Jewish Physician Executed. 5 Arrested in Havana Riots On Charge of Firing at Troops (Jowish Telegraphic Agency)

HAVANA, Cuba, Nov. 11-One Jew was killed and five Havana Jews were arrested on the charge of having fired on the military in the course of the fighting between adherents of the Grau San Martin

regime and the revers.

The dead man is Dr. Vasili Tzigrad and a resident of Havana for

the last seven years. The five arrested Iews will be placed on trial before a court-mar-tial. The charge of firing on the

troops has a death penalty.

The French Legation in Havana and the juridical committee of the Havana Jewish community intervened with the authorities to obtain the freedom of the men.

President Grau San Martin in-dignantly denied that prisoners were being executed without trial. "I am no murderer," he said sharply in reply to an inquiry.

"There can be no executions without my signature and I have signed no such orders." The entire Jewish community in

Cuba is living through a period of desperate fear, particularly in view of the agitation against the Jews of Cuba, and the declaration of Jewish community is without means of self-protection.

Anti-Jewish Riots Close Warsaw University (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

WARSAW, Poland, Nov. 11-The University of Warsaw was closed today as a result of anti-Jewish disturbances which broke out in the Polytechnical, Agricultural and Commercial Colleges on the occasion of the anniversary of the death of a Christian student, Wlaclawski, who was killed in the course of anti-Semitic riots in Vilno.

Student members of "Endek", the National Democratic anti-Semitic organization, distributed literature attacking Jews. Entrances to un-dergraduate colleges were barred by sympathizers who persisted in demonstrating their venom by subjecting Jewish students to physical vio-lence. Several were badly beaten.

Polish authorities who appeared on the scene at once ordered the University closed. Recently trouble between Endek students and Jews led to the suspension of classes in various units of the University. The Polish-Jewish newspaper, Naszpreseglad, was seized because of having published an account of

the rioting.

Greek Anti-Semites

Form Political Party (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

SALONICA, Greece, Nov. 11— The anti-Semitic Greek organization, known as "EEE", which was dis-solved by the Greek government some time ago, has now been formed into a political party, openly adopting the Nazi program, in order to obtain the right to exist as a political organization.

Three thousand attended the first "EEE" conference, which concluded with a shout of "Heil Hitler."

Prague Asks Berlin To Surrender Slavers Of Theodor Lessing (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

PRAGUE, Czechoslovakia, Nov. 11

A formal demand was made on Germany today by the Czechslo-vakian government for the surrender of the two murderers of Professor Theodor Lessing, noted philosopher and pacifist, who was slain in the villa he occupied at Marienbad, Czechoslovakia, after his flight from the Nazis in Germany.

Pointing out that the two men, Rudolf Eckert, a German-born Czechoslovakian citizen, and Franz Zischka, were ordinary criminals, the Czechoslovakian government asked for their extradition in accordance with the international extradition treaty. Eckert and Zischka had been

identified with Nazi activities in this country and early came under suspicion in the Lessing case when bloodhounds used by the police fol-lowed the trail of the murderers from the Marienbad villa to Eckert's home in a nearby village

The two men, it was established, fied over the German border, evading a police and border guard dragnet, and were welcomed by Nazi storm-troopers there. According to boasts of Nazi sympathizers in Eckert's village of Schanz, the two fugitives were brought to Nuremberg (Continued on Page 4)

Expelled from Germany by the anti-Semitic orders of the Nazi regime, Prof. Heinz Werner, famous psychologist, will come to the University of Michigan for a year's stay as special lecturer, according to Dr. Alexander Ruthven, president of the University.

Financial arrangements made by the international committee acting in the interest of ousted German scholars and the Rockefeller Institute of New York were responsible for Professor Werner's coming to the University of Michigan.

Warrant Out for Unfrocked Priest (Tewish Daily Bulletin)

JERSEY CITY, N. J., Nov. 11-A warrant for the arrest of Rev. Francis Gross who was indicted by the Hudson County grand jury for criminally libeling Samuel Unterto surrender to answer to the indietment.

