Cerman-American Conference Votes to Protest Boycott Backs German Day Plans

With no Tewish delegate attending the meeting, the German American Conference, the largest and most powerful German-American group in the United States, on Wednesday night "unanimously" "unanimously" voted to protest the boycott of German goods in the United States. take action against anti-German propaganda, and support the Steu-ben Society's projected celebration of German Day in Madison Square Garden on December 6.

Spokesmen for the German American Conference described the proceedings as being adopted unanimously by the twenty-three federations composing the conference, despite the fact that Robert Rosenbaum, delegate from the German Jewish Federation, did not attend and hence had no opportunity to vote

After a stormy session which ex-tended into the early morning tended into the earry morning in was remainly scattering that a letter of protest against the boycott would be drawn up within the next few days and published in American papers.

Efforts will be made to bring into the anti-boycott protest every unattached German verein and every American of German descent. Written Statement

(Tewish Telegraphic Agency) IERUSALEM, Nov. 2-Low flying planes of the Royal Flying Corps today scattered crowds of Bedouins, nomadic Arab tribesmen, marching towards Tulkarem and Wadi Hawareth, the latter a terri-tory of the Jewish National Fund. The Bedouins had intended to join in a demonstration against Iewish

Arab-Jewish Round-Table Parley to Be Held Scon (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Nov. 2-The sensational Berlin paper, the Achtuhrabendblatt. features a telephone conversation with the commandant of the Palestine police, allegedly disclosing that the Palestine government contemplates a round-table conference between the Arabs and the Jews, under government management to set-

tle the present outbreaks.

The Palestine police commandant, according to the paper, expressed the fear that Friday may see a renewal of the disturbances, when the Moslems leave the Mosques after mid-day prayers. He added, how-ever, that today's rains throughout the country have been of the greatest help to the police in suppressing the uprising. World Conference Work Gratifies Jewish Leaders: Rasis of Wider Effort Seen

(Tewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON, Nov. 2—General satisfaction with the achievements of the world conference for the relief of German Jews which concluded here last night, was felt today by Jewish leaders here. The air of doubt which surrounded the opening of the conference in which forty-five of conterence in which forty-live of the most important Jewish organiza-tions of Europe and the United States participated, was completely dissipated to be replaced by a strong optimism over the potential possibilities for determined action resulting from the conference's accom-plishments and the almost unprecedented united Jewish cooperation.

Dr. Chaim Weizmann, head of the

Zionist campaign for the relief of German Jews by settlement in Palestine indicated that the conference just terminated had laid the gound-work for greater activity in behalf of the German Tews and would be followed by other parleys, although admitting that for the present, ac-tivities would be limited solely to relief. Nevertheless, he pointed out, in the long run, charity is not the solution of present Jewish problems.

to the Nazi government.

"American citizens of German extraction," the statement continued, "constituting twenty-four percent of the population of this country, have created a record in achievements unexcelled by other nationalities.

"It is further declared that recently immigrated members of the organization have also come here with the intention of becoming citizens in the future and making similar contributions to their adopted land.

To Meet Monday

After heated argument, the Ger-man-American Conference decided to "get behind the German Day celebration under the auspices of the Steuben Society one hundred percent." Members of the various federations will meet on Monday night in the Teutonia Hall to perfect plans for the fete. It was stated on Wednesday night by mem-bers of the United German Societies, whose plans for a German Day celebration were curtailed when Mayor O'Brien suspended the affair "in the interests of peace and order", that their organization would support the celebration under the auspices of the Steuben Society.

"Of course Ambassador Hans Luther will speak at the new celebration," one member of the United German Societies declared at the conference meeting, "otherwise we never should have consented to have the day sponsored by the Steuben Society." The speech by Hitler's emissary to Washington and consequent swastika displaying ceremonies were considered by the mayor as provocation which might lead "to serious disorder and perhaps loss of life."

