Appeal for Clemency Mitigates Sentences of Convicted Arab Rioters

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, Dec. 16—The dis-trict court here, consisting of two British and one Arab judge, today listened to an appeal to mitigate the sentences against Jemal Husseini and two other members of the Arab Executive who were convicted of participating in the Jerusalem riots on Oct. 17, thereby violating the sedi-tious ordinances act.

Acting on the appeal, the court re-duced the sentence of Husseini and Edmund Roche, Christian Arab, requiring 100 pounds security deposit, which is to be held for a year. A month's imprisonment, the original penalty, was rescinded.

Muza Faar, the third member of the Arab Executive, wnose original sentence was a deposit of 200 pounds for a year as security, was acquitted.

Poland Pushing Jews From Government Jobs Dr. Rosmarin Declares (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

WARSAW, Dec. 16-That there is a continuous elimination of even the few Jews left in the government services, was revealed today in a speech made in the Polish Sejm by the well-known Jewish deputy, Dr. Henry Rosmarin, who spoke in con-nection with the post office bill now before the parliament.

Dr. Rosmarin cited East Galicia as an example. In 1918, he declared, there were 363 Jewish postal officials there, including fifty inspectors and forty postmen. Today, there are only seventy Jewish officials left in East Galicia, including three inspectors and four postmen, although 2,500 more officials have been engaged by the Post Office Ministry during the period.

In view of the tremendous hard-ship of the Jewish population and their loyalty to their country, Dr. Rosmarin said, he appealed for justice to the Jews. However, when pletely speech.

Germany's Exports Slump; Figures Might Be 'Tixed'. Says London Daily Herald (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Dec. 16-A slump in German exports of eleven and onehalf percent in November as compared with November of last year, is reported in today's Vossische Zeitung.

This is the first time that a German paper has dared to reveal the exact loss of German trade. The paper, in a most alarming manner, emphasizes that this substantial drop affects not only the budget, but also employment and the shipping trade.

Magazine for Blind Makes Its Appearance

A miscellany of articles, ranging from historical sketches of the criminal law of the Hebrews to reviews of the current problems facing modern Jews, are included in the current issue of The Jewish Braille Review, published by the Jewish Braille Institute of America, Inc., for the American Jewish blind.

The cost of payment for the magazine, which was suspended for four months, is met by the combined effort of the Women's Branch of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations, the National Council of Jewish Women, the Women's League of the United Synagogue of America and the National Federation of Temple Sis-terhoods. The periodical is distributed without cost to the blind.

The subject matter of the Review includes articles culled from outstanding Jewish and Anglo-Jewish publications, including the Jewish Daily Bulletin and the Detroit Jewish Chronicle.

CLEVELAND, Dec. 16-Sponsored by a committee of prominent Cleveland citizens headed by Governor George White and Mayor Harry L. Davis, and with the backing of the three Cleveland daily newspapers, the pageant "The Romance of a People" will be shown in Cleveland during the third week in March. Twenty-five percent of the proceeds will go to Cleveland philanthropic institutions, Jewish and non-Tewish, and the remainder will be used for the settlement of German Jews in Palestine.

Commenting on a cabled announce-ment from Palestine that 500 Jewish doctors and dentists, most of them from Germany, entered Palestine this year, Mrs. Edward Jacobs, for-mer president of Hadassah and now chairman of a committee to raise \$200,000 for the new hospital in Jerusalem, pointed to the urgent ne-cessity for up-to-date scientific fa-cilities in Palestine to enable the new arrivals to continue with their professional work.

Hadassah also announced a national campaign under the leadership of Mrs. Herman Shulman of New York, to be conducted throughout the country during December on behalf of the Palestine School Luncheon Fund.

English Fascist Paper Urges Boycott on Jews

mas and Porever Arter is the mea-sage of The Fascist, "organ of Fas-cist opinion", published by the Im-perial Fascist League of England, in its December issue. The issue reports the pledging of its support to Hitler at a German meeting.

