East Prussian Nazis Attack Jew and Christian Girl

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Sept. 14.—As a result of a visit to the home of a Christian girl friend, Max Steinhagen and the girl, Gertrude Haase, were dragged out of her home in Schoenlinde, East Prussia, and paraded through the streets of the town, which were crowded with spectators.

The girl bore a sign, "I prostituted myself with a Jew." Steinhagen carried a sign which read, "I misled a Christian girl." The Nazi guards marched them through the streets, cafes and restaurants and exhibited them in the local movie theater.

Both were beaten and before allowing them to go home, the man was made to sign a declaration that he would leave the town immediately. The girl, an employee in the local postoffice, was dismissed from her post.

Nazi Ministry Orders Bars On Jewish Firms Eased

BERLIN, Sept. 14.—The Ministry of Economics ordered on and yesterday to the system of investigation conducted here by different chambers of commerce to determine which firms are Aryan and which are Jewish.

The investigations were ordered discontinued and the Ministry stated that while preference should be given Aryan firms in issuing orders for public institutions, discriminations against Jewish firms should not be practiced and they too may receive orders.

Numerous Closures Against Jews in Budapest School

BUDAPEST, Sept. 14.—Only six Jewish students have been allowed to enter the medical faculty of the University of Budapest, this year. Sixty Jewish students applied, and 155 non-Jews gained admission.

This is proof that the numerous closures restricting the number of Jewish students in the universities, is still being applied with greatest strictness.

Witnesses Testify Against Starvsky and Achmeir At Arlossoff Hearing

JAFFA, Sept. 14.—Scrutiny on the right thumb base of Abraham Starvsky, one of the three Revisionists accused of the murder of Dr. Chaim Arlossoff, correspond with the distances between the prisoners in the barbed wire fence on the top of the hillside adjoining the scene of the murder, Inspector Schiff of the Palestine police testified today, at the resumption of the hearing in the case against the accused. Zvi Rosenblatt and Aba Achmeir are the other defendants.

Mayer Schling, student in the Hebrew University, told of a speech made by Achmeir in Haifa, on the occasion of Shavuoth, in which the Revisionist derided the gathering of the juvenile Revisionist Shalomana, student corporation. Achmeir told them that they had no real nationalistic spirit such as awakened the German student corporation responsible for the murder of Walter Rathenau, German-Jewish statesman, nor did they have the ardor of the murderers of Karl Liebknecht and Rosa Luxemburg, German Communist leaders. He inferred that they were cowards.

Did Not Identify Others

Schling failed to identify Starvsky and Rosenblatt as having been present at the general assembly of the Brith Trumpeldorites, Revisionist youth movement, with Jerusalem, Haifa and Tel Aviv groups participating. The conference had been called to discuss measures of retaliation against the Laborites, who allegedly snuffed them.

Achmeir refused to interrogate the witness, declaring that the testimony was merely a provocation, he (Continued on Page 6)

The Jewish pageant, "The Romance of a People", which was to have been staged at the Polo Grounds last night, was postponed on account of the weather to a date to be announced later. Performances will be as scheduled Saturday and Sunday evenings.

Holland Bars Uniforms; Adopts Numerous Closures

AMSTERDAM, Sept. 14.—A vigorous drive against Nazi organizations in Holland is expected to follow adoption today by the second chamber of the Dutch parliament of the bill against the use of uniforms by political organizations hostile to the present government. The law was passed by a large majority after the activities of uniformed Nazi groups had created much uneasiness in various parts of the country.

The parliament also empowered the Ministry of Education to introduce a numerous clauses in Dutch universities, restricting the number of foreign students on the basis of their race. It was emphasized that this measure was not anti-Semitic but was intended solely to check the enrollment of the growing numbers of foreign students, particularly from among the refugees here. The measure was made necessary by the lack of accommodations for the number of students wishing to utilize the laboratories of Dutch institutions.

Semitic Faces on Screen Cause Riot in Berlin Movie

BERLIN, Sept. 14.—A performance of the photoplay, "The Ugly Girl," had to be discontinued here yesterday at the Atrium theatre on the Kallenburger when an allegedly spontaneous demonstration broke out because members of the audience noticed Jewish-looking actors in the film.

Several in the audience began pelting the screen with rotten eggs and vegetables and when the manager of the house tried to restore order, he was hurled down. He was compelled to order the performance discontinued.

The management of the theatre, however, announced that it had no intention of withdrawing the film and would continue to show it for the duration of the picture's scheduled booking.

New Synagogue Dedicated By Pittsburgh Jewry

PITTSBURGH, Sept. 14—More than 300 members of the Shaarey Tephillah Synagogue, 23 Miller Street, attended the dedication of the new building. The synagogue had been destroyed by fire last spring.

