Correspondent Hails Genius of Hitler as a Wrecking Crew Boss

That Hitler is a great man not even his most biased enemies will deny.

Fighting entirely alone for many years, he has succeeded in bringing the largest nation in Western Europe around to his own morbid manner of thinking. In six months, Hitler has thus done more harm to his people than the armies of Germany's enemies could have done.

A glance at the situation in Germany is sufficient to convince anyone who retains a shred of reason or perception of the catastrophic effects of the rise of Hitler to power.

The German educational system, which has been "purged" of approximately 75 percent of its Jewish instructors and wholesale lots of "pacifists" and "Marxists" through outright firing and "intentional leaves of absence" has lost its appeal to thousands of foreigners who heretofore annually flocked to German universities. Foreign authorities in Germany announce that during the com-

Czechoslovakian Jews to Found Institute in Memory Of Prof. Lesing, Martyr

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

MARIENBAD, Sept. 3.—The Jewish community here has resolved to raise a fund with which to establish a Lesing Institute for Scientists, in memory of Professor Theodor Lesing, the murdered scholar. The proposed institute is to include all scholars who fled from Germany, irrespective of their religious or political beliefs.

The funeral of Professor Lesing will be held tomorrow with interest in the Marienbad Jewish cemetery. His remains may later be removed to Palestine.

A touching scene was enacted today when a distinguished looking German, who described himself as a member of the nobility but said he could not disclose his name for obvious political reasons, came as an admirer to place a wreath.

Mrs. Ada Lesing, the noted scholar's widow, presented to Professor Thomas Masaryk, president of the Czechoslovakian Republic, the

RE-ELECTION OF DR. NAHUM SOKOLOV LOOMS AS WORLD ZIONIST CONGRESS DRAWS TO A CLOSE

PRAGUE, Sept. 3.—The Eighteenth World Zionist Congress entered its final sessions tonight with a complete lack of agreement among its factions on leadership of the World Zionist Organization for the next two years and with several vital questions to be settled before adjournment late tonight or tomorrow.

Negotiations among the various factions during the past week, right up to the opening of the session tonight — the first since Thursday — resulted in failure to reach an understanding as to the composition of the executive body to be elected. It seemed definite, however, that Nahum Sokolov, seventy-two year-old president of the organization, would be re-elected in spite of the refusal of Dr. Chaim Weizmann, returned today, to accept the office.

The commercial agreement concluded with Germany, providing for the export of the capital of Jewish emigrants to Palestine in the form of German goods, was to come in for stormy discussion tonight as Meir Grossman, leader of the Jewish State party, was to renew his attack with a resolution committing all institutions affiliated with the Zionist organization not to have any dealings with Germany until the Reich allows the Jews to leave Germany and remove all their possessions without hindrance.

Grossman, who has declared his dissatisfaction with the reply of the

Zionist executive that it had nothing to do with the agreement, will present his resolution following the report on the deal prepared for the consumption of the congress by its political commission after several days of discussion and debate. The report will be in large part based on that given the commission by S. Hoesen, manager of the Anglo-Palestine Bank, which is to act as the clearing and collection agency in the transactions.

Referring to the deal reported in Berlin where Palestine will ship ten million marks worth of oranges to Germany, buying in exchange, twice that amount of German goods, Hoesen declared that the Anglo-Palestine Bank had nothing to do with this and had never entered into the deal, despite the assertion of the head of the fruit department of the Nazi Land Trade League, that George Halperin, a director of the bank, had negotiated the agreement.

Peace Terms Made With Non-Zionists In Agency Dispute

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

PRAGUE, Sept. 3.—A split between the Zionists and non-Zionists at the final session of the Council of the Jewish Agency was narrowly averted when an agreement was reached that the present proportion of fifty percent Zionists and a like number of non-Zionists be continued inviolable. At the same time a committee of four was appointed to work out a plan for the reform of the Jewish Agency in other directions.

The agreement was accepted upon the recommendation of a committee of ten, composed of five Zionists and five non-Zionists, which met all day in an endeavor to find a solution for the question.

