## Put Foot Down on Anti-Semitic Outrages, Jews Ask of Roumania

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

**BUCHAREST, Roumania, Oct. 21**—Representations to the Roumanian government on the position of the Roumanian Jewish population as a result of dangerous anti-Semitic activities in recent weeks were made to Minister of the Interior Mironescu today.

Dr. William Filderman, president of the Union of Roumanian Jews, told the minister of the growing extremes the anti-Semitic campaign in Roumania is reaching and presented documents supporting his contention that the incitements to violence which have come with great frequency in recent weeks are in direct defiance of government authorities. The anti-Semitic agitation, he warned, must inevitably result in anarchical upheavals dangerous to law and order and to the prestige of the government.

In many parts of Roumania, he advised the government official, the Jewish population lives in a tense atmosphere created by the terrorism and continual incitement created by the anti-Semites which makes it unsafe for the Jews to carry on their normal activities.

Anti-Semitism in Roumania recently took a serious turn with the organization of a Christian-Fascist party sponsored by German Nazis and directed by Stepan Tatarescu who recently returned from conferences in Berlin with anti-Semitic leaders there.

## Special Group Is Named To Edit Citizenship Law

**BERLIN, Oct. 21**—A special committee to reform the existing citizenship law has been appointed by Minister of Justice Frank. Since the committee is composed of representatives of the Nazi Jurists' Association, the political department of the Nazi party and the Academy for German Rights, it is expected to reduce still further rights of the Jewish population in the Reich.

## Palestine Will Allow Only 7,000 to Enter

**JERUSALEM, Oct. 21**—The Palestine government has agreed to grant only seven thousand immigration certificates for the period of October to March, it was reliably learned today. This is in the face of a demand for 24,000 certificates made by the Jewish Agency for Palestine.

The 2,000 certificates already advanced to the Jewish Agency against the new schedules, used for the German Jews, will be deducted from the allotted amount for October-March.

The Palestine high commissioner, Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchop, it is understood, in a recent interview with members of the new Jewish Agency executive, pointed out a great difference in their computations of the labor shortage of Palestine and the figures compiled by the government.

## Lehman Resting After Appendicitis Operation

Governor Herbert H. Lehman is resting comfortably following an operation for appendicitis performed Saturday morning in Mount Sinai Hospital.

Bulletins issued at the Governor's home on Park Avenue announced that the patient is doing well and that speedy recovery is expected. Mrs. Lehman was at her husband's bedside throughout most of the day.

Messages from officials of state and nation arrived at the hospital. Hundreds of telephone calls inquiring as to the Governor's health were received.

## Refugee Relief Committee Continues on Full Schedule

**PARIS, Oct. 21**—The Central Committee for the Assistance of German Refugees is continuing its work on a full schedule and is not planning to close its offices here, it was announced today. The London Jewish Chronicle earlier this week had stated that the committee had discontinued its work because of lack of funds.

## Persecutions Ended, Is Idea German Press Tries to Spread Abroad

**BERLIN, Oct. 21**—A visible effort is being made by the German press to create an impression abroad that the persecution of the Jews is slowing down and that even the Jews no longer complain of their treatment.

In this connection the press quotes a statement issued by the Jewish war veterans at the close of the Leipzig fair, which ended two months ago, in order to substantiate the contention.

None the less, anti-Jewish orders are continuing to flood the country, however, without any publicity.

The Landshandelbund issued secret orders to all bakeries that flour must be purchased only from Aryan mills and from Aryan dealers.

The official Labor Front, embracing all the labor unions, has created a special association of house managers. Only Aryans may belong to this association, thus rendering it impossible for Jews to manage the properties of hundreds of Jewish refugees who left Germany.

The police of Hesse were ordered to treat Jews differently from non-Jews.

It is significant that none of these orders are published in the German press, in order that an unfavorable impression may not be created abroad.

