Police and Military Quell Rioting of Iron Guardsists Against Roumanian Jews (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUCHAREST, Nov. 29.—Spontaneous disorders were reported today following a tumultuous series of outbursts by the anti-Semitic Iron Guardsists yesterday in various localities throughout the nation. Combined military and police forces had the situation in hand after a hundred and fifty Guardsists, including their leader, Zelea Codreanu, had been arrested.

The city of Jassy was the scene of serious disorder throughout the day. Students and other sympathizers, many of whom are allied with the Iron Guard Organization, gave vent to their feelings by raiding 200 Jewish homes, demolishing them and forcibly removing furniture which was hurled into the streets.

Many were injured. No deaths were reported in that city, however.

The dwelling occupied by the Under Secretary of the Interior in Jassy was almost completely demolished. A motor car owned by an attorney named Pogona was destroyed. Pogona was injured.

A Jewish self-defense organization was created to repel further attacks. But firm military reinforcements temporarily restored a semblance of order.

It was reported that a Jewish

Vossische Zeitung Rebukes Gov't for "Inhuman Act" Attacking Children's Status (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Nov. 29.—A courageous editorial criticizing the German government for the order issued Monday declaring the children of marriages between Jews and members of the nobility illegitimate appeared today in the Vossische Zeitung, the newspaper edited by Dr. Georg Bernhard before the Nazis came into power and which has attempted to retain some of the independence and liberal attitude for which it was famed, under coordination of the press by the Nazis.

The paper editorially points out that while revision of the nobility may be justified, "it is an inhuman act to make children, some of whom

Authorities Pledge Action as Hungarian Students Deride Goemboes, Threaten Boycott (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUDAPEST, Nov. 29.—Shouts of derision against Premier M. Julius Goemboes, classifying him as "the protector of the Jewish race", marked the release of thirty-nine anti-Semitic students from jail by police here today. They were charged with violence and assault on Jewish pedestrians.

Cautious lest the acts of violence be repeated, police were planning to bring further action against the agitators on the charge that their anti-Semitic activities also constituted mutiny against the national government.

The Minister of Education published an announcement that the government intends both to satisfy the justified demands of the anti-Jewish students and to insure freedom to pursue their studies to the

Thousands of English Jews packed the hall and voiced their indignation against the immigration policy of the Palestine government.

Frankfurt Nazi Mob Tries To Lynch Jewish Merchant (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Nov. 29.—Scenes resembling an attempted lynching occurred yesterday at Frankfurt, according to reports received here today, when an enraged mob of Nazis assembled before a department store and demanded that its manager, Kurt Aron, who is a Jew, should be handed over to it for summary punishment. Aron, according to leaders of the mob, "made an immoral proposal to an Aryan girl."

The police intervened, dispersed the mob and took Aron into "protective arrest" under the alleged charges.

Riots Not Influencing Immigration Policy of Gov't, Says Cunliffe-Lister (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, Nov. 29.—An emphatic denial that the recent Arab disturbances in Palestine were the result of increased Jewish immigration was made by Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, Colonial Secretary, in the House of Commons tonight.

Cunliffe-Lister's statement came in reply to interpellations by Major General Sir Alfred Knox, Conservative member, who made a suggestion to this effect. The Colonial Secretary explained that the recent improvement in Palestine economic conditions rendered the country attractive to immigration by a self-supporting class, making possible larger immigration quotas for wage-earners.

Cunliffe-Lister evaded direct answer to queries by Josiah Wedgwood, Labor M.P., as to whether the rounding up of Jews illegally in Palestine had not been undertaken as a result of the Arab disturbances. The measures taken by the Palestine government to round up Jews who have overstayed their leave on tourist visas has aroused a storm of protest. The Colonial Secretary insisted that the Arab disturbances had not caused the Palestine government to make any changes in its

Riot Leaders Deny Knowing Jerusalem Protest Banned By Palestine Authorities (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, Nov. 29.—Three members of the Arab Executive today pleaded ignorance of the government's prohibition of the demonstration at Jerusalem on Oct. 13 in mitigation of charges that they incited rioters to clash with the police.

The defendants claimed that they were aware that the procession at Jaffa Gate was prohibited, but each declared he knew nothing of the ban placed on demonstrations at the New Gate and the Damascus Gate because the warning posters escaped their notice.

They disclaimed the idea that

Baltimore Quietly Hears Hitler Advocate Defend Nazi Persecution of Jews

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

BALTIMORE, Nov. 29—Unlike the occasion last Sunday night when 5,000 protestants stormed the hall in Boston where he spoke, the gathering last night at the Chesapeake Club here when Dr. Frederick Schoenemann was the principal speaker, was entirely orderly.

