Adoption of Jewish Children in Aryan Homes Barred by Nazi Ruling

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Nov. 18—The statute prohibiting adoption of Jewish children by Aryan families, or Aryan children by Jewish families, with the added ruling that it is to have retroactive force, was approved today by the Reich government.

Proposed by the Ministry of Justice, the statute also provides for measures to be taken against marriage between persons of different race, if the motive of the union is the acquisition of a royal title. This provision is not to work retroactively unless one of the married pair proves that the motive of the union was solely the acquisition of titular distinction. In this case the marriage tie is automatically to be cancelled.

In editorial discussion of proposed legislation to prohibit intermarriage completely, the Deutsche Juristen Zeitung voices its opinion that such a ruling, working retroactively, would be "anti-moral and anti-religious."

Failure Is Confessed Of Soviet Jewish State At Moscow Congress

MOSCOW, Nov. 18—The fact that Bureya, national territory in the Far East which has been allotted by the Soviet government for the settlement of Jews, has not attained the status of a self-governing state, was attributed to the poor quality of the region's industrial equipment and its exceedingly slow development, by Chairman Weinstein, of the Ozet, society for the settlement of Jews on the land. The statement was made in an address before delegations of the Crimean and Bureyan governing bodies which have arrived to attend a celebration of the October Revolution.

A few of the attending delegates joined Weinstein in criticizing the Jewish settlement for its backwardness, but they enumerated its achievements and discussed the possibilities for future development.

Roumanian Iron Guard Makes Threat of Terrorism Against Allies of Jews

BUCHAREST, Nov. 18 — The threat that terroristic methods will be employed against any attempt of the new Roumanian government headed by Dr. Ion Duca, Liberal Party leader, to suppress anti-Semitic organizations was made today by M. Codreanu, leader of the anti-Semitic Iron Guard, in his newspaper, Garda. Claiming that his organization mustered a hundred thousand members, Codreanu boasted that there are at least "ten thousand legionaires whose hands do not fear to destroy those threatening the existence of the Iron Guard."

The daily newspaper Vointa reports that the Minister of the Interior is to take drastic measures against the anti-Semitic organizations and has decided to outlaw the Iron Guard and the organization headed by Professor Alexander Cuza. The new police prefects installed by the Duca government have already been instructed to this effect, the paper declares, and the Hitlerite movement, which has been most active in the province of Transylvania, will be wiped out completely.

In a special message issued through the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, Dr. Duca pledged his government.

LaGuardia Is Jewish, Budapest Paper Says; Once Son of Cohen

BUDAPEST, Nov. 18—The unusual announcement that Mayor-elect Fiorello H. LaGuardia, of New York City, is the son of Jewish parents, is made by the pro-Nazi newspaper Egyen Loeseg here.

In support of its claim, the periodical quotes an inscription on a tombstone in a Budapest Jewish cemetery reading as follows:

"Here rests Frau Achilles LaGuardia, born Iren Cohen, died Oct. 24, 1915. Aged 56"

Mr. LaGuardia, born in New York City, is of Italian descent.

Jews in Three Cities of Palestine Protest Against Curbs on Immigration

JERUSALEM, Nov. 18—Jews of Palestine today assembled in three huge mass-meetings at Jerusalem, Tel Aviv and Haifa to protest against restrictive measures adopted by the Palestine government to curtail Jewish immigration into the country.

Resolutions denouncing the administration's stand on Jewish immigration and its failure to issue immigration certificates in satisfactory quantities were passed at the meetings and were incorporated into a lengthy memorandum submitted to the British government which holds the mandate for Palestine.

Prior to the recent Arab disturbances, the Palestine government had allocated 5,500 immigration certificates for a six months' period although the Jewish Agency for Palestine had requested approximately 25,000 based on needs for labor in Palestinian industry and agriculture. Since the disturbances, the government has imposed further restrictions on Jewish immigration and has started a round-up of Jews illegally in the country.

Polish Society Urges Mandate of Palestine Go to Warsaw Gov't

WARSAW, Poland, Nov. 18—A society which has proclaimed its desire to have the Polish government take over the Palestine mandate from Great Britain has been organized here and has submitted a request for registration as an official body, according to an announcement published in the Yiddish daily, Moment, today.

The society claims that Poland is best fitted to administer the mandate because it is not affected by the considerations of policy which must be faced by the British government. The Polish government, declares the newspaper, is unable to obtain colonial acquisitions, nevertheless there is no reason why it should not be given the mandate.