A solemn procession carried the holy scrolls from the Congregation Mogan David Synagogue, next door, into the new building. They had been kept in the latter synagogue since the fire.

The feature of the opening was a musical program given by Rev. J. Waid, Rev. Julius Bloom, Rev. B. Kimmel and Sam Cohen and his orchestra. The principal addresses were delivered by Judge Benjamin Lencher and Mayor John S. Herron.

Officers of the congregation who took part in the celebration were Rabbi Samuel Hausman, teacher; Abraham Peckersky, president; Samuel Kofsky, vice-president; Harry Mosenson, secretary; R. B. Camel, treasurer, and Jacob Waid, cantor.

Rabbi Fink to Address Social Workers

SPOKANE, Wash., Sept. 14—Rabbi Adolph H. Fink of Temple Emanu-El, will deliver the principal address at the 26th annual meeting of the Washington State Conference on Social Work. The conference will be held at Wenatchee, Washington, September 17 to 20. Rabbi Fink is first vice-president of the organization.

Hebrew University Reports Record Fall Enrollment

Nearly 150 students have already been enrolled for the fall sessions of the Hebrew University at Jerusalem, according to figures released by the registrar and made public here by the American Friends of the Hebrew University.

Over 400 inquiries from prospective students, representing Palestine and 24 other countries, have been received so far this year and a student enrollment at least twice that of last year is indicated. Poland, where the numerus clausus is rigidly enforced, sent 236 inquiries to the university. Eighty-four were received from young men and women in Germany, all of whom have completed their secondary education.

Arkansas Jewry Votes Boycott, Relief Drive Aid

LITTLE ROCK, Ark., Sept. 14—An endorsement of the anti-Nazi boycott was unanimously approved by the board of directors of the Arkansas Jewish Assembly, at a meeting held here. A telegram to this effect was sent to Samuel Untermeyer, leader of the boycott movement in the United States.

The Assembly also voted to conduct a campaign for funds to be used for German-Jewish relief and for general philanthropy. Appeals will be made in all the synagogues on the High Holidays.

The Assembly is made up of representatives of all the Jewish organizations in the state of Arkansas.

Liev Vachs Dead

MOSCOW, Aug. 28—Liev Vachs, well-known labor leader and revolutionist who lived in the United States from 1901 to 1907, died here at the age of fifty.

Mr. Vachs came to Soviet Russia in 1917. For the past ten years he had lectured at a number of Moscow schools.

Services Today for Isadore Saks

Funeral services will be held today at Salem Fields, N. Y., for Isadore Saks, founder and president of the Saks department stores, who died Wednesday at his summer home in Elberon, N. J. He was eighty-one years old.

Mr. Saks was a native of Virginia but was brought up in Pennsylvania. With his brother, Andrew, he established a department store in 1902.

Mr. and Mrs. Saks had celebrated their fifty-eighth wedding anniversary Monday.

To Interview Wauchope On Zion Labor Schedules

JERUSALEM, Sept. 14—Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchope, Palestine High Commissioner, promised Isaac Ben Zwi, leader of the Histadruth, the Palestine workers' federation, and Moshe Shertok, Laborite member of the new Zionist Executive, an interview to consider the Jewish Agency schedule of labor certificates for the coming six months.

The High Commissioner will see the Palestinian labor leaders upon his return from his holiday at the island of Rhodes, at the end of October.

Earlier this week there was a report that the Jewish Agency had requested 24,700 labor immigration certificates from the government of Palestine. Attempts to confirm the story failed.

With the demand for the certificates a memorandum was submitted giving the fullest details upon which the request was based.

Jewish Socialists Meet In Chicago Tonight

Administrator for Levine Estate

Judge Max S. Levine who died at his home here August 28 after a long illness, left an estate of "not more than \$3,500" according to letters of administration filed in Surrogate's Court yesterday by his widow, Mrs. Rae Levine. Surrogate James A. Foley named Mrs. Levine administrator of the estate which will be divided among Mrs. Levine and her two daughters, Miss Hazel Levine and Mrs. Isobel Romm.

Montreal School for Jewish Studies

MONTREAL, Sept. 14—The Y.M. H.A. is again opening its school for Jewish Studies with A. M. Klein as headmaster. The courses will include the history of the relationships between the Jews and the Gentiles, the development of Yiddish literature, a survey of Hebrew literature and a discussion of Jewish folkways.

"Yortzeit" for Friendless Dead

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn., Sept. 14—A "Yortzeit", an annual memorial service, was conducted for the friendless dead at the Tiferes B'nai Jacob synagogue under the auspices of the Chased Shel Emes society. Rabbi S. Ninnenson officiated at the services.

Call British Conference On Program for Boycott

LONDON, Sept. 14.—A British conference to create a permanent council to undertake the organization of the boycott against Germany throughout England will be held here November 3, it was announced today. Sir Robert Hood, famous British industrialist; R. D. Hume, noted journalist and chairman of the board of the London Daily Express, and Philip Goodall, biographer and historian, are among the organizers of the conference.