The decision to sponsor the new German Day festivity was rendered by the Steuben Society late Wed-nesday afternoon, when Gustav W. M. Wieboldt, chairman of the society's German Day committee, announced that all German-American groups would be asked to take part and the general public is invited

The Steuben Society move is seen as a strategic manoeuver, coming, as it does, at a time when the United German Societies, traditional spon-sors of the affair, has been rendered powerless. During recent months, professional Nazi agents have as-sumed control of the Friends of New Germany organization, which in turn, by virtue of a huge inflation of membership, has succeeded in commandeering the United Ger-man Societies. Four Jewish and eight non-Jewish organizations have withdrawn from the United German Societies; the Nazi agents in charge of the organization have fled to Ger-many before federal investigation of their activities; and other American leaders, notably Rev. Wm. Popcke, ti-German boycott will be prepared former chairman of the United German Societies, and Dr. I. T. Griebl resigned president of the League of Friends of New Germany, have quit their posts.

The United German Societies at the Wednesday meeting sued for a united German front in the matter of the German Day celebration. "The younger elements", those who have recently come here from Germany, received the support of the conference.

The anti-boycott protest, it is believed, will closely resemble that of the Board of Trade for German-American Commerce, which was forwarded on Tuesday to President Roosevelt.

To Study Child Care Agencies Here to Introduce Methods For German-Jewish Children (Tewish Daily Bulletin)

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 2-A committee of four outstanding social workers will apply itself at once to a thorough study of the absorptive capacity of the various Jewish child caring agencies in this country with a view to ameliorating conditions along these lines among the Jewish child population of Germany, according to an announcement made through the Jewish Telegraphic Agency by Dr. Jacob Billikopf, ex-ecutive director of the local Federa-

This action was taken following conversations Dr. Billikopf had with leaders of German Jewry when he visited that country last summer and extensive correspondence since.

The first task of the committee will be to ascertain how many of these children can be absorbed in the existing American institutions. This will be followed by recommendations for additional placements.

The report of this committee, together with its recommendations. will be submitted to the Toint Distribution Committee for approval.

The committee named by Dr. Billikopf includes: Dr. Solomon Lowenstein, executive director of the Federation of Jewish Philanthropic Societies, and chairman of the Joint Committee on Child Caring, New Commutee on Child Caring, New York City; Harry L. Lurie, director, Bureau of Jewish Social Research, New York; Dr. Maurice J. Karpf, director of the Training School for Jewish Social Workers, New York; Dr. I. M. Rubinow, national secretary of B'nai B'rith, Cincinnati.

Newark Kosher Poultry

Workers' Strike Ended (Jewish Daily Bulletin) NEWARK, N. J., Nov. 2 -

Slaughterers, pluckers and other workers in local kosher poultry markets have returned to work, ending a strike that was marked by some violence since its inception last Thursday.

The NRA apparently is to be a deciding factor in the controversy between poultry dealers and the workers. A conference between members of the state NRA board and representatives of the workers and dealers resulted in a decision to stop the strike temporarily until the NRA mediation board could work out a satisfactory wage and hour scale.

This was said to be the first time since the NRA program went into effect in New Jersey that labor troubles were settled by the NRA board through arbitration.

Nazis Seize Control of Ulistein Publishing House

BERLIN, Nov. 2-Another step in the "gleichsgeschaltung" or coordination of the German press was taken here today with the with-drawal of the Ullstein family control from the Ullstein Publishing Company, the largest publishing concern in Germany. The Ullstein concern in Germany. The Ullstein firm not only published four daily papers, a number of weekly papers and a group of monthly magazines, but also published books, including the works of Feuchtwanger and Remarque, and ran a travel bureau besides.

Franz Ullstein remains on the governing hoard of the concern with eight Aryan colleagues and Karl Ullstein will be one of the five ex-ecutive directors of the concern, the other four being Aryans.

Most of the Ullstein family stock in the concern is to be made nonvoting stock and the voting stock that the Ullsteins still own will be neutralized by the inclusion of outside capital.