The non-Zionists appointed to the executive of the Jewish Agency are Dr. Maurice B. Hexter of New York, Dr. Werner Senator of Jerusalem and Dr. Isaac B. Berkson of Jerusalem. The Zionist members of the new executive of the Agency

Nazi Jail Merchant Who Sought to Ease Entrance to Palestine

BERLIN, Sept. 3.—A Jewish merchant, Moses Schlink, 51, was sentenced to six weeks' imprisonment and a six hundred marks fine for a transaction enabling him to have to his credit 1,000 pounds to permit his entry to Palestine in the unrestricted "capitalist" immigration classification. Schlink was convicted of illegal export of currency and sentenced to jail despite the fact that the presiding judge declared the transaction was a "wash" arrangement of no

Schopenhauer walking stick which her husband had inherited as the most prominent philosopher of the day. The stick has been handed down from generation to generation, from one great philosopher to another.

The Czech police are continuing their hunt for the assassins who killed the noted German Jewish philosopher. The gun with which Professor Lesing was killed has been found and the police definitely established the fact that it was of German make.

Eleven suspects are under arrest, alleged to have been the accomplices of Max Robert, notorious poacher, who is supposed to have fired the shots that killed Professor Lesing.

The Czech government continues to manifest the greatest interest in the murder. Dr. Jan Cesary, Minister of the Interior in the present cabinet, is taking an active personal interest in the investigation of the murder.

The entire population of Czechoslovakia is outraged over the murder and continues to express its indignation through a series of anti-German demonstrations. As a result of the bitter anti-German feeling, the German embassy in Prague is surrounded by a heavy guard of police.

Dr. Zilfoni Dead

Weizmann, former president of the World Zionist Organization, to accept re-election, was made unanimously today by members of the American delegation to the Congress.

Louis Lipsky, Morris Rothman and Jacob Fishman, all of New York, who favored the re-election of Dr. Weizmann, wired him at the Czechoslovakian resort where he had been staying that they felt he had deserted them by not attending the Congress and that he had weakened the position of the supporters at the Congress of adherents to the Weizmann policies.

In his reply Dr. Weizmann stated he had no intention of changing his mind and wants to do only work for the relief of German Jews. Dr. Weizmann left for Italy today.

Jabotinsky Condemns Congress

A condemnation of the decision of the Congress to send a commission to Palestine to investigate reports of alleged terrorism by some of his followers, and a vehement attack on the Zionist Laborites, to whose pressure he ascribes the Congress decision, was made in an interview with the press by Vladimir Jabotinsky, leader of the Revisionists, the extreme right-wing Zionists.

The Congress, in taking such action while the case was still under the jurisdiction of the courts, was denounced by Jabotinsky as "unscrupulous in the parliamentary history of civilized nations."

"The Palestine police," he charged, "have cooperated with Labor against the arrested Revisionists, and the Congress, too, has followed the Laborites in influencing the pending Palestine proceedings."

"I am fully convinced that the Palestine court will acquit the innocent Revisionists in spite of this Congress foolishness and the action of the Palestine police in sharing private documents with Labor people and private organizations."

Resents Psychological Influence

"We had been prepared," he declared, "to agree to a serious investigation of the truth by the Zionist Organization, but we oppose this dangerous play and demonstrative resolutions which will psychological-

ly influence the judge more than the entire evidence in court.

"The Laborites, I only despise. But we will settle the account with the other delegates. They will deeply regret the damage they have caused and that they have violated free speech against all the Congress rules, and have throttled debate on the German situation although, for years, it had constituted a central Jewish problem."

S. Hoodin, manager of the Anglo-Palestine Bank, denied reports from Berlin that George Halperin, a director of the bank and prominent Zionist, had negotiated the deal with Germany for a preferential market in Germany for Palestine oranges in exchange for a Palestine market for German goods, and asserted that the bank had nothing to do with the deal.

British Press Calls Talk

By Hitler at Nuremberg

Tedious Anti-Semitic Folly

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, Sept. 2.—"Tedious anti-Semitic folly," was the reaction of the English press today to Hitler's latest outburst against the Jews, delivered yesterday at the Nuremberg conference of the Nazi party. Although Hitler's tirade against the Jews constituted only a small part of his lengthy address, the Daily Telegraph featured it most prominently, declaring at the same time the race dogma of the National Socialist movement, as ignorant nonsense but nevertheless highly dangerous political poison. It constitutes an intellectually feeble and morally repulsive part of the Nazi movement, the paper states.

