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Polish Anti-Semites'

Resentment of Exiles Parliament Debate

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

WARSAW, Poland, Nov. 4.—An important debate on the Jewish question took place today on the opening of the Polish Sejm or parliament, after an adjournment of seven months.

Professor Rybarski, leader of the nationalistic, anti-Semitic National Democrat "Endek" party, which is in opposition to the Pilsudski government, severely attacked the government policy on the German Jewish question. He declared that even during the present crisis, Jews are still living better than the non-Jews. It is impossible to convert Poland into a refuge for Jews, Professor Rybarski declared, when even a philo-Semite country like the United States does not admit German Jewish refugees. He stated that although he esteems the Jewish people, he cannot permit a foreign race to penetrate Polish life.

The anti-government peasant leader, Rog, declared that while he recognizes the crime that has been committed against the German Jews, and while Poland would never follow the Nazi example, nevertheless, he cannot understand the Jewish policy of fighting against the Nazi dictatorship, while supporting the Polish dictatorship of Marshal Pilsudski.

Deputy Joshua Thon, Polish Zionist and rabbi of the Cracow Jewish community and long a member of the Polish parliament, derided the

Riga Bars Referendum

Move Against Jews' Rights

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

RIGA, Latvia, Nov. 4.—The Riga municipality declined today to open a bureau for collecting signatures for the proposed anti-Jewish referendum.

The Riga Nazis had proposed that all Jews be deprived of their citizenship rights; that no licenses be issued to Jewish merchants, and that there be a prohibition of all marriages between Jews and Christians. The Latvian Nazis also wanted to prohibit the treatment of Jewish patients by non-Jewish doctors.

Steuben Society Asks

Immigration Committee To Disavow Dickstein

A resolution calling upon members of the Congressional Committee on Immigration to disavow statements attributed to Representative Samuel Dickstein, chairman of the committee was adopted Saturday by the National Council of the Steuben Society of America.

Charging that Representative Dickstein had "sought out the German people for persecution," the resolution authorized the law committee of the Steuben Society to undertake the defense of any alien "who may be unjustly threatened with deportation."

The defense of naturalized citizens who may be threatened with cancellation of their privileges also was authorized by the resolution.

First New York Rally

Of Silver Shirts Fails, Speakers Don't Speak

Although their meeting proved to be a failure, the Silver Shirts indicated in their first public demonstration in New York held at the Kreuzer Halle on East 86th Street Friday night that they would present a united front with Nazi elements in this city and forecast possible unity among all Fascist organizations operating in this area. Members of the League of Friends of New Germany attended the first assembly.

The presence of detectives from the alien squad discouraged speakers from assuming the rostrum and the meeting broke up after an audience of approximately 100 men had waited vainly for someone to call the meeting to order.

Indicating the common vein of sympathy experienced by the American Nazi organization and the Silver Shirts, a revitalized type of Ku Klux Klan under the direction of William Dudley Pelley of Asheville, North Carolina, it was disclosed by the management of Kreuzer Halle that the League of Friends of New Germany had donated their hall, normally occupied for regular Fri-

Dr. L. Tietz Dead at 37,

Leader in Social Work Among German Jews

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Nov. 4.—Dr. Ludwig Tietz, brilliant young leader of German Jewry who has been in the forefront in all efforts of German Jews in their own behalf since the Hitler regime began a drive on Jews in the Reich, died here suddenly this morning at the age of 37. Death was due to a hemorrhage. Dr. Tietz was a member of the executive board of the Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith and was executive director of the Central Committee of German Jews for Relief and Rehabilitation, the organization formed to put German Jewish relief work on a nation-wide, coordinated basis and to supervise the work within the country.

Although he was a well-known medical specialist, Dr. Tietz had practically given up his profession to devote himself entirely to Jewish social work without remuneration. After the Hitler revolution, he became one of the most popular Jewish figures in Germany and was highly esteemed by British and American leaders in relief activities who had come into close contact with him.

Dr. Tietz was one of the twenty Jewish leaders attending the conference to plan relief measures for destitute German Jews in Berlin on June 20 who were arrested by Nazi storm troopers and mishandled by them. Political police secured the release of all the men but only after

The Verband was formed last night in the presence of government authorities, Nazi press representatives and representatives of the Catholic and Evangelical churches.

The newly formed organization aims to speak for some 6,000,000

Dickstein ridiculed charges made by

"I can't be bothered with such
nonsense."

Thus Representative Samuel Dick-
stein, chairman of the House Com-
mittee on Immigration and investi-
gator of Nazi affairs in the United
States, commented on reports that
Mrs. Maria Griebel had demanded in
a note to President Roosevelt that
a Gentile head the investigatory
body.

