights in the Reich, the *Juedische Rundschau*, official organ of the German Zionist Federation declared editorially. The suspension of the *Rundschau* by the secret police, because it replied to an article by Alfred Rosenberg, Hitler adviser and editor of the *Voelkischer Beobachter*, criticizing the Zionist party, was lifted last week.

The resolution of the Congress on the German situation, the *Rundschau* points out, mistakenly aims at the re-establishment of Jewish rights when Jews should ask at present, not for the re-establishment but for the creating of a basis for Jewish life and existence.

The *Rundschau* further expresses displeasure at the reference to religious discrimination in the Congress resolution, explaining that it probably was in reference to the ban on abortions, Jewish ritual slaughtering. The paper stresses the point that Nazi discrimination is not directed against the Jewish religion but against the Jewish race.

The paper ascribes this reference to religious persecution to pressure exerted on the Congress by the orthodox elements represented there.