The News Chronicle ridiculed Hitler's verbal violence, which parts little demand on his intellectual output, "since average words repeat themselves as easily as average deeds."

Havana Jewish Community

Not Harmed by Cyclone

HAVANA, Cuba, Sept. 2.—The tropical cyclone that swept down on Cuba Friday and devastated the island for more than eight hours did no damage to the large Jewish community in Havana.

In the provincial towns of Matanzas, Cardenas and Camaguey where the cyclone did the most damage, many buildings were destroyed including shops belonging to Jewish residents. Wires between Havana and the provincial towns are down and details of the damage and the loss of life which is believed to be small, are lacking.

Boycott in Toronto

TORONTO, Sept. 2.—Representatives of over sixty Jewish women organizations here proclaimed an official boycott of German-made goods in Ontario. They are especially active at the present time at the Canadian National Exhibition, where German goods are on display.

Swastika Hoodlums Invade Toronto Jewish Cemeteries

TORONTO, Sept. 1.—An aftermath to the activities of the Swastika in Toronto that started early this summer on the beaches and reached its climax with the serious riots August 16 and 17 in Willowdale Park, broke out anew in the vicinity of Jewish burial grounds on Rosedale Avenue where about fifty-two to twenty Jewish burial grounds are located.

Years ago Rosedale Avenue was miles out of the city limits. With the growth of the city, the Jewish cemeteries are now in the centre, surrounded by streets strictly populated, mostly by Gentiles.

With the commencement of Khat, when larger groups of Jewish people started visiting the cemeteries, the Swastika hoodlums found fertile ground. Young boys who are closely watched by grown-ups pester Swastikas on fences and tombstones. The elderly Jews on sight of same either cry or run from the cemetery. There is no doubt that the Swastika hoodlums in Toronto are greatly encouraged by the decision of Magistrate Brown, who dismissed the charges against four arrested in the Willowdale park riots, remarking that the whole thing was intended as a joke.

The police in the district assured the Jewish representatives of ample protection during this month; but that does not satisfy the community.

The whole situation is tense. Investigations to this date reveal that a mysterious hand is conducting the Swastika organization throughout the province, where clubs and groups grow over night.

Jews in suburban towns have received letters with warnings to clear out of their homes, signed by Swastika clubs; but all efforts to ascertain their origin have failed. The Post Office Department replied that it is not within its scope to prosecute for the mailing of such letters.

St. Louis Congregation Marks Golden Jubilee

ST. LOUIS, Sept. 3.—The Beth Hamedinah Hagadol Congregation celebrated its Golden Jubilee here Saturday and Sunday with special services and Sunday with a public banquet on Sunday evening. Rabbi Pinhas Epstein and Rabbi S. Kilbansky officiated. The presidents of all orthodox congregations, as well as a number of leaders of St. Louis Jewry were guests of the congregation. Five hundred guests and members attended the dinner which was addressed by Rabbi A. E. Halpern and Rabbi Jacob R. Mann.

Leaders, Friends of Jewry Favor and Oppose Boycott In Opinion's Symposium

In a symposium entitled "Shall We Boycott Germany?" which appears in the September issue of Opinion — a journal of Jewish life and letters, important leaders in American and Jewish life urge an organized boycott of German goods both here and abroad, by Gentiles and Jews.

Dr. John Haynes Holmes, chairman of the City Affairs Committee and Minister of the Community Church, writes:

"The boycott is a terrible weapon — so terrible as not to be used, perhaps, except as a last resort. But surely we are driven to the last resort in such a case as Hitler. The worst we ever feared, or even dared to imagine, of this Swastika horrocr, is now stark truth. We must fight it as we would fight the plague. Not by violence, for violence is Hitler's weapon. But by non-cooperation (boycott), which is Gandhi's weapon."

