Hope Million Polish Jews Might Be Slaughtered Quoted in Achimierz Notes

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
JAFFA, Sept. 7.—Further testimony from the notebooks of Aba Achimierz, Revisionist extremist accused of the murder of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, noted Zionist labor leader and head of the political department of the Jewish Agency, was read to the court at the resumption of the hearings in the case today. Accused with Achimierz are Zvi Rosenblatt and Abraham Stavsky.

Police Inspector Goffer read from Achimierz's notebooks: "The Histadruth must be broken up forcibly. They are worse than the Arabs." The Histadruth is the organization of Palestinian workers.

Another quotation read, "I wish that a million Polish Jews might be slaughtered. Then they might realize that they are living in a ghetto." Under cross-examination by the accused, the witness admitted that the phrases might be quotations.

The second witness was police officer Shif, who testified that when he arrested Stavsky, he noticed

Rabbi Wierzbowski Died; Was Known as Scholar and "Walking" Encyclopedia

WARSAW, Sept. 7.—Rabbi Michael Wierzbowski, world famous Jewish scholar, died here yesterday. He was 74 years old and was born and educated in Stahel, a town in the former Russian province of Lithuania.

Rabbi Wierzbowski was known among Jewish scholars as a "walking encyclopedia." It was sufficient for him to look at a page once to be able to remember it over afterwards. He was not only an authority on Biblical and Talmudic writings but was known for his knowledge of secular and worldly writings. He was the author of many volumes of commentaries on Talmudic writings and was the possessor of many original manuscripts.

GENEVA CONFERENCE DELEGATES PROTEST NAZI DEALS, CRITICIZE ZIONISTS FOR ENTERING THEM

GENEVA, Sept. 7.—A demand for a protest against the World Zionist Organization on the score of the agreements reached with Germany for export of German goods to Palestine, was made here today at the conference of Jewish leaders meeting preliminary to the convocation of a Jewish world congress.

Ten speakers, mostly from Poland, including Dr. Henryk Rossman, Wisniewski and Dr. Mazur, president of the Warsaw Jewish community, demanded that the world Jewish congress protest in the strongest terms against the German-Zionist deals.

The criticism of the Zionists drew a vigorous reply from Dr. Nahum Goldman, noted Zionist leader, who declared that the congress would not permit its platform to be turned into "a place for party politics against Zionism." Dr. Goldman pointed out that it was not the Zionist organization, but the Palestinian cooperative, Haganah, that negotiated the orange agreement with the German Land Trade League. He insisted that the sharpest line of demarcation must be drawn between the three million mark agreement and the orange deal, agreeing that the latter should be condemned and private deals for personal gain prohibited, especially by Palestine which should lead the fight against Germany.

Report Nazi Terrorists Seeking Einstein's Life

LONDON, Sept. 7.—The London Daily Herald reports that the "Poland" Nazi terrorist organization responsible for a score of political murders, has set a price of 1,000 pounds on the head of Professor Albert Einstein. The reward, says the paper, will be paid to the man who will "eliminate" the famous Jewish scientist who has won the deep hatred of the Nazis. Professor Einstein is now in Belgium.

On the other hand the three million mark agreement should be praised because it enables German Jews to establish themselves in Palestine and brings no profit to the German government, he said.

Natural to Negotiate

Dr. Goldman stated that despite the fact that the Jews were now at war with Germany, it was natural to negotiate and to take out of Germany as many people and as much capital as possible. He insisted on the fact that when two nations were at war, they negotiate for the exchange of prisoners, and the German Jews are prisoners who should be taken out of Germany.

Dr. B. Z. Maimon, of Tel Aviv, regretted the emergence of anti-Zionist politics and assured the conference that Palestine is carrying out the boycott against Germany better than any other country. He declared that while he was against any agreement with Germany, even the three million mark agreement,

London Conference Will Be Democratic, Chronicle

Says in Attack on Wise
(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, Sept. 7.—A sharp attack on Rabbi Stephen S. Wise of New York, who is now presiding at a Geneva conference of Jewish leaders held preliminary to convocation of a world Jewish congress, is made editorially today in the London Jewish Chronicle, influential Anglo-Jewish publication. Rabbi Wise is described as one "who flits from country to country in the more or less glorious role of a Jewish stormy petrel."

The publication asserts that the forthcoming conference at London, called by the Board of Deputies of British Jews, which Dr. Wise characterized as just a gathering of prominent Jews, will be "as democratic in character as Rabbi Wise

Urge Government to Permit Entry of German Refugees, Rabbi Schwartz Advises

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., Sept. 7—German Jews are gripped by a powerful psychology of fear and are completely without hope, according to Rabbi Lawrence Schwartz, head of the White Plains Jewish Community Center, who is back from Germany, where he spent most of the Summer visiting relatives.

