Discriminate Against Jews In German Winter Relief Despite Government Pledge

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BRESLAU, Germany, Dec. 6.—Despite the orders not to discriminate against the Jews in the issuing of winter relief for the unemployed, Breslau Jews are receiving no relief and are being exposed to starvation.

In Bavaria, the relief administration refuses to recognize the orders from Berlin not to discriminate against Jews. In Offenbach, Jewish unemployed are receiving relief cards only on the express condition that they will obtain the meat and coal they are being given, from Aryan stores, thus leaving the Jewish butchers and coal dealers isolated.

The order from Berlin not to discriminate against the Jews in unemployed relief, said to have been issued on the direct orders of Chancellor Hitler, aroused great interest outside of Germany and was regarded as a let-down in the Nazi measures against the Jews. The order follows an agreement between the government and central Jewish relief organizations in which the latter agreed to urge Jewish contributions to the general relief funds.

Estonia Weighs End of Minority Rights There

RIGA, Latvia, Dec. 6.—In view of the fact that the German minority in the Republic of Estonia, has espoused the Nazi ideals and have officially declared themselves Nazis, the Estonian government is planning to do away with minority rights in Estonia, it is learned here.

Weizmann Coming Here For Tour in January

Dr. Chaim Weizmann, former president of the World Zionist Organization, and now head of the Zionist Commission for the settlement of German Jews in Palestine, will arrive in New York, some time in January, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learned yesterday.

Dr. Weizmann will spend six weeks in the United States in furthering the work of his commission. A speaking tour of the country is being arranged for Dr. Weizmann.

DR. WEIZMANN WARNS OF NEW REFUGEE WAVE, ANTI-SEMITISM INCREASE, PALESTINE SOLUTION

LAUSANNE, Dec. 6.—Settlement of the problem created by the presence of thousands of political and religious refugees from Germany is a task involving all the principles of civilization and requires measures of a permanent nature, Lord Robert Cecil, famous British statesman and temporary chairman of the autonomous governing body created by the League of Nations to cope with the problem, declared today in opening the commission's second day of deliberations.

Members of the governing body heard Dr. Chaim Weizmann, chairman of the Zionist drive to settle German Jewish refugees in Palestine, describe the capabilities of that country to absorb a large number of refugees, as well as the migration possibilities open in other countries.

Representatives of Jewish relief organizations which have been active in refugee aid, addressed the session pledging support to the governing body.

Pointing out that the "whole civilized world is interested in the solution of the refugee problem," Lord Cecil declared it could not be disposed of by barring the gates of countries to the refugees. Such a course would be incompatible with Christian civilization, he stated. Relief measures, the statesman warned,

were only a temporary measure.

"The only way is to make the refugees self-supporting, which must be done through absorption in existing communities and establishment in various parts of the world of new communities through colonization," he advised. "The task is of vital importance, concerning all the principles of civilization."

Dr. Weizmann, in a one-hour address before the commission, recommended that an advisory committee composed of representatives of Jewish organizations and communities be appointed by the governing body. He recalled that this proposal had been made by the London conference for the relief of German Jews, at which practically every large Jewish agency in the world had been represented.

Describing the tasks that must be accomplished, Dr. Weizmann said they were:

"Firstly, the amelioration of the position of Jews staying in Germany, who are outside the scope of

Only 2,000 Refugees in Belgium, Gov't Declares

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BRUSSELS, Belgium, Dec. 6.—The actual number of German refugees in Belgium is less than 2,000 and not 20,000 as reported, according to an announcement made today by the government. Never has the number exceeded 2,800.

"In accordance with its traditional policy Belgium received the German refugees with open arms," said the announcement. "The government, however, made it clear to refugees that in view of the economic crisis, they must consider Belgium only as a transit country from which they must proceed to other places for permanent settlement.

"Jewish relief committees are assisting large numbers of refugees to proceed to South America and Argentina. Only a few exceptions are permitted to settle in Belgium.

"Contrary to reports, the number of refugees never exceeded 2,800 and is now actually less than 2,000."

Boris Katzman, Veteran Zionist, Dies in Colony Founded By His Father

JERUSALEM, Dec. 6.—Boris Katzman, veteran Zionist and friend of Dr. Theodor Herzl, founder of the modern Zionist movement, died in Rehoboth today at the age of 59. Mr. Katzman died on a farm in Rehoboth, a colony which his father had founded. A few months ago, he married Ruth Light, an American painter. It was his second marriage.

