## McDonald Commission to Create Central Body for German-Jewish Refugees

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON, Dec. 21—A central Jewish committee, organization of which was decided upon at the London world conference for the relief of German Jews, will convene here in January to work out a series of in January to work out a series of plans and recommendations to be submitted to James G. McDonald, High Commissioner for refugees appointed by the League of Nations.

Present plans call for the repre-

sentation on this committee of all fund-raising organizations, important democratic Jewish bodies and representatives of Jewish communities raising at least five thousand pounds annually for the work.

Mr. McDonald is a passenger on the liner Manhattan arriving here on Saturday.

#### Chronicle Urges Britain To Check Anti-Semitic Propaganda Spread (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, Dec. 21-An appeal to the British government for measures to stem the tide of anti-Semitic in-citement in England, which is as-suming a dangerous character, was made today by the London Jewish Chronicle, in a lengthy editorial.

As an example to be followed, the Chronicle cited the bill prepared by the Dutch government, for protection against anti-Semitic agitation and activities.

## German Banks Join Drive Against Jewish Firms: Call in Loans, Credits

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Dec. 21-A drive has been started against Tewish firms in various parts of Germany, particularly in Hesse, where the banks have, without any warning, demanded that Tewish firms repay within one week all loans and overdrafts. otherwise threatening to commence bankruptev actions at once.

This drastic action, which spells ruin for thousands of Jewish merchants, is explained by the banks as having been caused by the withdrawal of funds by Jewish depositors, necessitating the calling in of all Tewish credits.

While it is true that many Jews are actually drawing on their deposits for their living expenses, this has not been done on a large enough scale to justify an organized movement against Jewish credit. Most of the Jewish firms extend merchandise credits, especially to peasants, and it is impossible for them to collect their debts at such short notice to meet the bank demands.

## Aged Rabbi Transferred To Concentration Camp

BERLIN, Dec. 21-Rabbi Dienemann of Offenbach was transferred to the Osthofen concentration camp today by the political police. Rabbi Dienemann was arrested last Sunday for having described in his sermon the atrocities perpetrated in Biblical times and saying "to Jews it is the same thing whether the atrocities are committed by a French general or by the German police."

## Anti-Semites Routed in Roumanian Flections Duca Wins Majority (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUCHAREST, Dec. 21-The Liberal party, headed by Premier Ion Duca, won an overwhelming victory in the Roumanian general elections.

m the Roumanian general elections, early returns showed today. The government, according to first returns, won 301 out of the 389 seats in the Chamber of Deputies, obtaining 54 percent of the seats under the new electoral law. total vote, however, will not be known for several days. Under the Roumanian law, the party obtaining 40 percent of the total vote, is automatically guaranteed two-thirds of the seats in parliament. Because of a heavy snow-fall, the vote was unusually small.

#### Jerusalem Jewish Press Protests Gov't Plans For City Elections

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence) JERUSALEM, Nov. 26-The gov-

ernment is completing preparations for the elections to be held in the municipality here, and according to a report the ballots will be cast in January.

According to the newspaper, Doar Hayom, Hebrew daily, the city is to have twelve electoral wards, four of which will be Jewish, four of which will be Jewish, two Moslem-Christian, two Moslem-Christian of non-Arab race, one purely Moslem, one purely Christian and two mixed wards consisting of

Moslems, Christians and Jews.
"This arrangement," declares one
article published in Doar Hayom, "deprives the Jews of a majority or of suitable representation in the municipality. One or two non-Jewsish Englishmen will represent the foreign residents, as in the mixed municipality in Alexandria, Egypt."

Haaretz reports that Ragheb Nashashibi will not remain Mayor of Jerusalem but will be replaced by an Englishman appointed by the High Commissioner. The appointee will probably be one of the senior officials shortly due for retirement as having passed the age limit. The British Mayor will have a Moslem and Jew as vice-mayors.

Such a step, it is felt, "will solve the pressing problem of the municipal administration in Jerusalem, and do away with the present system of graft and corruption which have prevailed under the Moslem-Chris-tian civic regime."