## Jew-Baiting Weekly In Saar Is Prohibited

**BERLIN, Oct. 21**—The anti-Semitic weekly, *Fredericus*, has been banned from distribution in the Saar plebiscite region because of an article in the current issue, "Juda Beware." The article, written by the editor of the weekly, Herr Holtz, calls for extermination of the Jews.

Although the entire German press, in accordance with orders issued this week, no longer carries any news or articles which could be used abroad as evidence of the Nazis' continuing drive against the Jews, the *Fredericus* today featured the article by Holtz accusing the Jews of being guilty of creating international com-

### Mayor O'Brien Considers Plea Against Nazi Rally Here

Mayor O'Brien Saturday was considering his decision on the protest submitted to him late Friday afternoon by a group of war veterans against the Nazi mass meeting to be held on October 29 in the 165th Regiment Armory as part of the annual celebration of German day. The veterans urged the mayor to forbid the meeting.

Among the group who advised the mayor that the rally might lead to violence and bloodshed were:

John Cronin, New York County commander of the American Legion; Edgar H. Burman, of the Jewish War Veterans of America; Arthur Hyde, commander of the Bronx Democratic Veterans Association; William Bradley, commander of the Fort Hamilton Post, American Legion; Nat Gross, commander of the Rugby Post; Cornelius Bregoff, past commander of the Richmond County Legion; Abraham Kraditor, past commander of Post 224, Veterans of Foreign Wars; John F. Henry, past state inspector, Veterans of Foreign Wars, and I. N. Sussman of the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

### Professor Otto Warburg Is Here for Week's Stay

Professor Otto H. Warburg, noted German-Jewish scientist and winner of the Nobel Prize in physical chemistry, arrived Saturday morning on the North German Lloyd liner Bremen.

Professor Warburg, who will remain in New York only one week, refused to be interviewed or to make any comments on the purposes of his visit. During his stay in New York, Professor Warburg will be at the Plaza Hotel.

### 41 Groups in Rallies In Federation's Drive For City Institutions

The appeal for \$4,200,000 which will finance a supporting budget for ninety-one affiliates of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies will be widely publicized this week. Forty-one meetings of business and professional leaders, as well as prominent women, are scheduled before the end of the month.

Confidence that the Federation's 2,500 volunteer workers who have mobilized their facilities in a concentrated money-raising drive, will be successful, was expressed in a statement issued by Paul and Benjamin J. Bittenwaiser, campaign chairman.

"The success of the campaign becomes daily more imperative," read the statement. "Each day brings reports of an increasing need from our hospitals, child-care institutions, homes and direct-relief agencies. In this the fifth year of the depression, we realize that something more than food, shelter and clothing must be given to the thousands of victims of the crisis. They must be nursed back to health, given new spirit and ambition and restored to their positions as productive citizens."

Team captains in the Red Division of the Federation, headed by Mrs. Alfred A. Cook, will meet at luncheon at the Hotel Carlyle tomorrow. White division leaders will hold a luncheon meeting at the home of their commander, Mrs. Arthur Lehman, Wednesday. The Blue Division will meet at luncheon at the home of Mrs. Irvin Untermyer Thursday. The division is headed by Mrs. Joseph Brettauer and Mrs. Untermyer.

The drive will also concentrate on raising about \$15,000 at a meeting of leaders in the brewing industry, and about \$150,000 at the Federation Real Estate Club. Rabbi Louis I. Newman, of Temple Rodeph Sholem, will join the committee designated to raise about \$7,500.

### B'nai B'rith Seeks \$250,000 To Carry on Year's Work

The sum of \$250,000 is being sought by B'nai B'rith to carry on its activities during the current year. Municipal Court Judge Myron Sulzberger sounded a plea for their support by Jewish communal leaders throughout New York and the New England states.

At the present time the Anti-Defamation League, working through four hundred local committees, constitutes a systematic and effective agency to combat subversive influences in this country.