Mr. Dickstein refused to comment
further on the report when pressed
for his attitude toward Frau Griebel's
representation.

Before the federal grand jury last
Thursday Mrs. Griebel declared she
would refuse to give testimony on
Nazi affairs to a Jewish district at-
torney or Jewish judges, and she re-
fused to take her oath on the Holy
Bible, "which is based upon the old
Jewish testament."

She is the wife of Dr. Ignatz T.
Griebel, resigned leader of the Friends
of New Germany, and hostess to
Heinz Spanknoebel during the Nazi
agent's stay in New York.

Mrs. Griebel wrote as follows to
the president: "We believe that
Congressman Dickstein as a Jew
under the current adverse circum-
stances can not give tolerance and
justice in his conclusions; and I
therefore ask you to withdraw him
as chairman of the committee and
in his place substitute a neutral re-
presentative of the people, preferably
an Aryan American."

day night meetings, to the Silver
Shirts.

Mostly Germans Present

Approximately 90 percent
of those attending last night's meeting
spoke German. Among them one
recognized many faces familiar at
meetings of the League of Friends
of New Germany. Side by side, an
American newspaper vendor and a
young German sold copies of Amer-
ika's Deutsche Post, Nazi organ
published in New York, and Libera-
tion, the official Silver Shirt publi-
cation edited and owned by Pelley in
North Carolina. Both carried scur-
rilous attacks on Jews and Com-
munists, frequently identifying the
two as one and the same.

For fully an hour the audience
awaited speakers who were to relate
the community of purpose of the
Silver Shirt movement in the United
States and the Nazi movement in
Germany and the United States.

The assembly grew restive as 9
o'clock neared; and rumors filtered
into the room indicating that
"Lafayette," "Eberhardt," and others
cited as speakers had gone to a near-
by political rally.

A news photographer announced
his presence with attempts to shoot
flashlight pictures. The assembly
objected; and members of the
audience were on the verge of
throwing the photographer out
when members of the alien squad
of the city police came to his rescue.
Other police put in an appearance.
The audience edged out of the hall,
and the lights went out.

Lack of Planning Shown

The first thrust here of the Silver
Shirt movement which has rapidly
developed in the South and Mid-
West was weak and abortive. The
Friday night meeting indicated lack
of organization and planning.

Only a handful of persons knew
of the meeting. It was first sched-
uled for the Turn Halle, but was
shunted to the Kreuzer Hall when
arrangements were made to hold a
political rally there. A hundred or
more came to the Turn Halle and
were unable either to find members
of the Silver Shirts or to learn
where the meeting was being held.

It is understood that a Silver
Shirt meeting will be held again in
the near future with wider publicity
given it to lure more prospective ad-
herents to the Pelley ranks. The
groundwork has been laid for the
creation of a New York branch of
Silver Shirts during the last few
weeks.

Call to "True" Christians
At meetings of the United German

Societies and other organizations be-
lieved to have been brought under
the Hitler spell, Silver Shirt
pamphlets have been distributed with
reckless profuseness. They repre-
sent the first call of the group to
"true Christians" in a fight to over-
come the "Jewish international net-
work".

The pamphlet describes a plague
germ allegedly in the possession of
Jewish Communists throughout the
world, a pestilence of hoof and
mouth disease controlled and ready
for unloosing by the same elements,
fatal disease germs ready for inser-
tion into canned goods on the Pacific
Coast — all of which will be turned
loose at the appointed moment to
wreak Communist vengeance on
Americans. Liberation reckons
there are 15,000,000 Reds in the
United States waiting for the signal.

"The only man in Europe who
correctly understands the tie-up be-
tween Communism and the pre-
datory elements among the Hebrews
is Hitler," the pamphlet warns. In
the same category, Pelley declares
that everybody, excepting himself, in
the United States is out of step.

The pamphlet attributes Senator
Morrow's death to the aftermath
of a Jewish banquet, the world de-
pression and rise of Communism to
the tyranny of Jewish bankers, and
other unpleasant events to Jewish
sources.

Will Save America

"Do you know that right here in
America there is already such a pre-
ventive and protective militia, long
working under cover, called The Sil-
ver Shirts, and that its representa-
tives in 46 of our 48 American states
are fully apprised of these facts, and
more, some of which would prevent
you sleeping soundly tonight?" the
pamphlet asks.

It further demands, "Do you
know that this strictly Christian
Militia, The Silver Shirts of Amer-
ica, means to save America as Mus-
solini and his blackshirts saved
Italy, and Hitler and his brown-
shirts saved Germany. . . ."

The pamphlet reveals information
to the effect that "in 25 states the
military plan of operation, together
with recruiting, is proceeding swift-
ly."

