Salonica Governor Urges Revoking of Yom Kippur Legal Holiday Rulings (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

SALONICA, Greece, Nov. 21—What seems to be a counterpoint to the turbulent Jewish situation here which is growing more aggravated with repeated evidences of a wide-spread anti-Semitic movement, is the reaction on the part of the Jews themselves to the trouble in Palestine.

On one hand the government is being stormed for a revocation of its recent decree establishing Yom Kippur as a legal holiday in Salonica by the Governor of Salonica, who insists that such a step will appease anti-Semitic bodies.

On the other, the Jewish populace, large numbers of whom have recently established permanent homes in the Holy Land, are fearful lest their brethren be ejected and possibly turned adrift or obliged to return to Greece. The latter eventuality would mean perhaps serious trouble in a community already-disturbed by political anti-Semitism.

Crowds are hourly visiting the Zionist headquarters for news of Palestine. The Revisionists have organized a protest meeting demanding that all Jewish organizations reject immigration certificates which admit young pioneers to the Holy Land. This is in retaliation for the curtailment of certificate issuance by the Palestine administration and in line with the recent decision of the Central Revisionist Union.

Roumanian Gov't Repeats Assurances of Jewish Safety (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUCHAREST, Roumania, Nov. 21.—Jon Inuletz, Minister of the Interior of the new Roumanian government of Premier Duca, assured Deputy Michael Landau, Jewish representative in the Roumanian parliament, that the new government was determined not to tolerate anti-Semitism in Roumania.

Deputy Landau visited Minister Inuletz today to point out the danger for the Jews in the present parliamentary elections, particularly in the province of Bessarabia. The Minister, himself a Bessarabian, stated:

Nazi Press Renews Demands For Boycott Against Jews; Jews Beaten During Voting (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Nov. 21—With the Reichstag elections safely over, violent anti-Semitic attacks have been resumed in Germany. Today Germany's press, after a long silence, is urging the continuation of the anti-Jewish boycott as a means of combatting the Jewish peril.

That the boycott is continuing all over Germany is evidenced by a communication addressed by Minister of Justice Frank, to the Juristenbund, jurists association, demanding that they do not overstep the bounds of their instructions to discontinue the boycott of Jews until instructed to resume these activities.

An official communique from Stargard, Pomerania, describes how on the day of the election, November 12, an aged Jewish man of seventy-six and two Jewish women were severely beaten by two Nazis and taken to a hospital. The attackers were the storm troopers, Murr and Stiebens. They were arrested and police

130 Arrested as Police Act To Suppress Anti-Semitic Riots in Hungarian Schools (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUDAPEST, Hungary, Nov. 21—One hundred and thirty Hungarian anti-Semitic students were arrested at Debrecen, Hungary, when the authorities began today to take vigorous action against the anti-Jewish excesses by student organizations, which have spread to Budapest, Debrecen and Szegedin, endangering the public peace.

In Debrecen, street fighting between the students and the police occurred, while in Budapest and Szegedin, the fighting was confined to the university grounds.

Several students suspected of being Jewish were beaten by the anti-Semites, but none of the Jewish students were actually hurt, because they had been expelled from the colleges early this morning before the beginning of the lectures.

Anti-Semitic Hungarian student organizations have forwarded a series of demands to the Ministry of Education, declaring that they would

A.A.U. TAKES FIRM STAND AGAINST PARTICIPATION OF AMERICAN ATHLETES IN BERLIN OLYMPICS

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

PITTSBURGH, Pa., Nov. 21—The Amateur Athletic Union which yesterday went on record as disapproving the tactics being used by the Hitler government especially against Jewish athletes, and voiced this disapproval by withdrawing American participation in the 1936 Olympiad until the Reich government changes its policies, will in all probability find concordance in Washington tomorrow where the American Olympic Committee will hold its preliminary conclave. Support of this stand by the A.O.C. will mean that the United States will take no part in the international games scheduled in Berlin unless there is strong evidence that the Jewish athletes in Germany are given every opportunity to compete.

The resolution was couched in language indicating conclusively that sentiment against Nazi repressions among the largest sports-governing body in the world is strong. The

principle which the enrollment of the Amateur Athletic Union almost unanimously fears will be violated if support of German anti-Jewish discriminations is forthcoming, is one involving democracy in sport.