Dayar continued: "An attempt to make the Jewish majority into a minority is the substance of this change in organization of election wards." It deplores the fact that there will be four Jewish wards, six Moslem and Christian wards and two mixed wards

There has been no consultation with Jewish representatives on this unique form of polling," says Doar Hayom. "It appears that the gov-ernment has used the opportunity of the absence of Tewish councillors at the Municipality to foist on the public a new election scheme."

## Jabotinsky Hopes to Be Citizen of Palestine. Denies Polish Reports

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

PARIS, Dec. 21-Vladimir Jabotinsky, leader of the Zionist Revisionists, today denied that he had applied for Polish citizenship, as reported in the press recently. Jabotinsky revealed that the French government had offered him citizenship rights, but he had declined since he desires only Palestinian citizenship, which he hopes to secure soon.

According to earlier press reports, the Revisionist leader had applied for Polish citizenship in order to head the Polish Revisionist movement, which is very strong. It had been asserted that Jabotinsky would stand for election to the Polish Seim, on a Revisionist ticket, and head a strong Jewish group in the parliament.

As a result of the Arab riots of 1921, when Jabotinsky headed the militant Palestinian Jewish youths who met the Arabs with arms in their hands, the noted Zionist was deported from Palestine. He found-ed the Jewish Legion which fought under General Allenby in the capture of Palestine.

## German Jews Faithful To Fatherland, Though Rights Are Shattered

(I.T.A. Special Correspondence) BERLIN, Nov. 27 - Dr. Bruno Woyda, one of the leaders of the Berlin Jewish community, who is at the head of the Revival Movement of Jewish Germans, addressing the first public meeting held here by the Revival Movement, said that "in spite of everything, we feel now more than ever in weal or woe forever bound to our German home-

"It is a unique situation in which we German Iews find ourselves to-

day," he went on.
"There are large circles of the German people who will not allow us to be considered Germans, and there are many Jews living in Germany who regard us German Jews as fools for insisting in spite of everything, that we are Germans.

"It is precisely because of the things that we have experienced during this year 1933, that we have come to realize more thoroughly than ever before that we are Ger-mans and will stay Germans, come what may.

We intend to proclaim this faith of ours until it becames the general property of the whole German peo-ple, and the last German of those who are today under the impression of a caricature of what is Jewish, will do justice to our real self as German Jews, until contempt is converted into respect, and depreciation into honest recognition.

"It will be the task of this new movement to train pioneers and to place them in the battlefront in the new war for emancipation. We are out for justice, and we trust that we shall achieve it.

"There are only two movements among the Jews of Germany that have any right to existence," Dr. Woyda declared, "the German Jewish movement and the Zionist movement. There is no room for neu-trality. But the Jewish Germans desire to work in conjunction with all Jews in Germany in those fields in which life brings us economic aid, welfare work and religious ac-

munity, complained that the Central Union of German Citizens of Jewish Faith had adopted a stand of neutrality and as such, he said, it no longer represented the German-feeling section of Jewry.

They must make a clear distinction between the Jewish national conception and the German Jewish conception," he declared. "Zionists strove to direct Jewish youth to-wards Hebrew language, Hebrew literature and Hebrew song.

anti-Semitic disorders. Police made more than twenty arrests.

The anti-Semitic Iron Guard banned before the election, and with its leaders in flight or under arrest was unable to put candidates in the field. However, they instructed anti-Semites to vote for the slate headed by Professor Alexander Cuza. The anti-Semitic party received less than 5 percent of the vote-

The slate put in the field by Jewish groups was reported to have done well on the basis of incomplete

The election of the Duca slate and the defeat of the anti-Semite groups was widely hailed in Jewish quarters since the government headed by Dr. Duca, in its brief tenure of office. had taken firm and effective steps to quell the activities of the Iron Guard, the Cuzists and the Roumanian Nazis. While it is generally understood that these measures were taken, not only to protect the Jews, but because the anti-Semitic organizations were also very much opposed to the Duca government, nevertheless Jews in Roumania have expressed the belief that their destinies were in safer hands with Dr. Duca and his Liberal party in power.

The measures employed by the Duca government before the elections to suppress anti-Semitic outbreaks, coupled with the strong statement yesterday by King Carol of Roumania to the effect that racial and religious discriminations had no place in Roumanian life were accepted by many Jewish leaders as evidence that the new government, with a parliamentary majority be-hind it, would continue its firm policies.
