BERLIN, Sept. 28-Not a single BERLIN, Sept. 28—Not a single Jew will go to a synagogue on Yom Kippur, the Jewish Day of Atone-ment, in Darmstadt, Hesse, and neighboring towns, in view of the studden wave of terroristic acts against the Jews, which were re-sumed in the last few days, and which are remissioner of the early which are reminiscent of the early days of the Nazi assumption of power.

Expect Promulgation of Jewish Law Defining the Status of Reich Jews

Jewish law which will serve as a constitution for the Jews of Germany, clarifying once for all, their status in the country, is expected soon, it was learned today. The German-Jewish leaders, it is understood, would welcome such a law because it will settle definitely the kind of citizenship for Jews and

A Yom Kippur call to the German lews to unite was issued today by the recently-formed Federal Representation of Iewish Provincial Organizations of Germany, in which the four largest German-Tewish organizations are represented, under the signature of Rabbi Leo Baeck and the other eight members of the executive committee.

Time Requires Unity

The message declares that this is no time for individual wishes to dominate German-Tewish life, but cognizance must be taken of the fact that "the life and future of the German Jews depends on unity." Tewish employers and employees are urged to unite, the Yom Kippur call stressing the necessity to increase the number of Tewish schools in order to prepare the Tewish youth for Palestine.

The hope is expressed that the German government will show understanding of the Jewish problems and that the Iews abroad will increase their relief activities.

"May a new existence emerge for the German Tews from the present suffering," the appeal concludes.

The German government report enumerates measures taken only in the past few days to ensure an end of discriminations against Upper Silesian Jews. The rapporteur intends to bring up the report before the League Council although the German delegation demands that the report be kept secret and not

be discussed in open session. The German report, it is reliably learned, paints the Jewish position in Upper Silesia in roseate hues although the effect of the picture is somewhat diminished by the Jewish petition enumerating acts of discrimination throughout the plebiscite area

Jewish Memorandum Circulated Reasons for urging the League of Nations to intervene in the Jewish situation in Germany are expounded in a memorandum prepared by the British Board of Jewish Deputies and circulated among delegates to the League sessions here today.

The memorandum rejects the German contention that the Jewish question is purely an internal matter on the following grounds:

First: that revocation of naturalization of Jews and deprivation of equality status of German Jews is bound to arouse international con-

Second: States having financial relations with Germany cannot view with indifference the German government's deliberate destruction of important economic values dependent on the enterprise and skill of

German Jews. Third: the civilized world cannot remain unconcerned with the German violation of the fundamental principles underlying the public law

of civilized nations Fourth: the paralyzing sense of

physical insecurity caused by the need on one hand to submit to a government depriving the Jews of their means of livelihood and on the other hand, to be exposed to arbitrary arrests and imprisonment without legal process or means of redress, is an issue that goes to the foundations of public law and European peace.
Fifth: the international issue

raised by large numbers of refugees is constituting a serious problem for neighboring countries and is aggravated by the difficulties in exporting funds and the release of property of persons forced to leave Germany. The memorandum concludes with a request for the appointment of a League commissioner or commission

the petition of the Jewish commu-; to direct the work of settlement of the refugees. Thus the League of Nations would contribute, by international cooperation, to solve a grave human problem, the memo-randum declares, in the same way

the League functioned in the work done for the repatriated Greeks and the Armenians.

'A Frank Word on the Subject' "One of the reproaches levied against the Nazis", Goebbels told the newspapermen, all of whom were present this afternoon at the reception by personal invitation, "is connected with treatment of the Jews which is said to be contrary to the

laws of humanity. "Let us say a frank word on the subject, considering the fact that the public opinion of the world is deeply moved by the Jewish question. I frankly admit that in the course of the national revolution, incidents caused by uncontrollable elements occasionally occurred, but this is not decisive. The fact that we opposed Jewish predominance was generally known before the Nazi assumption of power."
Elaborating on the question of

Jewish influence on the intellectual German life as a whole, Goebbels asserted that "the action taken against the Jews to remedy the situation

was spontaneous and unavoidable.
"Settling the Jewish problem legally," he continued, "the government adopted the most humane and most loyal method. We do not understand while protests are raised against Germany's defensive action by other countries, at the same time they demonstrate their unwillingness

to absorb Jewish emigrants from Germany. Claims No Revenge Sought

"Nothing is further from the in-tention of Nazism than to exercise cheap revenge. If we abstained from such action, it was to a real, practical solution to the Jewish question. The intolerable atrocity legends have been spread abroad by Jewish emi-grants. It would be not only to the advantage of Germany but of benefit to the entire world if the criticism of events could be limited to the actual state of facts and any antipathy resulting from a different philosophy of life could be excluded.

"We have no reason to be afraid of the truth," he asserted, "but we wish an honest effort for truth, not to be poisoned by grotesque allega-

Hitler Paper Accuses Jews Of Flooding Geneva With Anti-German Propaganda (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Sept. 28—Jewish organizations are diligently at work in Geneva, flooding the diplomats there with anti-German propaganda, in an effort to drag the great powers into a regular and systematic boycott of Germany, the Voelkischer Beobach-ter, leading Nazi paper, declares.

"The Jews will find a willing ear among the influential diplomats who eagerly combine Jewish affairs with disarmament problems," the Beo-bachter stated.

