Anti-Zionist Meeting Fails To Win Parliament Support As Members Stay Away

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, Nov. 23—An elaborately prepared anti-Zionist meeting organized by the pro-Arab group, turned out to be a complete fiasco when it took place tonight in a private room in the House of Commons. The organizers had expected numerous parliamentarians and members of the House of Lords to attend. However, only three members of the House appeared, whereupon Lord Winterton, Conservative leader, who was to have seconded a resolution demanding justice for the Arabs of Palestine, withdrew his support and left the room. Nevertheless, the resolution was voted upon and adopted.

The audience consisted of a small group of known anti-Semites. Lord Lamington, who presided, read letters supporting the resolution, from the Palestine Arab Executive and from Shaikat Ali, Mohammedan leader of India. Lord Lamington explained that he was not an anti-Semite and deeply deplored the persecution of the Jews in Germany, but he declared he considered it wrong to help the Jews at the expense of the Arabs.

Miss Farquarson, organizer of the British League responsible for tonight's meeting, claimed that Palestine was in reality the wealthiest country in the world, but that the

Jewish Judges, Professors Ousted from German Posts In Series of Dismissals

BERLIN, Nov. 23—Further dismissals of Jewish judges and professors, which were announced today, include Privy Councillor Karl Neumeyer, a member of the Bavarian Supreme Court for many years, president of the Bavarian Jewish communities and eminent authority on international law; Dr. Arnold Busch, member of the State Academy at Breslau; and Professor Ritter Hans von Baeyer, Professor of Medicine at the University of Heidelberg and a noted Orthopedist.

Hungarian Gov't Rejects Anti-Jewish Demands Made By Student Organizations

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUDAPEST, Hungary, Nov. 23—The Hungarian government yesterday refused most of the demands submitted by the anti-Semitic Hungarian student groups. The anti-Semitic students had demanded the strict enforcement of a numerous clausus against the Jews, and no jobs for Jewish students who had completed their studies outside of Hungary. They also submitted a series of demands including prohibition of Jewish immigration to Hungary and the refusal of licenses to Jewish artisans.

Professor Balint Homan, Hungarian Minister of Education, received the student delegation which was headed by former Minister of Commerce, Miska Hermann. Minister Homan told the anti-Semitic students that the government was against strengthening the present restrictions against Jewish students. He appealed to the students to end their demonstrations against the

New Blow Struck at Jewish Doctors, Dentists by Nazi Decree on Sick Funds

BERLIN, Nov. 23—A far-reaching order was issued this afternoon by Franz Seldte, Minister of Labor in the Nazi government, prohibiting Jewish doctors and dentists in cities which have a population of more than one hundred thousand from continuing to accept patients from the sick fund lists. This spells expulsion even for the war veterans, who up to now have been legally exempted from expulsion. In Germany, where the sick benefit funds are supported and organized by the government, removal from the sick fund lists mean that the Jewish doctors will lose important parts of their practice.

The removal of the Jewish doctors and dentists has crippled the sick funds and vitally affected medical help all over Germany. The sick funds have been affected to the point where patients absolutely refuse to be treated by the inexperienced doc-

TO PROCEED WITH PALESTINE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, CUNLIFFE-LISTER DECLARES IN HOUSE

LONDON, Nov. 23—The intention of the British government to establish a legislative council in Palestine without further consultation with the British parliament on the subject was announced tonight in the House of Commons by Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, Colonial Secretary. Cunliffe-Lister's statement came in reply to interpellations by Josiah Wedgwood, Laborite M.P.

The question of a legislative council for Palestine, over which Great Britain holds a mandate, has been repeatedly and lengthily discussed in the House, Cunliffe-Lister declared, and there is no need for further consideration of the question by the House.

A complete misapprehension prevails regarding British intentions and obligations in Palestine, Sir Philip pointed out. "Our obligations remain the same whether the legislative council is established or not," he declared.

He detailed the differences be-

tween a Palestine legislature and the proposed legislative council and stressed the fact that it is not intended to set up an independent Palestine government. He gave "complete assurance that the powers of the British government, the British parliament and the High Commissioner to carry out the mandate policy remain strictly and completely unimpaired when the legislative council is established."

The purpose of the council, Cunliffe-Lister explained, is to give the various sections of opinion in Palestine the opportunity to express their opinions in a representative assembly.

The immigration of Transjordanian Arabs into Palestine is not restricted and any restrictions would constitute a complete breach of the mandate, Cunliffe-Lister declared when questioned on the subject by Barnett Janner, Liberal party member. Sir Philip, however, failed to explain

Jewish Workers' Secretary Released After Citizenship Is Questioned in Holy Land

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, Nov. 23—Yehudi Shimoni, secretary of the cultural commission of the Histadruth, the Palestine workers' organization, and a resident of Palestine for twelve years, was arrested this afternoon on the suspicion that he had entered Palestine illegally.

