(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

GENEVA, Oct. 2—The necessity member of the British cabinet, re-of increasing immigration to Pales-plied that Jewish immigration to tine in view of the German Jewish situation was stressed by numerous delegates today at the meeting of the sixth commission of the League of Nations. The speakers, describing the economic prosperity of Palestine and the possibilities for increased immigration, urged the mandatory power to support Jewish immigration.

Christian L. Lange, of Norway, expressed satisfaction with the extraordinary favorable economic and financial situation of Palestine and emphasized the importance of Palestine in the solution of the problem

of the German Jewish refugees.

Count Raczinski, the Polish representative, pointed out that Palestine not only answers the thousandyear-old hope of the Jews, but also answers the practical requirements of Jewish emigration.

Edouard Benes, Czechoslovakian Foreign Minister, and M. Antoniade of Roumania spoke in a similar strain. Rabbi D. I. Freedman of Perth, Australian delegate, appealed to the mandatory power, to bear the German occurrences in mind in regulating Palestine immigration in the spirit of the Balfour declaration. #### Yom Kippur In Germany Ouiet, Marked By Goyt. Drive on Mixed Marriages (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Oct. 2-The first Yom Kippur under the Nazi regime passed quietly in Germany, but the Day of Atonement was marked by the issuance of several anti-Jewish laws and orders aimed chiefly to break up mixed marriages between Iews and non-Iews.

Addressing the all-German Jurists convention now in session at Leipzig, Commissar of Justice Frank em-phasized that racial purity must be considered the basic law for German justice.

In Prussia, the Minister of Justice, Hans Kerrl, ordered that all negroes and other colored must henceforth be prohibited from entering legal or civil intermarriages. Also already existing civil intermarriages shall be considered void."

# AMERICAN FEDERATION OF LABOR CONVENTION RECEIVES COUNCIL REPORT URGING NAZI BOYCOTT

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 2-Ifor the brutality and the racial con-The American Federation of Labor flict interjected in the situation. today had under consideration a recomendation of the Executive Council that a boycott against Germanmade goods and German services be initiated as protest against "the repressive policies of persecution of the Tewish people."

The recommendation was made at a meeting held preliminary to the federation's annual convention op-ening in the Hotel Willard today. The federation membership exceeds 4.000,000

In a striking statement contained in the annual report submitted to the convention, the plight of the

Jew in Germany was reviewed along with the suppression of the labor movement. "Whatever the cause of the Hitler revolution," it declared, "there can be no justification Division of Opinion

There is a division of opinion on the question as to whether the federation is to condemn German products solely or to boycott the manufactured goods of other nations, including Italy, Russia and Japan as well, where organized labor has in general been stifled. A great deal of support is anticipated for the resolution condemning German anti-Jewish persecutions and banning German products. Regardless of whether the four nations are to be included in the boycott the federation is known to be wholly in sympathy with the plight of the German Jew and is expected to enunciate its sympathy in no uncertain terms.

#### Police Will Check Nazi Activities At Germantown Celebration October Fifth (Yewish Daily Bulletin)

PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 2-Any attempt by Hitler henchmen to unfurl a Swastika banner or to stage any other Nazi demonstration on October 5 in connection with the celebration of the 250th anniversary of the founding of Germantown, a suburb of Philadelphia, now in pre-paration here, will be promptly checked by the police, a spokesman for the Department of Public Safety declared today.

Since the decision of a number of German American Societies fittingly to observe this anniversary of the founding of Germantown, many efforts have been made by the Hitler cohorts here to utilize the occasion for the spread of Nazi propaganda. "The revolution in Germany, remeant the overthrow of the Weimar constitution (the Republic) and the inauguration of the Third Reich. Rallying to his support the discontent and unrest in all groups Hitler's regime turned upon the Social Democratic Party and the trade unions which accepted the Versailles Treaty because it afforded opportunity for building up democratic institutions. Many trade unionists were active in the Social Democratic Party which had been responsible for the government. The Nazi Government, therefore, struck directly at trade union officials and machinery in order to establish its power. First, methods of communications within the unions were suppressed or intercepted, and this was followed by the arrest and imprisonment of exec-utives and leaders. Terror and brutality followed, together with the inauguration of a campaign of Jewish persecution unparalleled in modern history. Complete Destruction of Unions

# Austrian Vice-Chancellor Urges Minority Status To Solve Jewish Problem

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BUDAPEST, Hungary, Oct. 2-The Austrian government will settle the Jewish question when it has solved other important state problems, the Austrian Vice-Chancellor Emil Fey, declared in an interview with the Hungarian newspaper, Pesti Hirlap.

"I have never been an anti-Se-mite," said Major Fey, "neither in principles nor in feelings, never-theless measures against the Jews are unavoidable as the result of the general situation. However, the Tewish problem is not an immediate one. There are more important problems waiting for solution.

"It is necessary to solve the Jew-ish problem on the basis of national minority recognition, whereby the government will not tolerate the rowdy anti-Semitism of the Nazis. Even the Heimwehr does not desire to solve the Jewish problem with the fist. The best proof of that is that the Heimwehr enrolls as members, respectable, patriotic Jews."