"The thing we in America can do," he declared, "which will help most of all is to persuade our government to allow some of the German Jews to enter our own country. I do not ask that we open wide the doors of immigration while we have so much unemployment here. But if we admit only a few that can be absorbed within the unfilled quota, it will bring new life and hope to all Jews in Germany."

Jewish Women's School To Open Here This Fall

The School of the Jewish Woman, the first women's institute for adult Jewish education, will open this fall at 125 East 42nd Street. Registration for the courses to be offered opens September 18, and will close October 15.

Courses will be given in Hebrew, Hebrew Literature, Bible, Jewish History and Jewish Customs and Ceremonies. The courses are given without any charge, and are open to the general public.

Dr. Trade Weiss Rosmarin is director of the school, Mrs. S. H. Hartley is registrar and Mrs. J. Harold Garfield is secretary.

nevertheless the question must not be viewed from a superficial point of view and the possibility of relief for the German Jews must be borne in mind.

Rabbi Angelo Sacchetti of Rome, who is believed to be a close friend of Benito Mussolini, the Italian dictator, made an attempt to influence the political committee of the conference not to adopt a boycott resolution but met with strong opposition.

Wise Attacks Deals

At the late session of the world Jewish conference held last night, Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, delivered a stinging attack against the private deals between the Palestinians and the German Government. This section of the speech climaxed Rabbi Wise's address which was concluded at midnight and turned the conference into a tremendous demonstration against the Hitler regime.

Rabbi Wise condemned in the strongest terms those who would enter into deals with the Nazis for private profit and demanded that they be driven out of Palestine. He asked however that no judgment be passed against those German Jews who in their anxiety to save themselves from the Nazis were compelled to do anything possible to escape from Germany and save what possessions they could.

He praised the French republic for opening wide its doors to the refugees and declared, "I am ashamed that my own country does not do it."

Contrast to Zionist Congress

Yesterday, the second day of the World Jewish conference, furnished a strong contrast to the policy of the Eighteenth World Zionist Congress in its attitude toward Germany.

The strong, outspoken anti-German speeches by Rabbi Wise and Dr. Margulies clearly indicated that the conference will close with a definite anti-Hitler program and call the Jews of the world for a worldwide, organized boycott against the Nazi regime.

A demand made by one of the delegates, that the conference work out a program for the proposed world Jewish congress was denied. Dr. Goldmann explained that the congress must work out its own program, emphasizing that the congress will have nothing to do with reli-

gious questions or discussions about Palestine.

Democratic Elections

The general debate yesterday, with Dr. Moosmann presiding, centered about the question of the composition of the proposed congress. The point at issue was whether the congress should be called on the basis of democratic elections or composed of representatives of the central Jewish organizations.

Several delegates, non-Zionists from Poland, opposed democratic elections while the Polish Zionists, headed by Dr. Rosmarin and Dr. Gottlieb, insisted on the election system.

In closing the debate, Dr. Goldmann declared that democratic elections had been decided on at the conference held last year and accordingly elections to the Congress will be held.

Canadian Young Judasmen Elect Batschaw President

OTTAWA, Ont., Sept. 7—Harry Batschaw, young Montreal attorney, who recently returned from a visit to Palestine, was elected president of the Young Judas of Canada at the close of the ninth annual convention here. Max Zaiden, of Saskatoon; Dr. Mark Zimmernan, of Toronto, and William Goss, of St. John, were named vice-presidents. Max J. Garmale, Toronto, was elected secretary and Samuel H. Abramson, Toronto, treasurer.

The convention unanimously adopted a resolution condemning persecution of the Jews in Germany and requesting the League of Nations to bring pressure to bear on the Nazi regime to end it. Other resolutions stressing the importance of Zionist education among the Jewish youth of Canada, were also adopted.

"At no time in the history of the Jewish race has it been subjected to such tortures and humiliation as today," A. J. Friedman, president of the Canadian Zionist Organization, told the convention. "We who live under the British flag are perhaps better off than any of our brethren, yet we are suffering spiritually the tortures of those being tortured in other lands."

Detroit Orthodox Jews Strike Against Schochetim

DETROIT, Sept. 7.—The Vaad Ha-Ih, the Council of Orthodox Jews of Detroit, is conducting a strike against the chicken killers (schochetim officials), in a demand that they reduce the present price of life for the killing of each chicken.

In order to advance this strike, a number of meetings were held in local synagogues, and in the Oakland section a mild riot broke out when an attempt was made by the leaders of the Schochetim Union to take away the knives from those schochetim who reduced their price to 5 cents.