The Ullstein Company was founded in 1877 by Leopold Ullstein.

McDonald Sails Tomorrow

James G. McDonald, high commissioner of the refugee commission created by the League of Nations. will sail for Europe, tomorrow, on the Ile de France, he announced yesterday at the national headquarters of the Foreign Policy Association. Mr. McDonald has tendered his resignation as president of the Association but will continue as a member of the board of directors.

Will Recognize Jews as National Minority When Isolated in Reich Territory (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Nov. 2—The Jews of German government as a national German government as a national minority when they are isolated in a special territory within Germany, Alfred Rosenberg, foreign minister of the Nazi party, declared in ad-dressing an election meeting of Nazi youth in Berlin.

The fight against Germany abroad is being instigated only by the Jews, Rosenberg maintained, bitterly at-tacking the League of Nations for dealing with the Jewish question.

The Angriff, leading Nazi daily, of which Dr. Goebbels, the propaganda chief, is one of the editors, declared in an editorial today that no matter what results the Jewish agitation against Germany may bring, they will not induce Germany to change her attitude to the Jews.

Events in Palestine are being used by the Nazi press for anti-Jewish agitation in Germany and in proving that the Nazis are justified in forcing the Jews out of Germany. The Voelkischer Beobachter de-

clared that the events in Palestine best prove that the Jews are parasites and warns England against a Moslem uprising which may spread as far as India, according to the

The Berliner Tageblatt, in an editorial, expressed the original view that since the United States and the leading European countries have taken an interest in the Jewish problem by cooperating in the appointment of the high commissioner for refugees, it would have been logical for them to give the new high commissioner the power to investigate the possibility of Tewish immigration into Palestine.

Included in the bequests are \$250,-000 to the Federation for the Sunport of Jewish Philanthropic Societies; \$150,000 to the Jewish Theolo-gicla Seminary Library; \$125,000 to the Solomon and Betty Loeb Memorial House for Convalescents and \$50,000 to the Henry Street Settle-ment; Tuskegee Normal and Industrial Institution of Alabama, the Auxiliary of the Montefiore Home and the Y.W.H.A. of New York City, \$10,000 each.

of the conference. Among the speakers were Chief Rabbi Angelo Sacerdoti of Rome, who sharply attacked Nazism as a misconception of Fascism. The latter seeks the unity of all citizens while the former sought to create divisions, he pointed out. Rabbi Lewin, speaking in behalf of the Agudath Israel. orthodox Jewish organization, ac-claimed the conference work and Berl Katzenelson, Zionist labor leader, speaking in behalf of the Vaad Leumi, lewish National Council of Palestine, in a striking ad-dress, stressed the importance of Palestine in any scheme as the only country not only able to offer fromcial assistance to refugees, but also to offer them shelter and means of livelihood. Other sneakers at the closing session included representatives of the Swiss Jewish communi-ties, the Polish Zionists, and D. Cohen, representing Dutch Jewry. In addition to a plan of organiza-

tion for coordinating relief activities and ensuring the cooperation of Jewish agencies in the various countries in their relief efforts the conference resolved to recommend to the British government the appointment of Lord Robert Cecil, noted statesman, as British member of the autonomous governing body being set up by the League of Nations to direct the relief work on an international scale. Lord Robert's name had been mentioned for the high commissionership to which James G. McDonald of New York was apnointed, and more recently, for chairman of the governing body.

Hit-ler expressed joy over the report made by Neville Laski, president of the Board of Denuties of British Jews, that there are over 60,000 German refugees in exile in various countries. "It was a great relief for us to

learn about the large number of refugees," said Hitler, declaring that he hoped that the number would soon be increased considerably.

The German Chancellor repeated his oft-expressed condemnation of the refugees, who, he said, were criminals. He pointed out that the Nazi party was not persecuting poli-tical opponents of Nazism, but on