Similarly, Will Durant, author of "The Story of Philosophy," expresses readiness to join in a boycott movement "wherever the Jews think it advisable." And Bernard S. Deutsch, President of the American Jewish Congress, states:

"Fully cognizant of the great responsibility which it assumes, the American Jewish Congress nevertheless urges the organization of a publicly proclaimed boycott against German manufacturers in the belief that this may save the Jews and bring about a repudiation of Hitlerism by the German nation."

Irwin Edman, Professor of Philosophy at Columbia University, holds that the "power of the Hitler regime depends on its economic success, and I shall do all I can and think every decent human being should, to make its economic success impossible. I cannot do much, but everyone can do a little by refusing to buy anything German . . . If enough people can come to share this attitude, I do not think a regime nourished on hate and climaxed by economic depression can long endure. It is a tragic world where one must resort to such measures, but it is a tragic world that Hitler has made more tragic and I willingly write a word in support of the only possible measure that may help to destroy the infamous present government of Germany."

Differing from the viewpoint of those in favor of the boycott, Rabbi Leo M. Fraadkin of Detroit opposes the proposed "organized" boycott on both practical and ethical grounds:

1,000 Present at Opening Of Poale Zion Convention

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 2.—Over a thousand delegates and visitors were present at the opening session of the twelfth annual convention of the Poale Zion Alliance of the United States and Canada, Zionist labor group.

Goldie Meyerson, representative of the Palestinian workers and principal speaker of the day, made a sharp attack on Rabbi Stephen S. Wise and other Zionists of his type who, she said, oppose the Laborite program in Palestine.

Others who addressed the convention were Jacob Lenzberger, national youth leader; F. Ginzoid, Jewish National Workers Alliance, and A. Spitzer, Poale Zion central committee.

According to the report of the secretary, J. Kamenka, the organization has 89 branches in 41 cities. In the discussion that followed the report almost all the delegates participated. The convention is to continue in session until Monday night.

Silent on Terrorists, Revisionist Arrested

JERUSALEM, Sept. 2.—The Revisionist, R. Bereman, was arrested here yesterday when he refused to testify against the Brit Hahayrimim (alleged Revisionist terrorist organization) in the hearing before Magistrate Roddy of the 14 Revisionists accused of sedition offenses.

Among the documents introduced was a letter from Uri Zvi Grinberg, Yiddish and Hebrew poet, in which he expressed himself against the leader of the Revisionists, Vladimir Jabotinsky. "We need another leader," said Grinberg. "Jabotinsky is dangerous. I think much of how to make the operation."

A second letter introduced read: "The fighting Jewish youth will have to leave the Revisionists and establish a militaristic, revolutionary Zionist movement."

The next hearing in the case will be held September 12, according to the orders of the court.

heart of the very people we wish to help.

"(2) We sink to the ethical level of the persecutor when we adopt his methods. That which makes him despicable in the eyes of thinking men, will make them equally despicable. "Eye for eye and tooth for tooth" was dictated neither by a high morality nor a wise statesmanship."

His view is shared by the Reverend Everett R. Clendy, Director of the National Conference of Jews and Christians.

ing semester scarcely five percent of former foreign patronage of German schools will be secured.

Berlin Loses Reputation

Berlin, famous for its development of medical science, has completely lost its reputation as cure center of Europe. Statistics show that considerably more than fifty percent of foreign patients normally going to Berlin for treatment, as well as a large, undetermined number of German patients, have followed the legions of "saugschalter" medics to Vienna, Prague, Paris, Warsaw, and London.

The effect of National Socialism on Germany's culture and art, which has been regarded as second to none in Europe, is reflected also in the lack of patronage of art and cultural institutions. Once a lively theatrical center, Berlin is laboring under the failure of people to respond to de-Marxized plays. Of thirty leading theatres, only seventeen remain open; and the rest are nervously thinking of closing because of the fall in box office receipts.

Germany's moving picture industry, which has produced virtually all important non-American triumphs during the last decade, has suffered a serious setback despite Hitler's desperate application of artificial respiration in the form of loans to poor but talented companies. With the export of films throttled, now Germany is experiencing lack of response to offerings at home. Although Hitlerized films are still in their infancy, and for that reason alone should appeal to the people, Germans freshly admit that pictures without sin, synopsis, stars and sex hold little appeal.