Mr. Shimoni was questioned by an officer engaged in tracking down tourists who had remained in Palestine illegally. He was released after his identity was established.

Z. O. A. to Establish Colony in Holy Land

A colony is to be established in Palestine for the settlement of American members of the Jewish Legion who have been instrumental in aiding General Allenby capture the Holy Land from possession of the Turks.

The sum of about \$40,000, bequeathed by Mrs. Rebecca Zundelwitz, of Wichita Falls, Texas, to the Zionist Organization of America, is to be used in financing the settlement. Morris Rothenberg, president of the organization, announced that this represents the first attempt of the Jews to show their appreciation of the services rendered in the establishment of a national homeland by the soldiers of the Jewish Legion.

Jews were concealing its wealth until they had established a Jewish kingdom. She asserted that the Dead Sea contains gold worth five billion pounds.

An Assyrian from Iraq attacked the purpose of the meeting and Eleanor Rathbone, Laborite member of Parliament, called attention to the illegal immigration of Transjordan Arabs into Palestine. Peter MacDonald, Conservative member of the House, expressed doubt as to whether the meeting was serving a useful purpose.

Edward Doran, former Conservative member of the House, who was repudiated by his constituency after his defense of Hitlerism, added to the confusion and disorderliness of the meeting when, after the vote on the resolution, he suddenly offered a second resolution, which Lord Winterton had previously withdrawn.

Postpone Sentence of Kauf, Aide to Heinz Spanknoebel

NEWARK, N. J., Nov. 23—Sentencing of Walter Kauf, who was the bodyguard of Heinz Spanknoebel, on charges of carrying concealed weapons at riots here recently, was postponed yesterday by Judge Daniel J. Brennan in Essex County Common Pleas Court.

The postponement will give an opportunity to the Committee of Immigration of the House of Representatives headed by Congressman Samuel Dickstein, now conducting an investigation of Nazi affairs, to cross-examine Kauf. He will also be called to testify before the Federal grand jury of the Southern District of New York.

Sentence will be imposed December 7.

Church and Synagogue To Hold Joint Services

Members of the congregation of Beth Shalom People's Temple, Brooklyn, and the First Presbyterian Church will join in a joint good-will service tonight and Sunday morning, Nov. 26.

The Friday night service will be held in the Temple, where the Rev. Robert A. Ashworth, educational secretary of the National Conference of Jews and Christians, will speak.

The Sunday morning service will be held in the church. Rabbi Rudolph I. Coffee, of California, will discuss the subject "Had I Been Born a Christian."

tors who have replaced the Jews who formerly held the posts.

As a result, another order has been issued, which abolishes altogether the dental clinics attached to the Berlin sick funds. A number of individual trade unions, such as the bakers and the barbers unions, have announced the abolition of their dental clinics, apparently because they were unable to find experienced non-Jewish dentists.

From now on, the members of the sick funds will be permitted to consult private dentists and the sick funds will pay the fees. However, if the patient consults a Jewish doctor the fees will be paid only in cases where the Jewish doctors are war veterans and others who are exempt from the Aryan clauses.

Brith Abraham Raises Insurance Assessments

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Nov. 23—The one-day special convention of the Independent Order Brith Abraham, Sunday decided to raise the death benefit assessment in order to comply with the demands of the Massachusetts and Pennsylvania state insurance departments.

According to the report of the credential committee, 420 lodges of the order were represented at the convention by 996 delegates.

The Order decided to take \$12,500 a month from its reserve fund and assess the balance pro rata month to month according to the number of deaths where the family of the deceased gets \$500.00. This will apply to 75,000 class A members.

According to reports submitted to the convention, the total membership of the Order is 95,000 in 500 lodges in 27 states.

The convention also voted to reaffirm by resolution, the endorsement of the anti-Nazi boycott.

After voting not to hold another convention until 1935, the convention adjourned.

which article of the mandate prohibits the restrictions.

When Mr. Janner asked the Colonial Secretary, whether the same ruling applied to Jewish immigration into Transjordan, Sir Philip made no reply.

The British cabinet member declared that altogether 4,000 Arabs entered Palestine from Syria and Transjordan in the years between 1922 and 1931. He was unable to state, however, the Arab immigration figures for the last two years.

Police Break Up Warsaw Demonstrations Against Palestine Restrictions

WARSAW, Poland, Nov. 23—Polish police dispersed demonstrations of Jews protesting against the curtailment of immigration into Palestine. The protest demonstrations were carried out in several places in Warsaw. Some of the demonstrators were arrested by the police.