Georgia Jews in Parley

On German-Jewish Question

Southern Social Workers

To Confer at Memphis

MEMPHIS, Tenn., Sept. 7.—A preliminary meeting of Jewish social service workers in the south will be held here Saturday and Sunday, to arrange for a conference of all Jewish communal agencies in the south. The general conference is to be held in this city some time in January and will discuss general problems and relationships.

Among the prominent Jewish social service workers who will take part in the preliminary conference are, Edward M. Kahn, executive director of the Federation of Jewish Charities in Atlanta and co-chairman of the committee on field service and regional meetings of the National Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds; Miss Stella Lowenstein, executive director of the Memphis Federation of Jewish Welfare Agencies, and Mrs. G. A. Jacobs, southern regional chairman of the National Council of Jewish Federations.

Mattapan-Dorchester Jewry Votes to Further Boycott

MATTAPAN, Mass., Sept. 7.—The large preliminary conference of the Jewish communities of Mattapan and Dorchester, held Wednesday, under the auspices of the New England office of the American Jewish Congress, voted unanimously in favor of an uncompromising boycott of German goods and German ships.

Over 300 delegates representing 30 Jewish organizations and institutions were present, including delegates from synagogues, lodges, charitable institutions and the Jewish war veterans. The conference was held in the Mattapan Hebrew School.

A special boycott message from Bernard S. Deutsch, president of the American Jewish Congress, was read.

Plans were made to hold a great protest parade to take place within the next three or four weeks. The delegates promised the hottest cooperation against the "common enemy of civilization." A committee of seven was appointed to make final preparations for a great mass meeting to carry through most effectively the boycott and to establish a permanent branch of the American Jewish Congress, in Mattapan, which has about 50,000 Jewish residents.

The principal speakers at the conference were Samuel Katsenky, Mrs. Jerry Leitman Barrow, Isadore Fox, Benjamin George Love, William Mannon, Rabbi Abraham Rose, Abraham Alpert, Joseph Reider and Rabbi Joseph S. Shalom.

Despite a heavy downpour of rain, the conference was a marked success.

Over 10,000 German Emigres Aided by HIAS, Says Report

More than ten thousand victims of the Hitler regime have been helped either to emigrate to various countries or to secure employment there.

This statement was made by the HIAS (Hebrew Sheltering and Aid Society) which, in conjunction with European organizations, the Jewish Colonization Association and the United Jewish Emigration Committee, is rendering service to Jewish refugees from Germany in all countries to which they have fled.

The report further states that the work among the Jewish refugees is increasing daily and is being continued vigorously on an ever larger scale.

Felix Warburg Urges Jews To Aid Anti-Hitler Fight

WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., Sept. 7.—The Jews of the whole world were urged by Felix M. Warburg to unite in the fight against "Hitler, the beastly lion, and his poisonous procreation."

Mr. Warburg spoke yesterday at a meeting in the local Jewish Community Center, to start the sale of tickets for the concert to be held Sept. 28 at the county center, the proceeds to be turned over to the Joint Distribution Committee, for the relief of the German Jews. Mircha Elman, violinist; Heida Lashanska, soprano, and Osep Gehrlovitch, pianist, will appear on the program.

Hebrew Education Week

To Be Held in Seattle

scratches on Stavsky's thumb, which he said were probably caused by his attempt to get through the barbed wire fence surrounding the Arab cemetery near the scene of the murder. The scratches correspond with the prickles in the barbed wire. Stavsky immediately demanded that the court visit the cemetery and compare the wound marks with the barbed wire prickles. The magistrate agreed to this and adjourned the court until tomorrow.

Palestine a Land of Hope Declares Rabbi Leo Jung

Dr. Leo Jung, Rabbi of the Jewish Center, returned on the Italian liner Vulcania after a four months' trip through Europe and the Near East, including Palestine.

Dr. Jung pictured Palestine as a land of hope and a source of strength for the Jewish people, and a startling contrast with the ghastly conditions now to be seen in Germany.

"Palestine," said Dr. Jung, "may assume a new significance as the melting-pot into which world Jewry will cast its various complexes and its quaint super-patriotism, to emerge sanely and nobly self-conscious, freed from the nihilisms of a decadent civilization, blessed by a renaissance of our old faith."

Dr. Jung declared that the influx of the German Jews into Palestine will prove a great boon to the country. "A local sage," said Dr. Jung, "declared that Grabski, the anti-Semitic Polish Minister of Finance, caused an exodus from Poland that led to the expansion of Tel Aviv. Hitler will help us build Haifa."

Prince Bismarck stayed at the home of Rabbi Wierzbowski and it was only after he was gone that the unworried rabbi discovered that he had been entertaining an anti-Semite. In the correspondence that ensued Bismarck expressed the hope that this would not interfere with their friendship.