A number of detectives were on hand, but not a single untoward incident occurred. Jews were well represented in the audience at the meeting, held under auspices of the Foreign Policy Association.

Dr. Schoenemann was followed by A. Fenner Brockway, chairman of the Independent Labor party of England. The subject discussed was "Nazi Germany."

At the conclusion of the addresses, Dr. Jacob H. Hollander, professor of political economy at the Johns Hopkins University, brought up the subject of anti-Semitism.

In answer to Dr. Hollander's charge that Jews in Germany had been subjected to discrimination, Dr. Schoenemann said:

"We know we have sinned, radical instincts are stirred up in time of revolution, but in time there will be moderation. We do not defend everything that has taken place during the revolution, but at the same time one cannot generalize and condemn the National Socialist Party on just one item. Hitler did not go to power on anti-Semitism."

Ban Christmas Displays

By Jewish Stores in Mainz

BERLIN, Nov. 29—All Jewish stores in the city of Mainz have been ordered by the authorities not to use Christmas decorations or toys in their displays or to use Christmas decorations in any way for advertising purposes.

The Dresden Chamber of Commerce yesterday forbade Jewish merchants from selling Christmas toys.

Jews and Gentiles Unite In Thanksgiving Services

UTICA, N. Y., Nov. 30—A joint Thanksgiving service in which three churches and a synagogue participated, was held here today.

The Rev. Theodore Speers, of the First Presbyterian Church, preached a sermon dealing with the subject "Judgment of Gratitude". Other churches participating were the Church of Reconciliation, the Plymouth Congregational Church and Temple Beth El, of which S. Josua Kohn is rabbi.

Hebrew Lore Contained in

Ancient Books on Exhibition

The fascinating story of how books four centuries old were made in Poland is told in an exhibition now on display at the Jewish Theological Seminary library, Broadway and 122nd Street.

The collection includes volumes printed in Cracow and Lublin between 1534 and 1691, and other cities of the Polish nation.

At the opening of the exhibit speakers included Dr. Mieczyslaw Marchlewski, Consul General of Poland; Dr. Cyrus Adler, president of the Seminary; Z. Tygel, executive director of the Federation of Polish Jews in America and Professor Alexander Marx, librarian.

Zionist National Guard

In Formation Here

Strengthening the link of international boycott organizations, Commander Sidney Schiff of the Legion of Judea Wednesday announced that a new group is at present being formed to combat persecution of the Jews in Germany. It will be called the Zionist National Guard.

The organization will be affiliated with a similar group operating in England under the leadership of Captain Weber.

Drops Appeal for Heavier

Sentence for Marx, Muehrdel

FRANKFURT, Germany, Nov. 29—The public prosecutor here today dropped his appeal to a higher court in connection with the conviction of Dr. Martin Marx, representative here of the Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith, and Ferdinand Muehrdel, former head of the Frankfurt political police.

Both men had been acquitted of bribery charges but were sentenced to seven months' imprisonment for conduct unbecoming their positions. The prosecutor had filed an appeal for a more severe sentence. Since he has now dropped the appeal, the lower court verdict stands and the two men will soon be freed since they spent five months in prison awaiting trial and almost two months have elapsed since their conviction.

Committee to Combat

Effects of Nazism in U. S.

Plans are under consideration by Supreme Court Justice Mitchell May, president of the Brooklyn Federation of Jewish Charities, and Arthur Garfield Hays, member of the international commission which recently held an impartial trial of the Reichstag arson trial defendants in London, for the formation of a committee whose object will be to fight the effects of Hitlerism in America.

Announcement was made at a dinner of prominent members of the New York bench and bar held at the Astor, that a committee of five will be named by Justice May and Mr. Hays. The committee will also give consideration to the matter of providing relief for lawyers in Germany, both Jewish and Gentile, who have been deprived of their means of livelihood by the Nazi repression. The meeting had been called by the American Jewish Congress.

Einstein Property Seizure

Confession of Weakness

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 29—In an editorial denouncing the seizure of the property of Albert Einstein by the Hitler government, the Los Angeles Times declares that the act is an open confession of weakness on the part of the regime.

"The action of the Nazi government in Germany in confiscating the property of Albert Einstein," says the editorial, "is probably the most stupid blunder the Hitlerites have yet committed. It makes clear that the real objection to Einstein is not his asserted Communism, but his Hebraic ancestry, and that the Nazis are not honest enough and courageous enough to say so."

American Mizrahi Opens Convention at Rochester

ROCHESTER, Nov. 30.—The 17th Annual National Mizrahi-Zionist Convention opened here this afternoon at the Hotel Seneca, with about 700 delegates and guests from all parts of the country in attendance.