The society intends establishing branches in other nations abroad in

Brandeis's Book Scoring Monopolies Reissued By National Home Library

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18.—With the expressed permission of Hon. Louis D. Brandeis, Associate Justice in the U. S. Supreme Court, a book written by him prior to his appointment to the bench, which is entitled "Other People's Money" has been reissued in the Jacket Library by the National Home Library Foundation here.

When it was originally published the book created a stir and brought the name of Mr. Brandeis to the fore as the champion of the people against monopolies and large privileged corporations.

The value deals with the misuse of funds by insurance companies, banks and other semi-public institutions.

Legion Post Protests Nazi Ceremony at Shrine

PITTSFIELD, Mass., Nov. 18.—The Pittsfield post of the American Legion has sent a protest to the national headquarters of the organization against the reported intention of Captain Georg Schmitt, recently arrived Stahlhelm emissary, to lay a wreath in behalf of the Stahlhelm at the tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

Official recognition of Schmitt, the post declared in its protest, "would be an affront to Jewish members of the post and contrary to the spirit of the magnificent preamble to the constitution of the American Legion."

Judge Lehman Hails Community Centers in Enriching of Leisure

The role of the community center in dispensing usefully the new leisure created by the NRA was referred to as being of first importance by Judge Irving Lehman of the Court of Appeals at a hearing on the subject held at the Bar Association Building, 42 West 44th Street, on Thursday.

"The Jewish Center seeks to bring into the lives of its members the finest ideals of American life," he said. "It seeks also to strengthen in its members a devotion to their ideals, so that they do their part in enriching the culture of our great city."

"Our leisure-time programs are opening the way for the exercise of the creative capacities of many people who ordinarily would find no outlet or encouragement in our system of large scale production and mechanical division of labor. The art classes, the craft shops, and the Little Theatre promoting the production of good plays, mean much to the individuals concerned and will mean more and more to our civilization."

Bulgarian Jewish Leader Is Selected for Parliament

SOFIA, Bulgaria, Nov. 18.—Chaim Farchi, president of the Bulgarian Jewish communities, was elected to fill the vacancy in Parliament created by the recent death of A. Liaptcheff, leader of the Centre party of the Democratic entente which was founded in 1923. Rabbi Asher Hananel administered the oath to the new leader.

The party which is made up of a large number of small political groups, has for its main planks a program of economy, educational reform, peace and good relations with neighbor nations.

Oldest Jewish Fraternity Condemns Hitler Bigotry

Zeta Beta Tau, oldest national Jewish college fraternity in the country and the largest of its kind, went on record at a meeting of the Supreme Council here, as condemning the "cruel bigotry and inhumanity" of the Hitler regime in Germany.

The organization, which has a membership of about 5,000, 34 campus and 35 alumni chapters throughout the United States and Canada, has initiated a drive for funds. Money realized will be turned over to the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee for relief of the German Jewish refugees.

Local Jews Outline \$10,000,000 Program For Reich Jews' Relief

As a result of the recent London conference, where the problem of finding permanent habitations for the German refugees was thrashed out, the American Jewish Congress has announced that a three-fold program involving the expenditure of \$10,000,000 had been mapped out for relief of the Reich Jews.

Places for the suffering Jews in Germany will be sought in many nations where absorption may easily take place. It was estimated that South American countries, particularly Brazil, will present opportunities. A permanent migration committee, with headquarters in London, is to be established with the purpose of seeking out lands where vocational opportunities will present themselves.

Oakland Community Center Expands Education Program

OAKLAND, Calif., Nov. 18.—The new addition to the Jewish Community Center, which houses a new library and more classroom space for the Jewish Educational Institute was formally opened here. The building was erected by the Oakland Jewish Federation of which Bernard Silverstein is president. The library, which will contain Judaica and Hebraica for the local Jewish community, already has one of the most active Yiddish sections on the Pacific Coast.

Dr. Michael Zarchin, graduate of Dropsie College, is director of the Jewish Educational Institute, which is planning an extensive program of Jewish education for children and adults.

Cincinnati Welfare Body Opens Drive for \$142,000

CINCINNATI, Nov. 18.—A drive to raise about \$142,000 for the use of 35 Jewish philanthropies in this city has been inaugurated by the Jewish Welfare Fund which is to confine its activities among Jewish residents here. The campaign got under way at a dinner held at the Alms Hotel.