Mr. Katzman was one of the most colorful figures in the Zionist movement, and worked in close association with Dr. Herzl.

He was born in Russia, in the Ukraine, in 1874, the son of a wealthy Jewish landowner. While

Australian Settlement**For Jewish Refugees
Considered Feasible**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

MELBOURNE, Australia, Dec. 6
—An investigation of the territory
and climatic conditions in the north-
ern part of Australia as a potential
haven for Jewish exiles was under-
taken by Melach Ravitch, Bundist
Jewish writer of Poland, who told
the Jewish Telegraphic Agency to-
day that the scheme for such a set-
tlement warrants further investiga-
tion by a commission of experts.

In spite of the fact that the iso-
lation of the Northern territory, and
its tropical climate, would constitute
in a measure serious drawbacks to
many persons wishing to settle, Mr.
Ravitch said there are redeeming
features.

Before further plans could be
made in this direction, he pointed
out, immediate measures would have
to be taken to prevent Jewish emi-
grants from leaving the northern
coast and retreating to the south. A
settlement comprising 5,000 families
would be essential, he insisted, and
could be established as a cost of
about two million pounds.

This would be possible, he said,
provided the Australian government
could be convinced of the feasibility
of the plan and would agree to co-
operate.

the High Commissioner and concern
only Jewish bodies.

"Secondly, for absorption of re-
fugees, re-training and re-adapta-
tion, especially of the youth, is
necessary."

He warned that "a new wave of
refugees may make an already diffi-
cult problem utterly unmanageable."

Referring to the immigration pos-
sibilities of the various countries,
Dr. Weizmann declared there were
some openings in the United States,
the British Dominions, the French
dependencies and some of the man-
dated territories, some of the South
American countries and, to a con-
siderable extent, in Palestine.

"A new wave of anti-Semitism
sweeping the world makes patent
that the peculiar economic and so-
cial structure of Jewry cannot be
maintained in the face of a changing
world," Dr. Weizmann declared.
"The success of Palestine is based
on the determination of the Jews to
found their lives on a normal, pro-
ductive basis.

"Palestine," he noted Zionists
learned told the governing body, "is
the only country where the Jew
comes not on sufferance as in other
countries. The governing body may
help in the realization of these
strivings, fulfilling, perhaps, the last
hope of the Jews."

The plight of the intellectual ele-
ments forced from Germany was
described to the governing body by
Professor William Rappard, of
Switzerland. He asked that they be
given consideration and facilities for
utilization of their capabilities.

Dr. Nahum Goldman, chairman of
the Committee of Jewish Delega-
tions, speaking in behalf of that
body and the American Jewish Con-
gress, declared that both organiza-
tions, representing large masses,
have always been convinced that the
Jewish question is international in
scope. He expressed the hope that
the governing body would accept the
London relief conference's sugges-
tion regarding the inclusion of Jew-
ish organizations in an advisory
body.

Tomorrow's meeting will be held
in private, but on Friday, it is ex-
pected, there will be a public ses-
sion. Declarations by the various
governments are also expected on
Friday.

Vaad Leumi Requests**Increased Subsidies**

JERUSALEM, Dec. 6—The Vaad
Leumi, the Jewish National Council
for Palestine, today submitted a
memorandum to the Palestine gov-
ernment requesting an increase in
the educational and health grants
made by the government.

The government subsidy for the
Jewish public health services for
the year ending Sept. 30, 1933, was
2,500 pounds (Palestine), or 2.6 per-
cent of the total budget of the Jew-
ish community for this work. The
public school system subsidy
amounted to 19,175 pounds (Palestine)
of a total budget of 101,899
pounds.

Commission to Investigate**Nazi Concentration Camps**

A preliminary meeting for the
purpose of establishing an impartial
inquiry into the conditions of Ger-
man prison and concentration camps
and reported German atrocities will
be held on December 8, in Paris, the
American Committee Against Fascist
Oppression in Germany announced
yesterday.

Twenty-five German refugees, who
recently escaped from German con-
centration camps, and a number of
women refugees who charge that
their husbands were murdered in
Germany, will testify at the Paris
hearing.

