Mysterious Witness Heard By Dickstein Committee Opening Nazi Inquiry

WASHINGTON Nov 14-A mysterious witness, whose name was not disclosed, took the stand today as the Dickstein inquiry into Nazi ac-tivities in this country held its first open session. A letter, first brought to light by the Daily Worker, New York Communist newspaper, pur-porting to be from Walter Haag, adjutant to Heinz Spanknoebel, fugnitive head of the Nazi movement in this country, and reporting prog-ress made here, was declared authentic by the witness.

Clarence Hathaway, editor of the paper, informed Congressman Dickstein that he would try to be present tomorrow to testify concerning the letter and to answer questions concerning Nazi propaganda activities. Hathaway is expected to bring the original of the letter with him.

Dana Hodgson, repre-sentative of the State Department also sat, heard Victor Ridder, one of the publishers of the New York Staats-Zeitung, who identified Nazi propaganda papers circulated in this country. Bernard Ridder, who will appear before the committee tomorrow, is expected to make startling revelations.

The committee also heard Joseph Smith an official of the National Association of American Seamen, who declared that hundreds of men who are in reality German citizens and whose families live in Germany, hold down jobs on American vessels by virtue of naturalization papers (Continued on Page 4)

MONTREAL, Que., Nov. 14-The question of German-Jewish im- R. D. Blumenfeld Arrives migration into Canada will receive much attention at the coming Congress of the Catholic trades unions of the Province of Quebec, which will be held here, according to Le Canada, French-Canadian daily.

The workers of Chicoutime have adopted resolutions protesting immigration of German Jews into Canada. The workers of Three Rivers will demand at the congress that immigration permits must receive narliamentary sanction and that more attention should be paid to the Lord's Day Act, to keep the Jews from laboring on Sunday.

Fear that a wave of German-Jewish immigration would sweep Canada and that the new arrivals would displace the French-Canadians from their jobs has been carefully nurtured among the workers by an active anti-Semitic press. Le Devoir, one of the most influential of these publications, industriously spread a report that a committee had been formed in Paris to transport "seven hundred thousand German Jews" to Canada.

.. The federal parliament has received scores of resolutions from French-Canadian bodies against admission of "anti-Christian" elements into Canada.

Anti-Nazi Boycott Aid (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 14-Following an address by Mrs. Stephen S. Wise, president of the Women's Division of the American Jewish Congress, 2,000 women pledged to dedicate themseves to further the boycott of German merchandise in this city, at a meeting held under the auspices of the Women's Philadelphia Council of the American Tewish Congress, at the Arch Street Theatre.

Mrs. Wise described conditions of the Jewish refugees in countries adioining Germany as she observed them during the summer when on a trip with her husband. She stressed the hopelessness of the Jewish youth in Germany and told of the efforts of the American Jewish Con-gress to bring some children to this country. She characterized the bovcott as the only weapon the Jews possessed to ameliorate conditions in Germany.

Abraham Goldberg, Zionist leader, asserted that the attitude of the Nazis may be interpreted as a declaration of war against world Tewry.

Rostonians Jam Hall to Attend Anti-Nazi Rally

(Jewish Daily Bulletin) BOSTON, Nov. 14-Boston's first large anti-Hitler demonstration, held here on Sunday, resulted in several persons being injured in the crush as 1,700 people tried to jam through the doors of Dorchester Manor to attend the meeting. Police reserves had to be called to control the crowd, which exceeded all expectations. Fifteen hundred people crowded around the building, which already held 2.000.

More than 700 persons marched through the Dorchester-Mattapan district in the parade which preceded the mass meeting. Signs denounceing Hitler and Hitlerism were carried. Maxwell Cohen and Israel Kolikof, commander of the Herbert J. Wolf Post of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, led the marchers. Members of the American Legion were in line as well as delegations from all the Hebrew societies in the district.

Senator Max Ulin presided at the meeting. The speakers included Congressmen John W. McCormack and William T. Connery, Dr. Frederick L. Andersen of the Andover-Newton Theological Seminary, Judge Jacob J. Kaplan, Alexander Brin, and Mrs. Jennie Loitman Baron.

British Envoys in Chile Decline to Receive Jewish Delegations Balfour Day (J.T.A. Special Correspondence)

SANTIAGO, Chile, Nov. 3-The refusal of the English embassy to grant a promised audience to a Tewish deputation on Balfour Day, November 2, was a keen disappoint-ment to local Zionists.

The audience, which had been arranged for the delegation of the Zionist Federation was to have lasted an hour. Several hours after the appointed time, the Zionist Federa-tion received a letter to the effect that as a result of instructions which had been forwarded from London the embassy could not receive the delegation. Similar advice was also received

from the British consul-general in Valparaiso by a Jewish delegation there. The Zionist Federation has informed the Zionist Executive in London of both incidents. Despite these disappointments, the

Balfour Day celebration which the Zionist Federation had arranged at the headquarters of the Circulo Israelita of Santiago was very suc-cessful. The celebration was attended by over 1,500 persons, including a number of members of parlia-Horacio Hevia, former Chilean minister of the interior; Isaac Drapkin, Zionist leader; L. Gomberoff and Gil Sinai. Although the Balfour Declaration was the topic of the evening, every speaker devoted some part of his speech to the condition

Vessels such as the Martha Washington and the Polonia have brought as many as a thousand immigrants on single trips.

Discontinuation of the direct Poland to Palestine service in which the Polonia has been operating in recent weeks is reported to be under consideration as a result of the gov-ernment order, it is learned.

ish leader, points out, the anti-Se-mitic parties might receive as high as forty percent of the vote. In this case, King Carol, who last week showed his displeasure at Cuzist anti-Semitic tactics by refusing to attend a reception at the Cuzist dormitory at the University of Jassy, would have little alternative but to invite Professor Alexander Cuza to form a cabinet.

Cuza as premier, would be as reat a calamity for the Jews of Roumania as Hitler as chancellor has been to the Jews of Germany, since he is the most violent anti-Semitic leader in the country.

Liberals count, however, on King Carol's strong support of Dr. Duca and the suppression of anti-Semitic agitation as well as of Fascist tendencies generally.

Jewish Writers' Contracts Invalid, Publishers Told

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, Nov. 14-German publishers are entitled to abrogate agreements and contracts with Jewish authors, the Juristiche Wochenschift, legal gazette, advises publishing houses today.

It points out that since the au-thorities have prohibited sales of books written by Jews, publishers cannot be expected to continue their agreements to publish works by Jewish writers and public books which cannot be sold legally.