What's Right? What's Wrong?

Rid of many leading Jewish and non-Nazi lawyers, notaries, and judges, German courts have fallen to a new low for this century's administration of justice. Attempts to humanize court procedure have resulted in the utter abolition of law and constitutionality, and Germany today founders in a state of populearity, not knowing what is right and what is wrong. A single word, overheard by Nazi adherents, is suf-

ficient today to send a man to the vilest type of prison without trial, without sentence, and without any knowledge as to why he is imprisoned. A word spoken by relatives abroad may land Germans in a concentration camp. Or, as admitted by Nazis themselves, the fact that the imprisonment of competitors in business may swell the trade of Nazi commercial institutions has inspired the arrest of many men absolutely innocent of any criminal offense or infidelity toward the Nazi regime.

Journalism in Germany, once the most careful and opinionated of any country in Europe, has disintegrated to an expression of the leader's political and philosophical perversions. Editorial matter is no longer reasonable; news content so seeks with propaganda that the reasonable reader is no longer able to place confidence in the simplest articles.

In the face of a severe financial crisis Hitler has rid the personnel of banks and financial institutions of many Jewish financial wizards, who have contributed much to Germany's successful fight to overcome the effects of war and reparations. The fact that one has been a loyal party member during Hitler's fight for power is sufficient to make him eligible for an important job in the banks, inner governmental structure, or diplomatic corps.

It is impossible to publish a book, produce a play, or make a moving picture in Germany today without first sending the work through the Ministry of Propaganda, where all elements not directly favorable to Hitler's policies are carefully sifted out and "suggestions" made as to how the book might be improved from the Nazi viewpoint. In view of this condition it is impossible to read any piece of German literature without suspecting it of propaganda.

The writer does not believe that the German people at heart are anti-Semitic nor under normal circumstances at all sympathetic to the personal conceivability of the Hitler government. Ordinarily the Jews themselves find the German people and the German nation the most likable of any in Europe. To the writer the Germans appear the most industrious, the most progressive, and the friendliest of all the people in Europe.

During conversations with hundreds of German people from all walks of life, the impression was gained that persecution of the Jews is made possible only because of the ease with which Germans may be brought into line by any leader entertaining any principles. Asked

harm to the state or to the value of the German mark.

A friend of Schlank's, in Palestine, deposited to his account in a Swiss bank, a thousand pounds and Schlank, in return, mailed a check to his friend to enable him to recover the loan when Schlank arrived in Palestine. The German censor intercepted the letter bearing the check and Schlank's arrest followed.

Great amusement at the case is expressed in the Nazi Lokal Anzeiger, which saw it an instance of the British Government, placing obstacles in the way of hundred percent non-Aryans entering Palestine, being overruled. It derides the Jews for their eagerness to go to Palestine although "not a hair is touched on the head of a Jew in Germany."

will be nominated by the Eighteenth World Zionist Congress and ratified by the administrative committee of the Agency, which meets on Monday.

Robert Seidel of New York and Professor Herbert Sporer of Belgium were elected as vice-chairmen of the Council of the Agency.

Both Zionists and non-Zionists are agreed that the chairman of the administrative committee shall be Neville Laski of England. The associate chairman is to be a Zionist, as yet unnamed. The chairman of the Council of the Agency are to be G. E. d'Arquier Goldstein of England and Morris Kohnberg of New York.

Twenty non-Zionists were elected to the Administrative committee, of whom fourteen were re-elected. The six newly-elected members include Dr. Maurice Karpf of New York.

Their views on anti-Semitism, German invariably rooted certain real or imagined abuses, which are being set forth in tons of propaganda pamphlets being distributed by the Nazi government. More intensive discussion of anti-Semitism invariably brings forth the admission from the man on the street, and even the most rabid Nazi officials (as Julius Streicher himself admitted), "but I personally am not anti-Semitic."

How long this self-delusion can endure is an unanswerable problem. Germany is now being confronted with real problems of survival. They can no longer afford to cast aside reason.