The American section of the In-
ternational Inquiry Committee has

Japanese, Hindus Not Hit By Nazi 'Aryan' Clause

BERLIN, Dec. 6.—The racial lines now in existence in Germany, and which the Nazi regime is furthering, are intended for Jews only and not for Japanese, Hindus or other Asiatic nations, Dr. Wilhelm Frick, Minister of the Interior, in the Nazi cabinet, declared last night in an official statement to the German press.

Dr. Frick declared most emphatically that the alarming attitude against the racial policy of Germany, which was recently assumed by Japanese and Hindu newspapers is groundless, because German racial policy will hit only the Jews. The Nazis, Dr. Frick stated, consider the nations of Asia as "ancient nations of high culture and the German government is far from desiring to eliminate them."

Apparently in a desire to justify the steps being taken by the Nazi government against the Jews, the German press is suddenly filled with inspired statistics proving that the Jewish population of Prussia increased ten per cent between 1919 and 1925.

Rashi Arch at Worms Is Renamed for Anti-Semite

BERLIN, Dec. 6.—The historic Rashi Arch, at Worms, erected to the memory of the great Jewish scholar and commentator on the Bible, and which has been standing for hundreds of years, has been renamed the Klaus Selzner Arch by the Nazis. According to the Wormser Volkszeitung, Selzner was "a prominent fighter against the Jewish spirit."

The Rashi, Rabbi Solomon Bar Isaac, was born in Troyes, France, in 1040 and died there in 1105. A legend even in his own day, innumerable stories, both fact and fiction, have grown up around the Rashi. It is known, however, that the family of the Rashi lived in Worms for some time and that the Rashi studied in the schools of the Worms Jewish community for some time.

Riggs in Dual Post

JERUSALEM, Dec. 6.—Alfred William Riggs, assistant superintendent of the Criminal Investigation Department, has been gazetted as an immigration officer of the Palestine government while retaining his present police duties.

Superintendent Riggs will have both capacities for the duration of Worms, there is the Rashi chapel, where he studied, as well as many other objects associated with his stay in Worms.

Dickstein Committee Hears Of Imported Propaganda

WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 6.—Translations of twelve German newspapers which have been smuggled into the United States or printed here, were today read into the record of the investigation into Nazi propaganda activities being carried on by the Dickstein committee.

The subject matter of the journalistic material is ostensibly intended to convert Americans to the Nazi banner.

Tomorrow the committee will query two representatives of steamship companies who will be asked to testify as to how Nazi literature is being brought into the United States.

With its investigation machinery running smoothly, according to Congressman Dickstein, the committee has succeeded in gathering for its fast-growing store of evidence printed matter and letters seized at the New York port of entry. Certain authorization papers belonging to one Carl Heim, a New Yorker, revealing him to be a Nazi agent, were read into the record after being translated. Samuel Schermer and Francis Cataggio, United States customs guards, who testified yesterday, surrendered the letters together with printed material. In addition portions of Adolf Hitler's recent book, "Mein Kampf", proving his inclination to spread Nazi doctrine through foreign emissaries, were read into the minutes of the proceedings.

Representative Dickstein commented as follows on the progress of the investigation:

"I am more than satisfied with the information that has been made available to the committee. I am particularly pleased with the splendid cooperation American citizens have given us in unearthing the necessary information."

He said that the picture of Nazi activities in this country which is given by the evidence on hand, is "quite interesting."

Jewish Medical Students Barred from Clinic Work

HAMBURG, Germany, Dec. 6.—Jewish medical students in the University of Hamburg, have been excluded from the university clinics on the pretext that the accommodations are insufficient for the number of students.

Jewish student holding the yellow tickets, without which no Jewish student is allowed in class rooms, have been permitted to enter the clinics only when Aryan students are absent.

Goemboes Acts to End Anti-Jewish Disorders

BUDAPEST, Dec. 6.—Premier Julius Goemboes conferred today with Professor Balint Homan, Minister of Education, on methods of quietening down the anti-Semitic disturbances in Hungarian universities. The government officials decided to invite the anti-Semitic student leaders to a parley where the government viewpoint would be explained to them and the government's final concessions to ensure peace would be revealed. The government has previously rejected student demands for a strict numerus clausus and segregation of Jewish students in the class-rooms, pointing out that the present laws sufficiently restrict Jewish admission to the institutions.