The resolution passed by the A.A.U. is expected to become part of the proceedings under consideration by the American Olympic Committee at the capital. The latter organization will be called upon

Penn. State Federation Of Youth Groups Formed

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 21 — A State Federation of junior organizations of the Reform Congregations of Pennsylvania was organized at the Youth Conference held yesterday.

Fifty delegates from Philadelphia and sixty-three from Pittsburgh, Harrisburg, Scranton, Wilkes-Barre, Lancaster, York, Reading, Altoona, Easton, McKeesport and Erie attended.

The discussion brought out many references to Nazi treatment of the Jews and problems of anti-Semitism. Rabbi Louis Wolsey, of Congregation Rodeph Shalom, presided at the afternoon session.

The conference adopted a resolution authorizing formation of a permanent state federation with executive and constitution committees to be appointed later. The following officers of the federation were elected: President, Edward L. Frater; first vice-president, Robert Baer; second vice-president, Albert Freedman; corresponding secretary, Miss Sylvia Goldstein; recording secretary, Miss Maizie Weisman; treasurer, Emil Cohn.

to take the same stand as the A.A.U. and refuse to certify any athlete for the eleventh Olympiad.

While the A.A.U. itself has no voice in the matter, its opinions are a strong influence on the proceedings of the American Olympic Committee which has a meeting scheduled in Washington tomorrow.

G. T. Kirby, of New York City, who introduced the resolution, presented the minutes of the Olympic meeting in Berlin in June, and in addition newspaper material tending to prove that its declared impartiality in connection with choice of athletes was false.

Albert F. Wheltie, of Baltimore, asserted that Jewish athletes competing in the Olympic games would need police protection. Forty-six Jewish athletes scored 116 points for the United States at the last Olympics, he said, adding with conviction that the proposed resolution was too mild. He said he favored holding the contests elsewhere than in Germany.

Detrich Wortmann, who cast the lone dissenting vote, expressed the view that Jewish athletes in Germany are not molested and insisted that America's stand on the racial question is hypocritical. He cited the prejudice existing against the Negro in the south as an instance of American intolerance. One Jewish athlete participated in the last contests for Germany, he said, urging that "friendly methods" be adopted to show that the Nazis are in the wrong.

A communication from Bernard S. Deutsch, president of the American Jewish Congress, enumerating fifty decrees passed in condemnation of Jewish athletes in Germany, was read by Charles L. Ornstein, member of the A.A.U. executive committee and the American Olympic Committee.

The resolution which is couched in conciliatory rather than violent language, concludes with a plea that Germans make the concession to demands from every part of the world for a let-up in its anti-Jewish repressions.

The resolution follows in part:

Have Violated Olympic Code

"Whereas, it is believed and is common universal knowledge, that the German Olympic Committee and the Berlin Organizing Committee, under and by reason of the decrees and direction of the government of Germany, have violated and will continue to violate the code of the Olympic games and the fundamentals of sports competition in that they have deprived and will continue to deprive Germans of Jewish de-

scent or belief from the rights of Olympic competition, if not by direct restriction, certainly, indirectly, by the withdrawal from them the rights of German citizenship and of a reasonable opportunity to train, prepare for and take part in sports competition in general and in the Olympic games in particular.

Refuse to Certify Athletes

"Now, therefore, be it resolved that the Amateur Athletic Union, as a member of the American Olympic Association, about to be assembled at its quadrennial meeting in Washington, D. C., instruct its delegates thereto to call upon said American Olympic Association, to resolve that the American Olympic Association through the members of the International Committee to the U.S.A., namely, Colonel William A. Garland, General Charles H. Sherrill and Commodore Earnest Lee Jahncke, Jr., give notice to the International Olympic Committee and to the German government, that neither the A.O.A. or the members thereof, nor the American Olympic Committee to be organized for the Olympic games of 1936, will certify any athlete of the U.S.A. for competition in the Olympic of Berlin, until and unless the position of the German Olympic Committee, of the Organizing Committee of Berlin and of the German government is so changed in fact as well as in theory, as to both permit and encourage German athletes of Jewish faith or heritage to train, prepare for and participate in the Olympic games of 1936."

All-Jewish-Manned Vessel

Makes Port at Antwerp

ANTWERP, Belgium, Nov. 11—The S.S. Imanuel, flying the flag of Palestine, arrived in port here for repairs. The liner, which is owned, navigated and completely manned by a Jewish crew, is en route from Palestine to England.

