Another Surrender

English colonial and mandatorial pride has bowed the neck again to Arab urgency. The English colonial and apologized for its attempt to break the back of the Arab riots at Jaffa of October 27th. It has done this by repudiating the action of the responsible officer, Superintendent John A. M. Faraday, Jaffa police chief, who has just been ordered transferred to Beersheba, which action constitutes at the least demo-tion and rebuke. Jaffa is, despite its Arabs, a city compared to which Beersheba is a wild frontier post. This demotion comes as the result of an inquiry by Attorney General Herbert, a member also of the Murison investigating commission which has been conducting an inquiry into the Arab riots, in secret, but has not yet issued its report.

The transfer of Superintendent Faraday is not the only concession made to Arab clamor. The hunt for Iewish tourists who were overstaying their leaves was most obviously instituted to quiet the Arabs, while, at the same time, Trans-Jordanian Arabs have been crossing the border without any by-your-leave from the authorities. It is on the whole difficult to avoid the conclusion that the Mandatory government welcomes the opportunity, extended to them by Arab demands, to restrict the rights of Jews to Jewish land, instead of bearing in mind that it is under the obligation to exercise a mandate over Palestine for the

In 1933, it promises to be well over 30,000, which figure does not include the vary large number of tourists who rentain in the country and whose status has not yet been legalized. Considering the size of the country, this mass immi-gration into Palestine is truly amazing for it exceeds the total immigration into Canada for 1932, which was 25,752 and will probably also exceed the total immigration into the United States, which was 35,576. Palestine today is one of the most important immigration

foci in the world, if not the most important.

The remarkable tempo of Palestine's progress, the great influx of new settlers and the still larger incoming wave make it imperative to revise the constrictive territorial limitations under which Palestine has been developing until now. The frontiers of Palestine must be extended and restored to the original borders contemplated by the Mandate. The country must no longer re-main cleft in twain, one half open to Jewish settlement, and the other half closed.

If the land problem in Palestine was a serious one till now, it will certainly become more serious as the population increases. If land values rose to almost prohibitive heights before, they will be raced up to new and even more preposterous levels in the future by the furious speculation which the

great land hunger of the new settlers will provoke. If over-urbanization was a serious matter before, it will in the future become truly noxious and unwholesome as settlement on the land becomes increasingly more

There is other Jewish land, which through intensive irrigation, may be made to support a larger agricultural population. In other words, Trans-Jordania, which is twice the size of Palestine, with but one-third of Palestine's population, must open its gates for Jewish settlement.

The separation of Trans-Jordania from Palestine is a political fiction. Up to 1927, the territory was in-cluded within the jurisdiction of the High Commissioner of Palestine and no special mention was made of it. Today Trans-Jordania is still administered by the High Commissioner of Palestine though he receives a separate commission from His Majesty's Government to administer it. Trans-Jordanian Arabs require no traveling documents to enter Palestine. They can enter without passports or visas and can settle there without permits while the Jews of Palestine enjoy no such privileges in Trans-Jordania. The cost of the Trans-Jordanian Frontier Force is borne almost entirely by the Palestine Government.

The political questions involved in the settlement of

Iews in Trans-Iordania as well as the question of the political status of Trans-Jordania itself, may well be the subjects of future negotiations. Whether the mem-orandum of the British Government of September, 1922, which was approved by the Council of the League



"The Cross of Peace" is chiefly interesting because it gives us a rapid survey of the post-war years in the guise of a story which may be described as at least palatable.


