LORD CECIL TO REMAIN AS CHAIRMAN OF REFUGEE GOVERNING BODY AND EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LAUSANNE, Dec. 7.—Viscount Cecil of Chelwood agreed today to remain as chairman of the governing body of the autonomous body, created by the League of Nations, to handle the German refugee problem, and also to head the permanent executive committee of the autonomous body. The small executive committee decided upon will contain representatives of France, Switzerland, Great Britain, Holland and Uruguay.

Lord Cecil's decision to accept the chairmanship of the autonomous body, comes after he had previously refused to accept the responsibility, because of the press of other work.

The advisory committee to the autonomous body, which meets this afternoon, will probably agree to include eight Jewish organizations in its own membership, it was learned. The decision of the advisory body is in accordance with the desire expressed by the recent London conference for the relief of German Jews, that more Jewish organizations be included in the advisory body, in view of the fact that the task of raising money for the refugee work would, in the main, fall upon Jewish organizations. Originally it had been planned to include only three Jewish organizations. The eight organizations to be invited will be chosen from the list submitted by the London conference. The American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, it is reported, formerly had opposed this action.

Three Jewish representatives will be elected by the advisory committee

to seats on the governing body. However, they will not have the power to vote. The Jewish Agency for Palestine, the Joint Distribution Committee and the Jewish Colonization Association are to have the seats on the governing body.

Dr. Alberto Guani, Uruguayan diplomat and jurist, and at present Uruguayan Minister to France, was elected vice-chairman of the autonomous body.

Rectors Endorse Student Demand for Jewish Quotas, Seek Approval of Goemboes

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUDAPEST, Hungary, Dec. 7.—Rectors of the universities today received representatives of the Christian nationalist students who have been agitating against their Jewish classmates and have been demanding that registration of Jews be restricted.

An agreement was reached pending ratification by Premier Julius Goemboes, between the rectors and student delegates, for enforcement of a strict numerus clausus by the enrollment commission on Jewish students next term.

In addition, a special employment bureau will be established for Christian university graduates, the rectors agreed.

The student leaders promised to guarantee peace in the institutions of higher learning provided the Premier, who will also confer with the students, endorses the settlement reached.

'HEIL HITLER' RESOUNDS AS STEUBEN SOCIETY DENOUNCES BOYCOTT, ACCLAIMS NEW GERMANY

Attacking the anti-German boycott, the New York City government, the part played by the United States in the World War, and the Versailles Treaty, the Steuben Society on Wednesday night acclaimed Hitler and Nazi policies in an enthusiastic celebration of German Day at the Madison Square Garden before a packed house of more than 20,000 persons. A number of Jews attending the meeting were man-handled and driven from the hall over their protestations of having come to the affair as a gesture of good will.

Among those ousted from the celebration were Robert Rosenbaum, president of the Federation of German Jewish Societies, and Dr. Fritz Schlesinger, a prominent member of German Jewish social circles in this city. Both assert that they were holding their peace when members of the Steuben Society pointed them out to police and demanded their ejection.

Dr. Schlesinger yesterday, in recounting his ejection from the cele-

bration, declared he is drafting a vigorous protest to the Steuben Society for their treatment of him, Mr. Rosenbaum and four Jewish members of his party. He said his lawyers are considering the desirability of bringing suit against the Steuben Society for "its unwarranted and vicious attack upon our persons and for the disgraceful consequences of our treatment" before the Garden crowd.

Opening the speaking program of the celebration, Gustav W. M. Wieboldt, chairman of the German Day Committee, explained that a challenge had been issued by "those who call themselves 100 percent Americans and American leaders." He said, "It is time the Steuben Society stepped in as leaders to take up this challenge." At mention of "those who call themselves 100 percent American", Mr. Wieboldt was roundly booed from various parts of the Garden.

Daniel C. Roper, United States Secretary of Commerce, tendered

Introduce Quota for Jews

In Art, Music Schools

BERLIN, Dec. 7.—Bernhard Rust, Prussian Minister of Education, today ordered the introduction of a numerus clausus against the Jewish students in art and music schools and academies. Only one and one-half percent of the students in these institutions are to be Jewish. However, this is exclusive of the non-Aryans who participated in the war, and the children of mixed marriages.

Father and Son, Together, Graduate Hebrew University

The graduates of Hebrew University who will receive diplomas at commencement exercises during the coming Chanukah holidays, will include Ephraim Duvshani and his son, aged 43 and 23 respectively.