Withdraw Hitler Book

The John Day Publishing Company will not issue Adolf Hitler's new book, "The New Germany Desires Work and Peace," Richard J. Walsh, president, announced yesterday. The reason given is that the volume, which contains utterances by the German chancellor and omits all reference to treatment of the Jews, is "mere propaganda."

Vittorio Corcos, Painter, Dead

FLORENCE, Italy, Nov. 21—Vittorio Corcos, famous Jewish painter, died here today at the age of 74. In publishing his obituary, the Italian press praised him highly for his genius and for his achievements for Italian art.

Sokolow Sees Little in Talk of Poland Assuming Mandate Over Palestine

WARSAW, Poland, Nov. 21—When asked about the possibility of the mandate for Palestine being taken over by Poland, Dr. Nahum Sokolow, president of the World Zionist Organization, stated at a press conference here that the British mandate for Palestine was for an unlimited period. And that moreover, even if Great Britain should relinquish the mandate, the League of Nations would have to decide the future of Palestine. In view of the many possibilities that might exist in the future, the question of Poland and the mandate was valueless at this time, the Jewish statesman declared.

Recently, a group of Polish Jews formed a society to have the Polish government take over the Palestine mandate, on the ground that Poland is not affected by the considerations of policy that affect the British government, and is therefore more fit to administer the mandate.

Ben-Gurion Attacks Drive On Illegal Immigrants

JERUSALEM, Nov. 21—David Ben-Gurion, of the political department of the executive of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, gave a three-hour review of the situation in Palestine at a press conference yesterday.

Ben-Gurion, who declared that the Jewish Agency was fighting the deportation of those immigrants who entered Palestine illegally, pointed out that the tourists had made up for the shortage of labor in Palestine and constituted a striking proof that the country could absorb them.

The political department chief referred to Arab-Jewish relations declaring that both races had a historic right in Palestine. He denied that the Jews desired supremacy in Palestine, but only the opportunity of building up a home in Palestine. Ben-Gurion also dwelt on the necessity for the compulsory hiring of Jewish labor on Jewish enterprises. Moshe Shertok, also of the political department, answered the questions propounded by the journalists.

Native Palestinian Quizzed In Immigration Roundup

JERUSALEM, Nov. 21—As an example of the relentless hunt going on in Palestine for immigrants in the country illegally, five Iraqi Jews informed the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that they were arrested while walking on the street in a group. They were taken to a police station and ordered to produce their

Warburg Library to Move From Germany to London

HAMBURG, Nov. 21—The Warburg Library will be moved from Hamburg to London, it was stated here today. It is expected that the final destination of the Library will be the United States.

The Warburg Library, which was closed last summer by the Nazis, was founded by Professor Aby Warburg, brother of Felix M., Paul M., and Max M., Warburg. He was born in Hamburg in 1886 and died there October 26, 1929.

Professor Warburg, a noted authority on the Renaissance, devoted his time and energy to the study of the history of art and of religion. Encouraged by Carl Justi and Jacob Burckhardt, authorities on the Renaissance period, Professor Warburg spent years in these studies. He carefully and ceaselessly collected all the materials needed in his studies, thus building up a valuable archive of Renaissance documents.

It was his aim to encourage research in the various legacies of the Renaissance from a single point of view. In this way, he managed to build up about the Library, a scientific institute. Many noted scholars have made use of the valuable documents contained in the Warburg Library.

Last year the Warburg Library published two volumes of Professor Warburg's collected works, entitled "The Renaissance of Heathen Antiquity."

Italian Zionists Endorse Congress Stand on Germany

ROME, Nov. 21—The Italian Zionist Congress which terminated today its two-day session in Padua, the great Adriatic seaport, went on record as supporting the World Zionist Congress resolution with regard to the German situation.

The resolution in effect condemned the Nazi repressions and anti-Jewish discriminations and favored settlement of Jewish refugees in Palestine.

Other items on the convention agenda included a protest against restrictions on immigration of Jews in Palestine and a plea that the laws of the Sabbath and kosher laws be observed on land belonging to the Keren Kayemeth, the Jewish National Fund, and in public kitchens there.

The conference delegates also voiced a hope that relations between Italy and Palestine, culturally and economically, be improved in every possible way.

Augusto Levi, prominent attorney, was elected president of the organization.

Dickstein Asks Delay in Deporting Spanknoebel Aide To Be Sentenced Today

A request that Walter Kauf, alleged bodyguard of Heinz Spanknoebel who will be sentenced in Newark today on charges of carrying concealed weapons, assault, and instigating a riot, be not deported has been made by Representative Samuel Dickstein, conductor of the House investigation into Nazi affairs.