A. Leszczynski, counsel for Gross, notified Assistant Prosecutor Irving Eisenberg last week that his client would appear to answer to the charges and the warrant was issued when Gross did not show up. Conviction on charges of criminal libel in this state carries a maximum

penalty of two years imprisonment and a \$500 fine or both. Charges were filed against the former priest by J. George Fredman, attorney for Mr. Untermyer, after Gross had circulated through the

mails a pamphlet allegedly libeling and defaming the noted New York attorney. In bringing the charges, Mr. Fredman declared Gross was a tool of Nazi propaganda agencies. Gross was bereft of his parish in 1921 by Bishop Walsh and is not now officiating at any church of the diocese.

followers recently displayed a swastika banner at a meeting held in Hoboken. Ostensibly the purpose of the gathering had been to commemorate the tenth anniversary of Mussolini's march on Rome, but ad-dresses were delivered by the Meyer retinue denouncing the Jews for projecting a boycott.

For German Jews' Relief

American Tov-Makers See Boycott Benefit To Business in U.S. (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Italian Grant Sets Up Languages Chair At Hebrew University

The Italian Government has made grant to the Hebrew University in Palestine for the purpose of es-tablishing a chair in Romance Lan-guages and Literature, with special emphasis on Italian, according to an announcement received here by the American Friends of the Hebrew University, Dr. A. S. W. Rosenbach, president. Commendatore Mario de Angelis, present Consul-General of Italy in Jerusalem, was instrumental in securing the subsidy from the Italian Government, Dr. Rosenbach stated. Dr. Heinz Pflaum, formerly instructor of Mediaeval Languages and Literatures at the Hebrew University, will be in charge of the new subjects, which will be supplemented by preparatory classes in Italian, under the charge of Dr. A. Verdi, it was announced.

"The action taken by the Italian Government is a most commendable one," Dr. Judah L. Magnes, chancellor of the Hebrew University, said in an address officially accepting the "The fund supplied by the grant. Italian Government for this leetureship has made it possible to introduce a subject at the Hebrew University, the need for which had long been felt. The Hebrew student has thus a new and wonderful window at his disposal through which he can look out on the culture of the modern world."

First Grant of Its Kind

Dr. Rosenbach expressed the Rope that the example set by the Italian Government would be emulated by others. He pointed out that the grant, which is the first that any government has ever made to the University, was in recognition of the high academic standing of the Palestinian institution, as well as an indication of the good-will of the Italian Government towards the Hebrew University.

Latvian Nazis Seek to Injure Jews by Strict Gov't Measures (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

RIGA, Latvia, Nov. 11-The stu-dent council of the Latvian Music Academy today adopted a resolution demanding the introduction of numerus clausus in the Academy violating Jewish civil rights.

Nazi agitation in the Latvian Republic has assumed serious proportions in recent months. Only a few weeks ago, Latvian Nazis introduced a referendum that would have deprived the Jews of all their citizen-ship rights and would have denied them trade-licenses, and hence the referendum failed.

(Continued from Page 1) at the time the Nazi party conven-

tion was taking place.
The attack on Professor Lessing, one of the bitterest foes of the Nazi regime and the man most thoroughly hated by Nazi leaders, on the night of August 31, followed a series of venomous attacks on him in the Nazi press, including the Voelkischer Beobachter, the newspaper published by Adolf Hitler. It was current belief that a substantial price had been set on the famous philosopher's head and he had received several death threats.

Professor Lessing was assassinatcd as he lay sleeping in a bedroom on the second floor of his villa at Marienbad. Police established that two men, mounted on ladders, fired one shot each through an open window at the famous German-Jewish exile, both shots finding their mark

in his head. Evidence revealing that the mur-der had been carefully planned after Nazi enthusiasts had been strongly incited to slay the foe of Hitlerism. was discovered by the Czechoslovakian police.

No word has been received here. it is understood, as to the German government's reaction to the extra-dition demand. The two men have been regarded as heroes by the Nazi press, and it is believed that the Nazi regime will find some pretext for refusing the Czechoslovakian extradition demand.

In the meantime, Yom Kippur the Jewish Day of Atonement, has been officially designated as one of the seven legal annual national holidays when all shops in Salonica, Jewish and non-Jewish, must be closed. The decree embodying the inclusion of Yom Kippur in national holidays was signed by the Greek-president, and published in the official Greek Gazette.

The Salonica chamber of commerce was instrumental in securing the inclusion of Yom Kippur in the holiday list. This is the first case in which a Jewish holiday has been proclaimed an official holiday.