Synagogues, fraternal orders, Zionist societies and Jewish trade union councils will be invited to send representatives to the conference. The assembly will consider only British boycott problems. It is understood that when the British boycott body is established, it will join the world boycott organization which it may consider functioning most effectively.

1500 Attend Dedication Of Pittsburgh Aged Home

PITTSBURGH, Pa., Sept. 14.—The two-day dedication exercises of the Pittsburgh Jewish Home for the Aged were concluded Tuesday afternoon. More than 1,500 people were present at the dedication exercises, which included addresses by Rabbi Aaron M. Ashkenazy, Dr. Samuel H. Goldwasser, Mrs. I. S. Harris, Dr. L. H. Horowitz, Miss Marjorie Aronson and Mrs. Emanuel Friedberg.

Alfred M. Marks, architect of the building, presented the keys of the new structure to Jacob H. Frank, president of the Home, who formally accepted them. The Home has accommodations for 150 persons and was erected at a cost of \$250,000. It is situated on a hill-side and connects with the old building, which is used for administration purposes.

The new structure replaces the original home, built 27 years ago. Rabbi Ashkenazy, who took part in the dedication services of the new home, was one of the founders of the original home.

Abraham Cahen Sails

Abraham Cahen, editor of the Jewish Daily Forward, and Mrs. Cahen sailed for home yesterday on the Ile de France after a two months stay in Europe.

While abroad Mr. Cahen visited Switzerland and several other countries, studying Jewish institutions and the condition of Jewish refugees from Germany.

Mr. and Mrs. Cahen will reach New York next Tuesday.

Emigration Sole Recourse For German Jews, Tolsey, HIAS Commissioner, Says

Reconstruction of the lives of the Jews of Germany within the Reich cannot be successful and the only alternative to extermination is emigration, Samuel A. Tolsey declared yesterday on his return here on the Italian liner Rex from a three months investigation tour through Germany and France.

Mr. Tolsey, a New York attorney and director of the HIAS, the Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society, made his investigation at special commissioner for the organization. He returned convinced that it is useless for the Jews to expect any change in policy on the part of the Nazi regime towards the Jews in its present.

Mr. Tolsey declared that conditions in Germany are becoming progressively worse, that there was no future at all for the Jew in Germany and that even the well-to-do German Jews agreed with this view, that nothing was left for the German Jews but emigration. The crying need of the moment among the Jews of the world, he said, is unity so that the activities in behalf of the German Jews may be centralized and duplication of work avoided.

Book of Israel Closed

"The book of Israel in Germany is closed," said Mr. Tolsey, gazing at a well known German rabbi, "and attempts at the reconstruction of the Jews in Germany have not, and cannot, be successful. I was told by those whose daily work gives them the means of knowing, that the discouragement and despair will shortly produce a large crop of suicides; suicides among the refugees have already become very frequent.

"I believe that the German policy in regard to the Jews will not change; the government will not relax. I do not believe that the external pressure sufficient to produce a change can or will be exerted; the German government, I firmly believe, will not yield to external pressure in this matter. Internal pressure for a change is out of the question for a long time to come. Before the Germans will have awakened and seek to redress the wrongs inflicted upon the Jews, the damage will have been irreparable."

Mr. Tolsey declared that "all Jewish agencies in the United States must unite; there must be no divergence. The work being carried on must be centralized and systematized; it overlaps in many cases."

He described the plight of the German-Jewish refugees in Paris and elsewhere as tragic in the ex-

Toronto to Launch Relief Drive for German Jews

TORONTO, Ont., Sept. 14.—Sir Herbert Samuel, noted English statesman and former High Commissioner in Palestine, is expected to be the chief speaker at a mass meeting to initiate a drive for twenty thousand dollars for the relief of German Jews. The meeting will be held at the Royal York Hotel on September 17.

Rabbi Maurice N. Eisenstadt, who recently returned from a tour of Germany, and Rabbi Sachs, will also speak. All classes of the Jewish community here are united in the relief drive which is expected to go over the top.

Later there will be a united drive for the Joint Distribution Committee, the Jewish Agency for Palestine, the HIAS (Hebrew Immigrant Aid and Sheltering Society) and the ORT, society for the promotion of trades and agriculture among the Jews of Eastern Europe.

During his visit in Toronto, Sir Herbert will endeavor to raise funds for the Hebrew University in Jerusalem.

Alexander Granat Dead at 75; Was Famous Encyclopedist

MOSCOW, Sept. 14.—Alexander Granat, famous Russian encyclopedist, died here yesterday at the age of seventy-five. He had founded the Russian encyclopedical dictionary more than forty years ago and had continued to edit it until shortly before his death, when the work had reached thirty-six volumes. The revolution did not affect his work and it was continued after the overthrow of the czar, when it became known as the Granat Encyclopedia. The most famous scientists of the periods before and after the revolution collaborated in the preparation of the works.