All persons over 18 years of age
"of reasonably sound health and not
afraid to risk life and limb for the
country" are asked by the pamphlet
to take "the Oath of Consecration
and step out as a True Christian
Soldier, garbed in a shirt of Silver,
with the great scarlet L emblazoned
on the banner and over the heart,
standing for Love, Loyalty, and Lib-
eration."

Hitlerites Among German-Austrian War Veterans in N. J. Roundly Scored

UNION CITY, N. J., Nov. 4.—Hitlerites within the ranks of the German-Austrian war veterans association were roundly scored here at an election meeting of the association attended by unit representatives of three leading counties in New Jersey and New York.

Agin Hammer, of the German Legion of New York, in criticizing George Ganss of Newark, former president of the association who resigned, pointed out that the latter had introduced Heinz Spanknoebel, American Nazi leader, now a fugitive from justice, at the last board meeting of the veterans' association and that since then the Nazi leader had tried to bring the war veterans under his influence and that of his alleged associate, Dr. Ignatz T. Griebel.

Bert Cohr, also of the New York German Legion, in answering charges made by various representatives that the respective organizations had failed to protest against the boycott of German goods and against the "slurs hurled at the country of our birth" questioned the honest intention of those who had "attempted to utilize the German veterans association as a political tool. Neither Spanknoebel nor Dr. Griebel is part of the element that really could do honor to our old country. That must be left to others with a clear

Eviction from Latvia of New York Newspaperman

RIGA, Latvia, Nov. 4.—Jacob Leschinsky, correspondent of The New York Jewish Daily Forward, has been ordered expelled from Latvia for writing anti-Nazi articles, according to The Rigasche Rundschau, a pro-Nazi newspaper.

Leschinsky, who is a Lithuanian citizen and was expelled from Berlin last spring by the Nazis, was ordered to leave the country immediately by the Minister of the Interior, says the Rigasche Rundschau. Subsequently, however, the expulsion was postponed for the fortnight.

The newspaper emphasizes that the government measure should provide a lesson of warning to other journalists who are writing articles purporting to incite sentiment against Germany.

No word of the reported order of expulsion of its correspondent from Latvia has been received by the newspaper, it was declared here yesterday.

Zionists and Refugee Aid Groups Represented at Funeral of Paul Painleve

PARIS, Nov. 4.—A considerable number of delegations of Jewish organizations attended the funeral today of Paul Painleve, French statesman and mathematician, who died Sunday.

A number of representatives of Zionist organizations, soldiers' unions and the Committee for the Defense of Jewish Refugees, of which M. Painleve was the president, attended the rites. Many flags and banners were in evidence.

Hudson County Jury Indicts Gross, Anti-Semite, for Libel

JERSEY CITY, N. J., Nov. 4.—The Hudson County Grand Jury has returned an indictment against the Rev. Francis Gross of Perth Amboy on the charge of criminal libel, it was revealed today. Mr. Gross is being sought under a warrant for his arrest issued here Tuesday, and will be tried during the latter part of the month.

According to J. George Fredman, counsel for Samuel Untermeyer, who started action against Gross for libel contained in anti-Jewish pamphlets circulated in the mails, until Gross is apprehended he is classified as a fugitive from justice.

Mr. Untermeyer will cross-examine Gross when the latter comes to trial in order to determine whether the clergyman who has not been connected with a parish for several years is an agent of the Nazis.

The statements published by Gross defamed the Jewish people and scourged Mr. Untermeyer and other officials. One of the pamphlets held up the Jews to ridicule and pleaded for widespread mobilization of anti-Semitic forces.

Berlin U. Alone Fired 117 Jewish Teachers

BERLIN, Nov. 4.—One hundred and seventeen Jewish professors and instructors were dismissed from the University of Berlin alone, it was officially announced today.

Among those dismissed were 64 members of the medical faculty and 49 teachers in the philosophy faculty.

A Berlin court ruled today that Jews cannot become executors of wills even in cases where the deceased have stated so specifically.

In Breslau, a court ruled that Christians of Jewish descent are not entitled to display the sign "Christian store."

Senor Cohen, Sailing for Montevideo, Tells of Jews' Position in Native Chile

The charge d'affaires of the Chilean legation at Washington, Senor Benjamin Cohen, embarked on the S.S. Santa Barbara Saturday afternoon to attend the Pan-American Conference to be held in Montevideo this month. He is to be the Chilean delegate-at-large.

A few minutes before Senor Cohen sailed he gave an interview to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency. Surrounding the swarthy-skinned South American Jewish statesman was a retinue of colleagues who have returned from a series of talks with President Roosevelt about Pan-American relations.

They were chatting in Spanish. In a great solid mass before the gangplanks of the Santa Barbara were American-made products which are to make up the cargo.