### Eddy, in Chicago Address, Argues for Boycott of Reich by Gentiles, Jews.

CHICAGO, Ill., Oct. 21.—Dr. Sherwood Eddy in an address yesterday at the initial meeting of the Council of Jewish Charities at the Chicago Palmer House told a large audience that he stands in favor of a joint economic boycott of German-made goods by both Jews and Gentiles. Dr. Eddy is former secretary of the Y.M.C.A. in Asia, and an authority on international affairs.

Cautioning Americans not to "meet hysteria with hysteria," and describing the political advent of Adolf Hitler as "the antitoxin of the disease of despair in Germany," the speaker warned that an economic boycott launched by Jews alone "is a dangerous weapon."

Dr. Eddy said that Hitler is "the most dangerous man in the world today." The objective of the Nazi regime in the Reich, he said, is the slow economic strangulation of the Jews. Relief must be extended to the suffering refugees immediately and generously, Dr. Eddy declared.

### Jewish Theatre Folk Mourn 'Loney' Haskell

Loney Haskell, one of the best-beloved figures in the theatrical world, who died on Friday of a cerebral hemorrhage, will be interred in Beth Cemetery today.

An actor who was famous for his beneficence among "down-and-outers," secretary of the Jewish Theatrical Guild of America, Inc., Mr. Haskell won popular success in vaudeville as a monologist and later as a master of ceremonies.

He was born sixty-three years ago with the surname of Levy and actors gave him the nickname of 'Loney,' an adaptation of Lorne. He retired from the mercantile business in 1898 and joined the burlesque producers, Hurtig and Seaman. In a few years he was admitted into big-time vaudeville, winning a name as a monologist whose humor and nonsense "bubbled and sparkled like champagne." He was an intimate friend of Oscar Hammerstein and managed the Victoria for Mr. Hammerstein's son, William.

Mayor O'Brien sent the following telegram to Loney's brother:

"I was shocked and grieved to learn of the death of your brother. He will be mourned by countless thousands into whose lives he had brought sunshine during his long career on the American stage. Please accept my deepest sympathy."

Rabbi Benjamin A. Tintner, of the Temple of the Covenant, will officiate at the services. Mr. Jessel will deliver the eulogy.

## Weizmann and Ruppin To Present Palestine Solution at London

Dr. Chaim Weizmann, head of the Zionist German relief drive, and Dr. Arthur Ruppin, agricultural expert and member of the Jewish Agency executive, will present the Zionist program for settlement of German Jews in Palestine at the conference called in London for October 29 to consider refugee aid plans, according to Louis Lipsky, American member of the World Zionist executive and chairman of the American Palestine Campaign.

The World Zionist Organization program for the coming year was made public by Mr. Lipsky. Its primary aim will be acceleration of German Jewish settlement in Palestine. "Real and lasting salvation for German Jewry is possible only by means of a great effort to settle large numbers of German Jews in Palestine, whither they will bring their possessions, their culture and their ability in order to enrich the land and the nation," the program states.

Other essentials of the program include "cooperation with the Mandatory power, the safeguarding of Jewish rights and the establishing of friendship and understanding with the Arabs." The statement points out that Palestine conditions are such as to make it ready to receive all categories of Jews. It promises that "the executive will strengthen the chalutz movement and facilitate its entry into the land. Further political work with Great Britain and the League of Nations, strengthening of the national funds and a "determined, vigorous and united" Zionist movement are other announced objectives.

## 40 American Pioneers Set Sail for Palestine

Forty American chalutzim, pioneers for Palestine, sailed Saturday night on the liner Vulcania for Palestine, where they will join the chalutzim of many countries in the work of building up Palestine.

All the members of the group belong to the Hechalutz and the Hashmar Hatzair, and underwent a period of preparatory training in this country on farms located near Baltimore and Minneapolis.

Fifteen of the group are girls. All speak Hebrew and more than half of the forty are college graduates. Many are going to Dganita Beth in the Jordan valley and all will work either on the land or at various trades for which they have been trained. Most of the group, at their own demand, will be assigned to farm work.