The Fascist is almost completely filled with attacks on the Jews, with

whatever space is left being devoted to attacks on the rival Fascist outfit headed by Sir Oswald Mosley. In an American letter the paper

describes the acceptance by the Roosevelt administration of the monetary reform program of the Fas-cists. Professor Irving Fisher is described as "President Roosevelt's adviser."

The issue also contains an adver-tisement for "the help of leisured men" for the work of the organization. "We do not believe in paid Fascist leaders", it points out.

Another advertisement is for swastika badges for wearers pledged to boycott Jews, never to employ Jews and to work to stop "the Jewish invasion of our country."

An attack on the Jewish national home in Palestine is also featured in the issue.

Vatican Denies Talks With Reich on Tolerance (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

ROME, Dec. 16-According to reports here, the Vatican has denied that there are any negotiations with the German government concerning the status and treatment of German Catholics of Jewish origin. Officials at the Vatican pointed out that only if German Jewish Catholics were subjected to injustices as Catholics could the Vatican intervene on their behalf.

Jewish Physician Invents A New Device for Aiding The Near Blind to See (Tewish Daily Bulletin)

BALTIMORE, Dec. 17-Dr. William Feinbloom of New York City, well-known optometrist, who is making an attempt to "restore sight to the blind", has invented powerful microscopic spectacles magnifying eighteen times, according to an announcement made here today at the twelfth annual meeting of the American Academy of Optometry.

Dr. Feinbloom's invention triples the power of lenses, which are composed of two convex parts. His second device increases distance vision by fifty percent. His achievement has been described as revolutionary in the optometric science.

In a paper which he read before the convention, Dr. Feinbloom said.

"As a result of these devices, together with those already known, we have found it possible to aid approximately sixty percent of the un-selected cases of subnormal vision. I believe the work to date has opened the field for development of optical devices.

A year ago Dr. Feinbloom gave the scientific world cylindrical telescopic spectacles for those with extremely defective vision. The new invention further increases the power of the lenses.

German Seamen Hired In U. S. Shipping Posts. Testimony Discloses

According to the testimony of witresses brought before the executive session of the Dickstein committee investigating Nazi affairs in this country, Nazi German supporters and agents are in control of em-ployment of the stewards' depart-ments of a number of American trans-Atlantic vessels.

The testimony, repeated to a reporter of the Jewish Daily Bulletin, reveals an intricate Nazi system for procuring American citizenship for German seamen without entailing the surrender of franchise in Gerpropaganda into this country, and the absolute powers granted Ger-mans in hiring and dismissing mem-

According to the testimony of a witness who joined the Nazi seafaring organization, American passports and citizenship papers are being procured for Nazi agents in the gations, the United Synagogue of Panama Canal Zone. These Nazis America, the Union of American are seeking to enlist the support of American seamen as consideration for which American supporters of the Hitler movement are given jobs aboard American ships in the Nazicontrolled departments. He stated that practically every German member of the crew who were naturalized American citizens, cast their ballots for Hitler when their ship Zippie Cohen, 80, Feted reached a German port on election

The witness testified that American seamen are bribed or coerced into removing smuggled material, the nature of which was said to be "propaganda, or rifles, or both" into New York City. Seamen are said to hold secret meetings to plan with advisers ashore the conduct of their Nazi propaganda.

He described organizations oper-ating in New York and Hoboken, composed of seamen and members of Hitlerite groups, primarily of the League of Friends of New Germany, engaged in smuggling unknown materials into this country. They are said to bring material in from both German- and Americanowned ships. Smuggling, he said, has not decreased since the inception of investigations by both federal and congressional authorities.

Both these nationalities have enjoyed much greater representation on the force during the last twelve months, the Shaatz-Zeitung asserts. In the meanime the percentage of Germans and Irish has perceptibly decreased, according to the paper.