"We would like to know just what Kauf's connections with the Nazis were," Mr. Dickstein said yesterday. "If he has facts that we should know about Nazi activities we shall never get them by deporting the man."

In response to a letter from Common Pleas Judge Daniel J. Brennan asking what action Mr. Dickstein would recommend, the House investigator asked that deportation of Kauf be postponed for a few months.

At first it was believed that immediately after sentence had been imposed by the state court, the affair would be turned over to the federal authorities for action on deportation. It is now believed that Kauf

Latvian Nazi Paper Urges Expulsion of Correspondent

RIGA, Latvia, Nov. 21—The anti-Semitic Latvian newspaper, Lattvis, continues to agitate for the expulsion of Jacob Lestchinsky, correspondent of the New York Jewish Daily Forward, from Latvia on the ground that he has been spreading atrocity propaganda against Latvia.

It also demands the expulsion of Daniel Charney, brother of the American Jewish writer, Samuel Niger, and of B. C. Vladeck, manager of the Forward. Mr. Charney arrived in Riga from Berlin last week. He proposes to settle in Riga.

Lestchinsky was expelled from Germany by the Nazis last spring. According to the Riga Nazi paper, the Rundschau, he was ordered by the Latvian Minister of the Interior to leave the country on November 4, but the order was later modified.

Austria's 'Fatherland Front' Asks Numerous Clausus

VIENNA, Nov. 21—The leaders of the Upper Austrian Fatherland Front resolved today to demand from the Front Central Committee in Vienna, the introduction of a numerous clausus against the Jews of Austria, in all branches of life. The resolution was forwarded to the various Ministries of the Austrian government.

call a strike in all the universities of Hungary, unless they were given a satisfactory answer by Saturday.

Included in the demands are:

1. The strictest application of the numerus clausus against the Jewish students.

2. The limitation of the granting of diplomas for practice for Jewish students who graduated abroad.

3. Vigorous control of Jewish immigration into Hungary.

4. The limitation of the number of artisans' licenses granted to Jews.

A boycott of all Jewish students was determined upon today at a meeting of the anti-Semitic Hungarian students. They also discussed further tactics in their campaign for numerus clausus against the Jewish students.

They resolved not to speak to the Jewish students, but at the same time decided to refrain from violence against the Jews and not to prevent Jewish students from attending classes as long as they occupied only the back benches.

The boycott is to continue until the anti-Semitic student organizations receive a reply from the government on the demands they submitted to it.

Columbia Not to Intervene In Students' Anti-Nazi Protest

Authorities at Columbia University announced Monday that no plans had been formed to suppress an anti-Nazi demonstration scheduled by the Social Problems Club for December 12, when Dr. Hans Luther, German ambassador to the United States, will lecture at that institution.

A spokesman for Nicholas Murray Butler, president of the university, said that it is unlikely that any announcement would be made regarding measures to suppress the projected anti-Nazi demonstration and indicated that no attempt will be made to interfere with expressions of anti-Nazi sentiment on the part of the students.

On Sunday, Dr. Butler refused to meet the demands of the Columbia Social Problems Club for the cancellation of the invitation extended to Dr. Luther.

will receive a jail sentence which will keep him in custody until formal action is taken by a House committee after Congress reconvenes in January.

Six weeks ago Kauf was arrested at the Schwaben Hall in Newark after a meeting of the League of Friends of New Germany at which Spanknoebel served as the principal speaker. A riot ensued when members of the Friends of New Germany and non-sympathizers with the Hitler cause met in the street outside the meeting place. Kauf was found to be carrying a lead pipe. He offered no defense when tried a few days later.

Investigation into the disappearance of Heinz Spanknoebel by the federal grand jury in New York has been adjourned pending introduction of new witnesses. It is believed hearings will be resumed late this week.

ted that he was acquainted with the situation and declared that he would take vigorous action against the fomentors of disturbances. The government, he declared, had issued the strictest instructions to this effect.

The government also announced that the anti-Semitic daily Calendar had been prohibited from appearing.

Student organizations are contemplating a vigorous campaign against the government and disturbances are feared, particularly at the University of Cluj, where the nationalist students have invited the anti-Semitic leader Goga, to lecture on November 26 on the subject "National Ideals."