Rabbi Jacob Tarshish, of Columbus, voiced a plea for unity of Jews in the United States as a means of militating against Nazi propaganda.

Bar Jews from German Juries

BERLIN, Nov. 18.—The Prussian Minister of Justice, Kerri, announced that in the future Jews would be prohibited from serving as members of juries.

Hamburg Paper's Editor For 45 Years Dismissed, Deprived of His Pension

HAMBURG, Germany, Nov. 18—Gustav Behrens, Jewish editor of the Hamburg Anzeiger for forty-five years, today was dismissed from office on the strength of the governmental program to purge business of non-Aryan blood. He was deprived of his compensation and pension.

San Francisco Zionists Resolve Anti-Nazi Boycott

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 18—San Francisco Zionists, at a rousing mass meeting held at Temple Beth Israel, unanimously adopted resolutions calling for the boycott of German goods and services until Jews in Germany are restored to citizenship and given full rights.

Voting on the resolution followed a symposium on the subject: "Shall there be an economic boycott on German goods and services?"

All of the speakers leading the discussion favored a boycott as the only means of bringing the Nazi government to a full sense of justice and humanity. The only difference of opinion was as to whether the boycott should be pressed officially or silently.

The opinion finally prevailing was that every peaceful means had been exercised during the last seven months of terror to have the Nazi government relent in its discriminations and persecutions and that, in spite of this, the situation had grown worse.

The speakers engaging in the discussion were Dr. Bernard Kaufman, Ralph Stern, Gus C. Ringole, Lucius L. Solomons, Jewel Alexander, and Sol Silverman.

I. D. Raffin presided.

Line Not to Discontinue Poland-Palestine Service

Reports that the Gdynia-America Line was considering discontinuing its Poland-Palestine shipping route in view of Palestine government regulations limiting the number of Palestine immigrants each ship could carry to 250 a trip, were denied in a cablegram from the main offices of the line at Warsaw received by the local offices.

The report had stated that the line was considering withdrawing the liner Polonia from the Palestine service as the new regulations would make the service unprofitable. The regulations have since been revised and the Palestine government is now permitting each vessel to land four hundred immigrants. The Polonia, on its last trip, brought in over 900 prospective Palestine settlers.

Criminal Libel Trial Date Set for Priest Untermeyer Is Suing

JERSEY CITY, N. J., Nov. 18—Rev. Francis Gross will go on trial here next week on charges of criminal libel in connection with a pamphlet allegedly issued by him attacking Samuel Untermeyer.

Gross, who was indicted for criminal libel by the Hudson County grand jury, is free on bail of \$2,500 set by County Judge Robert V. Kinkaid yesterday when he was arraigned on the charge.

Published statements that Gross was an unfrocked priest were denied today by his attorney, A. Leszczynski, who declared that Gross did not now have a parish because he suffered from rheumatism. Gross, who lives in Perth Amboy, recently circulated through the mails a leaflet urging support of Hitler and denouncing the Jews.

Conviction for criminal libel in this state carries a penalty of two years imprisonment or a \$500 fine, or both.

Nazi Sheet Sneers at Kosher Food on Ships

BERLIN, Nov. 18—The authority under which German steamers are providing kosher food for Jewish passengers was questioned today by Der Stuermer, Nazi daily published in Nuremberg by Julius Streicher. The shechita prohibition on kosher meat slaughtering applies to all German enterprises, it is pointed out.

Referring to the direct German-Palestine line which has been established here for Jewish refugees, Der Stuermer expresses the hope that the steamer either sink or the Arabs offer suitable welcome to the refugees.

The attack caused a great deal of embarrassment among shipping circles. The South Hamburg American Line is hoping that the new governmental policy not to publish information regarding attacks on the Jews for fear of foreign reprisals, will prevent spread of this latest intelligence in foreign countries.

Dr. Spiegel Named Professor

Dr. Shalom Spiegel of the faculty of the Jewish Institute of Religion has been promoted to the post of Professor of Hebrew Language and Literature, the board of trustees of the Institute announced.

He has been associate professor of Hebrew and acting librarian in the Institute. Dr. Spiegel is the author of "Hebrew Reborn" and of numerous articles on the subject in scholarly journals.

