Hungary Yields to Demands For Numerus Clausus; Students Pledge Peace (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUDAPEST, Dec. 11-The Hungarian government has promised the Hungarian anti-Semitic student associations strict enforcement of the numerus clausus against the Jewish students, in return for a promise to maintain peace, Minister of Education Balint Homan revealed today.

Not only will the numerus clausus be applied to the universities, but in addition, only a small number of Jewish pupils will be permitted to pass their final matriculation examinations in the secondary schools, thus preventing Jews from studying, the Minister of Education declared.

At the University of Szegelin, Jewish students complained to the rector that in spite of the assurances they had received, attacks against them are continuing. They an-nounced their decision to stay away from all lectures during the term. The rector admitted the attacks on the Jews and promised not to deduct credit for the term, since the absence of the students was forced, not voluntary.

PRAGUE, Dec. 11-Eight twentyyear-old Czechs were in custody today following their arrest yesterday by Karlsbad police as they were painting Jewish houses and shops with the swastika sign and posting up anti-Jewish placards. Iron Guardist Leader Hunted in Roumania: Police Rout Membership (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUCHAREST, Dec. 11-Roumanian authorities are conducting a nation-wide hunt for Cornelius Cod-reanu, leader of the banned Iron Guard, anti-nationalistic, anti-Semite organization. Codreanu is said to have disguised himself as a woman and escaped from police detachments now searching for him. More than 3,500 members of the Iron Guard were arrested by the police Police acting under instructions of

the government raided Iron Guard headquarters in various parts of Roumania. Numerous pistol battles and riots were reported in Bucharest. No deaths are listed, but a police commissioner was seriously wounded in a clash with Guardists. Anti-Semitic students, celebrating the anniversary of the creation of their organization, smashed Jewish shop windows in the principal streets

of Bucharest. Deputy Michael Landau protested to the government that police were hindering the filing of the election slate of the Jewish party in the va-

rious constituencies.

18 Jewish Youths Jailed Following Tel Aviv Riots Against Immigration Ban (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

TEL AVIV, Palestine, Dec. 11-Eighteen Jewish residents of this city, arrested as a result of disorders here Saturday when a crowd led by members of the Brith Trumpeldor, militant youth group, at-tacked the Revisionist, right-wing Zionist faction, demonstrated against the government's Jewish immigration policy, will go on trial tomor-row in Jaffa. Chief Magistrate Ralph B. Bodilly will preside at the hearings.

The disorders resulting when the crowd refused to heed police de-mands to disperse continued to form the chief topic of conversation in this all-Jewish city today and re-sulted in heated disputes between the Zionist factions.

The affair was the principal topic discussed at the meeting of the municipality last night which turned into a heated debate on the respon-

sibility for the disorders.

Mayor M. Dizengoff condemned the demonstrators in strong terms for not maintaining order. He was equally bitter in his condemnation of the measures employed by the government to round up tourists who had overstayed their leave in the country, terming the use of (Continued on Page 4)

Confer on Sentencing Of Spanknoebel Aide

Representative Samuel Dickstein, chairman of the House Committee on Immigration which is now con-ducting an investigation into Nazi affairs in this country, yesterday conferred with Judge Daniel J. Brennan in Newark regarding the sentencing of Walter Kauf, body-guard to Heinz Spanknoebel, who was convicted of carrying concealed weapons, assault, and instigating a riot following a Friends of New Germany meeting in Newark two months ago.

Kauf, according to Dickstein, has refused to discuss his connections with Spanknoebel, the American Nazi chief now a fugitive from justice. He has been asked for information by both Dickstein and Assistant United States Attorney William Prager, but toward both officials he maintained a stubborn refusal to talk.

It is expected that he will be sentenced to two years in jail in New-ark, after which he will be deported.

Recently reports have appeared in the press to the effect that comprehensive regulations on this subject are being considered, and that Jewish leaders had been requested by the government to submit their proposals. This, it is stated, they have declined to do, on the ground that as self-respecting citizens of Ger-many, they cannot submit to being governed by any laws other than those affecting the German citizenry as a whole. Throughout, the claim of the German government has been that the treatment of any part of the population is its own internal

"This claim has misled many organizations and individuals all over the world into acceptance of that dogma, which they have prefaced to

treatment of the Tews. "This attitude certainly does not represent the sentiment of civilized governments and of civilized peoples, among whom the voice of conscience cannot be stilled and speaks no matter where injustice may be done. When a government brings a section of the people to a condition of despair, and this despair becomes so great that many must flee from the country in which they and their ancestors have lived its definite decision not to endorse for centuries, they become an object of international concern, not only because they are refugees to other countries, but because of the basic causes which lead them to become refugees," Dr. Adler reported.

"Certainly as Jews", he declared, "we cannot regard the attitude of Germany to its Jewish citizens an internal affair. "It is imperative that we continue to resist the threatening danger with firmness and dignity, and by a comminuous appeal to the conscience of mankind, plead for justice and equality for the Jews in Germany

and elsewhere. "To this purpose the American Jewish Committee solemnly re-dedicates itself. Conscious of its great responsibility, the Committee calls upon the Jews of America for moral support and for adequate material support, without which its tasks cannot be effectively performed."

