JEWISH DAILY BULLETIN Hebrew University Reports Record Fall Enrollment

Nearly 150 students have already been enrolled for the fall sessions of the Hebrew University at Jerusalem, according to figures released by the registrar and made public here by the American Friends of the Hebrew University.

Over 400 inquiries from prospective students, representing Palestine and 24 other countries, have been dent enrollment at least twice that of last year is indicated. Poland, where the numerus clausus is rigidly enforced, sent 236 inquiries to the university. Eighty-four were received rom young men and women in Gernany, all of whom have completed heir secondary education.

Arkansas Jewry Votes Boycott, Relief Drive Aid (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

LITTLE ROCK, Ark., Sept. 14-An endorsement of the anti-Nazi boycott was unanimously approved by the board of directors of the Arkansas Jewish Assembly, at a meet-ing held here. A telegram to this effect was sent to Samuel Unter-myer, leader of the boycott move-

ment in the United States. The Assembly also voted to conduct a campagin for funds to be used for German-Jewish relief and been destroyed by fire last spring.

Liev Vachs Dead (J.T.A. Special Correspondence)

MOSCOW, Aug. 28-Liev Vachs. well-known labor leader and revolutionist who lived in the United States from 1901 to 1907, died here at the age of fifty.

Mr. Vachs came to Soviet Russia in 1917. For the past ten years he had lectured at a number of Moscow schools.

With the demand for the certificates a memorandum was submitted giving the fullest details upon which the request was based.