They have been classmates in courses dealing with Hebrew literature and philosophy. Both are candidates for Master of Arts degrees. Mr. Duvshani senior emigrated from Poland in 1906 and is a school teacher in Jerusalem. His son is a native Palestinian.

According to the American Friends of Hebrew University announcement, another of the graduates to receive a degree is a blind man who has been a resident at the Institute of the Jewish Blind in the capital since 1914. He is a basket-weaver, and a specialist in Hebrew literature.

The sightless student reads Latin and Hebrew in braille. His classmates assist in his studies by reading examination papers to him and taking dictation. He uses the Hebrew typewriter and is an expert linguist.

Einstein Concert Postponed

the greetings of President Roosevelt to the assemblage, expressed the gratitude of the United States for the German contributions to the American people, and explained at length the new responsibilities of all Americans toward the National Recovery program.

Hitler Salute for President

At the conclusion of his address, Wieboldt called for three cheers for the President. The audience responded, at the same time giving the Hitler salute.

Major General John F. Preston, Inspector General of the United States Army, and Rear Admiral Yates Stirling, Jr., Commandant of the United States Navy Yard in Brooklyn, traced the history of the Germans in this country and eulogized the part played by Germans in American military forces since Steuben joined the forces of George Washington.

As German Ambassador Dr. Hans Luther arose to speak the audience accorded him a tremendous Nazi ovation. "Heil" resounded throughout the large main hall of the Garden, as Luther stood at the rostrum and rendered the Nazi salute. The tumult had scarcely died down, when a woman fifty feet from the rostrum screamed, "Down with Hitler, down with Hitler!" The cry was taken up in all parts of the Garden, as the surprised audience countered with "Heil Hitler!" Chairman Wieboldt rushed to the microphone and pleaded, "Please, please, give Dr. Luther a chance to speak."

Police rushed to various parts of the Garden and escorted shouting men and women from their seats out of the hall. The band struck up "Deutschland Ueber Alles", and the audience joined in singing it.

Three heils were called for Hitler. They were given with the utmost enthusiasm. And Dr. Luther announced, "I bring you greetings from the old fatherland", as a score or more of police formed a solid cordon around the rostrum.

Praises Chancellor

Ambassador Luther praised the chancellor of Germany and attributed to him progress in reducing unemployment. He asked that reports on Hitler's administration of German affairs be discredited.

He listed three demands of the German people: that Hitler's peace utterances be believed; that Germany be regarded as the equal of other nations, and that Germany be given the right to regulate her own affairs.

At the conclusion of his speech,

another woman was dragged from her seat bawling, "Down with Hitler", and many other dissenters followed her as the band again struck up to drown out all protest. Luther repeatedly saluted his audience in the Hitler fashion.

Attacks Boycott

Theodore Hoffmann, acting chairman of the National Council of the Steuben Society, climaxed the speaking program with an attack upon the mayor of New York, the boycott, American participation in the World War, and praise of the United German Societies, control of which has recently been taken over by members of the League of Friends of New Germany, Hitlerite supporters and agitators in this country.

"For thirty years," said Mr. Hoffmann, "the United German Societies have with dignity and in true American spirit celebrated 'German Day', a day dedicated to the memory and achievements of those of their race in this country. We know that the organizations affiliated with the United German Societies have contributed loyally to the welfare of this great city and therefore of the nation, and we resent the attempts of professional agitators and certain newspapers to brand this society as being un-American, and attempting to use German Day to spread propaganda contrary to the interests of the country."

He made no mention of the disappearance of Heinz Spanknoebel, head of the Friends of New Germany and scheduled as principal speaker at the suspended German Day celebration, who is now wanted for subversive representation of the Nazi government here.

Betrayed Into War

"Due to the gradually sobering effects of the after-war period," Mr. Hoffmann said in part, "that period when the people of our country (America) began to realize how shamefully they had been betrayed into sacrificing the lives of our young men to an unworthy cause, a cause as unlike the idealistic fata morgana which led them to their deaths on the fields of Flanders, as different, I say, as Heaven and Hell, our Congress refused to be tied down to all provisions of the Versailles Treaty but came to an understanding with the German nation in a separate treaty."

Hoffmann proposed three resolutions: To support the President against the forces of depression and poverty and special privilege; to expedite Germany's return to normalcy

May Force German Jews To Quit Larger Cities To Relieve Congestion

BERLIN, Dec. 7.—German Jews will be compelled to move out of the larger cities, it was indicated by governmental authorities in announcing the establishment of a special commission by the Reich Ministry of the Interior for the depopulation of the German cities.