Senor Cohen was happy to talk about the Jews in his country, in fact he wished he had more time so that he might describe in detail one of the oldest Jewish settlements in the Western hemisphere esconced in Chile. The colony is made up of descendants of Spanish-Jews who immigrated three centuries ago. They are a dark-skinned race, said Senor Cohen, and have preserved ancient customs of prayer and dietary regulations. Otherwise they are undistinguishable from their fellows.

Is there much anti-Semitism in South American countries?

Senor Cohen said he didn't want to emphasize the situation which exists, but there is a situation. In

The study of race has been made compulsory in most of the schools in Germany. Pupils must pass examinations in the subject, and it was announced that diplomas would not be granted to those who had not taken the examinations in racial science.

record," the speaker declared. Anton Uhrig, president of the New York German Legion, took what might be regarded as a more conciliatory viewpoint. In describing Griebel as a "fanatic," Uhrig declared that his group adopted the swastika flag not because of any belief in its political significance, but because they felt it was the acknowledged flag of Germany today.

"After all," said Uhrig, "Hitler must be given credit for bringing about a unification of Germany, and he and his government demand equal respect for the stand taken in the war guilt question at Geneva."

A warning to the veterans' association "not to out-Herod, Herod" was voiced by Paul Zillgitt of Queens, New York. Richard H. Krueger, past commander of the Newark unit of the veterans, in reply to previous speakers, was outspoken in denouncing the swastika "as the symbol of a political party and of anti-Semitism, which the Austrian members of the organization were bound to consider as a gross insult to their own loyal feeling to their native country."

The successor to Ganss as president is Fred Obermueller. Dr. Zillgitt was elected first vice-president.

Germans, Christian by belief, but who have been declared non-German by the Nazi government because one of their parents or grandparents was Jewish.

One of the leaders of the newly formed group, Herr Gunther Alexander Katz, a decorated war veteran, declared that "something must be done to make it possible for the millions of non-Aryan Germans, who have been Germans for generations, to serve their deeply beloved fatherland. We are Germans and we want to remain Germans," he said.

"We hold that besides the community of blood there is a community of German nationalism born of a common faith, a common experience and a common feeling."

universities and professional schools there is discrimination, he said, against Jewish students. Likewise there exists to a small degree a kind of aloofness on the part of non-Jewish social leaders.

"There is a strange coldness," he said, "between Jewish families of old standing in the community and newly-immigrated Jews. But I suppose this is to be expected."

Asked whether barriers against immigration are high in the South American nations, Senor Cohen said that they are not more strict than those of any other countries.

He said that German refugees would be welcomed provided they have sufficient capital to save them from depending on State resources. He said that farmers, and not industrial laborers, are always welcome.

Extension Is Urged of Joint Zionist-Temple Membership Bronx Plan

Based on the action of Temple Adath Israel of the Bronx in establishing a new type of membership in the Zionist movement, a special committee, headed by Rabbi Henry A. Schorr of the Temple, will spread the idea among the American Jews. The plan carried out by the Bronx synagogue makes membership in the congregation co-extensive with membership in the Zionist Organization of America. The temple treasurer pays the dues from congregational funds. Details of the plan will be sent to rabbis and congregation boards all over the United States with the plea that this action be followed.

claim advanced by Professor Rybarski that the Jews are wealthy and asked whether Rybarski reached this conclusion because the Jews so generously participated in the national Polish loan, contributing their last pennies.

Rabbi Thon declared that he was proud that the Polish government was championing the historic fight against barbarism and for civilization. He rejected utterly Rybarski's allegation that Poland was flooded with German Jews, pointing out that only 4,500 German Jews, mostly Polish citizens, had sought refuge in Poland out of an estimated total of 65,000 Jewish refugees who fled from Germany.

Not Poland, but Palestine, is the Jewish goal, Rabbi Thon concluded.

His devotion and leadership will be sadly missed in these hard times."

Over Million and Half Raised by Federation

Contributions totalling \$1,673,488 have been received in the first three weeks of the 1933 appeal of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies, it was announced yesterday by Paul Adler and Benjamin J. Buttenwieser, chairmen of the campaign. The appeal expects to raise \$4,200,000 and will continue until the end of the year.

An industrial division of the Federation, to launch the first formal appeal to office and factory workers in all parts of the city, will be organized tonight at a meeting of industrial leaders at the Hotel Commodore.

German-Jewish Relief Fund Now Totals \$1,226,346

A fund totaling \$1,226,346 has been raised to date for the relief of German Jewish refugees under the auspices of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, according to announcement made yesterday by Rabbi Jonah B. Wise, national chairman of the German Relief Fund.

The sum will be used to provide aid to organizations engaged in finding a haven for the refugees, to ameliorate the plight of the Jews who have been deprived of livelihood means in Germany and for other purposes in the same connection.

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
