End of Arlosoroff Hearing Delayed by Defense Demand; Rosenblatt Alibi Supported (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JAFFA, Palestine, Oct. 19.—The intention of the prosecution to close the Arlosoroff murder examination today was opposed by the defense lawyer, Mr. Kaiserman, who demanded that the prosecution produce in court, before the conclusion of the hearing, all the written testimony taken by the police and also examine three more witnesses.

Zvi Rosenblatt, Aba Achmeir and Abraham Stavsky, members of an extreme Revisionist group, right wing Zionists, are under arrest charged with the murder of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, noted Zionist labor leader, on June 16.

The investigation was adjourned until November 1 and is then expected to last for three days. Following the conclusion of the examination, the examining magistrate must decide whether or not the three accused are to be committed for trial for murder.

One of the witnesses in today's proceedings, a young man named Portnoi, supported the alibi offered at previous sessions by Rosenblatt. Portnoi declared that Rosenblatt had spent the night of the murder at Kfar Saba and only learned of the murder at eight o'clock on Saturday morning, the day after the crime.

3 Jewish Students Injured In Anti-Semitic Excesses At Budapest Institution (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUDAPEST, Hungary, Oct. 19.—Three Jewish students were seriously injured and four others slightly injured when serious anti-Semitic excesses broke out today at the Polytechnic College. All the Jewish students were forced to flee from the college.

University authorities promptly instituted a vigorous investigation suspecting Nazi agitation behind the attack on the Jewish students, since early this morning, swastika signs had been painted on all the university buildings.

Jewish Liberals in Reich Launch Campaign to Check Growing Zionist Sentiment (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Oct. 19.—An organized campaign to discourage German-Jewish youths from going to Palestine has been launched by the Jewish liberal party in view of the growing Zionist sympathies of Jews throughout the Reich.

The Judische Liberale Zeitung, under the headline, "Storm Sign Over Palestine," commenting on the abortive Arab demonstration in Jerusalem last Friday, for the first time since the advent of the Nazi regime, warns German Jews against going to Palestine.

The fact that the Palestine government took preventive measures against the demonstration should not make the Jews of Germany believe that Palestine is safe, the paper warns. It urges German Jewry not to put its hopes blindly in Palestine "because nothing will remain if this last hope is lost."

Roumanian Prosecutor Acts Against Jewish Boycotters (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

CZERNOWITZ, Roumania, Oct. 19.—The legality of the Jewish boycott against German goods is to be contested by the public prosecutor here. An order was issued to place under arrest Dr. Bruno Markus, Jewish journalist, on the charge that he printed leaflets calling on the public to refrain from patronizing a German film now on exhibition in a local movie house.

Court action is also to be instituted against Deputy Max Diamond and Dr. Markus Kremer who are members of the Jewish boycott committee.

Leipzig Bans Half-Breed Dogs In 'Racial Purity' Campaign (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LEIPZIG, Germany, Oct. 19.—The municipality of Leipzig today imposed a heavy tax upon the owners of dogs of mixed breeds in order to force racial purity even among German dogs. The municipality was encouraged to do this by the recent government order against all intermarriages between Aryans and non-Aryans.

French Refugee Aid Body Suspends for Lack of Funds; American Attitude Is Hit (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

PARIS, Oct. 19.—The Central Committee for Assisting German Refugees has suspended its activities due to lack of funds. Whether it will resume its relief work is doubtful, since Baron Edmund de Rothschild, who had advanced the necessary funds when the committee's means were exhausted, declined to continue making contributions. He charged that Jews of other countries, particularly in the United States, from which funds are no longer received, are indifferent to the fate of the homeless refugees cared for by the committee.

Relief groups in Antwerp and Amsterdam have also suspended their activities for the same reason, it is further learned.

Refugees in French Barracks (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, Oct. 19.—Refugees from Germany now sheltered in French government barracks will continue to inhabit these quarters in the hope that the relief agency being established by the League of Nations will soon take over the burden of relief, the London Jewish Chronicle reports.