The new commission will work on the principle of "Aryan blood and Aryan soil" and those who do not come within these categories will have to leave the great cities and move to specified neighborhoods and other places.

The official pretext for the creation of the depopulation commission is that the German cities are too congested.

Nazi Propagandists Decide On Widespread Cuba Drive

HAVANA, Cuba, Dec. 7.—The propaganda emissaries of the Third Reich have invaded Cuba and will shortly commence the work of evangelizing the precepts of the Nazi government.

At a meeting Sunday night of the Nazi sympathizers held in the German Club, of which Eric Tropol, head of the German consulate, is the president, the decision was reached to carry on a widespread campaign to Nazify the country.

Five Jews who were arrested at the time of the most recent revolution in Cuba, have been released by Colonel Batista, Army head.

Six Jews who were stowaways on a German ship bound for the United States and were returned, have been released after intervention by the Jewish Center here. They were in detention for eight weeks.

Windows of the business establishments owned by Luis Jurick, an American citizen who is also the president of the Jewish Center, were destroyed by vandals yesterday. His place was then looted.

At the same time the home owned by Ben Dizik, a merchant, was robbed and a sizable sum of money as well as valuable gold objects were taken.

Asks Rabbi on Chapel Staff

SYRACUSE, Dec. 7.—Rabbi Benjamin Friedman of Temple Society of Concord, appealed to Jewish alumni of Syracuse University for placement of a rabbi on Dean William H. Power's Chapel staff. Rabbi Friedman said that attainment of this project on the local campus would do much to co-ordinate the activities of the Jewish students at the university.

Detroit Catholic Educator Attacks 'International' Jews

DETROIT, Dec. 7.—Speaking at the dinner at the Book-Cadillac Hotel here which closed the sessions of the Catholic Conference on Industrial Problems, Dr. George Hermann Derry, president of Marygrove College of Detroit, attacked the Swope plan for control of industry and made the charge that "a few international Jews hold a stranglehold on the world supply of gold that enables them to decide the destiny of nations, to make and unmake cabinets, and to rule the fate of mankind."

When a demand was made by Dr. Leo M. Franklin today that Dr. Derry produce proof of his charges, he refused to do so and said that he did not have to do that—that he had the proof himself and that was sufficient.

On previous occasions, Dr. Derry attacked the Jews when referring to Communist Russia, blaming Jewry for Communism, and always referring to "those Jews."

Feeling runs high here in resentment against Dr. Derry's statements, and a group of leaders is planning to press the issue and to demand proof or an apology from Dr. Derry.

Meeting Here Sunday to Reorganize U. S. Maccabee

The New York chapter of the United States Maccabee Association will meet Sunday evening in the Bronx Y.M.H.A., Fulton Avenue and 171st Street, for the purpose of reorganizing the association in this city.

The U. S. Maccabee Association, an affiliate of the World Maccabee Union which has international headquarters in London, will attempt to revivify interest in the movement and enroll 100,000 members in this country.

The purpose of the movement is to upbuild Palestine by enlisting the resources of Jewish youths who are interested in physical and cultural self-development.

Lord Melchett, honorary president of the World Union, recently commissioned Nathan L. Goldstein, Zionist and New York attorney, to head the revival movement in the United States. Plans are under way for participation by the United States group in the second Maccabiad scheduled to be held in Palestine in 1935.

Jewish Mayor Re-elected

CORNWALL, Ontario, Dec. 7.—Aaron Horowitz, Jewish mayor of Cornwall, has been re-elected by a large majority.

Schechita Ban in Effect; Community Urges Jews To Observe the Law

BERLIN, Dec. 7.—The prohibition of schechita, the method of killing animals for food prescribed by Jewish religious law, entered into force today in Germany. The prohibition applies to all ritual killing including poultry.

The Berlin Jewish community issued an appeal today to the Jewish population of Berlin to refrain from illegal schechita of poultry or buying from firms which can be considered violators of the anti-schechita law.

The law against schechita, which was announced some time ago, was passed because the Nazis claimed that schechita was a cruel method of killing animals.

Tel Aviv Extends Leases To Prevent Rent Raising

TEL AVIV, Palestine, Dec. 7.—The Tel Aviv city council, in view of the critical housing condition in the city, has voted to extend all leases on homes in this city for a fourteen month period. The city, which has grown tremendously in the last ten years, is faced by a shortage of housing for its population, hundreds here living in tents and impoverished shelters.