"It is too small a group to bring

## Hadassah Delegates Stream Into Chicago To Attend Convention

CHICAGO, Ill., Oct. 21—Hundreds of delegates from all parts of the nation are streaming into this city to attend the nineteenth annual convention of Hadassah, Women's Zionist Organization of America. The immediate objective of the convention agenda is the establishment of the Hadassah-Hebrew University Medical School which is to be erected in Jerusalem.

The convention formally opens tomorrow morning when Mayor Kelly will deliver the welcoming address. In the afternoon the discussion will be concerned chiefly with the relations of the Hadassah with the parent Zionist organization, and a lively debate is anticipated.

Among the arrivals yesterday was a Boston delegation of more than 200 women led by Mrs. Lewis Goldberg, and the large New York City delegation which came by special train.

A social gathering this afternoon attended by many of the Hadassah women featured a celebration of the Oneg Shabbath, a joyous festival in observance of the Sabbath, which was conceived by Chaim Nachman Bialik, Hebrew poet. The Chicago chapter of Hadassah is famous for its presentation of the performance.

About 500 persons attended an informal kosher supper served in the Tel Aviv Restaurant here last night.

Mrs. Samuel W. Halperin, national president, will speak on the subject "Seeing Palestine Through Hadassah" over a national N.B.C. network Monday afternoon at 1:45 P.M., Central Standard time (2:45 New York time).

About 2,000 persons are expected to attend the convention which will continue until Wednesday. The sessions are to be held in the Palmer House in Chicago.

The program of the convention includes a tea to be held in honor of the delegates at the "Century of Progress" fair when they will be guests of the State of Illinois. Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, of the Free Synagogue, New York, will speak Monday evening on "Germany and the World Crisis in Judaism." A banquet will be tendered the delegates following its final session at which Rabbi Solomon Goldstein, one of the creators of "The Romance of A People" and vice-president of the Zionist Organization of America, will speak.

## Charges Nazis Here Using Threats to Halt Production Of "Mad Dog of Europe"

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Oct. 21—Charging that an attempt is being made to stop the production of the cinema, "The Mad Dog of Europe" by intimidating the Hays organization and other producers, Al Rose, a Hollywood arts representative and spokesman for the March of Time Productions, in an interview with a representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, said he bitterly resents the interference of Reich officials.

"I have it on good authority," said Mr. Rose, "that the Hays organization was approached by representatives of Dr. Luther and of Dr. Gysling of Los Angeles to use its influence with the producers in Hollywood to make me stop the production of 'The Mad Dog of Europe'. But I shall go ahead nevertheless."

"The German officials have intimated that the property of the large Hollywood producers in Germany would be confiscated and further American pictures would not be imported into Germany," continued Mr. Rose, "unless they use their influence and pressure upon me to make me withdraw this film. Most of these large producers are Jewish firms, and they call themselves Jews."

"This picture, with the shots of actual scenes taken in Germany on the day of the Jewish boycott, and with authenticated and authoritative representation of the oppression, and cruelty of the Nazis against the Jews and other minority races, and

## Anti-Swastika Rioters Convicted in Milwaukee

MILWAUKEE, Oct. 21—Despite a refusal by the city attorney to prosecute, District Judge George E. Page yesterday found 16 radicals guilty of disorderly conduct for participating in a demonstration against Hitlerism during the visit of Dr. Hans Luther, German Ambassador. Page fined each \$25 and costs.

Judge Page convicted the 16 after appointing a prosecutor of his own, a move that has been challenged as illegal usurpation of power by the city attorney. This action will be the target of legal attacks on an appeal to higher courts, counsel for the radicals declared.

The arrest and conviction of the demonstrators have stirred widespread bitterness among Socialists and liberals who see an incalculable suppression of the right of free assemblage.