German Psychologists Condemn Inter marriage; French Ambassador Assailed (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Oct. 19.—Falling in line with the German government campaign against all intermarriages between Aryans and non-Aryans, the thirteenth congress of German psychologists now in session at the University of Leipzig adopted resolutions calling for racial purity and condemning the mixing of blood. The congress declared that intermarriage leads to degeneration of the blood which participants claimed had been established through experiments involving intermarried families.

Encouraged by the government order against intermarriage, the Berlin Volkswart today verbally attacked a foreign diplomat for being married to a Jewess. The diplomat who was attacked is the French ambassador

New Yorker Reveals Nazi Attack While in Germany

Morris R. Jacobson, silk merchant, who lives at the Empire Hotel, disclosed to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency yesterday that while on a trip to Germany, on September 1, he was struck by Nazi storm troopers, although he had offended them in no way. He did not report the incident to the American authorities.

"I was standing on the train platform of the Anhalter Bahnhof," said Mr. Jacobson. "Along the street I saw approaching a detachment of storm troopers. I turned away from them and pretended to be engaged in reading a sign post. All of a sudden somebody hit me. The blow was not violent. I turned around. An elderly officer leading the troops demanded to know why I had not saluted the swastika flag. I explained that I was an American. Without an apology, he left me staring."

Mr. Jacobson explained that his visit to the Reich was brief. He stayed with relatives who are of Polish extraction. He said that they are anxious to get out of Germany, but added that they are not annoyed by the Nazis. The reason, according to Mr. Jacobson, is that the Polish government "has put fear into the hearts of German rulers."

Mr. Jacobson warned that travelers in Germany are exposing themselves to unnecessary danger. He said that in other European countries there is a prevailing hatred of the German policies.

R. D. Blumenfeld Cancels Lecture Tour Here; Departs for Home

Ralph D. Blumenfeld, chairman of the Board of The London Daily Express and its editor-in-chief for thirty years, embarked on the S.S. Olympic last night which left for England. His projected speaking tour in this country was canceled on account of the sudden death of his daughter Tuesday night.

Mr. Blumenfeld arrived on the Olympic Tuesday evening, when he was scheduled to speak at the Jewish Daily Bulletin testimonial dinner in honor of Dr. Sherwood Eddy.

In an interview on board the liner before coming into Manhattan, Mr. Blumenfeld discussed the German situation, Anglo-American relations and other current subjects. He told reporters that the belief that war is imminent is based on "exaggerations and stretches of fancy."

England and America are notoriously antipathetic toward Hitler and his repressive measures, he said. The only weapon which could possibly have effect in ameliorating conditions in connection with the Jews in the Reich, Mr. Blumenfeld said, would be united effort on the part of England and the United States. He condemned war on any grounds, and said that talk of war is the overheated fervor of newspaper men and the German youth.

"There is plenty of war talk in Europe but it is all bunk," said Mr. Blumenfeld. "It is easy to talk war but quite another thing to make it. There is war talk in France but the French do not want to have it. In Germany the young men would be willing to go to war but the sober-minded people of the country are dead against it."

West Side Schools Plan Intensive Drive for Pupils

An intensive effort to bring more Jewish children into the Jewish religious schools, will be made by the West Side Hebrew schools, it was decided last night at a meeting of the Boards of the schools held at the Spanish and Portuguese Synagogue.

"As good Americans, we Jews can do our country no greater service than to give our children a knowledge of the faith and traditions of our people," declared Judge Otto A. Rosalsky, who delivered the principal address at the meeting. "There is no greater guarantee of a virtuous life, including good and loyal citizenship, than a religious education during the impressionable years of childhood."

Samuel A. Sternberg, president of Temple Israel, presided at the meeting.

Rabbi, Priest, Minister On Religious Tolerance Tour of the Country

In order to prevent the spread of European anti-Semitism to the United States, the National Conference of Jews and Christians has named a Protestant minister, a Roman Catholic priest and a Jewish rabbi to tour the nation together during the next three months and preside at inter-denominational discussions of religious tolerance in thirty-seven cities.