At the same time, the Voelkischer Beobachter called attention to the presence of Leonard Montefiore, president of the Anglo-Jewish Committee, and Norman Bentwich, former attorney-general of Palestine, in Geneva, where they represent the Board of Deputies of British Jews on behalf of the German-Jewish refugees. The Hitlerite organ declares that the presence of these distinguished British Jews in Geneva is evidence that the Board of Deputies is joining the anti-German boycott.

Ban on Swastika Upsets San Francisco German Day (Tewish Daily Bulletin)

-- SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 28-The refusal of J. Emmet Hayden, Acting Mayor and chairman of the Citizen's Committee, to consent to a display of the Nazi Swastika, threw a snag in the plans for the annual German Day celebration by the United German Society.

Louis E. Felmer, president of the Society, announced that the Swastika was to be displayed as a sign of respect to the German consul who is scheduled to deliver an address at the celebration. Mr. Hayden announced that he will not approve anything but the Stars and Stripes

Otto Kahn Returns, Quiet On German Situation

Otto H. Kahn, noted American banker, returned from a two-months vacation in France aboard the Italian liner Conte Di Savoia, yesterday. When asked to comment on the situation of the Jews in Ger-many, he shrugged his shoulders and replied, "As a German Jew, what can Jews." Mr. King de what can I say?" Mr. Kahn declared that his trip had been mainly for pleasure. He urged the American people to support President Roosevelt.

"I consider it the business of every right minded man to stand behind those who are trying to pull us out of the mess we are in," said Mr. Kahn.

Sirovich Predicts New War, Urges Russian Recognition. Praises Palestine Growth

Congressman William Sirovich, returning on the Italian liner, Conte Di Savoia, after a lengthy trip through Europe and the Near East, yesterday predicted a European war in the near future in which Germany, under the mad leadership of Hitler, would be dismembered, with the southern half of Germany, Ba-varia, Saxony and Wurtemberg, together with Austria, forming a new

state which would act as a buffer against the militarist aggression of Northern, Protestant Germany. Congressman Sirovich praised in enthusiastic language the achievements of the Jews in Palestine, particularly in Tel Aviv. "Why," he exclaimed, "when I saw that great Jewish city, I could hardly believe

that only a few years ago, ten at the most, there was nothing there but sand and emptiness. Dr. Sirovich, long an opponent of

the Soviet regime, returned praising the Russian Soviets for their accomplishments and urged immediate and unconditional recognition of the So-viet government. When asked about the condition of the Jews in the Soviet Union, the Congressman declared that it was impossible to recognize a Jew, to pick him out from the other citizens. The Jew, he stated, had complete freedom in Russia.

Luther's Milwaukee Visit Stirs Large Crowd to Riot (Tewish Daily Bulletin)

MILWAUKEE, Wis., Sept. 28-One is suffering from concussion of the brain and twenty-three persons, including three women and Fred Bassett Blair, former Communist candidate for governor, are under arrest as the result of a demonstration staged when Dr. Hans Luther, German Ambassador to the United States, arrived here at the doors of the Milwaukee Club to attend a luncheon.

To Establish Library at Hebrew University Named After Chaim Arlosoroff The Chaim Arlosoroff Memorial

Library, which will be established in memory of the late Dr. Chaim Ar-losoroff, noted Zionist labor leader who was murdered in Tel Aviv on June 16, will house works dealing with settlement and colonization problems, according to an announce-ment by Dr. A. S. W. Rosenbach, president of the American Friends of the Hebrew University.

The reading hall of the University Library will be equipped and furnished by means of a bequest of 5,000 pounds from the late Morris Symonds, of Sdyney, New South Wales. New gifts announced for the library include 750 pounds. library include 750 volumes of recent German fiction, donated by the Jewish Students' Association of Berlin; 1,200 pamphlets and 200 volumes dealing with Palestinian agriculture problems, donated by Mrs. Akiba Ettinger, and the archives of the bacteriologist Waldemar Mordecai Wolff Haffkine, from his friends.

Prussia Bans the Rond "Black Hundred" Group (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Sept. 28-The Czarist-Nazi organization, Rond, made up of former reactionary, anti-Semitic Russians, was officially declared ille-gal in Prussia today. One of the German states, Bavaria, had pre-viously prohibited the activities of the Rond.

The members of the notorious Russian anti-Semitic organization, the Black Hundred, and other reactionary, monarchist elements now in exile in Germany, formed their own organization after the Nazis came to power and affiliated themselves with the Nazis with the avowed object of bringing Nazi blessings to Russia. The Soviet am-bassador protested against their activities and the Bayarian authorities prohibited their activities and confiscated their property.

Kopeloff, Yiddish Writer

Funeral services for Isadore Kopeloff, Yiddish writer and retired assistant treasurer of the Zimmerman Meat Company, were held yes-terday afternoon from his home, 6113 Spencer Avenue

Mr. Kopeloff died Wednesday at the age of 75, having been ill two weeks. He came to the United States from Babroisk in 1881, became active in socialist and anarchist circles, and helped found and const circles, and neighbor found and worked on a number of Yiddish publications, including Die Freie Arbeiter Stimme, Dos Neie Leben, Die Zeit, Die Wahrheit, The Day and the Jewish Daily Forward.

Mr. Kopeloff retired in 1917, devoting all his time to the writing of three volumes of memoirs.