The convention was opened by Hyman Kolko, chairman of the Rochester convention committee, who introduced a number of speakers who greeted the audience in the name of the City of Rochester, the Jewish Community of Rochester, the Rochester Mizrahi, the Zionist District of Rochester, the Women's Mizrahi of Rochester, the United Charities and various other organizations.

The principal address of the afternoon was the annual message to the Mizrahi by Rabbi Wolf Gold, president of the Mizrahi of America. Rabbi Gold's message assumed additional importance this afternoon because of the fact that this convention will seek to solve the problems presented by the withdrawal of the Mizrahi from the Zionist Executive.

The annual convention of the Mizrahi Women's Organization will open here Saturday evening at the Hotel Seneca. About 150 delegates and guests are expected to be present at the discussions of the various activities of the organization.

Mrs. Adela Goldstein, president of the Mizrahi Women's Organization, will deliver the opening address. The guest speaker will be Rabbi Gold. Rabbi Gold's topic will be "The Present Political, Economic and Spiritual Situation in Palestine."

The speakers' list will also include the names of the prominent Mizrahi leaders, Rabbi Jacob Levinson and Isidor Epstein.

Rosenbach Scholar Named At Pennsylvania University

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 29.—Shane Leslie, English biographer and poet, has been appointed Rosenbach fellow in bibliography at the University of Pennsylvania for the academic year 1933-34.

The fellowship was established by Dr. A. S. W. Rosenbach, eminent antiquarian and scholar, because of "the steadily increasing interest in bibliography". The chair was first awarded in 1931 to Christopher Morley, essayist and newspaperman. In 1932, Dr. Lawrence C. Wroth, of the John Carter Brown Library of Brown University, held the fellowship and will shortly publish a collection of essays delivered during his incumbency entitled "An American Bookshelf, 1755."

Night in Jail Chastens Defiant Nazi Witness Who Agrees to Testify

Considerably chastened after having spent the night as guest of the government in the West Street Federal House of Detention, Engelborg Roell, secretary of the League of Friends of New Germany, Wednesday expressed the desire to cooperate hereafter with federal authorities in their efforts to reveal the nature of Nazi operations in this country.

Meekly, in contrast to the arrogant front he displayed during the Tuesday hearings in open court, Roell Wednesday appeared before Federal Judge Harry B. Anderson, and offered his services and testimony at hearings. On Tuesday, Judge Anderson had ordered Roell's detention for twenty-four hours when the latter refused to comply with the court's demand for a list of eighty members of the League of Friends of New Germany. His action Wednesday forestalled a threatened penalty for contempt of court.

John Holley Clark, Jr., Roell's counsel, protested to the court against ill treatment allegedly received by the German during his night's residence in the house of detention.

"You mean the jailors mishandled Mr. Roell?" the judge asked.

"No," the counsel replied, "it was the prisoners. They kicked and beat my client."

"Well, prisoners will be prisoners," commented the judge.

Roell, as far as the casual eye of observers could detect Wednesday, bore no outward signs of having been mistreated.

When Roell's counsel declared the intention of taking legal action against the beating his client had allegedly received, Judge Anderson advised that he be given a physical examination at once to ascertain the extent of damage incurred.

Roell promised to bring to court, on its convention next Tuesday, the membership list of the Friends of New Germany as ordered by the court. He also consented to give honest testimony to the activities of his organization before the grand jury.

Roell was brought before Judge Anderson on Tuesday in an open court session after he had defied the authority of the federal grand jury to force him to testify regarding the operations of the League of Friends of New Germany. In presenting the case, William W. Prager, assistant United States attorney, explained before the court that Roell's answers to questions had been evasive and that he had refused stubbornly to give direct responses to his own and the queries of the grand jury.

Reich's Third-Class Status Predicted by Blumenfeld

IOWA CITY, Ia., Nov. 29.—A belief which has already become fixed in the minds of countless thousands, Jews and Gentiles alike, that Germany by its policy of Gleichschaltung, which means that purified Aryanism will be attained at the price of a crushed Jewish population, will thereby become a third-rate power, was expressed by Ralph D. Blumenfeld in an address here.

Speaking before a large audience which gathered at the University of Iowa, Mr. Blumenfeld, for thirty years editor of the London Daily Express, who is now here on a speaking tour, said that by throttling its 600,000 Jews the German nation is losing much of its brain power. The eventual result of the suppression and wholesale expulsion of its "intelligentsia," he said, will be that the Third Reich will lose its place among the commonwealth of world powers.

Under the aegis of the Kaiser, the Reich army and navy and civil service were managed by the aristocracy, which excluded the Jews, Mr. Blumenfeld continued. The latter were obliged to enter other pursuits for their livelihood. These pursuits were chiefly business and scholarship.