The three clergymen selected were the Reverend Everett R. Clinchy, director of the conference and former pastor of the College Church at Wesleyan University; the Reverend J. Elliot Ross, C.S.P., of the Roman Catholic archdiocese of Baltimore, former Catholic chaplain at Columbia University, and the Reverend Dr. Morris S. Lazaron, rabbi of the Baltimore Hebrew Congregation of Baltimore.

Plans for a nation-wide campaign against intolerance were announced after a meeting of Newton D. Baker, Professor Carlton J. Hayes of Columbia University and Roger W. Straus, the Protestant, Catholic and Jewish co-chairmen of the conference.

Mr. Baker refused to comment on the recent declaration made by Representative Samuel Dickstein that the Nazis were seeking a foothold in the United States, but admitted that the campaign had been inspired by concern over "the outbreak of intolerance abroad." He said that the campaign would be carried on in an "utterly unspectacular fashion."

Mr. Baker also announced that a committee of three women, representing the Protestant, Catholic and Jewish faiths, would be selected soon to aid the campaign. Mrs. Dorothy Canfield Fisher, noted author, has been chosen as chairman of the women's advisory council.

The New York meeting will be held on October 30 and 31 at Teachers' College, Columbia University. The chairmen of the meeting will be Charles H. Tuttle, former Justice Joseph M. Proskauer and Martin Conboy.

Church Body Rejects Hitler Protest Resolution

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Oct. 19.—By a vote of 223 to one, the New Jersey Synod of the Presbyterian Church yesterday condemned a resolution protesting against the treatment of the Jews of Germany. The Rev. Robert Arthur Elwood, pastor of the Boardwalk Church here, who proposed the resolution, had asked for sympathy for the German Jews. The Rev. Walter H. Westerfield of Bergenfield led the victorious opposition.

Hoan Blocks Prosecution Of Demonstrators at Luther Milwaukee Visit (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

MILWAUKEE, Oct. 19.—Attempts of non-partisan (anti-socialist) aldermen to have a special counsel appointed to prosecute radicals arrested in a demonstration during the visit of Dr. Hans Luther, German ambassador, were blocked by a veto on the part of Mayor Daniel W. Hoan yesterday.

This leaves 16 of the communists seized on disorderly conduct charges without prosecution. Cases against them will probably be dismissed by the court, as a result. The mayor in his veto message said he would defend the right of communists to hold peaceful demonstrations.

Meanwhile, a special inquiry committee appointed by the socialist party to look into the police suppression of the anti-Hitler gathering reported that the police "acted with uncalled for violence." The committee declared further that the real blame for the incident "rests clearly on the shoulders of those who insisted on flaunting a representative of the Fascist government of Germany of Milwaukee."

Dr. Marx Bribery Trial Verdict Due Tomorrow (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

FRANKFURT, Germany, Oct. 19.—The examination of Dr. Marx, Frankfurt representative of the Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith, and Ferdinand Muerdel, former head of the political police, who are on trial on bribery charges, was concluded today. Prosecution and defense attorneys will deliver their summations tomorrow and a verdict in the case is expected by Saturday.

Dr. Marx is accused of bribing Herr Muerdel to obtain information about Nazi activities prior to the advent of the Nazis to power. He denied the bribery charges, declaring he had only rewarded Herr Muerdel

Polish Govt. Gathers Data On Refugee Situation (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

WARSAW, Poland, Oct. 19.—The Polish government began yesterday to collect information on the number of German refugees in Poland, in order to submit a report to the High Commissioner for Refugees, who will be appointed by the League of Nations in accordance with the decision reached in Geneva recently.

It is understood here that the governing body of the League circularized all the countries in which there are refugees, asking them to submit reports on the number of the refugees who fled from Nazi Germany.