Jews Barred from Towns

BERLIN, Sept. 14.—Jews must not enter or pass the free townships of Bertholdsdorf, Wollersdorf or Beismarck near Nuremberg, according to special signs displayed outside these towns.

Nuremberg, under the leadership of Julius Streicher, notorious anti-Semite and editor of the Jew-baiting newspaper, Der Sturmer, is one of the chief centers for legislation against the Jews.

Orthodox Jew Presents Sobiecki's Historic Horn To Marshal Pilsudski

WARSAW, Sept. 14.—A historic ivory horn which the great Polish king and hero, Jan Sobiecki, received from the city of Vienna in 1683, in grateful recognition of his victory over the Turks, was presented to Marshal Josef Pilsudski today by Simon Fischel, a Jewish resident of Strasbourg, France. The presentation was made at the Bellevue palace in the presence of the Polish consul stationed at Strasbourg, who accompanied M. Fischel to Warsaw.

Mr. Fischel, an orthodox Jew, acquired the trophy ten years ago at a sale of a part of the collection of the former Russian czar, paying ten thousand dollars for it.

(Seeing, however, my own desire to avoid the confusion of the day students will take their examinations on September 15.)

I would like to take this opportunity to assure you, as official representatives of the Jewish Kaddish, that as far as our students are concerned, we stand on the dignity of any holiday and whenever a conflict arises in connection with an examination, we have always in the past and will continue in the future to cooperate with the religious authorities of any religion.

Emigration Sole Recourse For German Jews, Telacy, HIAS Commissioner, Says

trois. "There are 5,500 Jewish refugees in Paris alone," said Mr. Telacy, "and the Jews, as independent people, used to earning their own living, are themselves reduced to the status of perpetually begging for charity and they commit suicide, rather than go on. Place must be found somewhere. Subsidence for them in Germany is utterly out of the question. Palestine can only absorb a small number. The refugees must go elsewhere. That is our principal job."

Peaceful on Surface

Mr. Telacy described conditions in Germany as being very quiet on the surface. The streets are peaceful and orderly, the Nazi parades have diminished and armed men are no longer conspicuous. The Nazis have learned a new technique, he declared. Physical violence now takes place late at night or very early in the morning, and the new order of the day is the silent, economic or cold pogrom.

The HIAS representative described the sequestration of the German-Jewish relief funds and declared that the American consul in Berlin, Raymond Geist, had told him that despite the fact that American funds were included in the funds seized, the American government could do nothing, but that he would guarantee certain protection for American Jewish relief funds if they were deposited in the name of American organizations and then transmitted to the German-Jewish relief groups.

Like everyone else returning from Germany, Mr. Telacy was extremely cautious about mentioning names or dates, warning the reporters that it would only mean persecution for anyone whom the Nazis could trace.

"Death to the Jews"

However, he told of a song now being sung by German school children. The song was given him by the daughter of a German-Jewish lawyer. Needless to say, he refused any details. The song reads in part, "Germanes awaken, death to the Jews, and arms for the people."

Mr. Telacy declared that a peculiar situation had arisen in Germany. As soon as it is known that any Jew is in the hands of the Nazis, the first anxiety is to get the prisoner into the hands of the regular police. According to him, when the Jewish doctors of Berlin, meeting to organize relief for their own members, were seized by the Nazis, the Berlin Jewish community was frantic, until it was learned that the arrested men were safe in the custody of the reg-

cause the witness had not brought a verbatim report of the actual speech.

Testimony Withdrawn

Constant Weisberg testified as to the details of the manufacture of plaster casts from the footprints at the scene of the murder. When cross-examined, he admitted to Starvsky that the footprints could have been made by another pair of shoes of the same size. At an earlier examination, the prosecution had made much of the fact that shoes found in Starvsky's room were the same as the footprints of those found at the scene of the murder.

Guardians for Arlossoff Children Named by Court

JERUSALEM, Sept. 14.—The current issue of the official Palestine Gazette carries an order appointing Dr. Maurice B. Bevan, of New York; Joseph Agnew, manager of the Workers Bank; M. Dunshel, Tel Aviv attorney, and David Rosolio, accountant, as guardians for the children of the late Dr. Chaim Arlossoff.

The language of the official announcement indicates that a public trust fund has been created for the family. Mr. Rosolio is a brother-in-law of Mrs. Sima Arlossoff.

Dr. Arlossoff, young and brilliant leader of the Labor Zionist party, was assassinated on June 16. His murder caused a sensation in Jewish circles the world over. Three Revisionists, extremist right wing Zionists, are under arrest charged with the crime.