Following the War, when German aristocracy found itself dispossessed, the higher-ups demanded the ousting of the Jews, whom they termed usurpers, Mr. Blumenfeld reflected.

"If civilization is to survive," he continued, "the United States and England cooperatively must be prepared to exercise the dominant world influence, else civilization will disappear as other civilizations before have failed and disappeared."

Speaking of the League of Nations, Mr. Blumenfeld said that the conception for this great peace organization was born in the United States, and once born, it was "deserted and left on the doorstep of Europe."

J.N.F. Votes for Observance Of Sabbath on Its Land

A decision to insert in all leases and contracts with settlers on J.N.F. land clauses for the observance of Sabbath so far as it affects field or garden work, was adopted by the Keren Kayemeth, the Jewish National Fund, at a meeting of the board of directors, according to word received here Wednesday by the Jewish National Fund of America.

The decision is in accordance with the program formulated by the Mizrahi, orthodox Zionists, at the last World Zionist Congress at Prague.

policies with regard to the admission of Jews into the country.

Pressed by Wedgewood, who asked whether this deportation policy had not been recently introduced, Cunliffe-Lister replied that it was best for all concerned that immigrants should enter Palestine only through authorized channels. He did not answer the Labor member's question whether the government really intends deporting the 20,000 Jews said to be in Palestine without visas.

Replying to questions regarding the proposed legislative council for Palestine which he had previously announced would be established, the Colonial Secretary declared that there was no intention of placing the Palestine police under the authority of the council. The council is not intended to supersede the High Commissioner of Palestine, he declared.

Palestine, governed by Great Britain under a League of Nations mandate, is administered by an appointive administration under a High Commissioner named by the British Colonial Office.

The legislative council announced by Cunliffe-Lister would provide for popular representation on a council the function of which would be to advise the High Commissioner on Palestine matters.

students who are the object of the outbursts here. There was confidence that the authorities would succeed in quieting the revolt, and crushing the instigators from the outside. Obviously the source of inspiration for the agitators was to be sought by the government, which pledged determined action against the instigators.

The anti-Semitic contingents, however, did not find the arm of the law sufficiently intimidating to curb their passion for violence and destruction. They have countered the police action by threatening to declare a boycott against the Jews and against Gentile protagonists and defenders of the Jews.

ber of the executive of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, severely criticized the government of Palestine for granting an utterly inadequate number of immigration certificates and pointed out that, ironically enough, Jewish enterprise was benefiting the Arabs of Transjordan, instead of the Jews. David Ben-Gurion, of the political department of the Jewish Agency, corroborated the statement of Professor Brodetsky, and declared that it would be impossible for the government to expel thousands of Jews already settled in the country in the campaign now going on.

Dr. Chaim Weizmann, former president of the World Zionist Organization, and now head of the Zionist committee for the settlement of German Jews in Palestine, urged dignified representations for justice to the government of Palestine.

The noted Zionist leader, whose return to active work for Palestine was hailed by the audience, predicted that the growing city of Haifa, like Alexandria in Egypt, could easily absorb six hundred thousand new inhabitants, and expressed the hope that the newcomers would be Jews. The meeting was under the auspices of the English Zionist Federation.

Rabbi Twersky Dead

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon for Rabbi Isaac Twersky, brother of the Talner Rebbe. Rabbi Twersky died at Israel Zion Hospital Tuesday evening after a long illness. He is survived by his wife and two children. Rabbi Twersky was 31.

girls' school in Sereteanu was attacked by a gang of hooligans who sent a barrage of stones and missiles through the windows and doors. A panic resulted. Many young girls became ill with fright.

Outside the city limits of Bucharest an attempt by students to stage a demonstration was crushed by police who succeeded in dispersing them after making twenty arrests.

In Constanza, one Iron Guardist was killed and two were wounded when police fought students who participated in an anti-Jewish demonstration.

From towns scattered all over Roumania came reports of violence yesterday resulting generally in destruction and vandalism.

Both the Roumanian government which earlier in the day issued a communique condemning the wave of anti-Semitism which has swept the country, and the League of Nations will be petitioned to take immediate action to guarantee the safety of Jewish citizens.

The Jewish community in Jassy has been preparing photographs of the scenes of rioting. These will be submitted together with other evidence of the violent anti-Semitic outbreak.

A threat publicized by Octavian Goga, another anti-Semitic leader, indicating that violence would increase in intensity if the government persisted in quelling the rioters, aggravated the trouble in Jassy.

The government communique cautioned political parties against engaging in the melees. It promised to withdraw the right of casting ballot from agitating political units.