Jewish Congress Warns Of Reich Debt Defaults In Answer to Steuben Group

A statistical analysis of American-German relations refuting the conclusions drawn by the Steuben Society that the boycott against German goods is injuring American investors, was issued yesterday by the American Jewish Congress. The Steuben Society statement had been attacked Wednesday by the American League for the Defense of Jewish Rights.

"The contention by the National Council of the Steuben Society of America, betrays a lack of familiarity with the true state of affairs, particularly in regard to American investments in the Reich," the statement signed by Rabbi Stephen S. Wise and Bernard S. Deutsch, declares.

"A careful analysis of the status of German obligations forces the conclusion that the payment of interest and amortization on German bonds to American investors, individuals as well as institutions, cannot be expected to be resumed as long as the present form of government continues," the Congress statement declares.

The statement also insists that the American investors are withdrawing from Germany because the Reich has not kept its promises to American bondholders. This latter fact, bringing about "the inability of Germany to secure financial accommodations," rather than the boycott, is likely to "deprive Germany of the possibility of continuing to purchase American goods, in particular raw materials," says the statement.

The Steuben Society protest against the boycott, which was sent to Secretary of State Cordell Hull and President Roosevelt, declared that "the movement to exclude German goods from importation into the United States as a protest against the persecution of minorities by the present German government is economically unsound in view of America's huge stake in Germany."

"We, the Steuben Society of America," the statement goes on, "therefore denounce the boycott as detrimental to the interests of the American people and we moreover are of the opinion that such policy toward Germany is the most inappropriate method to achieve the aims allegedly pursued by its propagators. The Jews of Germany, in whose interest the boycott is proclaimed, have repeatedly and in unmistakable terms appealed to the outside world to desist from actions against Germany which in their further effect might tend to inflame already highly wrought feelings. We declare it to be our firm conviction that a stabilization of political and social conditions and a return to

Toronto Deluged With 'Friends of New Germany' Anti-Semitic Leaflets (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

TORONTO, Oct. 19.—Thousands of printed leaflets bearing a bitter attack on the Jews were distributed throughout this city in the early hours of the day. Copies were found in hundreds of cars parked in the downtown district. All bore the printed signature of the Friends of New Germany, Hitlerist organization active now in the United States.

The leaflets exhorted Gentiles to "awaken" to the menace of the Jews in their midst and denounced Sir John Simon, British secretary of state for foreign affairs, and Joseph Paul-Boncour, French minister of foreign affairs, as being Jewish.

An immediate investigation was ordered by Mayor Stewart, who was instrumental last summer in disbanding the swastika clubs which had flourished here and had been involved in numerous anti-Jewish riots. At Mayor Stewart's instance, display of the swastika in this city was banned.

It was established that the leaflets were printed in the United States and brought by automobile to Toronto.

Beobachter Photographs to Show Jewish Life 'Normal' (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Oct. 19.—Tomorrow's issue of the Illustrierter Beobachter, a supplement of the Voelkischer Beobachter, newspaper owned by Adolf Hitler, will be devoted entirely to photographs of scenes from Jewish life in Berlin.

The photographs, taken by an American cameraman, are intended to show that Jewish life in Berlin is normal. There are also pictures of ghetto trading centers. The Voelkischer Beobachter explains that the illustrations will serve to counteract atrocity propaganda.

2,442 Jews Admitted Into Palestine in August (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, Oct. 19.—According to figures published here yesterday, 2,513 persons immigrated to Palestine during the month of August. Of this number 2,442 are Jews who include 213 in the capitalist classification. The number of prospective immigrants who were refused admittance into Palestine during the month was 122.

Francois Poncet, allegedly married to a Jewess whose maiden name was Levy. The Nazi paper declares that the intermarriage explains why Ambassador Poncet recently proceeded to Paris with plans for a project for the French government to open the colony of Madagascar for settlement by German refugees.