The steady flow of new inhabitants into the city has created a situation putting all houses and apartments at a premium and the council was compelled to extend all leases in order to prevent rents from sky-rocketing.

A heavy building program is being pushed here with homes and apartment houses under erection in all parts of the city. The shortage of skilled labor, however, has seriously handicapped the building program and prevented it from keeping pace with the population requirements.

Rabbi DeSola Pool Urges Vigorous Nazi Boycott

YONKERS, N. Y., Dec. 7.—Rabbi David DeSola Pool of the Spanish Portuguese Synagogue in New York, endorsed the boycott of German goods in an address delivered before the Baptist Church of the Redeemer here.

"The only thing Americans can do to help the 600,000 disfranchised German Jews, who are now in abject poverty, with no country open to them, is to use the boycott," declared Rabbi DeSola Pool.

"We can refuse to travel on German boats," he said, "we can boycott everything that Germany makes. That is our only weapon."

Posts, made public by the latter, were published today in all German newspapers prohibiting the boycotting of Jewish firms.

In a communication addressed to the Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith, the central post administration stated that no post official had ever been prohibited from patronizing Jewish firms, and that any official who maintained that such a prohibition had been ordered would be punished if reported to the proper authorities.

The Bavarian Minister of Economics issued a circular to all local authorities in Bavaria, including gendarmerie headquarters in the small towns, where the Jewish merchants suffer greatly from the anti-Jewish boycott, prohibiting the hindrance of Jewish trade.

"It is an attack against our entire economic system", the circular declared, "when Jewish traders are not permitted to enter certain districts, pass certain roads or are isolated in market places. I hereby state that such measures must be strictly combatted," the Minister ordered.

The Association of Wine and Spirit Industry, today announced itself as being against the boycott of Jewish shops. In view of the rush of Christmas trade, this decision is expected to have important consequences.

'Heil Hitler' Resounds at German Day Celebration

by lessening pressure and intervention by official or unofficial spokesmen of public groups in other countries, and to protest and deny the right to carry on a high pressure propaganda and boycott in the United States; and to condemn the suspension of German Day by Mayor O'Brien on October 29, when it was to have been held under the auspices of the United German Societies.

Free Speech

While leaders of the celebration called for the suppression of anti-German free speech, at both ends of the Garden were hung large signs admonishing: "Americans—The inalienable right of free speech—The inalienable right of free assemblage—Hold them sacred—Never surrender them." The Hitler banner, the swastika, decorated the platform perhaps to further signify individual rights enjoyed by residents of Germany.

The celebration, originally called "German Day celebration" had been changed by its sponsors to "German Day and Free Speech celebration."

Commenting on his ejection after the celebration, Dr. Fritz Schlesinger said, "Our ousting from the German Day celebration was a deliberate frame-up. We were there as representatives of the German Jewish federations as a gesture of good will toward the German organizations, which, it had repeatedly been asserted, were celebrating as Americans and without discrimination as to race or creed."

No Heckling at Time

"Six of us were given seats not far from the rostrum. At first we were told the seats had been reserved, but Carl Nicolay, the president of the United German Societies and a member of the celebration committee, later gave us these places. We took no part in the heckling, and at the time of our being dragged from our seats there was no heckling."

"Someone led the police over to us and demanded that we be thrown out. We asked Robert Leyendecker, chairman of the reception committee, to identify us and give us protection."

"Mr. Leyendecker knew both Mr. Rosenbaum and myself very well. We have frequently met with him in the conduct of the affairs of our German Jewish groups. He stared coldly at us on this occasion and offered no word to help us as the police dragged us away."

"In the investigating room of the Garden the police recognized us and promptly released us with apologies. Unable to protect ourselves against the hostile audience and of-

where one of the parents or two of the grandparents are Aryans.

Jewish students who come within the numerus clausus quota will be compelled to pass special examinations to prove their fitness for an education in music or in art. In addition they will be asked to prove their close contact with the German nation.

Open Farm School Registration

Registration in the National Farm School which occupies 1,200 acres of fertile land in Doylestown, Pennsylvania, is under way for the thirty-seventh semester which will commence in March.

The course of instruction covers thirty-six consecutive months and admits students between 17 and 21, who have had at least a year of high school training.

Beth David Hospital Dinner

Beth David Hospital will seek to raise funds for charity patients at a dinner to be held at the Hotel Astor on January 14. It is a non-sectarian institution situated at 113th Street and Lexington Avenue, and observes Jewish dietary laws. Arthur I. Levine, president, and Israel Sachs, chairman of the dinner committee, are in charge of the arrangements.
