his son, of Bukhara, Turkestan, and Rachami Moshe, of Afghanistan, Machami Moshe, of Afghanistan, were to have been deported to the latter country with the wife and daughter of Joshua. They had been arrested yesterday together with Yechya Ben-Shabon, also of Afghanistan, and the latter's wife and two children. The three men and the rest of the Joshua family were in a nolice automobile here when the crowd of unknown sympathizers converged on it, routed the police guard and the driver, and took the three men and their haggage away, leaving the women

A relation of one of the escaped men was taken into custody last night by the police for interrogation, while a diligent search was begun to discover the hideout of the fugitives.

Weizmann Says Problem Of German Jewry Will Reach Solution Shortly (Terrish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, Dec. 26—German Jewry's position will be stabilized shortly in one way or another, Dr. Chaim Weizmann, former president of the World Zionist Organization, and head of the Zionist commission for settling German-Jewish refugees in Palestine, declared yesterday in an address delivered before the conference of the British Zionist Federation, now in session here. "Even hell has limits," Dr. Weizmann said, nointing out that even in Russia, the position of the Iews has been stabil-

"Within five or six years, German Jewry will be reduced to half its present number, and will perhaps be digestible among sixty millions of Germans," Dr. Weizmann declared.

"One-third of the total Chalutz
(pioneer) immigration into Palestine
is from Germany," the veteran Zionist leader pointed out. "Also more
than one thousand tourists and capitalists enter Palestine from Germany each month. Assuming an annual emigration of twenty thousand German Jews, half will go to Palestine. The income to be expected for Palestine from various sources will be about one hundred and fifty thousand pounds annually and this will enable the absorption of six thousand German refugees each year. As Vandals Set Fire to Synagogue in Jassy (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUCHAREST, Dec. 26-The Kantarschi Synagogue in Jassy was de-stroyed Sunday evening by incendiaries who made their escape in safety. The interior of the syna-gogue was found to have been drenched with petroleum and then fired. The resulting blaze gutted the building completely, leaving it aimost a total wreck. Only the sefer torahs, sacred scrolls of the law, were found miraculously un-touched.

Mizrachi Launches Drive For Palestine Work

The Mizrachi Organization of America has launched a drive to raise \$200,000 for the Mizrachi Palestine Fund, officers announced following a conference held at the Hotel

Pennsylvania.
The campaign will raise the money by means of a popular campaign and by the establishment of an organization to be called Agudath Bnei El Chai. Ten thousand members, each contributing the sum of \$18, will be sought.

Regional conferences to be held throughout the country will be called by rabbis and other prominent Jewish workers.

Rabbi M. S. Margolies will confer with about a hundred orthodox rab-bis in New York in this connection.

The quota for the city is \$75,000.

Members of the Board of Governors to consist of 500 rabbis and prominent orthodox leaders, will each be asked to contribute \$100 to the fund. The organization will also make an attempt to secure 50,000 individual contributions of one dollar.

Anti-Semitism Limits Opportunities for Youth. Rothenberg Tells Masada (Jewish Daily Bulletin)

NIAGARA FALLS, N. Y., Dec. 26-The first annual convention of Masada, national Youth Zionist Organization, closed here yesterday with the election of national officers. After describing the preliminary work that resulted in the creation of Masada, the Zionist leader said

"More than ever before there is today a psychological need for the identification of Jewish youth with Jewish life and Jewish problems. With anti-Semitism limiting Jewish opportunity and world economic deopportunity and world economic us-pression increasing the isolation of the Jew, a psychic danger to Jewish youth lurks, unless normal Jewish impulses and mental processes can

function freely.
"It is my deep conviction that if we all work earnestly and wisely, we can make Masada the vehicle for enlisting great masses of Jewish youth in the service of the greatest of Jewish causes, the re-constitution of Israel's land and the revival of Israel's culture, a consummation which will at the same time confer an infinite benefit upon all who participate in this historic task."

Mr. Imber called upon Jewish youth to do away with the multitude of Jewish organizations that divide them.

"We must cut through party lines, allegiances and restrictions," he de-clared. "The Zionist platform is broad enough for every shade of opinion.