VIENNA, Oct. 2-The press here featured the Fey interview as an an-ti-Semitic sensation, and interpreted the Vice-Chancellor's declaration as an intention to introduce the numerus clausus against the Jews in all branches of Austrian life, because the national minority status is tantamount to numerus clausus.

Major Fey promptly denied the correctness of the interpretations and stated that all he said was that the Jewish problem does not exist in Austria, but that if it should arise, his solution was national minority status for the Iews, with all minority rights.

The Austrian Vice-Chancellor disclaimed any other pronouncements contained in the alleged interview.

## Palestine Land of Hope Sir Herbert Samuel Tells Audience At Pageant

Characterizing Germany as a land of grief and Palestine as a land of hope, Sir Herbert Samuel, former British Home Secretary, first High Commissioner of Palestine, and lead-er of the British Liberal Party, declared that "constructive Jewish work" is the best answer to racial intolerance in the Reich, in an adress to the audience that viewed the Jewish pageant, "The Romance of a People" Sunday evening at the Kingsbridge Armory.

The Jew has persisted because "he is the vehicle of an idea. He feels, he knows that he is the body in which there lives a soul - a spiritual conception which, from the time of the patriarchs, he has known to be useful, essential to the welfare of mankind", stated

Herbert. "Once again racial intolerance, religious persecution raises its head" he continued. "As in the Roman Empire, in Spain, in Russia, so it arises again in modern Germany, a land which has held a foremost place in the ranks of civilization - thanks we must add to the achievements of doctors. Jewish scientists and philosophers and poets, who have added lustre to the intellectual life of Germany. What then is now to be done? The best answer is con-structive Jewish work. The best immediate solution is to help those oppressed to seek their welfare in other lands. And here it is that the question of Palestine links with

"I had the privilege to be for five years the Governor of Palestine; the first Jew for two thousand years to fill that office, the first Jew, in fact, since Herod. I hope that I did better than my predecessor. The land has developed well. There are no unemployed today in Palestine. There is a surplus in its budget. The Jewish agricultural colonies are prospering. . . . Under prudent, honest, progressive administration, benefitting by the long Colonial experience of Great Britain, with the Jewish combination of the idealist and the practical, the land makes rapid progress. For this, thanks are also largely due to world Jewry. and particularly, to the Jews of America from whom Palestine has derived greater material help than from any other section of the com-

# Camelots du Roi Join With Jews Against Nazis In Paris Cafe Meles

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) PARIS, Oct. 2-Nazi propaganda methods were responsible for a curious alignment of forces in a battle in a Montparnasse cafe early this morning when the Camelots du Roi, anti-Semitic monarchist group, joined with Jewish students in a pitched battle against Nazi sympathizers.

Students visititng the cafe last night, including a number of Jewish youths, objected to the repeated appearance there of a newspaper vendor hawking anti-Semitic publications and making insulting remarks about the Jews, including French Jews, and drove him out. He returned about midnight and a new argument started. It developed into a fight when a number of Nazi students rushed into the cafe.

Then, to the surprise of by-standers, another group, wearing the insignia of the Camelots du Roi, also entered the fray, but on the side of the anti-Nazi forces. Police restored order.

# **Bucharest Synagogue Deaths** Ten; Fifty Injured to Live (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUCHAREST, Roumania, Oct. 2

The death-toll of the victims of the panic that occurred in the Poradim synagogue in the women's gallery on the eve of Yom Kippur (the Day of Atonement) has been placed by the authorities at ten Jewish women. Hopes are held out by the medical authorities that all of the injured, who number about fifty women, will recover.

The panic began when a frightened woman worshipper in the gallery yelled "fire," when a short circuit in the electric lights occurred. In the rush for the exits, the women were trampled under foot and the women's gallery collapsed.

# Washington Jews to Hold Anti-Nazi Meeting Tonight (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 2-Leaders of the anti-Nazi movement in this city were determined to carry on their drive for a boycott against German-made goods despite the reported relaxation of restrictions against Jewish merchants in Germany. This determination was given added force by the recommendation for a boycott made today at the opening session of the American Federation

of Labor convention by the Executive Council. Jewish leaders here hastened plans for a series of mass meetings the first of which is to be held Tuesday evening in the Jewish Community Center.

Members of all women's organizations will gather to discuss a consumer's boycott against imported German goods. In Berlin, the Minister of Education, Bernhard Rust, in connection with the celebration of his fiftieth birthday yesterday, proclaimed the wish that beginning with October 1, all German schools should teach ra-

cial science at least three hours, even at the expense of such subiects as mathematics and foreign languages, if no time for racial science is provided in the regular school schedule.

The Reichs Gesetzblatt yesterday published a decree of the government that non-Arvans cannot be patent registrators. The Ministries of Interior and Finance yesterday issued a joint order, acknowledging for the second time that in the future they will not employ any one of Jewish descent or who is married to a descendant of a Jew. Exception will be made only for the wives of those who fell in the war. Other special exceptions will be permitted only in urgent cases and only with the direct approval of the Minister himself.

The government also issued an order saying that all non-Aryans must be cleared out of all institutions not later than April 1, 1934.