Right Wing Zionist Youth Protest Immigration Curb Before Warsaw Embassy

WARSAW, Nov. 18—Hundreds of members of the Brith Hachail and Trumpeldorite organizations, youth groups of the right wing Zionists, carried out a demonstration today in front of the British Embassy in Warsaw. The demonstration was a protest against the severe immigration restrictions against the Jews recently imposed by the Palestine government. The Polish police dispersed the demonstration after arresting several of the participants.

Approval of Hitler Regime Arouses Meeting in Chicago

CHICAGO, Ill., Nov. 18—The International House of the University of Chicago was the scene of a turbulent meeting following an address by Professor Friedrich Schonemann, of the University of Berlin, who voiced his approval of the Hitler regime in Germany.

The meeting was marked with considerable excitement, provoked when listeners, who obviously took issue with the Professor, gave vent to their feelings.

Bruce W. Dixon, director of the International House which was built by means of a donation by John D. Rockefeller, Jr., was deprived of chairmanship of the meeting by some of the more hostile members of the audience who insisted on parading their sympathies.

The gavel was turned over to Miss Mary B. Gilson, assistant professor of economics at the University of Chicago, who attempted to refute some of the statements made by Professor Schonemann in the face of considerable heckling from supposed Nazi-sympathizers who were generously sprinkled among the audience.

Miss Gilson herself was subjected to uproarious cross-questioning from some listeners.

Jewish Musical Prodigies Abound Also in Soviets

MOSCOW, Nov. 18—Out of ten musical prodigies elected at Leningrad from all of Russia in connection with the celebration of the October Revolution, eight are Jewish. Their names are Isis Slonim, 12, pianist and composer; Lenia Goldberg, 12, cellist; Boria Levit, Moma Dreiser, Boria Grodzinski, violinists; Yasha Babel, pianist and Danis Hoffman, cellist.

The work of Margarete Cheifetz, 10, composer, who conducted a full symphonic orchestra which played the complicated works of Rimsky-Korsakov, aroused great enthusiasm.

Resentance Jew Convicted Of Grotkowski Slaying

LWOW, Poland, Nov. 18.—The court of appeals here has overruled the lower court which on August 9 sentenced Moses Katz, a Jewish baker, to four years imprisonment for the slaying of Jan Grotkowski, a Polish student, in a street brawl last November, and resentenced the prisoner to six years imprisonment.

The case had been appealed by both prosecution and defense, the former contending the sentence too light because the crime had been premeditated, while the defense, asserting Katz's innocence, sought to prove that two unknown men attacked and stabbed Grotkowski.

The death of Grotkowski last November led to a series of strong anti-Semitic disturbances. Katz and two other Jews were arrested in connection with the crime. The others won their freedom at the trial.

Official Predicts More Race Legislation in Reich

BERLIN, Nov. 18.—Further race legislation in Germany may be expected shortly declared Ministerial Councillor Dr. Gutt, who addressed the advisory council for race questions convoked by the Minister of the Interior, Dr. Wilhelm Frick. "The unlimited confidence the elections have given Hitler obliges us to materialize his racial aims," Dr. Gutt stated.

14,905 Jews Enter Palestine

LONDON, Nov. 18.—According to an official report issued here, 14,905 Jewish immigrants entered Palestine in the first eight months of 1933, as compared with 3,841 for 1932 and 3,049 in 1931. Since the end of the world war, 132,930 Jewish immigrants came into Palestine, the report disclosed.

give rise to considerable complications the newspaper points out. Approving future application of such a law, the article urges that no legislation of this kind be passed with ex post facto force because existing statutes make racial incompatibility ground for separation.

Following a heated dispute on the subject of retaining the Old Testament as part of the Holy Gospel, the Superior Council of the Protestant Church has suspended all new regional regulations recently perpetrated by governmental decree, including the Aryan clause which would eject divines who have the taint of ancestral blood that was Jewish. This action was taken pending enactment of an all-German church law.

Young Judaeen Resumes Monthly Publication Soon

Beginning with the Chanukah issue in December, The Young Judaeen, the national magazine for the American Jewish youth, will resume monthly publication. The new schedule of publication is being made possible under a plan arranged by David Levine, president of National Young Judaea and Lawrence Meyer, chairman of the publication committee. The magazine is to be edited by Sidney Wallach.

The Young Judaeen attempts to interest the American Jewish youth in the Zionist movement and Palestine.

Arthur I. Levine Chosen To Head Heights Center