Order on Jewish Boycott Issued by Nazi Ministers

BERLIN, Oct. 18.—A further order against boycotting Jews was issued yesterday, this time by the Ministries of Economics and Labor. The joint order prohibits:

1. The compilation of blacklists.
2. Refusal to accept Jewish advertisements.
3. Refusal to register Jewish firms in official directories.
4. The intimidation of people patronizing Jewish shops.
5. Posting pickets on Jewish premises.
6. The display of leaflets and placards calling for a boycott of Jews.
7. Photographing customers entering Jewish shops or the publishing of such photographs, displaying them in pillories with names and addresses.

The order emphasizes again that Jewish firms should be given a chance to exist, otherwise, Christian employees and workers will suffer through the resulting unemployment.

Although the Nazi party as such has not issued any instructions against the boycott of Jews, nevertheless the order points out that it is in the interests of the country to abstain from the boycott.

On the other hand, the municipality of Arschwang, unanimously resolved today that Jewish peddlers and cattle dealers be prohibited from entering or trading in the town and that official signs to this effect be displayed outside the town.

The German industrial press advises the introduction of the Aryan principle, urging that only Aryans be appointed as the representatives of German firms in Palestine and that no Jews be given such appointments. Otherwise, the German trade papers declared, German trade with Palestine will suffer.

The Anzeiger for Machine Work, however, pointed out that the danger that the boycott against the Jews may cause a decline in German trade with Palestine is exaggerated, because Germany is allegedly purchasing fifty per cent of Palestinian citrus products.

group is taken as a sign that a strong anti-Zionist front is again being organized in view of the increased Zionist activities in the country.

Publication of a series of articles in the Berlin Jewish community organ urging German Jews to remain aware of the fact that they are German under all circumstances, to the extent, even, of agreeing to a numerous clausus in the universities, except for those students about to graduate, has provoked strong Zionist dissatisfaction and resulted in the resignation of Dr. Moses from the directorate of the community. Dr. Moses declared such matters of policy belong solely to the representative body embracing almost all Jewish organizations in Germany, organized last month. Dr. Moses is vice-president of this group. He declared that the community, by its programmatic pronouncements, had broken the united front of German Jewry.

Roumanian Jewish Body To Mark 25th Anniversary

Roumanian Jewry in the United States will celebrate the twenty-fifth anniversary of their activities here, this coming January, according to Leo Wolfson, president of the United Roumanian Jews of America.

A twenty-fifth anniversary convention will be held in New York City, Mr. Wolfson stated. A committee was appointed to head the celebration with Dr. Julius Klepper as chairman and Herman Speier as secretary. The committee also includes David Abramowitz, Abraham Berger, Bruno Berk, Henry Eisler, Abraham Falick, Peter Ferester, Leon Fischer, Herman Fischer, Charles I. Fleck, Isidore Goldenberg, Abraham Hirsch and Louis Weiss.

At the same time it was announced that Louis Minsky had been commissioned to prepare a history of Roumanian Jewish activity in the United States during the past 25 years.

Isaac R. Travis Burial To Be in Palestine

The body of Isaac R. Travis, 85, one of the Jewish pioneers of the Southwest, is being taken to Palestine where it will be buried on the Mount of Olives alongside the grave of his wife.

Memorial services were held at the pier in Exchange Place, Jersey City. Dr. Bernard Reval, president of Yeshiva College, Mr. Travis' son-in-law, and other well-known rabbis, recited eulogies.

First Training Center For Young Refugees Established in Britain

LONDON, Oct. 19.—The first agricultural center in England for the training of German youths in preparation for their settlement in Palestine has been established by the Jewish Refugee Committee in arrangement with a committee of agriculturists.

A number of young German Jews have already begun to work at the center which has been functioning experimentally for the past six months.

Vilno Jewry Protests Closing of Jewish Hospital

VILNO, Poland, Oct. 19.—The rabinate of Vilno and the Jewish community have initiated a strong protest movement against the intention of the municipality to close down the only Jewish hospital in the city. The hospital is important not only because it treats the Jewish ill, but also because, in view of discriminations against Jews in medical institutions, it offers the only opportunity for training young Jewish doctors.

The Jewish Doctors' Association will cooperate in making a vigorous protest against the closing of the institution.