The report also contained a summary of the Committee's attitude and an explanation of the many steps it had taken in regard to the critical situation in Germany.

As to the boycott on German goods, Dr. Adler's report expressed the view that "Naziism is not only a Jewish problem, but also a world menace. In this view it is supported their protest against the barbaric by umnistakable evidence from within the German borders; the sup-pression of all freedom of speech, press and assembly; the destruction of the rights won by labor unions and women; the utilization of the church for the aims of the state, and the militaristic aims of the Nazi leaders. While the American Tewish Committee sympathizes with the desire, and recognizes the right of individuals to refrain from buying goods made in Germany, it reaffirms or participate in a boycott organized by Jews in America."

Horace Samuel Assumes Defense of Stavsky in Jaffa Murder Trial (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JAFFA, Palestine, Dec. 11-Hor-ace Samuel, noted British barrister, today took over the defense at the resumption of hearings in connection with the trial of Abraham Stavsky, Zionist Revisionist who is charged with complicity in the murder of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, noted Zionist labor leader, on the night of Tune 16.

Levand Turgeman, 18, daughter of the hotel proprietor whose premises Stavsky claimed housed him on the night of the murder, testified that she had registered the defendant June 16 but said she had not seen

any more of him.

Jacob Friedman and Moshe Mendelboim told the court they had spent the night in Turgeman's Hotel. Friedman identified Stavsky as having been a fellow lodger while Mendelboim admitted that he had bandaged Stavsky's hand. The evidence confirms statements made by the defendant regarding his presence in the Jerusalem hotel on the night of the murder. Professor Nahum Slusz testified

Palestine Govt. Weighs Restricting Number of Jews in Professions

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) IERUSALEM, Dec. 11-Deputy Director of Health Joseph W. P. Harkness informed the Jewish Telegraphic Agency yesterday that the government of Palestine was considering a possible restriction of the number of licenses issued to doctors. He declared that out of a total of 1,043 physicians in Palestine, 882 were Jewish. Most of the Jewish physicians licensed this year, he stated, were German immigrants. The total inumber of doctors and dentists in Palestine on November 30 was 1.566. Since the end of 1932 there had been an increase of 500 Jews in these professions, Deputy Director Harkness declared.

Vienna Clergyman Asks Gov't Intervention in Curbing Austrian Jews (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

VIENNA. Dec. 11-The necessity for an immediate settlement of the Jewish question as a means of forestalling the danger of forceful measures, was stressed by Pastor Wil-helm Schmidt, Professor at the University of Vienna, in addressing a conference of Catholic leaders to-

Pastor Schmidt pointed out that Jewish predominance in Austria was unbearable. He said it had pene-trated the professions of teaching, medicine and law, pushing out needy Christian youths, who have before them the example of the radical

treatment of the Jews in the Third Reich of the Nazis.

Iews also dominate the cinema, the theater and the press, the Cath-olic cleric complained. He admitted that the solution of the Jewish question was rendered very difficult in the case of the converted Jew, declaring, however, that conversion does not remove the disadvantages created for the Christians and therefore, the converts too must be treated differently from the Chris-

tion to the public press was forthcoming this afternoon from Dr. Kurt Schmitt, Reich Minister of Economies, regarding his stricture against discriminating against Jewish business establishments.

The Cabinet member said that it is essential to keep the interests of the Fatherland above all else. It is necessary, he insisted, to use every individual and every opportunity to develop the German economic system and encourage the restoration of prosperity. It would be inconsistent, therefore, he maintained, to discriminate against persons who have economic status.

Chanukah Festival to Answer Steuben Day In Anti-Nazi Protest

A demonstration intended to answer the challenge of the recent German Day celebration held by the Steuben Society at Madison Square Garden, will be the purpose of the Maccabean festival scheduled at the Madison Square Garden on Satur-day evening. Samuel Untermyer will deliver the principal address which is to be a rejoinder to remarks made by German Ambassador Hans Luther.

Untermyer described the Mr. speech made by Mr. Luther as "condemning testimony of the efforts of the Nazis to spread German propa-

Morris Margolies, secretary of the Zionist Organization of America, which is sponsoring the festival, an-nounced that the Chanukah celebration has been "transformed into an anti-Nazi demonstration." Appeals Court Holds Jews May Act as Executors of Aryan and Jewish Estates (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Dec. 11-The Kammergericht, court of appeals, today an-nulled the ruling of the Berlin district court, cancelling the right of Jews to act as executors, in wills filed in German courts.

The court of appeals not only up-held the right of Jews to act as ex-cutors in wills filed by Jews, but also upheld the right of Jews to be executors for Aryans, if such a desire is expressed in the will of the deceased.

An executor does not necessarily act as lawyer, the appeals court ex-plained, and therefore the Aryan clause cannot affect executors.