Dr. Alexander Dushkin of Chicago, chairman of the Zionist commission on youth education, stressed the importance of the youth Zionist movement and lauded the Masada group.

Jewish Agency Recognizes American Economic Group Dispensing Information

The Central Bureau for Industrial and Agricultural Information, established and maintained by the American Economic Committee for Palestine, has been recognized by the Jewish Agency for Palestine as the central source for economic information regarding the country, accord-

ing to word received here.

The Jewish Agency has decided to join other Palestine economic bodies in making the Central Bureau the clearing house for economic in-formation to immigrants, Israel B. Brodie, president of the American Economic Committee for Palestine, announced yesterday. The commit-tee was organized in 1932 to foster the economic development of Palestine and the encouraging of private initiative is among its aims. organization also maintains an economic bureau here at 522 Fifth Ave.

Mr. Brodie's announcement was made in his report on the activities of the committee during the past six months which revealed that over seventy percent of the inquiries cleared by the Tel Aviv bureau had come from German Jewish middle-

class refugees.

"In designating the American Economic Committee for Palestine, the central source for industrial and the central source for industrial and agricultural information, the Jewish Agency puts the stamp of official approval on the activities of our Tel Aviv Bureau, which the Jewish com-munity of Palestine and prospective immigrants abroad have for some time come to regard as the authoritative medium for reliable and impartial information on all phases of Palestine economic life. The action of the Jewish Agency comes six months after the national organizations representing Palestine labor industry, commerce, agriculture and horticulture united in agreeing to centralize all their informational activities in our Bureau," Mr. Brodie

The report continues:

"Since April, our Tel Aviv Bureau has been literally besieged by Ger-man Jewish 'middle-class' refugees seeking information and direction for their rehabilitation in Palestine. At present such German refugees constitute well over 70% of the inquirers serviced at the Bureau. A con-siderable number of these immigrants possess productive experience and capital ranging from £1,000 to £20,000.

"The Bureau has been guiding German business men in transfer-ring and reestablishing their facto-ries and stores in Palestine. It is facilitating the establishment of new industrial and commercial enter-prises and is aiding in the expansion bers of the Board of Directors: Ab-

Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi Group Formed to Combat Spread of Propaganda

A new organization has been form-ed by the American League for the Defense of Jewish Rights which will have as its purpose to launch a campaign against the spread of Nazi propaganda in this country as well as to conduct the boycott, according to Samuel Untermyer, president of both organizations. The new group will be known as the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League to Champion Human

Rights. "The invasion and flooding of our country by Nazi anti-Semitic, sedi-tious propaganda," Mr. Untermyer stated, "is contrary to American in-stitutions and must be met, as must also the recent attempts of the Nazi regime to destroy Catholic and Protestant churches and to substitute in their place the 'German Church' which involves the scrapping of the Old Testament and parts of the New Testament and the proposed destruction of the franchise to women irrespective of race or creed. All this, added to the continuing persecution of the Jewish people in Germany has imposed upon us greatly added responsibilities. In order to accurately represent these enlarged activities, which have the whole-hearted cooperation of many outstanding Americans, Jews and non-Jews, the name of the League has been changed to the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League to Champion Human Rights."

Mr. Untermyer announced that the reorganized body will continue to concentrate upon the boycott, which he characterized as "the only effective weapon in defense of basic human rights and for the preservation of democratic institutions, religious freedom and the inalienable rights of man against medieval barbarism, which has seized control of Germany, throttled its free institutions and is threatening the peace and freedom of the world."

It is largely due to the Committee's development of a single, competent information instrument, in place of the many former information services (issuing conflicting reports at times), that Palestine is in a posi-tion to assimilate and absorb the capital and valuable experience of the 'middle-class' German refugees with a minimum of waste and of unwarranted enterprises."

The extent to which the facilities of the Committee's Bureau at Tel Aviv is being taxed by German re-fugees may be judged, according to the report, by the fact that between April and November, 1933, the per-centage of German immigrant inquiries increased from less than 20 percent to approximately 70 percent per month.

Of a total of 1,568 inquirers (families) serviced in person and by mail between July and November, 1,023 were Germans. The aggegate capital reported by those inquirers who specified their capital was more than 2,000,000 pounds of which much more than 1,300,000 pounds were possessed by German refugees.
