

Thus it is clear to anyone that the friction between Jews and non-Jews, here and abroad, is certainly no the same as that which exists between Catholics and Protestants. Why then, in Heaven's name, are they Protestants. Why then, in Heaven's name, are they grouped together, thereby roiling and muddying the problem? It is equally clear that the principle cause of anti-Semitism in the modern world is not the religion of the Jew. Why then put the discussion upon that plane? Why approach this intricate economic, racial and social problem from the naive angle orlegious toleration and why send ministers of religions.

to discuss it and to enlighten men about it?

"The outbreak of intolerance abroad" was not due to any recent increase in religious bigotry or to any new discovery that Judaism was not a good religion Nor is the spread of anti-Semitism in this country

Why not face the problem for what it really is, an economic and racial problem; and if tours for propaganda are desirable, why not send in place of clergymen, noted economists and ethnologists, sociologists and professors of ethnic psychology to expose gists and professors of ethnic psychology to expose the new victous race myth, the horrible blood cult, which is now leading captive the minds of youth in so many countries, and to inform men concerning the true reasons for the abnormal and unbalanced eco-nomic satus of the Jew in the world and what can be done about it.

A Good Will tour which "means business" will pro-

ject into the arena of discussion the whole ghastly problem of the economic ghettotizing of the American Jew. To this discussion should be invited the leaders of American industry, heads of corporations, banks, public utilities and men who stand at the head of the professions and the educational institutions of our country

American non-Jews should be made keenly aware of the increasing difficulties which Jewish men and women are encountering in trying to earn a living in the trades and the professions and of the corollary to this economic isolation and frustration-the intensification of that very unrest and radicalism among our people which feed the flames of anti-Semitism. There is very little that is theological about all this and there is very little that theologians can do about it.

Any movement which attempts to localize the Jewish problem, to confine it to its religious phase and to utter no word of criticism or indignation when Jewish life is being assaulted in other parts of the world consigns itself to utter futility and irrelevance in the world of hard; realities in which we live.

It is no more a Zionist defeat than it is an anti-Zionist victory. The fact is so long as the Arabs and the Jews are to be pitted against each other as a battledore and shuttlecock by political intriguers, so long will there be spora-

Palestine is the only country in the world which
not only balanced its budget but actually has a surplus. What a joy for Mr. Woodin, for instance, if he
could say the same for the United States or Herr
Nazi Schacht, for Germany, or M. Daladier. Think
of the United States Treasury issuing a statement to the world that its books are balanced and that it will not be necessary to borrow money to keep going will not be necessary to borrow money to keep going and that money is in the till to devote to other pur-poses. Mr. Chamberlain, British Chancellor of the Exchequer, almost reached these Utopian fields, but at what cost. We in England are still paying five shillings on the pound income tax which is one-quarter of one's income, to say nothing of the additional tax on incomes over ten thousand dollars yearly.

Well, these interesting people in Palestine have done it with the brains, initiative and courage so charac-teristic of Tews fully astended. teristic of Jews fully extended. There is no reason why Palestine should not become like ancient Mesopotamia, a land of milk and honey, a sort of terrestial paradisc

But these rosy prospects have nothing to do with the duty of Jews throughout the world which is to do what they can to rehabilitate a much harassed race. Closer union is essential. Quarrels between factions so dear to the heart of Jewry, must disappear. The trouble with the Tews as I have found since my shor more intimate acquaintance, is that there is too much

individual effort and not enough team-work. I wonder if it is a curse on the race that they are all so quick-witted and resilent of mind that they cannot unresistingly accept leadership and follow uncomplainingly and without criticism. I admit that this criticism is frequently just and sound and wise but "pull Devil, pull Baker," never gets us anywhere.

What we want in Jewry is a definite, uncompromising leadership and its definite, uncompromising obedience. Let us have a grand merger of ideas and organizations, one ideal and, if I may follow the precepts of Tammany, one boss. Do that and the sun will shine on Jewry not only in Palestine, but in Pittsbugh, Prague, Petrograd and Pawtucket.

I have just conversed with a rich Jew who thinks, perhaps rightly, that he has been euchred out of a few hundred pounds by another Jew with whom he was associated in a publication devoted to Jewry. I have been trying to explain to him that the publicity ensuing from the cheap little quarrel between men actuated by high motives in promoting the cause of their race will inevitably reflect on the Jews as a whole and all his work in the past would be nullified by the evil effects of the publicity ensuing from the Is 1929 so far behind us?

All he could reply was that he wanted his rights. I answered, Shylock said something like that, via Shakespeare, and his attitude never in all these generations helped the cause of the Jews. I think I finally convinced him and I merely relate this little incident as an object lesson of the necessity for pulling together and showing the world a solid, unbreakable front.

A friend of mine has just come back from a visit to Germany, where he has two brothers, who intend to remain there, though they are not very happy, because they have tried going elsewhere, and found it still worse. It is not a pleasant picture we get of the plight of the refugees in the various countries. And peo-ple are getting tired of lavishing sympathy on them. The novelty of it has gone. It is becoming-hum-drum. The volunteer workers in the relief organizations who were at irst enthusiastic about their new infirst enthusiastic about then accom-ferest, are no longer so assiduous in their attendance, and the work is left to the paid clerks, whom the distress of the refugees has pro-ided with jobs. There is already a great deal of dissatisfaction in th countries to which the refugees lemonstrations in some of them gainst the German refugees.

The Governments are becoming nxious about the problem. And rate rings of the problem in Ger-many has not been touched. Not a tithe of the Jews of Germany have been drawn off. The great mass of bem are still in Germany. Neither Palestine nor any other country is able to absorb them. We shall only the to absorb them. We shall only be deluding ourselves if we think they will. The fund-raising organi-ations have almost exhausted their ossibilities

Where are the German Jews to go? Who will admit them? Amer-ica? England? Palestine? In spite of all the noise being made about Palestine as the sole salva-tion of German Jewry, in spite of Dr. Weizmann's appointment as High Commissioner for German Jewish settlement in Palestine, can Palestine take 600.000 German Jews this year, next year, ever? Can it take 100.000? Even if the funds are available? Will the absorptive capacity of the country permit it? Will the British Government allow it? Will the Arabs be acquiescent?

What does the Jewish immigration organization, Hias, say? "Palestine can absorb only a small number. The refugees must go elsewhere. That is our principal job," says Mr. Telsey, the special Commissioner of the Hias for investigating the situation in Germany and the adjoining countries.