The Jewish students have determined to reject the so-called "ghetto benches" which the nationalist students demand they occupy and eventually, to refrain from attendance at classes, until the authorities guarantee peace and equality of treatment to legally enrolled Jewish students.

Mobilize Autos for Anti- Jewish Christmas Drive

BERLIN, Dec. 6.—Every motor car and bicycle in Giessen, Hesse, a town of some 33,000 population, has been ordered to carry posters reading "German Christians, don't buy presents from Jewish stores", the Nazi Commissar for Hesse, Schimmel, announced today.

Commissar Schimmel announced that this mobilization of motor cars for the anti-Jewish boycott would be extended to the entire province of Hesse. He explained that the new campaign against the Jews would be conducted by the Retailers Association, and not the official Nazi party.

Dispatches from Berlin yesterday stated that in Berlin, the Nazi party itself, was directing a boycott of the Jewish stores during the Christmas rush and appealing to the Germans to buy only in Christian stores.

Palestine Trials Postponed

JAFFA, Palestine, Dec. 6.—The trial of the Arab leaders accused of instigating the recent disorders in this city, which had been set for today, was postponed until Dec. 18 because of the illness of Chief Magistrate Bodilly.

The continuation of the hearings for the three defendants in the murder of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff has had to be put over until Dec. 12. Magistrate Bodilly is presiding at the hearings.

Dr. Hess, Medical Scholar, Dies at Age of 58

Dr. Alfred Fabian Hess, eminent pediatrician and winner of the John Scott medal for studies on the operative influence of light on rickets, which was a cure for the disease, died suddenly Tuesday night at the age of fifty-eight.

Long a patron of the Home for Hebrew Infants and chairman of its medical board, Dr. Hess was the husband of the former Miss Sara Straus, sister of Jesse Isidor Straus, U. S. Ambassador to France. He studied at Harvard and Columbia Medical School.

Services Held for Isaac Frank

Funeral services for Isaac Frank, seventy years old, who died Tuesday at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Philip Brenner, were held yesterday at the Jewish Memorial Chapel, 1406 Pitkin Ave., Brooklyn. Mr. Frank was buried in the Washington Cemetery, Brooklyn.

Mr. Frank was widely known in Jewish circles in Brooklyn as a pioneer Zionist and a leading supporter of Jewish philanthropic societies in New York.

Boris Katzman, Veteran Zionist, Dies at Age of 59

he was studying in the Russian secondary schools, he heard of Dr. Herzl's call for the first Zionist Congress. Katzman entered into communication with Dr. Herzl and was authorized to make a tour of Russia, to urge the Russian Jews to participate in the election of delegates to the Congress. From that time on, Katzman devoted most of his energies to working for the cause of Zionism.

Sent by his father to complete his education at the University of Vienna, Katzman became a leader of the Jewish students at the university and a duellist of note, fighting many duels with the anti-Semitic students of Vienna. He was expelled from the university for refusing to obey an anti-Jewish regulation of the university. At the University of Montpellier in France, Katzman graduated as a chemical engineer, specializing in agricultural chemistry.

After his graduation he secured work as an engineer in sugar factories in the West Indies and in Lyons, N. Y. Later he became consulting chemist for the Kellogg Company in Battle Creek, Michigan. He visited Palestine frequently and was forever, in the words of one of his intimate friends, "evolving grandiose schemes for the benefit of Palestine." Katzman was a member of the Zionist Organization of America, never having joined any particular faction.

During the Bolshevik revolution, Katzman's family in Russia was ruined, the Bolsheviks confiscating their property. After many hardships, the aged father escaped from Soviet Russia and after incredible difficulties made his way to Palestine and to his Rehoboth farm. Two months after he landed in Palestine he died, and his son arrived from America too late to see his father alive.

Some time ago, one of the projects evolved by Katzman interested American Zionists, particularly Justice Louis D. Brandeis, who provided funds for the experiments. Katzman perfected a process for extracting oil from the lime shale so plentiful in Palestine. The process was a success, but the development of the Mosul oil fields in near-by Iraq, made his process commercially unprofitable. Katzman remained in Palestine, sending for the two children of his first marriage to join him in Palestine. Katzman spent more than ten years in the United States, living in New York most of the time.