America into line with the accomplishments of the other countries of the world in the Hechalutz movement," said Eliezer Galili, member of the executive of the Histadruth in Palestine and now in charge of the Hechalutz work in the United States. "But as a beginning it is an encouraging sign. Small as the group is, it is paving the way for a larger immigration of American chalutzim into Palestine. Their experience in Palestine will bring many other Americans, I am sure.

"They are chalutzim doubly—chalutzim in that they will share in the building of Palestine, and also in the sense that they are the vanguard of many American chalutzim."

## Reception for Eckener Is Favored in Miami

MIAMI, Fla., Oct. 21—Public opinion here has firmly expressed its opposition to the campaign being carried on here by Ellard G. Kahn Miami Jewish editor and publisher, who is campaigning against welcoming the Graf Zeppelin into the United States.

The significance of Mr. Kahn's efforts to have the city ignore Dr. Hugo Eckener, commanding the German airship, is as a protest against the Hitler anti-Jewish atrocities.

The Miami Herald said in an editorial which was generally considered as having the support of Jews here:

"Because Hitler behaves like a boor is certainly no good reason for the people of free United States doing the same. The Germans under Hitler insulted Albert Einstein, although he had nothing to do with the German government except do credit to the nation. Would it be any better for the people of Miami and Florida to insult Dr. Eckener, the foremost dirigible flyer in the world, simply because he has come from breathing the same air with Hitler?"

unpopular political parties and religions, will visualize to the world what is actually being done.

"They say that if my picture is produced, the Jews in Germany will be harmed. Any normally informed American knows that the Jews in Germany have suffered exile, imprisonment, brutality, denial of the privilege of earning their living, and are not infrequently executed. Could a race thus outraged be inflicted with newer or greater outrages? The press is full of the stories of Nazi brutality. Have these organs created any greater outrage upon the German Jews by printing these stories? Then why should they object when we are going to visualize the actual scenes before the American public?"

"Without having seen the manuscript; without, indeed, having asked to see it, friends and adherents of Hitler have accused me of vicious intentions. However, it strikes me that the loyal Hitlerites insult their leader by their objections to the picture. By their objections they acknowledge that a filmed record of the German Chancellor's career is a record of shame. That is there insistence, not mine.

"Biographies are lives, not written, and if the Chancellor's followers in America do not like our story, let them address their protests to Adolf Hitler. He is the author."

## Asks Gov't to Provide Kosher Meat for Needy

LYNN, Mass., Oct. 21—The Federal Government does not want destitute Jewish people to violate the tenets of their religion by eating pork. Samuel G. Vack, secretary of the Lynn Jewish Civic League, declared in protesting against the kind of provisions supplied for relief purposes here by the government.

A shipment of 32,000 pounds of pork has been received for distribution to the city's needy from the Federal Emergency Relief Administration. The other meats supplied were ham and bacon.

Vack, in his protest to Joseph Cole, Lynn welfare secretary, asked that kosher beef be substituted for part of the shipment.

The provisions have been stored at the Lynn city hall, which will be the "butcher shop" for the needy families of this city.

plications and exhorting the public to "finish the German Jews as Germany has done with the communists."

"Our country cannot practice mercy to the Jews," the paper states, describing the Jews as "our sworn enemies."

As an unprecedented provocation, the paper asserts that German Jews meet in their temples and synagogues to work out all kinds of plans against Germany. It charges that Jews are financing the entire anti-German propaganda flow abroad and warns the Jews that the day is approaching when even the state will be helpless to protect them.

The Saar authorities, who are under the direction of the League of Nations Saar Basin commission, banned the publication "to maintain public security."

## Jewish Telegraphic Agency Establishes Prague Bureau

A news-gathering and distributing bureau has been established in Prague, Czechoslovakia, by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, according to an announcement from the main office of the news service here. The bureau will supply news to Central European newspapers receiving the Jewish Telegraphic Agency service. The bureau will be managed by Michael Wurmbrand.

The Jewish Telegraphic Agency now maintains bureaus in London, Paris, Berlin, Prague, Warsaw and Jerusalem as well as correspondents in every Jewish population center.