The governing body of the Jewish community of Lodz unanimously adopted a resolution of protest against the decree of the Palestine government. The resolution of protest will be forwarded to the British government and the League of Nations.

Polish Jewry has reacted most violently to the recent order of the Palestine government sharply curtailing Jewish immigration, and to the campaign to deport all Jewish immigrants who entered Palestine illegally. The Jews of Poland have looked to Palestine as one of the few places that was capable of absorbing the many Jews anxious to emigrate from Poland.

Jewish Fencing Ace Named On German Olympic Team

BERLIN, Nov. 23—Helena Melyer, German Jewish fencing champion in the 1928 Olympiad, will be a member of the German team in the 1936 Olympic games which are to take place in Berlin, despite her exclusion from the Offenbach Fencing Club on the ground that she is a Jewess. The German Fencing Association declared today that her expulsion from the Offenbach club in no way affects her membership in this Association.

The Red and White Tennis Club, which revised its membership requirements in October, excluding all Jews, announced today the expulsion of all members of Jewish origin and those who are married to descendants of Jews. However, it was stated that foreigners will be accepted regardless of race.

Jewish National Fund Flag Day to Be Celebrated Dec. 10

Jewish National Fund Flag Day, to be called officially the Festival of the Blue-White Emblem, will be observed Sunday evening, Dec. 10, by hundreds of Jewish communities throughout the nation. The celebration will commemorate the victory of the Maccabees over the Greeks more than 2,000 years ago. More than 340,000 dunams of land in Palestine have been acquired as Jewish national property since the Keren Kayemeth, the Jewish national fund, initiated its activities thirty-two years ago.

Horace Samuel Appears In Arlosoroff Case as Alibi Of Stavsky Gains Support

JAFFA, Nov. 23—Horace Samuel of London, noted barrister who has been retained by the defense, appeared in court today for the first time in the hearing of the Revisionists accused of the murder of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, noted Zionist labor leader. Mr. Samuel has not as yet taken an active part in the defense. He has merely taken notes and consulted with defense attorneys, but has not spoken in court.

More witnesses testified today in the effort to establish an alibi for Abraham Stavsky, one of the three defendants. Arieh Vorbel testified that he had eaten in a Jerusalem restaurant on the night of June 16, the night of the murder, and had seen Stavsky there at 8:30 that evening. At 8:45 Vorbel and Chaim Bochorov had left the restaurant. Bochorov testified yesterday in Stavsky's behalf.

Sara Rechtscheid, a former waitress in the restaurant, testified that she had noticed a stranger in the restaurant, who was conversing in Polish, and whom she later identified as Stavsky.

She explained that she had been unwilling to testify before, since she had entered Palestine illegally and wished to avoid any publicity. She had come forward now, she said, because she had married and her status as an immigrant was legalized.

The hearing was once more adjourned, this time until next week.

Vienna Jews Protest Over Palestine Restrictions

VIENNA, Nov. 23—The plenum of the Vienna Jewish community today adopted a strong resolution sharply protesting the expulsion of Jews who had entered Palestine illegally, and demanded the withdrawal of the anti-Jewish measures adopted by the government of Palestine.

The resolution adopted by the Vienna Jewish community is one of a series of protest resolutions that have been adopted by various Jewish communities all over Europe, which have reacted strongly against the curtailment of Jewish immigration into Palestine.

Greek Jews Ask Free Immigration

SALONICA, Greece, Nov. 23—A resolution demanding free Jewish immigration into Palestine and protesting against the measures recently adopted by the Palestine government to restrict Jewish immigration was adopted today at a meeting of the Jewish communities in Greece, presided over by the Chief Rabbi of Salonica, Rabbi Zvi Hirsh Koretz.

Federal Official Pledges Action Against Nazis Agitating in Northwest

SEATTLE, Wash., Nov. 23—The Federal government will be on the alert to detect any signs of Nazi propaganda in the Northwest section of the United States, Ralph Bonham, new Federal district director of immigration, announced here. Mr. Bonham takes up his duties here following his transfer from Portland, Ore. The immigration official has been in the service for more than 30 years.

"Deportation laws will be invoked, if Nazi propagandists try to work in the Northwest," Mr. Bonham declared. "I believe, however," he added, "that there is slight danger here of an outbreak of Nazi propaganda, such as the one reported in the East."

The statement of Mr. Bonham was occasioned by the protests of Jewish residents of Longview, who reported that Nazi sailors had landed from German ships and paraded through the town.

P. Allen Rickles, head of the Northwest B'nai B'rith anti-defamation activities, investigated the incident and reported that there was little likelihood that such incidents would recur.

German Jewish Vereins Slighted in German Day Bids

John Leftin, chairman of the publicity committee for the German Day celebration to be held in the Madison Square Garden on December 6, announced yesterday that invitations had been extended to all German vereins and to the general public to take part in the event.

Leaders of the German Jewish organizations, however, stated that they had received no invitation to the affair.

Approximately 300 members of the Steuben Society and other German vereins crowded one of the meeting rooms in the Teutonia Hall on Wednesday night to complete arrangements for the celebration.

Rabbi Klemens Allowed to Leave Russia for Palestine

MOSCOW, Nov. 23—Rabbi Jacob Klemens has received permission from the Soviet government to leave Palestine with his family. Rabbi Klemens left the Soviet Union Sunday.

When the Soviet government, last May, introduced passports for all citizens in order to exile from the cities those whom the Soviet government considered dangerous, Rabbi Klemens was threatened with expulsion from Moscow and was saved only through the intervention of the highest authorities.

Professor van Baeyer's great-grandfather was a Jew, but his grandfather, a convert, was a high Prussian officer, and his father, a Nobel Prize winner.

Jewish students have been prohibited from acting as legal apprentices. This apprenticeship was required of all law students before they were allowed to practice for themselves. The order will make it impossible for Jewish newcomers to enter the legal system except as sons and brothers of those who were killed in the war.

Leningrad Rabbi Did Not Die in Prison, Soviet Says

MOSCOW, Nov. 23.—Soviet authorities yesterday denied emphatically that the former Chief Rabbi of Leningrad, Rabbi Simon Lazarew, died in prison, as the Warsaw rabbinat was informed on Nov. 6. They stated that Rabbi Lazarew had not been arrested for religious propaganda, but for other reasons.

Rabbi Lazarew was freed from prison over a year ago and permitted to return to Leningrad, where he died in his own home, Soviet authorities declared.

The Leningrad rabbi was arrested by the secret police on Feb. 26, 1930, and accused of maintaining illegal connections with rabbinical organizations abroad. On April 3, he was found guilty and sentenced to ten years imprisonment in a concentration camp.

Palestine Takes Men From Cities to Soil

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)

TEL AVIV, Palestine, Nov. 10.—Plans are being worked out here to defer constructional and public works of secondary importance in order to release workers for urgent agricultural labor. The Central Employment Bureau of the Histadrut Haavdim is seeking the cooperation of employers throughout the colonies in the effort to take workers from the city to the country.

The shortage of Jewish workers has become a pressing problem. Newly-arrived immigrants are given employment at once but the demand cannot be completely met, according to Davar, Hebrew daily. The most serious situation exists in the plantations colonies, where vital farm jobs cannot be carried out for want of labor. In many places saplings removed from nurseries for transplanting in the groves are actually decaying for lack of attention.

In the urban building trades there exists a similar problem. Tel Aviv reports lack of skilled craftsmen and artisans, including builders, plasterers, tilers and locksmiths. The setback in building is causing congestion in residential neighborhoods. Carpenters, upholsterers, tinsmiths, locksmiths, metal foundries, ironworkers, mechanics, loomhands and leather-workers are dismally absent.

Forty dwellings in Haifa are standing uncompleted. Roads have been abandoned because of the labor shortage.

Seattle's German Consul Hit by Anti-Defamation Head

SEATTLE, Wash., Nov. 23.—The German consul here was subjected to a bitter verbal attack by P. Allen Rickles, head of the Anti-Defamation League in the Northwest division of B'nai B'rith. The Reich representative, who is the author of a biographical work dealing with George Washington, was said to be injecting Nazi propaganda into his literary work.

W. L. Reinhardt is the German consular head in Seattle.

Jews and to restore peace and order in the universities of Hungary, in the interests of the nation.

Minister of Education Homan today received a deputation from the Jewish community, which demanded adequate government protection for Jewish students. The Minister reassured the delegation and pointed to the strongly worded reply the government had given the anti-Semitic student organizations, as evidence that the government was doing everything in its power to end the student disturbances.

Tel Aviv's Share as Tax Contributor on Increase

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)

TEL AVIV, Palestine, Nov. 11.—That the Municipality of Tel Aviv shares to a large extent in the direct governmental taxation is disclosed in computations published in the Bulletin of the city. Reports indicate the extraordinary progress the township has made, and that today it has a floating population of about 50,000 persons.

In 1930, the city had an 18 per cent contribution to State revenues, according to the Bulletin. Economic turnover, land transactions and direct taxation have increased the municipal expenditure from \$85,000 in 1930 to \$180,000 in 1933. The newspaper adds that in spite of the development of the city's business, and taxation turnover, there was no corresponding grant for public works.
